The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1347 (1937-38) together with the prescribed statements.

The outstanding features of the fasli are—

- (i) The season was fairly satisfactory outside parts of the Deccan—Vide paragraph 2.
- (ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 22,708 acres from 27,572,870 acres (as now revised) in the previous fasli—Vide paragraph 7.
- (iii) The total assessment on holdings showed an increase of Rs. 40,916 over Rs. 6,02,47,505 (as now revised), the total assessment of the previous fasli—Vide paragraph 8.
- (iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings increased by 288,560 acres—Vide paragraph 9.
- (v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge increased by Rs. 5,06,404—Vide paragraph 10.
- (vi) Season remissions increased by Rs. 5,87,608—Vide paragraph 11 (i).
- (vii) The fixed remissions decreased by Rs. 1,27,270—Vide paragraph 11 (ii).
- (viii) The beriz deductions increased by Rs. 17,982—Vide paragraph 11 (iii).
- (ix) The amount of revenue remitted in this fasli was Rs. 105.64 lakhs against Rs. 84.77 lakhs in the previous fasli—Vide paragraph 11.
- (x) The miscellaneous revenue decreased by Rs. 1,15,986—Vide paragraph 12.
- (xi) There was a decrease in the number of land sales—Vide paragraph 27.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon advanced as a feeble current on the Malabar coast on the 4th and 5th June and strengthened and established itself there on the 9th and 10th. The rainfall in that month was below the normal throughout the province except in Chittoor. In association with a low pressure area, a depression and a storm in the Bay of Bengal, the monsoon was active on the West Coast in July and showed an intermittent activity in the rest of the Province. The rainfall in July was bordering on or above the normal except in West Godavari, Anantapur, South Arcot, the Central districts and the South (Tinnevely excepted). In August, the monsoon weakened and the rainfall was below the normal except in East Godavari (Plains), West Godavari, Kistna, Chingleput, South Arcot, the Central districts and the South, the deficiency of rainfall being marked in the Deccan. The rainfall in September outside the West Coast was received mainly in the last week of the month when a spell of unsettled weather in the east Arabian sea and a depression in the south-west Bay added to the frequency and intensity of thunderstorms; the rainfall in the month was generally below the normal except in

Chittoor, Trichinopoly, the South (Tanjore excepted) and South Kanara. On the whole, the south-west monsoon was *defective* except in Chingleput, Chittoor, Trichinopoly, Madura, Ramnad and South Kanara.

Sowings of the early crops were above the average except in the Circars, the Deccan (wet crops only) and the South.

The condition of the standing crops was generally satisfactory except in parts of Guntur, the Deccan, Chittoor and Tinnevely.

The conditions in the south-west Bay off the Coromandel coast were markedly unsettled on the last day of September and they developed into a depression which was centred off Cuddalore on the morning of the 1st October. Moving in a west-north-westerly direction as a low pressure area, it intensified into a deep depression in the east Arabian sea off the Kanara coast by the morning of the 3rd. This depression caused widespread and locally heavy rain along and near its track. The north-east monsoon set in over the Bay of Bengal by the middle of the third week of October and became active by the 20th. It also extended to the south-east Arabian sea towards the early part of the fourth week and remained active there and over the south Bay of Bengal throughout the rest of the month. But the bulk of the rainfall in October was received in the first fortnight. The rainfall in the month was bordering on or above the normal except in Bellary, Madura, Ramnad and Tinnevely. November began with an active north east monsoon over the region from the south Bay of Bengal to the south-east Arabian sea. There were three troughs of low pressure culminating in the formation of a depression off Coromandel on the 14th. The disturbances mentioned above more or less kept up the activity of the north-east monsoon in the month in the Carnatic, the Central districts and the South so that rainfall was often fairly widespread and in excess of the normal. The rainfall was nearly twice the normal in Chingleput district and $2\frac{1}{2}$ times the normal in South Arcot district with the result that many tanks breached and rivers overflowed their banks. The rainfall was, however, largely in defect in the Circars, the Deccan (Cuddapah excepted) and the West Coast. The north-east monsoon revived in the Coromandel coast in the beginning of the second week of December but was, on the whole, much weaker than usual. January was practically rainless. On the whole, the north-east monsoon was above the normal in all districts outside the Circars, Kurnool, Bellary and Tinnevely.

