The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1344 (1934–35) together with the prescribed statements.

The outstanding features of the fasli are—

- (i) The season was fairly satisfactory outside the Deccan—vide paragraph 2.
- (ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 33,681 acres from 27,880,554 acres in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 7.
- (iii) The total assessment on holdings showed an increase of Rs. 11,23,324 over Rs. 5,97,07,977, the total assessment of the previous fasli—vide paragraph 8.
- (iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings decreased by 674,149 acres—vide paragraph 9.
- (v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge increased by Rs. 1,41,207—vide paragraph 10.
- (vi) Season remissions increased by Rs. 18,02,532—vide paragraph 11 (i).
- (vii) The fixed remissions increased by Rs. 2,77,659—vide paragraph 11 (ii).
- (viii) The beriz deductions increased by Rs. 49,008—vide paragraph 11 (iii).
- (ix) The revenue suspended on account of the fall in the prices of agricultural products amounted to Rs. 55.45 lakhs—vide paragraph 11 (iv).
- (x) The amount of revenue remitted in this fasli was 111.05 lakhs—vide paragraph 11.
- (xi) The miscellaneous revenue increased by Rs. 2,38,948—vide paragraph 12.
- (xii) The effective percentage of collection was 98—vide paragraph 16.
- (xiii) There was a decrease in the number of land sales—vide paragraph 27.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon which appeared in Malabar on the 8th June declared itself about the middle of the month and the West Coast received heavy rains during the last three weeks of June and in the first and last weeks of July. The rainfall in June was bordering on or above the normal in Ganjam (Plains), Vizagapatam (Agency), Kurnool, Cuddapah, the Carnatic, the Central districts (Coimbatore excepted) and Ramnad. Conditions were unsettled off the Circars Coast between the 23rd and 26th of July and again on the last three days of the month. During the last week of July the monsoon was on the whole strong in the Peninsula and good rains were received in all the districts of the Presidency except Salem, Coimbatore, Trichinopoly, Tanjore and Madura. As a result of the heavy rains there were floods in the Budameru in the Kistna district. The monsoon strengthened in August and conditions were unsettled off the Orissa-Ganjam Coast on the 14th morning. During the course of that day the unsettled conditions developed into a depression which

passed inland causing good rains over the Peninsula up to the 19th. The rainfall in August was below the normal except in the Circars (Kistna and Guntur excepted) and in Chingleput. The Godavari was in high floods in August and the crops in river-side villages of the districts of East Godavari and West Godavari were to some extent affected by the floods. The monsoon was generally weak in September and the rainfall below the normal. On the whole, the south-west monsoon was bordering on or above the average only in Ganjam, Vizagapatam, East Godavari and Chingleput and below the normal in the rest of the Presidency especially in Bellary, Anantapur, Salem, Coimbatore, Trichinopoly and the South.

Conditions characteristic of the north-east monsoon set in in the south of the Bay of Bengal by the 20th October and extended to the southern districts between the 22nd and 25th although there had been scattered thunder showers in the south of the Peninsula between the 3rd and the 13th causing fairly good rains. Conditions were unsettled off the Malabar coast after the 29th causing widespread and heavy rainfall throughout the Presidency. The rainfall in October was generally above the normal in all the districts outside the Circars (Guntur and Vizagapatam Agency excepted), the Deccan and South Kanara. A depression formed in the south of the Bay of Bengal on the 25th November and intensified into a storm on the 26th. Moving in a west-north-westerly direction it crossed the coast near Negapatam on the 27th causing rainfall in the south of the Peninsula during the last week of the month. On the whole the rainfall in November was below the average except in Ganjam (Agency), Vizagapatam, East Godavari (Agency), Kurnool, Bellary and Trichinopoly. The monsoon weakened further in December and the rainfall in the month was deficient. The north-east monsoon was on the whole generally below the normal outside Vizagapatam (Agency), East Godavari (Agency), Guntur, South Arcot and the Central districts. In January there was slight increase above the average in a few districts but there was practically no change in the situation.

February was practically without rain. In March there were slight thunder showers. There were local thunder storms in April. Thunder showers also occurred in the latter half of May and the rainfall in the month was below normal. On the whole the hot weather rains were above normal in Kurnool and Anantapur, normal in Tinnevely and below normal in the rest of the Presidency.

Sowings of the early crops were generally satisfactory or above normal except in the Deccan, the central districts and the south. The condition of the standing crops was generally satisfactory except in parts of the districts of Bellary and Anantapur, Kurnool, Cuddapah and Chittoor where the crops were affected by drought.

Sowings of the late crops were generally satisfactory or above normal except in the Deccan, where the sowings of the late wet crops were slightly below normal. The condition of the late crops was generally fair except in parts of Bellary, Anantapur, North Arcot, Coimbatore, Ramnad, Tinnevely, Malabar, Kurnool, Cuddapah and Chittoor where they were adversely affected for want of rain.

