The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1343 (1933-34) together with the prescribed statements.

The outstanding features of the fasli are—

- (i) The season was fairly satisfactory though not as good as in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 2.
- (ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 68,028 acres from 27,812,528 acres in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 7.
- (iii) The total assessment on holdings increased by Rs. 5,18,273 from Rs. 5,91,89,706 in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 8.
- (iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings decreased by 142,294 acres—vide paragraph 9.
- (v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge increased by Rs. 1,62,888—vide paragraph 10.
- (vi) Season remissions increased by Rs. 3,11,458—vide paragraph 11 (i).
- (vii) The fixed remissions decreased by Rs. 1,83,058—vide paragraph 11 (ii).
- (viii) The beriz deductions increased by Rs. 3,798—vide paragraph 11 (iii).
- (ix) The revenue suspended on account of the fall in the prices of agricultural products amounted to Rs. 61,61,947—vide paragraph 11 (iv).
- (x) The amount of revenue remitted in this fasli was Rs. 61-86 lakhs—vide paragraph 11.
- (xi) The miscellaneous revenue decreased by Rs. 4,88,108—vide paragraph 12.
- (xii) The effective percentage of collection was 98 per cent—vide paragraph 16.
- (xiii) There was a slight increase in the number of land sales—vide paragraph 27.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon declared itself in Malabar on the 22nd May about ten days earlier than usual and the West Coast received heavy rains until the end of September. In the rest of the Presidency, it was generally weak in June. In July, the Circars, Bellary, Anantapur, Coimbatore, Madura and Tinnevely, enjoyed more than their average share of rainfall. In August, the rainfall in the whole Presidency outside the Circars (Ganjam and the Agency portion of East Godavari excepted), Chingleput, South Arcot and South Kanara was above the average. There were freshes in the main rivers. In September, the Bay current strengthened and gave rise to unsettled conditions off the Circars coast and a depression formed there by the 7th which crossed the coast to the south of Calingapatam on the 10th morning causing widespread rain in Ganjam, Vizagapatam, East Godavari, West Godavari and Bellary. In the rest of the Presidency, the rainfall in the month was generally below the average. The monsoon began to weaken towards the end of the third week of the month and withdrew from the

Presidency by the 27th. On the whole, the south-west monsoon was bordering on or above the average in all districts outside Guntur, Kurnool, Cuddapah, the Carnatic, Chittoor, North Arcot, Salem and Tanjore.

There were floods in the Circars (Vizagapatam excepted) resulting in damage to huts, irrigation works, roads and standing crops mainly paddy. East Godavari, West Godavari and Kistna were the districts which were affected most.

Conditions characteristic of the transition from the south-west to the north-east monsoon prevailed over the Bay on the last four days of September and the first ten days of October and fairly widespread thunder-storms occurred in the southern half of the Presidency. A storm crossed the Circars coast between Cocanada and Masulipatam on the 18th October causing widespread rain in the northern half of the Presidency. There were floods in parts of Ganjam, East Godavari and West Godavari. The rainfall in October was bordering on or above the average in all districts except Cuddapah, South Arcot and Tanjore. An area of low pressure lay off the South Coromandel coast on the 8th November and thence passed across the south of the Peninsula into the south-east Arabian sea by the 10th morning causing widespread and locally heavy rain in the south-east Madras especially on the 10th. There were heavy floods in the taluks of Sattur and Srivilliputtur of Ramnad district causing damage to Minor Irrigation works. The floods in Tinnevely town temporarily cut it off from the rest of the district. A storm crossed the coast near Nellore on the night of the 17th and fairly widespread rain occurred on the 18th in East Godavari, West Godavari, Kistna, Guntur, Kurnool, Cuddapah, Nellore and Chingleput. Strong winds which accompanied this storm carried away the shutters of the Kanigiri reservoir with the result that the country below was submerged but the water drained off rapidly and little damage was caused. On the whole the rainfall in November was below the average except in Vizagapatam (Agency), Kistna, Guntur, Kurnool, Bellary, Madura, Ramnad and Tinnevely. Conditions became unsettled to the east of Ceylon on the 11th December and a depression formed by the 12th evening. It intensified by the 14th morning into a severe cyclone which moved north-westwards, crossed the coast near Cuddalore on the 15th evening, lay as a depression over south-east Madras on the 16th and filled up there on the 17th causing widespread and generally heavy rain in the Carnatic and Central districts and in Tanjore. The rain was accompanied by very strong winds and caused severe floods resulting in damage to telegraph and railway lines as well as to crops and property especially in Chingleput and South Arcot. The rains were, however, too late to be beneficial to the standing paddy crops in parts of the Chingleput district. The rainfall in December was above the average in the Presidency except in the plains of Ganjam and Vizagapatam and in Madura, Ramnad, Tinnevely, Malabar and the Nilgiris. Conditions became unsettled in the south of the Bay of Bengal to the east of Ceylon after the 20th January 1934. A depression formed there on the 23rd which filled up off Malabar on the 26th. This led to widespread rain in the southern half of the Presidency and the rains were very heavy in the south. The north-east monsoon was on the whole above the average except in Cuddapah.