Sowings of the late crops were restricted or below the average except in the Central districts and the South where the sowings of the late wet crops were above the average.

The condition of the late crops was generally fair except in parts of Vizagapatam, Kurnool, Bellary, Anantapur, South Arcot, Tanjore and Tinnevely.

The rains in February were abundant, though untimely, in Vizagapatam South Arcot, Trichinopoly and the South, due to

thunderstorm activity accentuated by a revival of the north-east monsoon during the first ten days. There were again abundant rains between the 22nd and 27th March in South Arcot, Trichinopoly, the South and Malabar as the result of a depression in the south-west Bay and the passage of a trough of low pressure from the east Arabian sea. Coimbatore, Ramnad, Tinnevely and the West Coast experienced fitful but occasionally intense thunderstorm activity in April. The south-west monsoon made a preliminary advance into the south-east Arabian sea, west of Ceylon and into the south Bay of Bengal about the 12th May. Shortly after, conditions became unsettled off the Circars—Orissa coast, but the result was only a shallow depression. Unsettled conditions next appeared over the east central Bay and the neighbourhood on the 23rd and moving to the north Bay on the 24th developed into a trough of low pressure off the Circars—Orissa coast by the 25th. The monsoon advanced on the Malabar coast about the 26th and soon after conditions became unsettled in the east central Arabian sea, where a depression formed by the 29th. Moving slowly north-westwards, the depression weakened. The rainfall in the month bordered on or was above the normal in the Circars, the Deccan, South Arcot, Chittoor, North Arcot, Salem, Ramnad and South Kanara. The hot weather rains were, on the whole, above the normal outside Coimbatore.

The season for the Province as a whole was fairly satisfactory outside parts of the Deccan.

Parts of the Deccan suffered from famine. The rainfall in both the monsoons was neither adequate nor timely in Kurnool and Bellary and was also not evenly distributed in Bellary. The south-west monsoon rains were also inadequate and the north-east monsoon rains unevenly distributed in Anantapur. Owing to the failure of crops consequent on adverse seasonal conditions, relief operations under the Famine Code were found necessary in these districts. Distress was confined to parts of the taluks of Kurnool and Pattikonda of the Kurnool district, the taluks of Adoni, Ahur, Bellary and Rayadurg of the Bellary district and the taluks of Gooty and Tadpatri of the Anantapur district. Test works were first opened in the Bellary district in December 1937 and were gradually converted into relief works. Three road works were opened in the Gooty taluk of the Anantapur district in December 1937 under the control of the district board with the aid of Government grants. Road works under the control of the district board were also opened in the Kurnool district in January 1938. As these works proved inadequate to provide employment for all who required assistance, test works were started in the second week of February 1938 in the Anantapur district and in March 1938 in the Kurnool district and were gradually converted into relief works, where necessary. Distress was severe in all the three districts. Four relief works and one test work in the Kurnool district, 16 relief works and one test work in the Bellary

district and six relief works in the Anantapur district were in progress at the close of the fasli, the average number of persons relieved daily in all the three districts being 114,486 of whom 79,570 were workers and 34,916 received gratuitous relief.

In addition to the above works, road works were started by the District Board in the taluks of Kalyandrug, Dharmavaram and Kadiri of the Anantapur district out of Government grants. The road work in the Kadiri taluk was continued to the end of the fasli and all other road works were closed during the year.

Two test works in the Penukonda taluk of the Anantapur district and one test work in the Hindupur taluk of the same district were opened during the first week of May 1938 as unemployment was apprehended but they were closed by the middle of the next month as the tests revealed that famine works were not necessary and were replaced by ordinary minor irrigation works and district board works.

Stocks of fodder were generally sufficient except in the famine-affected areas.