The season for the Presidency as a whole was fairly satisfactory outside the Deccan. Relief operations under the Famine Code were started in parts of Bellary and Anantapur districts. Grazing concessions in these districts and in parts of Chittoor were given by throwing open panchayat forests for free grazing or grazing at concessional rates and the panchayats concerned were compensated by the grant of remission of rent amounting to Rs. 6,428.

3. The total number of ryotwari villages in the Presidency increased by 171 being 21,802 in the fasli against 21,631 in the previous fasli. The details for the increase are as shown below:—

- (1) Increase of 155 villages in East Godavari district, due to the introduction of ryotwari settlement in the rented villages of Yellavaram and Nugur taluks.
- (2) Increase of one village in Nellore district, due to the resumption of the whole inam village of Nakkalakalva Khandriga in the Gudur taluk.
- (3) Increase of 12 villages in the Tanjore district due to the substitution of beriz deductions for assignments of land revenue for the payment to certain religious institutions of what are locally known as 'mohini' allowances and to the resumption of two whole inam villages (Shemmangudi and Tennanjeri) in the Tanjore taluk.
- (4) Increase of one village in the Trichinopoly district due to the bifurcation of Mahadanapuram village in Kulittalai taluk.
- (5) Increase of two villages in Salem district due to the bifurcation of three villages of the Omalur taluk and to the exclusion of one village of the Dharmapuri taluk entirely under submerision.

4. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources:—

- (1) peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates;
- (2) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (3) assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari tenure; and
- (4) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,89,907 against Rs. 49,90,583 in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 676 is the result of—

7. The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,914,235 acres and exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised) by 33,681 acres. There was an increase in all the districts except North Arcot, South Arcot, Nellore, Ramnad, Tanjore, Cuddapah, Madura and the Nilgiris where there was a decrease of 5,479, 3,869, 789, 706, 386, 328, 256 and 183 acres, respectively. The increase was marked in the districts of East Godavari (13,282 acres), South Kanara (6,108 acres), Anantapur (4,792 acres) and Guntur (3,075 acres). The increase in East Godavari was due to the introduction of settlement in some villages of Yellavaram and Nugur taluks. In South Kanara, it was the result of the resettlement introduced in the fasli. The increase in Anantapur and Guntur was chiefly due to assignments of lands. The decrease in North Arcot and in the other districts referred to above was due to the relinquishment of land during the fasli, the purchase by the Government of lands sold for arrears of land revenue and the resumption of lands granted to members of the scheduled classes on account of breaches of conditions.

8. The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 608.31 lakhs against Rs. 597.08 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 11,23,324. There was an increase in all the districts except South Arcot, North Arcot, Cuddapah, Ramnad, Bellary, the Nilgiris and Madura, where there was a decrease of Rs. 5,120, Rs. 4,426, Rs. 1,270, Rs. 616, Rs. 572, Rs. 483 and Rs. 215, respectively. The increase was

appreciable in the districts of Tanjore (Rs. 5,40,354), South Kanara (Rs. 3,25,349) and Salem (Rs. 1,96,370). The increase in Tanjore was due to the revision of assessment made as the result of the reclassification of irrigation sources while in South Kanara and Salem it was due to the introduction of the resettlement rates of assessment. The variations in the other districts do not call for any special remarks.

9. The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20.16 million acres against 20.83 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 600,724 acres under dry and 73,425 acres under wet. The decrease was large in Anantapur (184,315 acres), Coimbatore (85,842 acres) and Bellary (66,872 acres) and this was due to insufficient rainfall during the cultivation season.

The total area cultivated during the year including the area under 'Miscellaneous cultivation' was 20.98 million acres against 21.81 million acres in the previous fasli. There was an increase of 392,685 acres under waste charged.

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 38.15 lakhs against 36.74 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 6,18,825 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rs. 4,77,6,18 in others resulting in a net increase of Rs. 1,41,207. The increase was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 4,11,873), East Godavari (Rs. 1,03,595) and Trichinopoly (Rs. 82,817), while the decrease was appreciable in Anantapur (Rs. 75,630), Nellore (Rs. 74,349), Tinnevely (Rs. 63,494), South Arcot (Rs. 59,253) and Chingleput (Rs. 45,930). The large increase in Tanjore was due to the introduction of the Tanjore District Cauvery Water-cess Rules in the existing delta and to the development of irrigation in the Cauvery-Mettur Project area. The increase in East Godavari was the result of favourable seasonal conditions. In Trichinopoly the increase was chiefly due to enhanced rates of water-cess ordered in G.Os. Nos. 521, Revenue, dated 13th March 1934 and 736, Revenue, dated 12th April 1934, and to the levy of second-crop charge on single crop wet lands under the Cauvery channels ordered in G.O. No. 2030, Revenue, dated 9th October 1934.

