GENERAL REVIEW—LOCAL BOARDS ADMINISTRATION—1935-36.

PART I.—CONSTITUTION AND MANAGEMENT.

Legislation.—The Madras Local Boards (Amendment) Act, 1935 (Madras Act XIII of 1935), providing for the division of local fund districts into three groups for purposes of local board elections and other incidental changes relating to the term of office of members of local boards, preparation of electoral rolls, etc., came into force during the year.

2. *Jurisdiction*—(a) *District Boards.*—The North Arcot District Board was divided into two new boards (Vellore and Tiruvannamalai District Boards) on 1st December 1935, the Ganjam District Board into Ganjam and Chicacole District Boards, on 20th January 1936, the Guntur District Board into Guntur and Ongole District Boards, on 1st August 1935 and the Vizagapatam District Board into Vizagapatam and Bobbili District Boards, on 1st May 1935. The total number of district boards at the end of the year was 30.

(b) *Major panchayat (ex-union) boards.*—No panchayat board was abolished during the year. The Pamarru Panchayat Board in the Kistna district, the Kadayanallur and Shermadevi Panchayat Boards in the Tinnevely district, the Usilampatti Panchayat Board in the Madura district, the Vinukonda Panchayat Board in the Guntur district, the Adirampatnam Panchayat Board in the Tanjore district, the Rayadrug Panchayat Board in the Bellary district and the Sriperumbudur Panchayat Board in the Chingleput district were superseded and placed in charge of special officers. The Watrap Panchayat Board in the Ramnad district was dissolved during the year. The Usilampatti Panchayat Board in the Madura district, the Dachapalli Panchayat Board in the Guntur district, the Porto Novo Panchayat Board in the South Arcot district, the Dharmavaram Panchayat Board in the Anantapur district, the Aska Panchayat Board in the Ganjam district and the Palakonda Panchayat Board in the Vizagapatam district were reconstituted during the year. The number of major panchayats working at the close of the year continued to be the same as in the previous year, namely 448. These boards were distributed as shown in Statement I A-1. The South Kanara and the Nilgiri districts had no major panchayat boards within their jurisdiction.

(c) *Minor panchayat boards (i.e., those which were not unions before the passing of Act XI of 1930).*—There were 5,309 minor panchayat boards in the Presidency at the end of March 1936.

3 (a) *Personnel*—(i) *District boards.*—The total sanctioned strength of district boards was 1,313 against 1,244 in the previous year. The actual strength at the end of the year, including the ex-presidents of the abolished taluk boards who became additional members of the

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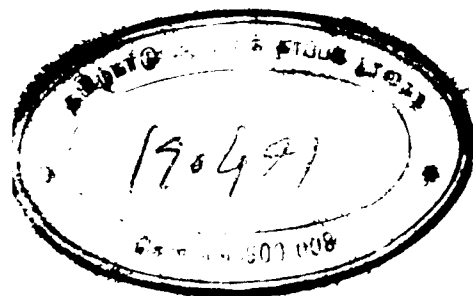

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district boards, was 1,296 against 1,322 in the previous year. All the members excepting four nominated members in each of the East and West Tanjore District Boards were elected.

(ii) *Panchayat boards.*—The total sanctioned strength of the major panchayat boards (ex-unions) rose from 5,755 * to 9,208 † and all the members were elected. The actual strength was 8,982 † against 5,619 * in the previous year.

(b) *Directing officers.*—There were elected non-official presidents in all the district boards at the end of the year. Four hundred and thirty-seven out of 448 panchayat (ex-union) boards were presided over by elected non-official presidents, the remaining eleven having been in charge of special officers.

4. *Elections.*—The privilege of election to the membership of local boards was exercised to the extent shown in the following statement:—

5. *Meetings.*—The total number of district board meetings convened increased from 277 to 373, of which four were adjourned for want of quorum and 19 for want of time or other reasons. The major panchayat boards in all the districts excluding East Godavari, Kurnool and Malabar, for which separate figures for major panchayat (ex-union) boards are not given, convened in all 8,463 meetings of which 361 were adjourned for want of quorum and 108 for want of time or other reasons. The average attendance of members at district board meetings ranged from 91 per cent of the sanctioned strength in Tiruvannamalai District Board to 65 per cent in the Malabar District Board. Attendance of members at the meetings of panchayat boards, so far as information has been furnished, was highest in the Bobbili district (81 per cent of the sanctioned strength) and the lowest in the Salem district (50 per cent).