3. The total number of ryotwari villages in the Presidency was 20,969 against 20,967 in the previous fasli. The increase was due to the addition of 2 villages in the Cuddapah district—One due to the relinquishment of shrotriyam Obulapuram of Jammalamadugu taluk and the other due to the bifurcation of West Chennur village of the Cuddapah taluk and the consequent formation of the new village Upparapalle.

4. The land revenue of the Province is derived from the following sources :—

- (1) peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates ;
- (2) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages ;
- (3) assessment including water-rate on lands held under ryotwari tenure ; and
- (4) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 46,79,514 against Rs. 46,81,840 in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 2,326 is explained below :—

7. The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,595,578 acres and exceeded that of the previous fasli (as now revised) by 22,708 acres. There was increase in all the districts except Nellore, the Nilgiris and Ramnad where there was a decrease of 563 acres, 67 acres and 44 acres, respectively. The increase was marked in the districts of South Kanara (6,034 acres), Anantapur (2,783 acres), East Godavari (2,486 acres), Chittoor (1,875 acres), Malabar (1,592 acres), North Arcot (1,493 acres), Salem (1,411 acres) and South Arcot (1,184 acres). The increase in Malabar was mainly due to transfer of 'unoccupied dry lands' to 'occupied dry' and that in South Kanara to fresh assignments on darkhast. The increase in other districts was due to fresh assignments or resumption of minor inams.

8. The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 602.88 lakhs against Rs. 602.48 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 40,916. There was increase in all the districts. The increase was marked in Guntur (Rs. 5,901), Kistna (Rs. 4,816),

Tanjore (Rs. 4,717), South Kanara (Rs. 1,262), Salem (Rs. 3,409), Malabar (Rs. 2,247), North Arcot (Rs. 1,825), Chittoor (Rs. 1,746), South Arcot (Rs. 1,687), Cuddapah (Rs. 1,519), the Nilgiris (Rs. 1,470), West Godavari (Rs. 1,416) and Kurnool (Rs. 1,317). The increase in Guntur, Kistna and West Godavari was due mainly to transfer of dry lands to wet. The increase in Tanjore was due to reclassification of sources and transfer of dry lands to wet. In Malabar the increase was chiefly the result of (1) transfer of 'un-occupied dry' lands to 'occupied dry' and transfer of 'dry' lands to 'wet' and 'garden' in the plains taluks, (2) transfer of 'undeveloped dry' lands to 'developed dry' in Wynad taluk and (3) transfer of 'single crop' wet lands to 'double crop' wet in Palghat taluk. In the Nilgiris the introduction of resettlement in the plateau taluks accounted for the increase. In Cuddapah there was an increase in wet (Rs. 549) and dry (Rs. 970) holdings. The increase in the other districts was mostly due to fresh assignments.

9. The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20.96 million acres against 20.67 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net increase of 273,083 acres under dry and of 15,477 acres under wet. The total area cultivated during the year including the area under 'miscellaneous cultivation' was 21.91 million acres against 21.54 million acres in the previous fasli.

There was a decrease of 263,482 acres under 'waste charged.'

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 41.26 lakhs as against Rs. 36.19 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 6,46,707 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rs. 1,40,303 in others resulting in a net increase of Rs. 5,06,404. The increase was marked in North Arcot (Rs. 1,63,520), Chingleput (Rupees 1,33,407), South Arcot (Rs. 1,16,279), Tanjore (Rs. 60,274), Trichinopoly (Rs. 46,092) and Guntur (Rs. 41,827) while the decrease was appreciable in Tinnevely (Rs. 43,220). The increase in North Arcot, Chingleput and South Arcot was chiefly due to adequate supplies received in irrigation sources. In the remaining districts the increase was due to the extension of wet cultivation: in Tanjore under the Cauvery-Mettur Project, in Trichinopoly under the Kattalai high level channel and in Guntur, under the Kistna West high level channel opened during the year. The reason for the decrease in Tinnevely was the want of sufficient supply in irrigation sources.