February was practically without rain. Thunder storms occurred in the south on the 12th and 13th March. There were thunder storms practically in the whole of the Presidency in the third week of April. Scattered thunder showers occurred in the Presidency on many days in May. On the whole the hot weather rains were below the average except in Kurnool and Coimbatore.

Sowings of the early crops were generally satisfactory or above normal except in the Circars and the West Coast where the sowings were slightly below normal on account of heavy floods or rains. The condition of the early crops was generally fair.

Sowings of the late crops were restricted except in the Circars and the West Coast where they were satisfactory. The condition of the late crops was generally fair but paddy was affected to some extent for want of timely rains in parts of Chingleput and North Arcot, by cyclone and insects in parts of South Arcot and by heavy rains in parts of Tanjore.

The season for the Presidency as a whole was fairly satisfactory though it was not as good as the previous season.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the fasli was 21,631 against 21,630 in the previous fasli. The increase of one village in the Presidency was the result of a decrease of two villages in the West Godavari district, and an increase of one village in each of the districts of Guntur, Ramnad and Coimbatore. The decrease of two villages in the West Godavari district was due to the cancellation of the resumption of Lingaraopalem Agraharam of Ellore taluk and Kristnapuram Agraharam of Chintalapudi taluk and their consequent transfer to inam tenure. The increase of one village each in the Guntur and Ramnad districts was due to the bifurcation of the village of Addanki in Ongole taluk of the former district and the resumption of the inam village of Sarvanandal in Tiruvadanai taluk in the latter district. The formation of a new village by the name of the Anamalai Hills village in Pollachi taluk accounts for the increase in Coimbatore district.

4. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources :—

- (1) peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estate;
- (2) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (3) assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari tenure; and
- (4) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,90,583 against 49,91,532 in the previous fasli. The decrease is the result of—

6. The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or favourable tenure was Rs. 7,52,855 against Rs. 7,52,741 in the previous fasli. The increase of Rs. 114 is accounted for below :—

7. The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,880,556 acres and exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised) by 68,028 acres. There was an increase in all districts except East Godavari, West Godavari, Cuddapah, North Arcot, South Arcot, Madura, Ramnad and the Nilgiris where there was a decrease of 3,544, 994, 401, 727, 163, 272, 574 and 60 acres, respectively. The increase was marked in the districts of Malabar (29,469 acres), South Kanara (7,998 acres), Guntur (6,400 acres) and Anantapur (5,311 acres). The increase in Malabar was chiefly due to the introduction of resurvey areas in the taluks of Chirakkal, Kottayam, Ernad and Ponnani while that in the other districts was mainly due to assignments. The decrease in East Godavari was due to the shrinkage of Podu cultivation in Bhadrachalam taluk. The drop in West Godavari was due to the cancellation of the resumption of two Agraharam villages and their consequent transfer to inam tenure. The decrease in other districts was small and calls for no remarks.

8. The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 597-08 lakhs against Rs. 591-90 (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 5,18,273. There was an increase in all the districts except South Arcot and Ramnad where there was a decrease of Rs. 877 and Rs. 464, respectively. The increase was appreciable in the districts of Malabar (Rs. 4,28,074) and Tanjore (Rs. 48,472). The increase in Malabar was due to the introduction of resettlement rates of assessment in the taluks of Chirakkal, Kottayam, Ernad and Ponnani and in Tanjore to the resumption of ten Mohini inam villages in Tanjore taluk and their conversion to ryotwari. The variations in other districts do not call for any remarks.

9. The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20.83 million acres against 20.98 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 157,592 acres under dry and a net increase of 15,298 acres under wet. The decrease under dry was large in Bellary (83,290 acres), Madura (25,831 acres) and Anantapur (23,613 acres) and it was due to inadequate rainfall during the season of dry cultivation.

The total area cultivated during the year including that under 'Miscellaneous cultivation' was 21.81 million acres against 22.01 million acres in the previous fasli. There was an increase of 215,697 acres under 'waste charged.'