11. *Remissions and suspensions of revenue.*—There was a total remission of Rs. 111.05 lakhs during the fasli of which Rs. 49.43 lakhs related to season and other fixed remissions of fasli 1344 and Rs. 61.62 lakhs represented the remission of the suspended revenue of fasli 1343 collectable in fasli 1344. As compared with the previous year there was an increase of Rs. 21,29,199 under season and other fixed remissions. The increase was marked in Anantapur (Rs. 7,95,898), Bellary (Rs. 5,46,424), Tinnevely (Rs. 2,67,962), South Kanara (Rs. 2,51,810), Madura (Rs. 1,89,144), Salem (Rs. 1,83,561), Nellore (Rs. 1,16,695) and Cuddapah (Rs. 1,13,204). The increase in Anantapur and Bellary was due to the bad state of the season and the grant of remissions both on dry and wet lands. The increase in Tinnevely was due to the insufficiency of rain during the north-east monsoon. The increase in South Kanara which was mostly under 'fixed remissions'

was chiefly due to the remission allowed on account of the gradual introduction of resettlement rates of assessment. The increase in Madura, Salem and Nellore was the result of bad seasonal conditions.

(i) *Seasonal remissions*.—The amount remitted under this head during the fasli was Rs. 31,75,866 against Rs. 13,73,334 in the previous year and there was thus a net increase of Rs. 18,02,532. The increase was very marked in Anantapur (Rs. 7,99,620) and Bellary (Rs. 5,52,018) and was appreciable in Tinnevely (Rs. 2,69,013), Madura (Rs. 1,89,973) and Cuddapah (Rs. 1,14,415).

(a) *Waste remitted*.—Remission under this head amounted to Rs. 6.98 lakhs or Rs. 3,79,245 more than in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 4,36,343 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 57,098 in others. The increase was marked in Anantapur (Rs. 1,85,896), Tinnevely (Rs. 70,725), Madura (Rs. 43,895) and Bellary (Rs. 28,398). There was a marked decrease in North Arcot (Rs. 32,600). Dry remissions of Rs. 54,278 on an extent of 209,759 acres in Anantapur, of Rs. 6,702 on an extent of 33,376 acres in Bellary, of Rs. 2,334 on an extent of 4,181 acres in Kurnool, of Rs. 1,319 on an extent of 7,026 acres in Cuddapah and of Rs. 56 on an extent of 32 acres in Trichinopoly were also granted during the fasli. These dry remissions were granted under the authority of G.Os. Nos. 94, dated 12th January 1935 and 244, dated 31st January 1935, in the case of Anantapur district, of G.O. No. 384, Revenue, dated 11th February 1935 in the case of Bellary district, of G.O. No. 245, Revenue, dated 31st January 1935 in the case of Kurnool district and of G.O. No. 246, dated 31st January 1935 in the case of Cuddapah district, while the remission in Trichinopoly district related to sanded dry lands and was granted under the authority of G.O. Ms. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 16,14,011 against Rs. 4,89,305 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 11,24,706. The increase was marked in Bellary (Rs. 5,14,890), Anantapur (Rs. 4,50,764), Kurnool (Rs. 81,458) and Cuddapah (Rs. 67,275). In the case of Bellary, Anantapur and Kurnool, the grant of dry remissions in pursuance of the orders quoted in the preceding clause mainly contributed to the increase.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions* (i.e., remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 7,54,579 against Rs. 3,75,115 in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 3,79,464. The increase was appreciable in Anantapur (Rs. 1,59,977) and Tinnevely (Rs. 76,107).

(d) *Injury by floods*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 44,501 against Rs. 1,45,448 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,00,947. The decrease was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 61,627) and East Godavari (Rs. 17,890). The large amount of remission granted during fasli 1343 was due to the extensive damage caused by floods in the river Godavari.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 55,335 against Rs. 29,700 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 25,635. The increase was marked in Madura Rs. 16,283.

(ii) *Fixed remissions* (i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with the season).—These remissions amounted to Rs. 7.19 lakhs against Rs. 4.42 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 2,77,659. The increase was marked in South Kanara (Rs. 2,51,568) and it was due to the increment remission allowed at the gradual introduction of the resettlement rates.

(iii) *Beriz deductions*.—Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 10.48 lakhs against Rs. 9.99 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 49,008. The increase was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 55,544) and it was due to the disbursement in fasli 1344 of the beriz deduction granted to the Tanjore Palace devasthanam for faslis 1343 and 1344 consequent on the change in the method of payment of what are locally known as 'mohini' allowances to certain religious institutions.

(iv) *Suspensions*.—Owing to the continuance of the low level of prices of the agricultural products, the Government in their Order No. 68, Revenue, dated 10th January 1935, were pleased to suspend a portion of the land revenue due in the fasli. The amount suspended was one anna in the rupee of the assessment on all dry lands, two annas in the rupee of the assessment on lands registered as garden in Malabar and South Kanara districts, one and three quarter annas in the rupee of the assessment on wet lands in areas which were resettled in or after 1918-19 and one and a quarter anna in the rupee of the assessment on wet lands in the other areas of the presidency. The total amount involved in the above concessions was, Rs. 55.45 lakhs. The Government have since, in their Order No. 1866, Revenue, dated 9th August 1935, remitted the entire amount thus suspended.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 110.76 lakhs against Rs. 108.37 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 6,18,715 in some districts, and a decrease of Rs. 3,79,767 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,38,948. The several items are dealt with below:—

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 22.70 lakhs against Rs. 23.57 lakhs, the net decrease being Rs. 86,362. The decrease was marked in the

Anantapur and Bellary districts, being Rs. 47,076 and Rs. 30,236, respectively. This is due to remissions on account of bad season.