11. *Remissions.*—There was a total remission of Rs. 105.74 lakhs during the fasli of which Rs. 34.34 lakhs related to season and other fixed remissions and Rs. 71.40 lakhs represented the special remissions granted under G.O. No. 2627, Revenue, dated 16th December 1937. As compared with the previous year there was an increase of Rs. 4,78,320 under season and other fixed remissions. The increase was marked in Bellary (Rs. 4,52,077), Anantapur (Rs. 3,77,448) and Kurnool (Rs. 1,73,279) and it was due to adverse seasonal conditions.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head during the fasli was Rs. 23,12,685 against Rs. 17,25,077 (as now revised) in the previous year and there was thus a net increase of Rs. 5,87,608. The increase which was due to adverse seasonal conditions was marked in the districts of Bellary (Rs. 4,57,662), Anantapur (Rs. 3,76,323) and Kurnool (Rs. 1,73,353).

(a) *Waste remitted.*—Remission under this head amounted to Rs. 3.06 lakhs or Rs. 51,358 less than in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 1,01,810 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 1,53,168 in others. The increase was marked in Vizagapatam (Rs. 21,787) and it was due to insufficient supplies in irrigation sources. Dry remissions of Rs. 4,164 on an extent of 8,819 acres in Kurnool and of Rs. 27 on an extent of 21 acres in Trichinopoly were also granted during the fasli. In Kurnool this dry remission was granted under the authority of G.O. No. 1389, Revenue, dated 30th May 1938. The dry remission in Trichinopoly related to sanded dry lands and was granted under the authority of G.O. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop.*—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 13,11,153 against Rs. 7,07,213 in previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 6,03,940. The increase which was marked in Bellary (Rs. 4,25,044) and Anantapur (Rs. 3,39,587) was due to unfavourable seasonal conditions and the grant of remissions on dry lands on a large scale under the authority of G.O. No. 1389, Revenue, dated 30th May 1938.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions (i.e., remission of the difference between wet and dry assessments on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply).*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 4,36,149 against Rs. 5,63,701 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,27,552. The decrease was appreciable in North Arcot (Rs. 75,846).

(d) *Injury by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 24,684 against Rs. 45,734 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 21,050. The decrease was appreciable in West Godavari (Rs. 27,847).

(e) *Remission of second crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 31,755 against Rs. 33,179 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,424. The decrease was marked in North Arcot (Rs. 8,629).

(ii) *Fixed remissions (i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with the season).*—These remissions amounted to Rs. 1.59 lakhs against Rs. 2.86 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 1,27,270. The decrease was marked in South Kanara (Rs. 74,459) and Salem (Rs. 38,301) and was mainly due to the decrease

in the increment remissions allowed on account of the introduction of resettlement rates.

(iii) *Beriz deductions*.—Deductions made in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9.63 lakhs against Rs. 9.45 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 17,982.

(iv) *Special remissions*.—With reference to the Hon'ble the Prime Minister's announcement while introducing the Budget Estimate for 1937-38, the Government in their Order No. 2627, Revenue, dated 16th December 1937, ordered land revenue concessions in the following forms :—

(1) Cancellation of percentage enhancements imposed at resettlement on dry, wet and garden lands in certain tracts resettled in recent years.

(2) grant of a remission of 2 annas in the rupee of the wet assessment in the remaining areas in the province ;

(3) a temporary reduction of water-cess from Rs. 6-4-0 to Rs. 5-12-0 an acre for a first crop with corresponding reductions for other crops in the East and West Godavari and Kistna districts and in the deltaic tracts of the Guntur district.

The actual cost of the above concessions came to Rs. 71.4 lakhs.

Owing to adverse seasonal conditions remission of dry assessment was granted in parts of the districts of Kurnool, Anantapur and Bellary as noted below :—

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The Revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 112.73 lakhs against Rs. 113.89 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 3,42,242 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 4,58,228 in others, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 1,15,986. The several items are dealt with below :—

Item 1.—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 21.68 lakhs against Rs. 23.41 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,73,549. This decrease was due to the grant of remission to inam lands on account of adverse seasonal conditions.