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 36.74 lakhs against Rs. 35.11 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 2,72,111 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rs. 1,09,223 in others resulting in a net increase of Rs. 1,62,888. The increase was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 66,323), Nellore (Rs. 63,232), Tinnevely (Rs. 33,527) and Anantapur (Rs. 28,697) while the decrease was appreciable in North Arcot (Rs. 67,892). The increase in Tanjore was due to the development of irrigation under Cauvery-Mettur Project and the increase in the other districts noted above was the result of the favourable seasonal conditions. The decrease in North Arcot was due to want of timely or sufficient rainfall during the cultivation season.

11. *Remissions and suspensions of revenue.*—There was a total remission of Rs. 61.86 lakhs during the fasli of which Rs. 28.14 lakhs related to season and other fixed remissions of fasli 1343 and Rs. 33.72 lakhs represented the remission of the suspended revenue of fasli 1342 collectable in fasli 1343. As compared with the previous year there was an increase of Rs. 1,32,198 under season and other fixed remissions. The increase was marked in North Arcot (Rs. 2,34,812) and Malabar (Rs. 1,34,543). The increase in North Arcot was due to the inadequate supply received in tanks. The increase in Malabar which was mostly under 'fixed remissions' was chiefly due to the remission allowed on account of the gradual introduction of resettlement rates of assessment :—

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head during the fasli was Rs. 13,73,334 against Rs. 10,61,876 in the previous year and there was thus a net increase of Rs. 3,11,458. The increase was very marked in North Arcot (Rs. 2,39,676) and was appreciable in Kistna (Rs. 1,49,334).

(a) *Waste remitted.*—Remission under this head amounted to Rs. 3.18 lakhs or Rs. 25,561 less than in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of Rs. 1,38,829 in some districts and an increase of Rs. 1,13,268 in others. The decrease was marked in the districts of Nellore (Rs. 41,468), Cuddapah (Rs. 26,314), Anantapur (Rs. 24,982) and Chittoor (Rs. 22,123). There was a marked increase in North Arcot (Rs. 48,485). A dry remission of Rs. 94 on an extent of 48 acres of sanded dry lands was granted in the Trichinopoly district under the

authority of G.O. Mis. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shahi and short crops*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 4,89,305 against Rs. 2,34,678 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 2,54,627. The increase was marked in Kistna (Rs. 1,44,971), North Arcot (Rs. 1,10,825), Chingleput (Rs. 49,358) and South Arcot (Rs. 33,772). In South Arcot an amount of Rs. 1,836 was remitted on an extent of 749 acres of dry lands in pursuance of the orders contained in G.Os. Nos. 434, Revenue, dated 1st March 1934, and 504, Revenue, dated 12th March 1934.

(c) *Tirucakammi remissions* (i.e., remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 3,75,115 against Rs. 4,23,053 in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 47,938. The decrease was appreciable in Nellore (Rs. 54,641) and Anantapur (Rs. 36,333). There was, however, a marked increase in North Arcot (Rs. 64,606) and it was due to the inadequate supply received in tanks.

(d) *Injury by floods*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,45,448 against Rs. 30,446 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 1,15,002. The increase was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 61,525) and East Godavari (Rupees 38,460) and was due to the damage caused by floods in the river Godavari.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 29,700 against Rs. 23,720 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 5,980. The increase was marked in North Arcot (Rs. 14,807).

(ii) Fixed remissions (i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 4.42 lakhs against Rs. 6.25 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 1,83,058. The decrease was due mostly to progressive reduction in the rate and amount of increment remission allowed in connexion with the introduction of new rates of assessment in East Godavari, West Godavari and Kistna districts.

(iii) *Beriz deduction*.—Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9.99 lakhs against Rs. 9.95 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 3,798.

(iv) *Suspensions*.—In their Order No. 2254, Revenue, dated 15th December 1933, the Government remitted $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the land revenue of fasli 1342 in ten districts and in portions of three districts of the Presidency, the collection of which was suspended in G.O. No. 476, Revenue, dated 13th May 1933, on account of the general economic depression.

In view of the continued fall in prices of agricultural products the Government in their Order No. 72, Press (Revenue), dated

10th January 1934, were pleased to suspend a portion of the land revenue due in fasli 1343. The amount suspended was $6\frac{1}{4}$ per cent of the assessment on dry lands in all the districts and $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the assessment on wet lands in areas in which resettlement rates were introduced in or after 1918–19 and $9\frac{3}{4}$ per cent of the assessment on wet lands in the other areas. The total amount involved in the above concessions was Rs. 61,61,947. The Government have since in G.O. No. 2506, Revenue, dated 4th December 1934, remitted the entire amount thus suspended.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 108.37 lakhs against Rs. 113.25 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 1,97,551 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 6,85,659 in others resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 4,88,108. The several items are dealt with below :—

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 23.57 lakhs against Rs. 23.51 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 5,332. The increase was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 4,902).