Item 2 (a)—Second crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.74 lakhs against Rs. 1.49 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 25,029. The increase was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 21,274).

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 17.06 lakhs against Rs. 16.25 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 80,741. The increase was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 67,749).

Item 3—Charge for water in villages in estates including tirwajasti and fasljasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 33.77 lakhs against Rs. 29.56 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 4,20,554. The increase was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 2,33,201) and it was due to the development of irrigation in the Cauvery-Mettur Project area and to the introduction of the Tanjore district Cauvery Water-Cess Rules in the existing delta.

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 3.75 lakhs against Rs. 3.25 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 50,270. The increase was marked in South Arcot (Rs. 12,562) and North Arcot (Rs. 12,147) and it was due to the strict enforcement of the rules in regard to the levy of enhanced water-cess in respect of irrigation of dry lands from Government sources without obtaining permits.

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 5.48 lakhs against Rs. 6.22 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 73,564. The decrease was appreciable in Anantapur (Rs. 58,808) and it was due to the grant of remission on sivayijama lands owing to famine conditions in the district, during the fasli under report.

Item 6—Charges levied for the occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 3.52 lakhs against Rs. 3.59 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 6,793. The decrease was appreciable in Anantapur (Rs. 5,068).

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 1,57,722 were levied on an extent of 20,211 acres against Rs. 1,73,407 on an extent of Rs. 20,264 acres in the previous fasli showing an incidence of Rs. 8 per acre as against Rs. 9 per acre in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were Rs. 61 in Nellore, Rs. 48 in Coimbatore and Rs. 32 in Chingleput and these were due to prohibitive penalties levied for persistent encroachments on objectionable porambokes.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Malabar and Madras. The work of reclassification is reported to have been completed in almost all the other districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 90,717 acres of poramboke lands against 79,524 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Anantapur (20,971 acres), Kurnool (8,151 acres), Bellary (8,678 acres), Guntur (8,525 acres), Tanjore (7,293 acres), Salem (6,401 acres) and Ganjam (5,592 acres).

In Ganjam the work of reclassification of porambokes, so far as it related to the transfer of hillock and swamp porambokes to unassessed lands, was completed and that of unobjectionable porambokes to ayan is being done piecemeal. In Vizagapatam, the provisions of Act III of 1905 were enforced in almost all cases of objectionable encroachments. In West Godavari, single taram assessment only was charged in the case of unobjectionable occupations of porambokes. In Nellore, poramboke lands were transferred to ayan wherever circumstances warranted such transfer. In Bellary, there are still some unobjectionable cases of occupation mostly by the members of the scheduled classes pending subdivision and transfer to ayan. In Kurnool and Chingleput, steps were taken to transfer to ayan and to assign all poramboke lands, the occupation of which was found unobjectionable. In North Arcot proposals for the transfer of poramboke to ayan were being received and sanctioned. In Tanjore, an extent of 18 acres was transferred to assessed waste for purposes of assignment. In Trichinopoly an extent of 120 acres was so transferred.

Item 7—Revenue derived from tared trees.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.63 lakhs against Rs. 3.83 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 20,190. The decrease was noticeable in South Arcot (Rs. 9,219) and Tinnevely (Rs. 7,683).

Item 8—Commission from estates under Court of Wards.—The revenue derived from this head was Rs. 21,410 against Rs. 19,721 in the previous fasli; the net increase being Rs. 1,689. The increase was marked in Vizagapatam (Rs. 2,410).

Item 9—Revenue from process service fees.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 15,847 against Rs. 15,180; the net increase being Rs. 667.

Item 10—Sale-proceeds of lands sold.—The income under this head was Rs. 1.65 lakhs against Rs. 1.26 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 39,207. The increase was marked in South Kanara (Rs. 32,704).

Item 11—Rent of lankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.71 lakhs against 4.22 lakhs during the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 51,390. The decrease was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 27,665).

Item 12—*Quit-rent and ground-rent*.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2.54 lakhs against Rs. 2.53 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 1,347.