Item 2 (a)—Second crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.86 lakhs against Rs. 1.70 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 15,859.

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The Revenue under this head was Rs. 17.28 lakhs against Rs. 16.97 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 30,988. The increase was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 37,566).

Item (3)—Charge for water in villages in estates including tirrajasti and faslijasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 35.15 lakhs against Rs. 33.18 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 1,97,068. The increase was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 71,610), East Godavari (Rs. 42,209) and Kistna (Rs. 36,534).

Item (4)—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.88 lakhs against Rs. 3.75 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 13,191.

Item (5)—Charges levied for occupation (with or without permission) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.51 lakhs against Rs. 6.33 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 18,501.

Item (6)—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.67 lakhs against Rs. 3.85 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 17,825.

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 1,68,554 were levied on an extent of 22,507 acres against Rs. 1,80,178 on an extent of 26,047 acres in the previous fasli, showing an incidence of Rs. 7 per acre as in the previous fasli. The highest district average rate was Rs. 55 in Vizagapatam and this was due to prohibitive penalties levied for persistent objectionable encroachments.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Malabar and Madras. The work of reclassification is reported to have been completed in almost all the other districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 73,321 acres of poramboke lands against 68,281 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Anantapur (11,893 acres), Guntur (9,188 acres), Bellary (8,355 acres), Tanjore (7,470 acres), Salem (5,412 acres) and Kurnool (5,405 acres).

Item (7)—Revenue derived from taxed trees.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.52 lakhs against Rs. 3.58 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 5,833.

Item (8)—Commission from estates under Court of Wards.—The revenue derived from this head was Rs. 0.02 lakhs against Rs. 1.14 lakhs in the previous fasli, the decrease being Rs. 1,12,288. The decrease which was marked in Vizagapatam (Rs. 1,03,303) was partly due to the reduction of the rate of Government commission from 2½ per cent to 1½ per cent in respect of the Vizianagram estate sanctioned with effect from fasli 1347.

Item (9)—*Revenue from process service fees.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 0.10 lakh against Rs. 0.12 lakh in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 2,157.

Item (10)—*Sale-proceeds of lands sold.*—The income under this head was Rs. 1.26 lakhs against Rs. 2.41 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,15,174. The decrease was marked in Madras (Rs. 61,975) and it was due to the inclusion in fasli 1346 of the sale-proceeds of a Government land in Georgetown.

Item (11)—*Rent of lankas.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 4.04 lakhs against Rs. 3.82 lakhs, the net increase being Rs. 21,603.

Item (12)—*Quit-rent and ground-rent.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.59 lakhs against Rs. 2.79 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 19,744. The decrease was marked in Madras (Rs. 18,349).

13. The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 722.53 lakhs against Rs. 723.00 lakhs (as revised) in the previous fasli. The details for the decrease of Rs. 0.47 lakh are given below:—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 9,04,10,795. A sum of Rs. 8,10,35,675 or 89.6 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 74,40,532 or 8.2 per cent written off the accounts. The collection of a sum of Rs. 6,28,824 or 0.7 per cent was suspended or postponed. The percentage of collection to the collectable demand was therefore 98.4. The percentage of collections to demand during the previous fasli was 92.4, that written off 6.4 and that suspended or postponed 0.03. The percentage of collection to the collectable demand was 98.7. The land revenue concessions for fasli 1347 have been dealt with in paragraph 11 (iv) above.