Item 2 (a)—Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.49 lakhs against Rs. 2.58 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 1,08,645. The decrease was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 63,478) and West Godavari (Rs. 53,682).

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 16.25 lakhs against Rs. 15.53 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 72,629. The increase was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 46,859) and East Godavari (Rs. 21,497).

Item 3—Charge for water in villages in estates including tirwajasti and fasljasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 29.56 lakhs against Rs. 30.00 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 43,924. The decrease was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 33,316) and East Godavari (Rs. 24,600).

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 3.24 lakhs against Rs. 3.37 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 12,396. The decrease was marked in Tinnevely (Rs. 36,882) and East Godavari (Rs. 10,302).

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.22 lakhs against Rs. 6.65 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 43,157. The decrease was appreciable in Kistna (Rs. 23,966) and Malabar (Rs. 15,078).

Item 6—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 3.59 lakhs against Rs. 3.95 lakhs in the previous fasli; the net

decrease being Rs. 35,857. The decrease was appreciable in South Arcot (Rs. 5,691) and Salem (Rs. 5,308).

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 1,73,407 were levied on an extent of 20,264 acres against Rs. 2,04,379 on an extent of 23,301 acres in the previous fasli showing an incidence of Rs. 9 per acre as in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were 70 in the Nilgiris, 62 in Nellore, 46 in Coimbatore and 30 in Chittoor, and these were due to prohibitive penalties levied for persistent encroachments on objectionable porambokes.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Malabar and Madras. The work of reclassification is reported to have been completed in almost all the other districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 79,524 acres of poramboke lands against 88,057 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Guntur (9,189 acres), Anantapur (8,508 acres), Kurnool (7,587 acres), Tanjore (7,577 acres), Bellary (7,523 acres) and Salem (5,932 acres).

In Ganjam an extent of 167 acres of porambokes the cultivation of which was unobjectionable was transferred to ayan. In Vizagapatam the provisions of Act III of 1905 were enforced in almost all cases of objectionable encroachment. In West Godavari single taram assessment only was charged in the case of the unobjectionable occupation of porambokes proposed for assignment to the encroachers. In Nellore porambokes were transferred to ayan in all cases in which circumstances warranted the transfer. In Bellary there are still some unobjectionable cases of occupation mostly by scheduled class members and others, pending transfer to ayan. In Kurnool an extent of 875 acres was transferred from poramboke to ayan. In Chingleput steps were taken to assign the land in all cases of unobjectionable occupation. In North Arcot proposals for the transfer of poramboke to ayan were sanctioned. In Tanjore an extent of 47 acres was transferred to assessed waste for purposes of assignment. In Trichinopoly an extent of 186 acres was so transferred.

Item 7—Revenue derived from taxed trees.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.83 lakhs against Rs. 3.72 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 11,198. The increase was noticeable in Tinnevely (Rs. 6,838) and South Arcot (Rs. 4,918).

Item 8—Commission from estates under Court of Wards.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 19,721 against Rs. 29,094 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 9,373. The decrease was marked in Ramnad (Rs. 11,876) which was due to the rendition of the Sivaganga Estate.

Item 9—Revenue from process service fees.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 15,180 against Rs. 18,142 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 2,962.

Item 10—Sale-proceeds of lands sold.—The income under this head was Rs. 1.26 lakhs against Rs. 4.46 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 3,19,829. The decrease was very marked in Madras (Rs. 2,37,399) and was mainly due to the credit to Government during the previous fasli, of the cost of lands transferred to the Madras and Southern Mahratta and South Indian Railway administrations.

Item 11—Rent of lankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 4.22 lakhs against Rs. 4.60 lakhs during the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 37,595. The decrease was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 27,278) and West Godavari (Rs. 13,300).

Item 12—Quit-rent and ground-rent.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2.53 lakhs against Rs. 2.48 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 4,778.