13. The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 707.79 lakhs against Rs. 714.05 lakhs in the previous fasli. The details for the decrease of Rs. 6.26 lakhs are given below:—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current)*.—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,81,66,225. A sum of Rs. 8,04,60,555 or 91.3 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 15,829 written off the accounts, while Rs. 56,69,041 or 6.40 per cent was suspended or postponed. Effective collection was therefore about 98 per cent. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 91.2 per cent and that suspended or postponed was 7.1 per cent. The land revenue concessions for fasli 1344 have been dealt with in paragraph 11 (iv) above.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears*.—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 77,96,548. A sum of Rs. 13,92,539 or 19 per cent was collected and a sum of Rs. 62,74,846 (including the suspended revenue of fasli 1343) or 80.5 per cent was written off the accounts. The percentage of collection in the previous fasli was 24.9 and that written off was 73.6.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 78,19,004 against Rs. 77,89,551 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by the Collectors in their demand collection and balance statements for October 1935, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1345 was Rs. 77,45,617. Up to the end of October 1935 a sum of Rs. 10,72,708 was collected and Rs. 56,06,121 written off the accounts. Sanction has since been accorded to write off a sum of Rs. 54, while proposals have been made to write off Rs. 3,684. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1935 was thus Rs. 10,63,050. Out of this amount a sum of Rs. 1,47,415 is covered by suspensions or postponement in the Presidency. Deducting this amount, the realizable balance on 1st November 1935 was Rs. 9,15,635.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and over-payments*.—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli*.—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between "Land revenue and cesses" is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1344 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli, and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to local boards, the recovery of over-payments is being watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated the 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue*.—The charges in the land revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head "22. General Administration." The district administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 108.15 lakhs during fasli 1344. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 120.54 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 228.69 lakhs or 27.94 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected. It must however be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The land revenue department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of the Government. Moreover a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with the magisterial work. While the actual cost of

collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the amount shown above. The increase in charges was mainly due to the inspection of the Laccadive and Amin Divi islands, the extra expenditure incurred in connexion with the conduct of elections to the Legislative Assembly and the enhanced postal rates on 'book posts.'

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes issued during the fasli under report as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis.

23. *Demand notices.*—The number of demand notices issued during the fasli is higher than those issued during the three previous faslis.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is however a decrease in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with the previous faslis.

25. There is a decrease of 6.09 in the percentage of the number of distraints and attachment of personal property arising from demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property also, there is a decrease of 1.72 per cent as compared with the last fasli.

The number of defaulters whose immovable properties were attached during the fasli was 64,231 against 88,944 in fasli 1343.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 1,68,764 defaulters whose properties were attached, 42.92 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 49.40 per cent in the last fasli. The number of notices of sale issued during the fasli was largest in South Arcot (33,790), as in fasli 1343 (53,304).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose properties were sold was less than in fasli 1343 by 1,241. There was a decrease in the number of sales of personal property by 1,751, but an increase in the number of sales of real property by 510. The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the presidency is 13.92 against 10.22 in fasli 1343. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to

the total number of holdings is 0.23 against 0.25 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1344 compared with those for the preceding three faslis:—

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 3,30,131 were sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 1,91,037. The amount realized was Rs. 2,02,343. The estimated value of the land sold was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in the districts of Kistna, Chingleput and Madura as in last fasli. The Collectors of these districts make no special mention of this point, but the reasons are probably similar to those reported in B.P. Rt. No. 2337, dated 21st April 1927. The prices fetched for lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to four and one-seventh times the assessment in the case of dry lands and seven and one-fifth times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1343, immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 6,85,116 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 2,09,413 and the amount realized was Rs. 2,47,725. The average price fetched for dry lands sold to private individuals is less than in fasli 1343, being four and one-seventh times the assessment against five and one-fourth times but in the case of wet lands, the average price fetched is higher than in fasli 1343 being seven and one-fifth times the assessment against six and a half times.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli, was 13,939 acres under dry and 3,976 acres under wet against 13,275 and 5,678 acres respectively in fasli 1343. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 9,767 acres under dry and 1,547 acres under wet against 8,671 and 2,186 acres respectively in fasli 1343. The total area of land sold is 29,229 acres against the total holdings of 27,914,235 acres or one acre in every 955 acres.

28. *Process-serving establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by the special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 2,142,545 or 509,397 more than in fasli 1343. The number of processes served by the special agency (52,061) was larger than in the previous fasli by 8,233.

29. *Costs in civil suits.*—Rs. 29,500 was awarded to the Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 24,002, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 53,502, of which Rs. 28,018 was collected, Rs. 1,478 written off the accounts, and Rs. 375 recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 23,631 made up of the following items:—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue*—Statement No. 14.—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 55,306 of which Rs. 23,741 were collected and Rs. 512 were remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 31,053. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of East Godavari, Chittoor, South Arcot, Tanjore, Ramnad and Tinnevely.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 1,830.21 acres assessed at Rs. 3,266 were sold for Rs. 1,04,270. 12.87 acres of tank-bed lands assessed at Rs. 17 were sold for Rs. 318. 90.28 acres of house-sites assessed at Rs. 324 were sold for Rs. 67,725 under Standing Order No. 21. Eighty-two cents of lands assessed at Rs. 5 were sold for Rs. 820 under Standing Order No. 22. 514.32 acres of lands bought in by Government at sales for arrears of land revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 3,112. 7.57 acres of lands which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 9,515. 1.38 acres of land for which the railways are not likely to have any further use was sold for Rs. 135 under Standing Order No. 91. 2.52 acres of lands escheated to Government under Standing Order No. 197 assessed at Rs. 2 were sold for Rs. 14. Sixteen grounds and 1,087 square feet of lands were sold in the Madras City for Rs. 1,523 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the City.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—There were two cases during the year as against ten cases during the last year under Standing Order No. 58 for the subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in enfranchised inams.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfer of revenue registry falls under the following main heads:—