17. *The demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 22,40,401. A sum of Rs. 10,26,864 or 45.7 per cent was collected and a sum of Rupees 7,86,298 or 35.1 per cent written off the accounts. Of this amount Rs. 7,10,632 relates to water-cess on mamul wet lands in Tanjore district which was written off the accounts under the orders of the Board following the decision of the Government to exempt these lands from the payment of water-cess. The percentage of collection in the previous fasli was 51.04 and that written off was 4.3.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both arrears and current was Rs. 23,61,826 against Rs. 22,38,989 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by the Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1938 the balance at the beginning of fasli 1348 was Rs. 23,62,125. Up to the end of October 1938 a sum of Rs. 10,12,623 was collected and Rs. 20,797 written off the accounts. Proposals have been made to write off Rs. 2,784. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1938 was thus Rs. 13,25,920. Out of this amount a sum of Rs. 6,68,399 is covered by orders of suspensions or postponements in the Presidency. Deducting this amount the realizable balance on 1st November 1938 was Rs. 6,57,521.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and overpayments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustments to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between land revenue and cesses is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1347 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli, and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from the Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to local boards, the recovery of overpayments is being watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges in the Land Revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head, "25. General Administration." The district administration charges *excluding* village establishments amounted to Rs. 105.50 lakhs during fasli 1347. The village service charges including those of proprietary estates during the fasli were Rs. 116.95 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 222.45 lakhs or 27.1 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected.

It has, however, to be borne in mind that the expenditure does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The Land Revenue department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all the departments of the Government. Moreover, a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the amount of expenditure shown above.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of the Government dues under Madras Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes issued during the fasli under report as compared with those for the three preceding faslis :—

There is an increase in the number of processes issued under all heads but the number of defaulters whose properties (personal and real) were sold shows a decrease of over 14 per cent as compared with fasli 1346.

23. *Demand notices.*—The number of demand notices issued during the fasli is less than those of faslis 1344 and 1345 and more than those of fasli 1346.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is an appreciable decrease in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with those of faslis 1344 and 1345 and a slight increase when compared with those of fasli 1346.

25. There is an increase of 0.26 in the percentage of the number of distrain and attachment of personal property arising from demand notices when compared with the previous fasli. There is a decrease of 0.88 per cent in respect of real property.

The number of defaulters whose immovable properties were attached during the fasli was 23,477 against 30,718 in fasli 1346.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 125,054 defaulters whose properties were attached 35.30 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 39.49 per cent in the last fasli. The number of notices of sale was large in Tanjore (20,954), South Arcot (17,601) and Malabar (17,910).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose properties were sold in the fasli was less than the number in fasli 1346 by 1,750. There was an increase in the number of sales of personal property by 226 but a decrease in the number of sales of real property by 1,976. The percentage borne by the actual number of sales to the number of sale notices in the Province is 12.47 against 16.77 in fasli 1346. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to the total number of holdings is 0.16 against 0.19 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1347 as compared with those for the preceding three faslis :—

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 5,31,542 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 1,21,221. The amount realized was Rs. 1,53,943. The estimated value of lands sold was noticeably disproportionate to the

arrears in the districts of Kistna, Nellore, Bellary, Chingleput, Chittoor, North Arcot, Tanjore, Trichinopoly, Madura and Ramnad. The prices fetched for lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to 3-9/10 times the assessment in the case of dry lands and 3-1/6 times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1346 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 6,72,131 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 1,99,178 and the amount realized was Rs. 2,00,383. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals is less than in fasli 1346, being three and nine-tenth times the assessment in the case of dry lands against six and one-seventh times in fasli 1346 and three and one-sixth times the assessment in the case of wet lands against eight and five-eleventh times in the previous fasli.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of lands sold to private individuals in the fasli was 5,513 acres under dry and 2,473 acres under wet against 6,969 and 3,546 acres respectively in fasli 1346. The total area bought-in by Government for want of bidders was 4,811 acres under dry and 2,415 acres under wet against 8,173 and 2,438 acres respectively in fasli 1346. The total area of lands sold is 15,012 acres against the total holdings of 27,595,578 acres or one acre in every 1,838 acres.

28. *Process-service establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by the special establishment and of the fees realized during the fasli. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 1,366,203 or 146,477 more than in fasli 1346. The number of processes served by the special agency (31,490) was less than in the previous fasli by 13,946.