6. The Inspector of Municipal Councils and Local Boards and his Personal Assistant visited ten districts during the year in connexion with matters relating to local fund administration.

The net expenditure under management excluding the amount spent from service receipts was 16.75 lakhs. A sum of Rs. 86,452 was paid as travelling allowance to members. In the districts of South Arcot, Chittoor, Coimbatore, West Godavari, South Kanara, Madura, Malabar, Nellore, Ramnad, West Tanjore and Trichinopoly the net cost of management exceeded Rs. 60,000.

9. *Roads—General.*—The district boards maintained during the year 34,595 miles of roads against 33,573 miles in the previous year.

The total length of roads newly opened during the year was 360 miles. Every hundred square miles of local fund area had a total mileage of roads ranging from 14.1 miles in the Kurnool district to 88 miles in the East Tanjore district.

Details are furnished in Annexure B. A sum of Rs. 7,719 was given as special grant to the West Godavari and South Kanara District Boards for repairing the roads damaged by floods.

10. *Trunk roads*.—The district boards maintained during the year 3,086 miles of trunk roads. The expenditure incurred by the district boards on these roads amounted to Rs. 20.18 lakhs against which the district boards earned a total Government grant of Rs. 18.23 lakhs.

The condition of trunk roads was good in the South Arcot, Chittoor, East Godavari, Nellore and Tinnevely districts. It was either fair or satisfactory in sixteen * districts. In the Madura district, the condition of certain portions of the trunk road was fair and others not satisfactory. It was very unsatisfactory in the Chingleput district and not satisfactory in Bellary, Chicacole, Kistna and Malabar.

11. *Second-class roads*.—The total expenditure incurred by district boards on the maintenance of second-class roads was Rs. 43.80 lakhs of which a total sum of Rs. 14.6 lakhs was met from Government grants.

13. *Contribution from Government under the Madras Motor Vehicles Taxation Act, 1931.*—The total amount disbursed to district boards under this head was Rs. 24.79 lakhs against Rs. 21.95 lakhs in 1934–35.

14. *Ferries.*—The income from ferries amounted to Rs. 3.37 lakhs against Rs. 3.45 lakhs in the previous year.

15. *Rest-houses, etc.*—The number of rest-houses maintained during the year was 643 against 659 in the previous year and that of choultries was 522 against 563. The income derived from and the expenditure incurred on the maintenance of rest-houses, choultries and water-sheds (other than those maintained from the Tanjore Raja's chatram funds) amounted to Rs. 1.94 lakhs and Rs. 3.35 lakhs against Rs. 2.24 lakhs and Rs. 3.35 lakhs, respectively, in the previous year.

16. *Tanjore Raja's chatrams.*—The income from rest-houses, choultries and water-sheds maintained from these funds was Rs. 2.50 lakhs against Rs. 2.68 lakhs in the previous year, while the expenditure was Rs. 1.48 lakhs against Rs. 1.56 lakhs.

(a) Elementary Education.

18. Education tax continued to be levied during the year in all districts except Nellore. The income from this tax fell from Rs. 15.87 lakhs to Rs. 15.42 lakhs. The scheme of compulsory education continued to be in force in the Saidapet taluk under the Chingleput District Board and in selected areas of four other district boards.

19. *Adequacy.*—The adequacy of elementary education in the areas under the local boards is shown in Annexure C. The number of children of school-age has been estimated according to the usual method by taking, in the case of boys, four-fifths of the male population of the age group 5–10 and one-fifth of such population of the age group 10–15 and, in the case of girls, the whole female population of the age group 5–10. As thus estimated, 56 per cent of the boys and 82 per cent of the girls of school-age in the local board areas of the whole Presidency did not attend any school compared with 56 and 83 per cent, respectively, in 1934–35. The percentage of boys unprovided for was more than 70 in Chittoor, Coimbatore, Vizagapatam and Salem districts, while the percentage in the case of girls exceeded 80 in all local fund districts except Malabar, Kistna, East Godavari, Tinnevely, Ongole, West Godavari, Guntur, South Kanara and Kurnool.