- (i) transfer made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars; and
 - (ii) transfer effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.
- (1) Under the first head 389,530 applications were received during the fasli as against 374,119 in the previous fasli, the

increase being 15,411 or about 4 per cent. There was a general increase except in a few districts where the decrease was as noted below:—

The total number of applications of all kinds including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 706,860 of which 636,920 were disposed of during the fasli leaving a balance of 69,940 (or about 9.9 per cent of the total number) as against 70,503 (or about 10.4 per cent of the total number, in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli, 30,463 or about 4.8 per cent were rejected and 1,966 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The causes of rejection were mainly defective title or failure to produce documentary evidence. The percentage of pendency was marked in the districts of Anantapur (21), South Arcot (20), Ganjam (17) and Nellore (16).

34. The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that generally the Collector should himself conduct the settlement of each taluk once in five years was complied with in all the districts except Ganjam, Chittoor and Tanjore. In Ganjam two ryotwari villages and two estate water-rate villages of the Parlakimedi taluk which were due for Collector's jamabandi during the fasli had to be settled by the Revenue Divisional Officer, Chicacole, as the Collector was unable to conduct it himself, being engaged in the work connected with the formation of the 'New Orissa Province.' In Chittoor, the Collector could not conduct the jamabandi of the Chittoor taluk, due for his settlement during the fasli, as he had to be in touch with the conditions of the Madanapalle taluk which was affected by famine. So with the Board's permission he conducted the jamabandi of the Madanapalle taluk and left the Chittoor taluk to be settled by the Revenue Divisional Officer, Chittoor. In Tanjore the Collector had to settle Papanasam and Tanjore taluks during the fasli. In their Order No. 296, Revenue, dated 4th February 1935 the Government however permitted the Collector to conduct the jamabandi of the Tanjore taluk alone, in view of the increase in work owing to the introduction of irrigation under the Cauvery-Mettur Project. Hence Papanasam taluk was settled by the Revenue Divisional Officer.

35. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year

amounted to Rs. 9.19 lakhs against Rs. 7.55 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in nine districts and a decrease in sixteen districts. The increase is marked in the districts of Bellary and Anantapur where alone there has been an increase of 2.19 lakhs over the advances made during the previous year and it has mainly contributed to the net increase.

36. Including the uncollected balances outstanding at the close of the previous year, the amount repayable during the year on account of principal under both the Acts was Rs. 17.43 lakhs. Of this amount, a sum of Rs. 15.16 lakhs (or 87 per cent) was collected. A sum of Rs. 0.97 lakh was repaid by the borrowers on account of loans, the repayment of which had not yet fallen due, while a sum of Rs. 5,892 was written off as irrecoverable.

37. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years, was Rs. 21,62,199 of which a sum of Rs. 19,04,200 or 88 per cent was collected during the year. Of this, Rs. 21,136 and Rs. 38,053 were realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties respectively and a sum of Rs. 6,851 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 2,57,999.

38. The advances drawn by Collectors during the official year 1934-35 under the head "Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors" amounted to Rs. 1,11,553 as detailed below against Rs. 1,04,546 in the previous year:—

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors (now revised) including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rs. 1,11,331 was adjusted during the year leaving a net debit balance of Rs. 2,53,464 under "Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors."

Under the head "Cost of Survey marks—Collectors" a sum of Rs. 91,890 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 7,276 to be realized.

The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under "Cost of Survey marks—Survey Officers" was Rs. 1,37,544. Fresh landholders' bills for Rs. 1,70,114 were received from Survey officers

during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 3,07,658 a sum of Rs. 1,43,859 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 1,63,799. The major portion of the amount is outstanding in the district of Malabar where there is an arrear of Rs. 92,994. This amount includes a sum of Rs. 9,381 on account of instalment not due in the year. The actual balance for collection at the end of the year was Rs. 83,613 and this has since been reduced to Rs. 66,935.

39. The following new Acts passed by the Madras Legislative Council came into operation in this fasli:—

(1) The Madras Estates Land (Amendment) Act, 1934.

(2) The Madras Co-operative Land Mortgage Banks Act, 1934.

It is too soon to gauge the effects of this legislation on the ryot population.

40. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well and the tahsildars have generally exercised their powers judiciously. The ryots were aware of the rules and made timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and the consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission deterrent penalties were imposed.