29. *Costs in civil suits.*—A sum of Rs. 36,563 was awarded to the Government as costs during the fasli. Including the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 67,481 of which Rs. 18,291 were collected, Rs. 6,732 written off the accounts and Rs. 330 recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 42,128 made up of the following items:—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue.*—Statement No. 14.—The total demand on account of interest on arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 55,126 of which Rs. 16,536 were collected and Rs. 3,392 were remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 35,198. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in

the districts of Vizagapatam, East Godavari, Kistna, Nellore, Chingleput, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15), 2,217.50 acres assessed at Rs. 2,866 were sold for Rs. 77,262. 29.62 acres of house-sites were sold for Rs. 44,329 under Standing Order No. 21. 742.69 acres of lands bought-in by Government at sales for arrears of land revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 4,905. 29.24 acres of lands which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 3,327. 3.07 acres of lands for which the railways are not likely to have any further use, were sold for Rs. 1,385 under Standing Order No. 91. An extent of one cawny and 450 square feet of land was sold in Madras for Rs. 666 subject to the payment of an annual ground-rent of Rs. 164-14-7 under the special rules governing the disposal of waste lands in the city.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—There was no case in the fasli under Standing Order No. 58 of the subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in enfranchised inams.

33. *Transfer of revenue registry.*—Transfer of registry falls under the following main heads:—

- (i) transfer made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars, and
 - (ii) transfer effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.
- (i) Under the first head 412,442 applications were received during the fasli as against 421,962 in the previous fasli, the decrease being 9,520 or about 2 per cent. There was a general decrease except in certain districts where the increase was as noted below:—

The total number of applications of all kinds including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 791,549 of which 724,315 were disposed of during the fasli leaving a balance of 67,234 (or about 8 per cent of the total number) as against 72,990 (or about 9.6 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli, 33,215 (or about 4.5 per cent) were rejected and 2,635 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The causes of rejection were mainly defective title and failure of the parties to produce documentary evidence. The percentage of pendency was marked in Vizagapatam (21), Anantapur (19), the Nilgiris (16), Guntur (15), East Godavari (13) and South Arcot (1).

34. The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that generally the Collector should himself conduct the settlement of each taluk once in five years was complied with in all the districts except in the case of Tiruturaipundi taluk of Tanjore district. In Tanjore district, the Collector was permitted in February 1935, to arrange the cycle of the Collector's jamabandi of the district so as to cover a period of six years.

35. The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year amounted to Rs. 9.54 lakhs against Rs. 12.14 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in 15 districts and a decrease in 9 districts. The amount advanced during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, for the relief of agricultural indebtedness was Rs. 7.41 lakhs.

36. Including the uncollected balances outstanding at the end of the previous year, the amount repayable during the year on account of principal under both the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts was Rs. 11.57 lakhs against Rs. 14.04 lakhs in the preceding year. Of this amount, a sum of Rs. 9.93 lakhs (or 86 per cent) was collected. A sum of Rs. 0.83 lakh was repaid by the borrowers on account of loans, the repayment of which had not fallen due, while a sum of Rs. 5,215 was written off as irrecoverable.

The amount repayable during the year on account of principal under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 62,244, of which a sum of Rs. 60,800 was collected.

37. The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years was Rs. 15,12,689 of which a sum of Rs. 13,20,967 or 87 per cent was collected during the year. Of this, Rs. 11,316 and Rs. 12,418 were realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties respectively and a sum of Rs. 6,950 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest. The balance outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 1,91,722.

The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 1,32,861, of which a sum of Rs. 1,29,886 was collected in the year.

38. The advances drawn by Collectors during the official year 1937-38 under the head "Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors" amounted to Rs. 1,07,437 as detailed below against Rs. 1,08,960 in the previous year :—

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors (as revised) including the amounts referred to above a sum of Rs. 1,05,132 was adjusted during the year leaving a net debit balance of Rs. 2,37,068.

Under the head "Cost of Survey Marks—Collectors" a sum of Rs. 89,077 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 8,329 to be realized.

The arrear at the beginning of the year under "Cost of Survey Marks—Survey Officers" was Rs. 47,635. Fresh landholders' bills for Rs. 76,500 were received from Survey Officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 1,24,135 a sum of Rs. 62,284 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 61,851. A large portion of the

amount is outstanding in Vizagapatam (Rs. 14,251) and East Godavari districts (Rs. 29,515). The Collectors of these districts have been requested to explain the delay in collecting the amounts.