20. *Number and strength.*—The number and strength of local fund elementary schools are shown in Annexures D and E, respectively. The figures given below show that, although there was a fall in the number of schools maintained, the strength and the total cost showed an appreciable increase:—

21. *Efficiency.*—The percentages of children reading in classes I and II to the total number in classes I to V in the area of each district board are shown in Annexure F. The percentages ranged from 49 to 69 in the case of boys and from 68 to 82 in the case of girls, those for the whole Presidency being 62 in the case of boys and 74 in the case of girls.

22. *Backward communities.*—Complete information has not been furnished by district boards in their administration reports in regard to the provision made for the education of backward and depressed classes. According to the statistics appended to the report of the Director of Public Instruction for the year 1935-36 there were 1,347 schools chiefly intended for Muhammadans with 98,292 pupils, 1,003 schools for scheduled classes (Adi-Dravida, Adi-Andhra and other kindred classes) with 38,370 pupils and 163 schools with 5,542 pupils, for the aboriginal, hill and criminal tribes.

23. *Accommodation.*—The provision of local fund buildings for the board elementary schools continued to be inadequate, 11,043 or 64 per cent of the total number of schools having been accommodated in rented buildings.

24. The cost of elementary education per pupil ranged from Rs. 7-10-0 in Guntur to Rs. 13-11-6 in Kistna, the average cost being Rs. 10-8-9.

(b) *Secondary Education.*

25. The total number of secondary schools maintained by the local boards (excluding the Sanskrit College at Tiruvadi managed by the West Tanjore District Board) continued to be 209. Their total strength increased as shown below:—

Medical relief.

29. Information regarding the number of medical institutions in each district and the population and area served by each centre is given in Annexure I. The areas and population served by each centre in the Presidency were on the average 104 square miles and 36,100 persons respectively compared with 118 square miles and 37,200 persons in the previous year. The smallest area served per centre was in the East Tanjore district (35 square miles per centre), East Godavari coming next (39 square miles a centre). The area per centre was below 100 square miles in sixteen other districts, viz., Vellore, Tiruvannamalai, South Arcot, Bobbili, Chingleput, Coimbatore, Chicacole, Ganjam, West Godavari, Guntur, Kistna, Malabar, The Nilgiris, Ramnad, West Tanjore and Tinnevely. The largest area served per centre was in the Salem district (278 square miles a centre), Kurnool coming next with 237 square miles a centre, while in the districts of Anantapur and Cuddapah one centre had to serve more than 200 square miles. The position in regard to medical relief continued to be most favourable in the Nilgiri district where only 12,300 persons had to depend upon each centre. The number of persons depending upon each centre ranged from 20,000 to 30,000 in nine other districts and from 30,000 to 60,000 in nineteen other districts. It was over 60,000 in one district, viz., Salem (97,400 persons per centre).

30. The total number of institutions of Western medicine maintained by the local boards during the year was 65 hospitals and 829 dispensaries against 71 hospitals and 764 dispensaries in the previous year. The number of rural dispensaries continued to be 473 as in the previous year. Particulars regarding the local fund institutions of Western medicine are given in Annexure J-1, while those relating to Ayurvedic dispensaries are given in Annexure J-2.

31. The medical officers in charge of some institutions in all districts except Bellary, Bobbili, Chittoor, Cuddapah, Chicacole, East Godavari, West Godavari, Kurnool and the Nilgiris had no full-time work. Some of them were deputed to do itinerating work on fixed days in the week in the neighbouring places where medical relief was not easily available.

32. The number of patients who received treatment at the local fund hospitals and dispensaries during the year as compared with the previous two years is given below :—

Details are furnished in Annexure J-1. The local boards maintained 237 institutions of Indian Medicine (214 Ayurvedic, 17 Siddha and 6 Unani dispensaries) and one Homœopathic dispensary. The total number of patients treated at these institutions was 2,623,651 as detailed in Annexure J-2.