13. The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 714.05 lakhs against Rs. 713.44 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli. The details for the increase of Rs. 0.61 lakhs are given below :—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,85,64,896. A sum of Rs. 8,07,94,856 or 91.2 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 52,711 written off the accounts, while Rs. 62,63,756 or 7.1 per cent was suspended or postponed. Effective collection was therefore about 98 per cent. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 94.8 and that suspended or postponed was only 3.8. The land revenue concession for fasli 1343 has been dealt with in paragraph 11 (iv) above.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 46,59,167. A sum of Rupees 11,58,727 or 24.9 per cent was collected and a sum of Rs. 34,28,218 (including the suspended revenue of fasli 1342) or 73.6 per cent was written off the accounts. The percentage of collections in the previous fasli was 90.5 and that written off was 6.1.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 77,89,551 against Rs. 46,60,610 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by the Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1934, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1344 was Rs. 77,93,546. Up to the end of October 1934, a sum of Rs. 11,58,952 was collected and Rs. 18,851 written off the accounts. Sanction has since been accorded to write off a sum of Rs. 95 while proposals had been made to write off Rs. 3,648. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1934 was thus Rs. 66,12,000. Out of this amount a sum of Rs. 63,09,632 is covered by suspensions or postponement in the Presidency. Government have since remitted the amount suspended under G.O. No. 72, Press, dated 10th January 1934. Deducting this amount, the realizable balance on 1st November 1934 was Rs. 3,02,368.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and over-payments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between "Land revenue" and "Cesses" is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1343 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli, and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to local boards, the recovery of over-payments is being watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated the 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of the land revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head "22.

General Administration." The district administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 105.97 lakhs during fasli 1343. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 120.57 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 226.54 lakhs or 27.64 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected. It must however be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The land revenue department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of the Government. Moreover a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with the magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the amount shown above. The increase in charges is mainly due to the partial abolition of the emergency cut in the pay of the officers of the Indian Civil Service and its total abolition in the pay of the officers under the administrative control of the local Government. The increase in the village service charges is mainly due to the execution of works under "Petty Construction and Repairs" which had been postponed during the period of financial depression.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes of each kind issued during the year, as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis :—

There is an increase under all heads. This as pointed out by Collectors is due to the continuance of the economic depression and the low prices of food crops.

23. *Demand notices.*—The number of demand notices issued during the fasli is higher than those issued during the three previous faslis.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is also an increase in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with the previous faslis.

25. There is an increase of 2.78 in the percentage of the number of distraints and attachment of personal property arising from demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property also there is an increase in percentage over that of last fasli by 2.82.

The number of defaulters whose immovable properties were attached during the fasli was 88,944 against 36,621 in fasli 1342.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 283,277 defaulters whose properties were attached 49.40 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 47.46 per cent in the last fasli. The number of attachments during the fasli was largest in South Arcot (53,304) as in fasli 1342 (25,288).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose properties were sold was greater than in fasli 1342 by 3,411. There was an increase in the number of sales of personal property by 3,075 and of real property by 336. The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the Presidency is 10.22 against 13.70 in fasli 1342. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to the total number of holdings is 0.25 against 0.19 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1343 compared with those for the preceding three faslis :—

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 6,85,116 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 2,09,413. The amount realized was Rs. 2,47,725. The estimated value of land was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in the districts of Kistna, Chingleput and Madura. In Madura where the disparity is higher than in other districts, properties of the estimated value of Rs. 79,777 were brought to sale for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 3,572. The reasons as reported by the Board in B.P. Mis. No. 4333, dated 3rd December 1934, are that entire holdings had to be attached and fields sold in rotation to ensure the realization of the arrears in full. The Collectors of Kistna and Chingleput make no special mention of this point but the reasons are probably similar to those reported in B.P. Rt. No. 2337, dated 21st April 1927. The prices fetched for lands sold

to private individuals amounted on the average to $5\frac{1}{4}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $6\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1342 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 7,02,831 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 1,63,263. The sum realized was Rs. 1,50,619. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals is higher than in fasli 1342 being $5\frac{1}{4}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $6\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands against $4\frac{1}{3}$ and $5\frac{1}{6}$ times, respectively.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli was 13,275 acres under dry and 5,678 acres under wet against 9,107 and 3,799 acres, respectively, in fasli 1342. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 8,671 acres under dry and 2,186 acres under wet against 9,739 and 2,963 acres, respectively, in fasli 1342. The total area of the land sold is 29,810 acres against total holdings of 27,880,556 acres or one acre in every 935 acres.

28. *Process-serving establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by the special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 1,633,148 or 403,182 more than fasli 1342. The number of processes served by the special agency (43,828) was larger than the previous fasli by 4,950.