39. The scheme for relief of indebtedness under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was suspended in January 1938 in all the districts where it was in force pending consideration of the Madras Agriculturists' Relief Bill which was later passed into law.

Debt Conciliation Boards constituted under Madras Act XI of 1936 functioned in the districts of Guntur, Nellore, Bellary, South Arcot, Coimbatore and Ramnad.

40. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58 Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well. The ryots were aware of the rules and made timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed.

41. *Cultivation of tank-bed lands.*—There are no tank bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In some of the other districts tank-bed lands were cultivated with melons or cucumber. Wherever the cultivation was permitted, ordinary dry rates were charged and cases of objectionable cultivation were dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Land Encroachment Act.

42. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these registers was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Certain minor defects noticed were duly rectified.

43. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris.

The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of these registers up to and during the fasli 1347 :—

44. *Minor Irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 gives for each district the number of works in charge of the Revenue department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1938. The statement also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1939.

45. *Conferences with ryots.*—Ryots' conferences were held in all the districts except Tinnevely, Coimbatore, Malabar and the Nilgiris and the grievances of the ryots represented were either redressed or steps were taken to redress them. In Malabar the ryots would not attend the conferences and no effort was made to convene them.

46. *Extent to which the inspection of subordinate offices has been carried out by the Board, Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers.*—All subordinate offices except two sub-treasuries in Malabar district and one Deputy Tahsildar's office in Tinnevely district which was opened on 1st May 1938 were inspected by the Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers. The Collectors' inspection of the Revenue Divisional Offices was generally thorough. The Board examined the notes of inspection and issued suitable instructions.

During the fasli under report the Members of the Board of Revenue inspected the offices of the Collectors of Anantapur, South Arcot, Bellary, East Godavari, South Kanara, Kurnool, Madura, the Nilgiris, Ramnad, Salem and Malabar and found that the administration of the districts continued to be efficient.

47. *Administration of charitable and religious service inams.*—The administration of charitable and religious service inams continued to be generally satisfactory in all districts except West Godavari where as reported in the previous fasli there was a growing tendency on the part of the inamdars to give up the prescribed services for the institutions concerned. Alienations were also not

uncommon in the district. In such cases prompt steps were taken to resume the inams and reassign the net assessment on them to the institutions concerned for their upkeep or for rendering similar services. In cases of alienation of the inam lands or cessation of the prescribed services every facility was afforded to the inamdars to redeem the inams alienated by them or to revive the service. The inams were resumed only on the failure of the inamdars to avail themselves of the opportunity afforded to them. The principles laid down in paragraphs 7 and 8 of Board's Standing Order No. 54 were duly observed in connexion with the reassignment of the net assessment on the resumed inams. 1,728-76 acres of religious and 528-38 acres of charitable service inams with an assessment of Rs. 2,761-7-8 and Rs. 222-8-11 respectively were resumed in the fasli on account of alienation of the inam lands, cessation of the prescribed services, or disappearance of the institutions concerned.

As regards resumed religious service inams, net assessments amounting to Rs. 2,167-2-2 were reassigned to the working incumbents and the balance of Rs. 594-5-6 was credited to general revenues. In respect of resumed charitable service inams, net assessments amounting to Rs. 127-6-11 were reassigned to the working incumbents and the balance of Rs. 95-2-0 was credited to general revenues.

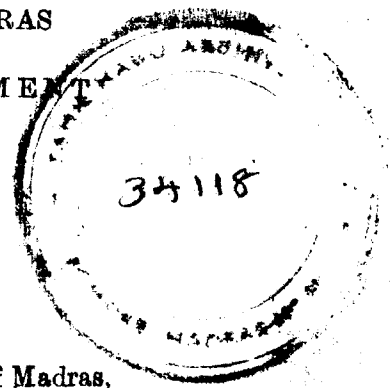