33. The local fund medical institutions for the exclusive treatment of Women and Children at Ambur and Melvisharam (Vellore), Kana-dukathan, Devakottai and Sivaganga (Ramnad), Tirutturaipundi (East Tanjore) and Kalangudiyeruppu (Tinnevely) continued to be maintained during the year.

34. The actual strength of the medical officers employed in all the local fund allopathic medical institutions (excluding rural dispensaries) was 385, consisting of 12 assistant surgeons, 359 sub-assistant surgeons, two women apothecaries and 12 women sub-assistant surgeons.

Preventive medicine.

35. *Organization and staff.*—The district health staff continued to discharge its duties satisfactorily and carried on propaganda work as usual.

36. *Birth-rate and maternity relief.*—The recorded birth-rate for the Presidency was 36.4 as against 34.4 in the previous year. Statistics relating to maternity relief in rural areas are given below :—

37. The number of births which received skilled attention during the year fell from 4.2 to 4.1 per cent of the total number of recorded births. The percentage averaged or exceeded five only in eight districts—in Chingleput, Chittoor, Cuddapah, South Kanara, Nellore, the Nilgiris, East Tanjore and West Tanjore. Each midwife attended on

the average 85 labour cases against 79 in the previous year. The number was highest in Bellary (150) and lowest in Chicacole (31), while it exceeded 100 in five other districts, viz., Anantapur, Vellore, South Arcot, Kurnool and Madura. Details are given in Annexure K.

38. *Death-rate—Epidemic and endemic diseases.*—The recorded death-rate in the Presidency fell from 23.9 to 21.9 per mille of the population. The rate was the highest in Ongole (27.9), Bellary coming next with 27.5 while Vizagapatam recorded the lowest rate (6.0), Kurnool (10.4), Bobbili (12.0), Salem (14.9), Tinnevely (16.9) and Coimbatore (17.4) being next in order—Vide Annexure L.

39. *Cholera.*—The number of deaths from cholera further rose from 14,801 to 28,091, the worst affected districts being South Arcot (5,080), Chingleput (2,729), Tiruvannamalai (2,458), West Tanjore (2,109), Cuddapah (1,798), East Tanjore (1,664), Tinnevely (1,356), Madura (1,293) and Kurnool (1,084). The districts of Bobbili, and the Nilgiris were free from the epidemic during the year. The districts which were least affected by the epidemic were Vizagapatam (1) and South Kanara (6).

40. *Smallpox.*—The number of deaths from smallpox fell from 14,005 in 1934-35 to 8,658 in 1935-36. The districts in which the mortality was heaviest were Ramnad (1,516), Salem (746), South Arcot (682), Malabar (627) and East Godavari (528). No district was free from the epidemic during the year. The number of successful cases of primary and secondary vaccinations further increased from 979,057 to 1,033,221 and the rate per mille of the population from 22.9 to 24.5. The rate was highest in Vizagapatam district (33.2) and the lowest was in South Arcot district (16.1). There was a rise in the outturn in 14 districts, when compared with the previous year. The number of successful cases of revaccination fell further from 637,990 to 454,636. Increase was noticeable only in eight districts (Annexure M).

41. *Plague.*—The number of deaths from plague fell from 1,305 to 268 during the year, the worst affected districts being Madura (103), Bellary (72), and Coimbatore (60).

42. Conservancy in rural areas continued to be mainly confined to panchayat board areas.

43. *Water-supply and drainage.*—The local boards were able to draw Rs. 1,72,197 out of a total grant of Rs. 2,05,900 sanctioned during the year for the improvement of water-supply in rural areas. The execution of the Arkonam and Tiruvellore water-supply schemes was in progress. Details of minor works carried out during the year are given below:—

There was an increase in the number of public markets, cart-stands and slaughter-houses maintained by the local boards. Coimbatore possessed the largest number of public markets, viz., 166. Salem, Malabar and Chittoor came next with 144, 111 and 95 markets respectively. Guntur, Ongole, Nellore, Nilgiris and East Tanjore continued to have very few public markets. Malabar as usual possessed the largest number of private markets.