29. *Costs in civil suits.*—Rs. 32,981 was awarded to the Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 19,984 the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 52,965 of which Rs. 24,150 was collected, Rs. 4,821 written off the accounts and Rs. 56 recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 23,938 made up of the following items :—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue.*—Statement No. 14.—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 47,317 of which Rs. 19,297 were collected and Rs. 470 were remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 27,550. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of Ganjam, East Godavari, South Arcot, Tanjore, Ramnad and Tinnevely.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 2,370.47 acres of lands assessed at Rs. 3,640 were sold for Rs. 96,330. 19.45 acres of tank-bed lands assessed at Rs. 21 were sold for Rs. 350. 52.92 acres and 10,246 square yards of house-sites in towns assessed at Rs. 157 were sold for Rs. 41,572 under Standing Order No. 21; 224.26

acres of lands bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 1,863. 10.31 acres of lands which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 883. One acre of land for which the railways are not likely to have any further use was sold for Rs. 35 under Standing Order No. 91. One cawnie three grounds and 1,315 square feet of lands were sold in Madras for Rs. 7,145 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the City.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—There were 10 cases during the year under Standing Order No. 88 for subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in enfranchised inams in Trichinopoly district.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfer of revenue registry falls under the following main heads:—

- (i) Transfer made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars; and
- (ii) transfer effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.
- (i) Under the first head 374,119 applications were received during the fasli as against 389,681 in the previous fasli, the decrease being 15,562 or about 4 per cent. There was a general decrease except in a few districts where the increase was as noted below:—

The total number of applications of all kinds including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 675,323 of which 604,820 were disposed of during the fasli leaving a balance of 70,503 (or about 10.4 per cent of the total number) as against 93,693 (or about 11.7 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli 35,227 or about 5.8 per cent were rejected and 1,948 were transferred to deputy tahsildars for disposal. The causes of rejection were mainly defective title and failure to produce documentary evidence. The percentage of pendency was marked in the districts of Ganjam (24), South Arcot (18) and Guntur (16).

34. The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should generally be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years was complied with in all the districts.

35. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year amounted to Rs. 7.55 lakhs against Rs. 10.05 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in 8 districts and a decrease in 17 districts. The increase in Ganjam and Tanjore and the decrease in Vizagapatam, Guntur, Bellary, Anantapur, Salem, Coimbatore, Madras, Malabar and the Nilgiris were marked.

36. Including the uncollected balance outstanding at the close of the previous year, the amount repayable during the year on account of principal under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts was Rs. 20.43 lakhs. Of this amount Rs. 17.68 lakhs (or 86.5 per cent) were collected. A sum of Rs. 0.90 lakh was repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayment of which had not fallen due, while a sum of Rs. 5,879 was written off as irrecoverable.

37. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years, was Rs. 25,43,791, of which a sum of Rs. 22,33,184 or 88 per cent was collected during the year. Of this Rs. 18,392 and Rs. 34,884 were realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties, respectively, and a sum of Rs. 6,419 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 3,10,607.

38. The advances drawn by Collectors during the official year 1933-1934 under the head "Revenue survey advances—Collectors" amounted to Rs. 1,04,546 as detailed below against Rs. 1,19,830 in the previous year:—

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors as now revised, including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rupees

1,10,722 was adjusted during the year leaving a net debit balance of Rs. 2,53,127 under 'Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors.'

Under the head 'Cost of survey marks—Collectors' a sum of Rs. 88,628 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 8,603 to be realized. The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under 'Cost of survey marks—Survey officers' was Rs. 2,42,214. Fresh land-holders' bills for Rs. 1,35,417 were received from survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 3,77,631 a sum of Rs. 2,40,087 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 1,37,544. The major portion of the balance is outstanding in the district of Malabar where there is an arrear of Rs. 97,251. This amount includes a sum of Rs. 51,020 on account of instalment not due in the year. The actual balance for collection at the end of the year was Rs. 46,231 and this has since been reduced to Rs. 34,085.

39. No new enactment affecting the agricultural classes generally was passed during the fasli under report.

40. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well and the Tahsildars have generally exercised their powers judiciously. The ryots are aware of the rules and make timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigations of objections and the consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission deterrent penalties were imposed.

41. There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In their Order Ms. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, the Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed lands. In Nellore, Anantapur, Chingleput and Ramnad a few cases of unauthorized cultivation were repressed by penalization.

In Cuddapah, 317 acres of tank-bed land were cultivated and the revenue derived therefrom was Rs. 391. Enhanced assessment of Rs. 844 was also imposed for unauthorized occupation. In Kurnool, the members of scheduled classes were permitted to cultivate an extent of 97 acres of tank-bed lands. Cases of unauthorized occupation of tank-bed lands were dealt with by the imposition of deterrent penalties or by eviction. In Chittoor, an extent of 362 acres of tank-bed lands was cultivated and the revenue derived was Rs. 505. In Arantangi taluk, Tanjore district, an extent of about 11 acres of tank-bed lands was cultivated. In Tirumangalam taluk of Madura district, an extent of 58 acres of tank-bed lands was cultivated mostly by poor Kallars. In Coimbatore, there was tank-bed cultivation in six villages and no damage was caused to the tanks thereby.

42. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these accounts was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Such minor defects as were noticed were duly rectified.

The Collector of Ganjam has reported that the Revenue Divisional Officers, Ghumsur and Chicacole, would shortly take up the check of taluk accounts in their divisions. The report of the Revenue Divisional Officer, Anantapur, has yet to be received by the Collector.

In Bellary, the accounts of all the taluks except Bellary taluk were inspected. The Collector reports that the accounts of this taluk will be inspected shortly by the Revenue Divisional Officer. In Kurnool and Chingleput, the checking of village accounts was completed in all taluks before the close of the fasli and the inspection of taluk accounts will be attended to shortly by the Revenue Divisional Officers.

43. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris.

In South Kanara, the Sub-Collector, Coondapoor, has yet to inspect the registers of the taluk. In Malabar, the registers have yet to be received from the Settlement office in regard to Chirakkal, Kottayam, Ernad and Ponnani taluks in which resettlement was introduced in the fasli. The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of these registers up to and during fasli 1343 :—

44. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1934. It also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1935.

45. *Conferences with ryots.*—In Ganjam, informal conferences were held in November and December 1933 at seven places by the Executive Engineer for discussing matters relating to irrigation and the local Revenue officers also attended these conferences. Conferences with ryots were held during the jamabandi of Chicacole taluk at Chicacole and Narasannapeta where the Agricultural Demonstrator lectured on the improved methods of agriculture. In Vizagapatam, ryots' conferences were held by the Sub-Collector, Narsapatam, at Yellamanchili and Narsapatam, at which the Executive Engineer and the subordinate officers of the Revenue and Public Works Departments were present. The grievances of the ryots were heard and action was taken where necessary. In East Godavari, the settling officers held conferences with the ryots at the time of jamabandi and the officers of the Public Works Department did so at their convenience. In West Godavari, the Collector held informal conferences during the jamabandi of Tadepalligudem and Kovvur taluks and certain points of general importance were discussed then. In Guntur, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers during their tours and at the time of jamabandi enquired into the needs of the ryots and interviews were also freely granted. In Nellore, informal conferences were held at the time of jamabandi and matters relating to revenue and irrigation were discussed. In Cuddapah, all the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with the ryots during jamabandi. The Collector himself held two conferences, one at Badvel and the other at Proddattur at the close of the jamabandi of the two taluks. At these conferences subjects relating to irrigation, sanitation, water-supply, etc., were discussed. In Anantapur, the Executive Engineer, Bellary, accompanied by the Agricultural Demonstrator and the local Tahsildars held conferences of the ryots at Anantapur and Singanamala. In Bellary a ryots' conference was held by the Sub-Collector at Kudligi at which subjects relating to the cultivation of tank-beds, constitution of village panchayats, improvement of agriculture, roads and public health were discussed. Irrigation conferences were also held by the officers of the Public Works Department at Rayadrug, Hospet, Adoni and Siruguppa. In Kurnool, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences during the jamabandi of all the taluks. An exhibition of agricultural implements, seed grains, manures, etc., was also held in February 1934 at Ahobilam, a big festival centre. In Chingleput every opportunity was given at jamabandi and other times to the ryots to represent their grievances which were redressed as far as practicable. Irrigation conferences were held at the headquarters of the Revenue Divisions of the district at which the Executive Engineer, the Revenue Divisional Officer and the leading ryots took part. In Chittoor, conferences were held by the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officer, Chittoor, at the time of jamabandi while the Revenue Divisional