41. There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In their Order Mis. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, the Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed lands. In Cuddappah 479 acres of tank-bed land were cultivated during the fasli and the revenue derived therefrom was Rs. 947. Cultivation in some of the tank beds was permitted as a special case in Pulivendla and Rayachoti taluks in view of the bad seasonal conditions. Cultivation of tank-bed lands with fodder crops was freely resorted to in Anantapur by the ryots on account of the unfavourable seasonal conditions. In cases where the cultivation in tank beds was monopolized, penalties were levied. In Bellary, permission was granted for tank-bed cultivation in the case of all minor irrigation tanks in all the taluks except Adoni. In Kurnool an extent of about 27 acres in Dhona taluk and 95 acres in Koilkuntla taluk were cultivated during the year with the Collector's previous permission. In Chittoor an extent of 749 acres of tank-bed lands was cultivated during the fasli and the revenue derived therefrom was Rs. 999. In North Arcot there were a few cases of cultivation of tank beds and in the case of cultivation with melons with permission the highest dry rate only was charged; in objectionable cases, however, penalty was levied. In Tanjore an extent of 2 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated in Arantangi taluk. In Trichinopoly an extent of 21 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated with cucumber without permission in Perambalur taluk alone. In Madura owing to the failure of crops during the year the Collector permitted the ryots to have cucumber cultivation in some of the villages in Palni and Tirumangalam taluks. In Ramnad an extent of about 89 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated with cucumber with

Collector's permission and the highest dry rate was charged. The condition of the tanks concerned was not adversely affected by the cultivation. In Coimbatore an extent of 280 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated in the taluks of Coimbatore, Erode, Kollegal and Palladam and the assessment realized thereon amounted to Rs. 431.

42. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these registers was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. The Collector of Ganjam reported in October that the Revenue Divisional Officers, Ghumsur, Chatrapur and Berhampur would shortly take up the check of taluk accounts in their divisions. In Kurnool the Revenue Divisional Officers were attending to the check of taluk accounts. In Chingleput the Collector expected that the Revenue Divisional Officers would complete the inspection of taluk accounts shortly.

43. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris.

In South Kanara the Revenue Divisional Officer, Puttur, had yet to inspect the registers in two taluks in his division. The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of these registers up to and during fasli 1344:—

(a) The registers were not maintained in the case of two villages of Sriperumbudur taluk. The Collector has directed the Tahsildar to have the registers written up and checked at once.

(b) Statistical registers have not been prescribed for the remaining three hill villages of Tirupattur taluk under the control of the Forest department.

(c) The registers were not written up and checked in the case of 146 villages of Tirumangalam taluk. The Tahsildar has been directed to attend to the work at once.

(d) The registers of the remaining villages were sent to the Settlement department for reference.

44. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1935. It also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1936.

45. *Conferences with ryots.*—In Ganjam informal conferences were held by the Executive Engineer in one or two centres to discuss matters relating to irrigation and the local Revenue officers generally attended these conferences. It is reported that the ryots did not turn up in large numbers as they had no serious grievances to complain of. In Vizagapatam, ryots' conferences were held by the Sub-Collector, Narasapatam, at Yellamanchili and Narasapatam. The grievances of the ryots were heard and action was taken where necessary. In East Godavari, the settling officers held conferences with the ryots at the time of jamabandi and the officers of the Public Works Department did so at their convenience. In West Godavari the Collector held an informal conference of the ryots of the Bhimavaram taluk on 2nd March 1935. The Subdivisional Officer, Tanuku, the Tahsildar, Bhimavaram, the Agricultural Demonstrator and 25 ryots attended the conference and discussed certain points of general importance. In Kistna, the officers of the Public Works Department held a conference with the ryots and discussed matters of interest relating to irrigation. In Guntur, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers enquired into the needs of the ryots during their tours and at the time of jamabandi and also granted them interviews freely. In Nellore, jamabandi officers and Executive Engineers held informal conferences with the ryots and heard their grievances in regard to matters relating to irrigation. In Cuddapah, all the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with the ryots. The Collector himself held two conferences one at Pulivendla and the other at Rajampet, at which subjects relating to irrigation, sanitation, communications, water-supply, etc., were discussed. In Anantapur, the Executive Engineer, Bellary, and the Tahsildar held an informal conference at Gooty. In Bellary, the Sub-Collector, Hospet, held a conference at Harpanahalli during jamabandi at which subjects connected with improvement of agriculture, public health, etc., were discussed. The Executive Engineer, Bellary, along with the concerned Revenue Divisional Officers held irrigation conferences at Adoni and Siruguppa and heard the representations of the ryots. In Kurnool, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with the ryots at jamabandi. The local officers of the Agricultural, Co-operative and Veterinary departments attended the conferences and matters concerning improved methods of cultivation, treatment of animals and the facilities afforded by the Co-operative Department for the purchase of agricultural implements, etc., were explained to the ryots. In Chingleput, every opportunity was given to the ryots at jamabandi and at other times to represent their grievances which were as far as practicable redressed. An irrigation conference was held as usual. The Executive Engineer, the Revenue Divisional Officers, the Tahsildars and the leading ryots of the respective divisions took part in it. In Chittoor, the Collector