South Kanara and Salem had the largest number of public cart-stands, viz., 59 and 58 respectively, while Anantapur and Madura had the least, 2 each. Tinnevely and Ramnad had the largest number of private cart-stands 58 and 56 respectively.

Salem and Kurnool maintained the largest number of public slaughter-houses, 27 and 26 respectively. South Kanara had no public slaughter-house. Tanjore West and Ramnad had the largest number of private slaughter-houses 158 and 36 respectively.

TREE-PLANTING.

48. The revenue realized by local boards from avenues amounted to Rs. 2.55 lakhs and the expenditure incurred thereon to Rs. .78 lakh. The boards in the Salem district derived the largest income from this source, viz., Rs. 58,605. East Godavari, Trichinopoly and Vellore came next with Rs. 24,781, Rs. 21,730 and Rs. 21,201 respectively. The income was nil in the Nilgiris district. Chicacole, Tiruvannamalai and Nellore derived the least income from this source, viz., Rs. 165, Rs. 466 and Rs. 620 respectively.

Annexure O furnishes particulars regarding avenues.

LAND-DEVELOPMENT.

49. The Madras Town-Planning Act was in force in 41 panchayat areas against 39 in the previous year. Fourteen panchayat boards only had taken up the preparation of detailed town-planning schemes and of these only one board had undertaken the preparation of general

town-planning schemes in compliance with the provisions of the Act. During the year under review town-planning schemes were sanctioned for four panchayat boards. A sum of Rs. 8,735 was realized during the year from the sale of lands in non-panchayat areas and a capital expenditure of Rs. 9,678 was incurred on schemes other than those under the Madras Town-Planning Act.

Electric lighting schemes were working in the Sembiam, Tiruvottiyur and Alandur Panchayat Board areas. Licences were granted for the Villivakkam and Tiruvallur Panchayat Boards for electric lighting schemes during the year and the schemes were under execution.

There were no other remunerative undertakings.

51. The year opened with a balance of Rs. 85.97 lakhs. The total receipts amounted to Rs. 467.69 lakhs against the total expenditure of Rs. 471.30 lakhs thus resulting in a deficit of Rs. 3.61 lakhs. The balance at the end of the year was Rs. 82.36 lakhs. There was a fall both in the total receipts and in the total expenditure as compared with the previous year. The ordinary expenditure under 'Management' and 'Communications' decreased, while there was an increase in the ordinary receipts under these two heads. There was an increase in the ordinary expenditure under 'Education', 'Public Health' and 'Remunerative enterprises', although there was a decrease in the ordinary receipts under the former two heads.

The total ordinary expenditure under the general account excluding investments amounted to Rs. 195 lakhs. There was thus a surplus of Rs. 27.68 lakhs. A total sum of Rs. 35.69 lakhs was contributed from the general account (ordinary) to the other accounts.

53. The total ordinary running charges of the services amounted to Rs. 300.61 lakhs during the year against Rs. 297.26 lakhs in 1934-35, and the total service receipts Rs. 80.73 lakhs against Rs. 78.81 lakhs. The net cost of the services was thus Rs. 219.88 lakhs against which a sum of Rs. 1.97 lakhs was realized from endowments and contributions and Rs. 114.25 lakhs from Government grants. The proportion of the income realized under the several heads to the total expenditure was as follows :—

54. The total capital expenditure incurred under all heads including railways fell from Rs. 88.57 lakhs in 1934-35 to Rs. 69.08 lakhs in 1935-36. The capital expenditure during the year under review included an investment of Rs. 10.39 lakhs. Against the total capital expenditure, sums of Rs. 18.60 lakhs were realized from service receipts, Rs. 7.17 lakhs from endowments and contributions, Rs. 17.31 lakhs from Government grants and Rs. 0.76 lakhs from loans. Of the

service receipts referred to, a major portion viz., Rs. 15.50 lakhs, related to investments realized (Rs. 0.20 lakh under 'Remunerative enterprises' and Rs. 15.30 lakhs under 'Railway account').