Officers, Madanapalle and Chendragiri, held them on other days at which the representations of the ryots were attended to. Irrigation conferences were also held at Madanapalle and Chendragiri at which the Executive Engineer was present. In North Arcot, conferences were generally held with the leading ryots immediately after the jamabandi when lectures were delivered on various subjects such as village sanitation, agriculture, co-operation, etc., and the ryots in general appreciated such conferences. In South Arcot, informal conferences were held at taluk headquarters by the Executive Engineer and the Revenue Divisional Officers concerned for discussing matters relating to irrigation. The Collector himself held conferences at Gingee and Chidambaram during jamabandi at which the leading ryots were present. Steps were taken to redress their grievances as far as possible. In Tanjore ryots' conferences were held in all the taluks except Tiruturaipundi, Pattukkottai and Arantangi. At these conferences, the officers of the Public Works Department, Agricultural Demonstrators and some leading ryots were present and questions relating chiefly to irrigation and drainage were discussed. In Trichinopoly, the Collector held a conference during jamabandi at the Kulittalai taluk office at which the officers of the Agricultural and Co-operative Departments were present. There was also an agricultural exhibition of different sorts of paddy, cotton, sugarcane and manure seeds. Similar conferences were held by Revenue Divisional Officers at Musiri, Perambalur and Jayankondasholapuram. An irrigation conference was also held by the Executive Engineer at Lalgudi, in November 1933. In Madura, the Executive Engineer, Periyar division, held irrigation conferences at Uttamapalayam (on 2nd February 1934), at Peranai (on 6th February 1934), at Andipatti (on 10th February 1934), at Chittampatti (on 20th February 1934) and at Melur (on 24th February 1934). The Collector was present at the conference at Melur. In Ramnad, the Collector held a conference at Srivilliputtur at the close of the jamabandi at which the Executive Engineer, Minor Irrigation Supervisor, Tahsildar, Agricultural Demonstrator and certain leading ryots were present. At this conference certain matters of general importance were discussed and the existing orders of the Government in all these matters and their policy in general were explained to the ryots assembled. In Salem, no regular conference was held but the representations of the ryots made at the time of jamabandi were heard and steps were taken to redress their grievances wherever they were found to be genuine. In South Kanara, the Collector held ryots' conferences at Puttur and Coondapoor during jamabandi. The Sub-Collector, Coondapoor, held two conferences at Udipi and Karkal after the jamabandi. At these conferences the only ryots that were present were the village officers and the public did not take special interest. The Collector of Malabar reports that the conditions in that district are not generally favourable to informal conferences and no efforts were made to organize them. The revenue officials have, however, kept in touch with the masses as much as possible during their tours.

46. *Extent to which the inspections of subordinate offices have been carried out by the Board, Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers.*—The reports received from the Collectors show that practically all the

subordinate offices were inspected by them and their Revenue Divisional Officers, only two offices and three sub-treasuries not being inspected. The Collectors' notes of inspection of the Revenue Divisional offices have generally been thorough and the Board has critically reviewed the Collectors' reports and added instructions and admonitions wherever necessary.

During the fasli under review, Members of the Board of Revenue inspected the offices of the Collectors of South Arcot, Tinnevely, Anantapur, Kurnool, Bellary, South Kanara, Cuddapah, East Godavari, Guntur, Kistna, Malabar, Nellore, Ramnad and West Godavari.

The administration of the districts continues to be on the whole efficient.

47. *Administration of religious and charitable service inams.*—Proper attention was bestowed by the Revenue Officers on the administration of religious and charitable service inams. In cases of alienation of these inams or the cessation of the prescribed services the inamdars were given every opportunity to redeem the inams alienated by them or to revive the prescribed services, and the inams were resumed wherever necessary. The principles laid down in Board's Standing Order No. 54-7 and 8 were adhered to in connexion with the re-assignment of the net assessment on the resumed inams. 2,813-50 acres of religious and 486-88 acres of charitable service inams bearing an assessment of Rs. 6,600-3-0 and Rs. 669-13-0, respectively, were resumed in the fasli. Net assessment of Rs. 5,707-4-0 and Rs. 763-8-0 were re-assigned to the working incumbents including the institutions concerned and credited to general revenues respectively in the case of resumed religious service inams and Rs. 212-11-0 and Rs. 457 were re-assigned to the working incumbents and credited to general revenues respectively in the case of resumed charitable service inams.

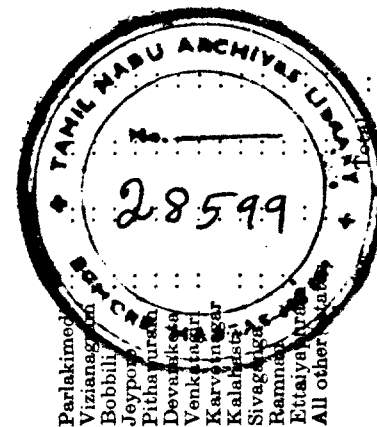

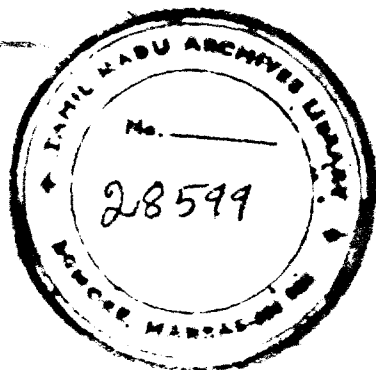