and the Revenue Divisional Officers heard the complaints of the ryots during jamabandi and also on other days specially fixed for the purpose. Irrigation conferences were held at Chandragiri and Madanapalle, at which the Executive Engineer, Madanapalle, was present. In North Arcot, the Revenue Divisional Officers held conferences with the leading ryots of the villages immediately after jamabandi, when matters of general interest—such as, village sanitation, improved methods of cultivation, co-operation, rural reconstruction, etc., were discussed and lectures were given by the officers of the several departments. In South Arcot, informal conferences were held at the taluk headquarters by the Executive Engineer and Revenue Divisional Officers and matters relating to irrigation were discussed. Ample opportunity was given to the ryots to offer their remarks on important public matters and steps were taken to redress their grievances as far as possible. In Tanjore, ryots' conferences were held in all the taluks at which the officers of the Public Works Department and the Agricultural Department were present. The attendance was fairly large at almost all the conferences in which the leading ryots took part and questions relating to irrigation and drainage were, as usual, discussed and explained to the ryots. In Trichinopoly, the Collector held a conference during jamabandi at Jayankondasholapuram at which the officers of the Agricultural and Co-operative Departments were present. There was an agricultural exhibition of different sorts of paddy, cotton, sugarcane and manure seeds. The Revenue Divisional Officers held similar conferences at Karur, Kulittalai and Musiri taluk offices and these conferences were very poorly attended. The annual irrigation conferences were also held by the Executive Engineer at Karur, Kulittalai and Lalgudi in November 1934. In Madura, the Executive Engineer, Periyar division, held irrigation conferences at the places noted below on the dates mentioned against each—

In Ramnad, the Collector held an informal conference at Sattur at the close of the jamabandi. The Sub-Collectors of Ramnad and Sivakasi held similar conferences. In Salem, although no regular conference was held, the grievances of the ryots represented at the time of jamabandi were either redressed or steps were taken to redress them wherever they were found to be genuine. In South Kanara, the Collector held a ryots' conference at Udipi during jamabandi at which the Assistant Engineer, the local Forest Range Officer, certain Revenue subordinates, the village officers and a few ryots were present. The Agricultural Demonstrator who was also present gave an instructive lecture on agricultural improvements. The Revenue Divisional Officers also held similar conferences in other taluks. In Malabar the conditions are not generally favourable to informal conferences. At the time of jamabandi, the subordinates of the Agricultural Department gave informal lectures to the village officers. The Revenue Officers, however, keep themselves in touch with the ryots during their tours.

46. *Extent to which the inspections of subordinate offices have been carried out by the Board, Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers.*—The reports received from the Collectors show that all the subordinate offices except one were inspected by them and their Revenue Divisional Officers. The Collectors' notes of inspection have generally been thorough and the Board has critically reviewed the Collectors' reports and has issued instructions or admonitions wherever necessary.

During the fasli under review, Members of the Board of Revenue inspected the offices of the Collectors of Chingleput-Madras (Saidapet), Chittoor, Coimbatore, Ganjam, Madura, Nellore, North Arcot, Salem, Tanjore, Trichinopoly and Vizagapatam. The administration of the districts continues to be on the whole efficient.

47. *Administration of religious and charitable service inams.*—The administration of religious and charitable service inams continued to be generally satisfactory in all the districts except West Godavari, where there was a growing tendency on the part of the inamdars to give up the prescribed services for the institutions concerned, due to the pressure which they were subjected to by the trustees. In such cases prompt steps were taken to resume the inams and reassign the net assessment to the institutions concerned. In cases of alienation of these inams or cessation of the prescribed services, the inamdars were given an opportunity to redeem the inams alienated by them or to revive the prescribed services and the inams were resumed only on the failure of the inamdars to avail themselves of the opportunity afforded to them. The principles laid down in Board's Standing Order No. 54 (7) and (8) were duly observed in connexion with the reassignment of the net assessment on the resumed inams. 2,674-98 acres of religious and 190-10 acres of charitable service inams with an assessment of Rs. 6,175-14-0 and Rs. 608-3-0 respectively, were resumed in the fasli on account of alienation of the inams, cessation of the prescribed services or disappearance of the institutions concerned.

As regards resumed religious service inams net assessments amounting to Rs. 5,261-10-0 were reassigned to the working incumbents and the balance of Rs. 914-4-0 was credited to general revenues. In respect of resumed charitable service inams, net assessments amounting to Rs. 461-13-0 were reassigned to the working incumbents and the balance of Rs. 146-6-0 was credited to general revenues.

48. *Inspection of cattle census (quinquennial).*—A cattle census was taken by the karnams during the year and tested by Revenue Inspectors, Deputy Tahsildars, Tahsildars and in a few cases by Revenue Divisional Officers also. It is reported that the check by the inspecting officers has not disclosed any defect in the work of the karnams and the enumeration has been, on the whole, fairly correct.

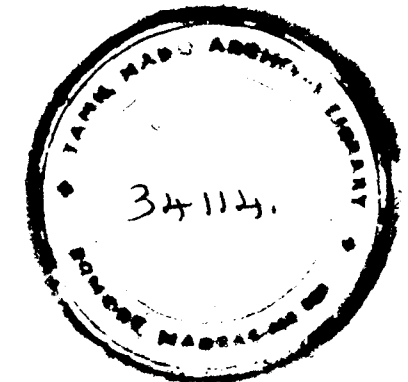