PART VII.—AUDIT.

57. *Condition of accounts.*—The general condition of the maintenance of accounts improved in the case of district boards, but deteriorated in the case of panchayat boards (ex-unions). Out of 29 district boards excluding Ganjam District Board which has been transferred to Orissa Province and 444 panchayat boards (ex-unions) excluding those in the area of Ganjam District Board, the condition of the accounts of five district boards and 176 panchayat boards was considered to be not satisfactory. The accounts of the Chilakalurpet Panchayat Board in the Guntur district could not be audited, as the records, vouchers, etc., were not made available for the purpose.

58. *Financial position and general irregularities.*—There was no improvement in the financial position of the panchayat boards during the year. Though in several instances the district board accounts closed with large balances, the balance under their general accounts was not sufficient to meet their heavy outstanding liabilities. The general account of the Bellary and the Coimbatore District Boards closed with a deficit balance. The Tinnevely District Board was not able to maintain the prescribed minimum working balance under its general account. The general account of the Madura District Board closed

with an adverse balance from December 1935 to February 1936 and would have closed with a deficit in March, 1936 also but for the unauthorized diversion of the railway cess funds amounting to Rs. 80,800. The balance under the general account of 12 panchayat boards was less than Rs. 100. Although the balances were in excess of Rs. 100 in several panchayat boards, they fell short of the prescribed minimum working balance, e.g., in Sivagiri, Kuttalam, Tiruvadi, Chetpet, Jaggayapet and Chennur. The general account of the Madakasira, Kalayaradug, Ponnani and Kollegal closed with deficit balances. Some boards were faced with heavy outstanding liabilities. This unsatisfactory financial position was mainly due to slackness in collection of revenues, failure to restrict expenditure to normal income and to a tendency to exceed the budget appropriation in the case of district boards and in the case of panchayat boards, it was due chiefly to poor collection of revenues. The Government wish to impress on the Presidents of District Boards and the Presidents of Panchayat Boards that they should take all possible steps to see that the defects repeatedly pointed out by the audit department do not recur.

59. *Defalcations and misappropriations.*—Seventy-three cases of defalcations and temporary misappropriations of local fund money were noticed during the year under review. The amounts involved ranged from Rs. 2-12-0 to Rs. 9,124-8-2.

60. *Surcharges.*—Twenty surcharges for an aggregate sum of Rs. 7,172-4-1 were made during the year. Of this, a sum of Rs. 2,290-3-1 was recovered, while the recovery of a sum of Rs. 3,184-4-0 was waived—Rs. 2,401-4-0 by Government and Rs. 783 by the Court. In five cases, the amounts involved are pending recovery including one case pending disposal in a court of law.

PART IX.—GENERAL REMARKS.

63. The general administration continued to be satisfactory in the case of the District Boards of Anantapur, Vellore, Chittoor, Coimbatore, Chicacole, South Kanara, Madura, Malabar, Nellore, Ramnad, East Tanjore, West Tanjore, Trichinopoly, Kistna and Kurnool. The administration of the Nilgiri District Board was fairly efficient. The Tiruvannamalai, Bellary, Chingleput, Cuddapah, West Godavari, Guntur, Salem, Tinnevely, Vizagapatam and East Godavari District Boards presented fairly satisfactory records. The Bobbili District Board also presented a fairly satisfactory record but failed to keep in sufficiently close touch with the people of the district or to command their confidence. The administration of the South Arcot District Board was not carried on with due regard to the general welfare of the district and did not command the confidence of the public. The administration of the newly constituted District Boards of Ongole and Ganjam called for no special comment.

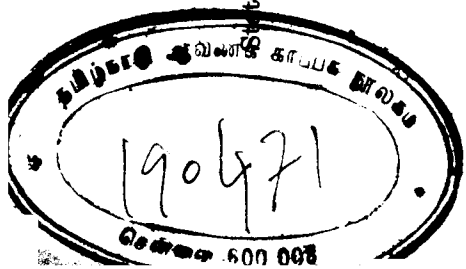
