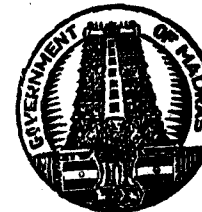

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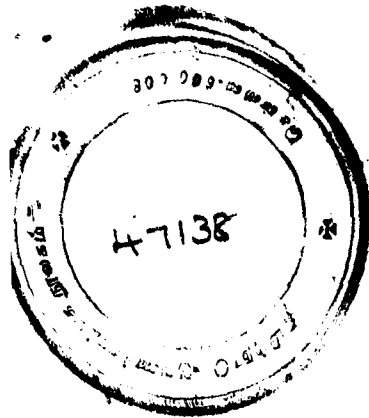

ADMINISTRATION REPORT OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT ON
THE WORK DONE FOR THE AMELIORATION OF CONDITIONS
OF THE ELIGIBLE COMMUNITIES FOR THE YEAR 1947-48.

PERSONNEL.

Sri Rao Sahib C. G. Reddi continued to be the Commissioner of Labour till 16th July 1947. Mr. R. M. Sundaram, O.B.E., I.C.S., took over charge of the post on the 16th July 1947 and held it throughout the year.

Sri A. Uttandaraman Pillai, B.A., B.L., continued to be the Assistant Commissioner of Labour throughout the year.

Sri V. Balasundaram, B.A., continued to be the Personal Assistant to the Commissioner of Labour except during the period from 8th April to 19th May 1947 when Sri A. Uttandaraman Pillai, B.A., B.L., held additional charge of the post.

TOURING.

During the year, the Commissioner of Labour toured in the districts of Coimbatore, Madura, Nellore, West Godavari, Vizagapatam, Chingleput, Tiruchirappalli, South Arcot, Malabar, Tirunelveli, Salem, Chittoor, North Arcot, Tanjore, East Godavari and the Nilgiris. The tours were undertaken mainly for the purpose of enquiry into and settlement of labour disputes. Inspection of factories, labour schools and hostels, and hearing of workmen's compensation cases were also undertaken during some of these tours. The Commissioner of Labour attended the following conferences during the year:—

- (i) Labour Ministers' Conference held at New Delhi in April 1947.
- (ii) Eighth Labour Conference held at New Delhi in April 1947.
- (iii) Meeting of the Industrial Committee on Plantations held at New Delhi from 31st March to 2nd April 1948.

COMMUNITIES ELIGIBLE FOR HELP BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

The ameliorative work undertaken by the Labour Department was confined, as usual, to the communities specified in Appendix A and to those who have been converted from these communities to other religions and their descendants.

The Collectors of the districts continued to be responsible in the mufassal for the ameliorative work with the Commissioner of Labour as the Co-ordinating Officer. A District Harijan Welfare Officer (formerly known as District Labour Officer) of the grade of Deputy Tahsildar with a small staff was employed in each of the districts shown in Statement I.

PROVINCIAL HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEE AND DISTRICT HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEES.

The Persons mentioned below have since been appointed as additional members of the Provincial Harijan Welfare Committee.

The Committee has submitted its report to Government. The recommendations in the report are under the consideration of Government.

The District Harijan Welfare Committees consisted of 5 to 8 members with the respective Collectors as Chairmen.

The Collectors state that the members evinced keen interest in the welfare of eligible communities and that proposals and suggestions made by them were promptly dealt with.

AMELIORATIVE MEASURES UNDERTAKEN BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

The ameliorative work proceeded on the usual lines and consisted of—

- (i) provision of house-sites;
- (ii) maintenance of schools, grant of scholarships, stipends, boarding grants, grants for the purchase of books, etc., and grants to private educational institutions for the benefit of the communities mentioned in Appendix 'A';
- (iii) provision of wells, tanks, etc., for the supply of drinking water;
- (iv) provision of sanitary amenities, pathways and burning or burial grounds;
- (v) grants to private bodies engaged in social and economic uplift of the eligible communities; and
- (vi) assignment or lease of land for cultivation.

Details of work done under the heads mentioned above are given in the succeeding paragraphs.

HOUSE-SITES.

House-sites are provided by assignment of land at the disposal of Government or by acquisition of private lands. Details of house-sites provided by the assignment of Government lands are given in Statement II. During the year, 441 house-sites covering an extent of 24.39 acres of land, as against 589 house-sites covering an extent of 34.34 acres of land in the previous year, were provided in various districts. The total number of house-sites provided since the commencement of the activities of the Labour Department to the end of the year was 48,584.

There was no change in the policy of Government regarding the acquisition of private land for the provision of house-sites for the eligible communities. The Government continued to bear half the cost of acquisition of land covered by house-sites subject to a maximum of Rs. 350 per acre for wet land, Rs. 250 per acre for garden land and Rs. 150 per acre for dry land. The entire cost of communal portions in the area acquired was, as usual, borne by the Government. Particulars of house-sites provided by acquisition of private lands are given in Statement III. An extent of 41.10 acres was acquired at a total cost of Rs. 40,456-2-10 as against 27.66 acres of land at a total cost of Rs. 18,651-10-7 acquired in the previous year, and 626 house-sites were provided as against 444 provided in the previous year. The cost borne by the Government as contribution towards half the cost of house-sites and the cost of land set apart for communal purposes was Rs. 16,913-3-2 and the cost borne by the applicants was Rs. 23,542-15-8. The total number of house-sites acquired up to the end of the year was 44,928.

The Collector of Bellary arranged to get a free gift of one acre of land from Sri Hampa Reddi for the extension of the Harijan Colony in Muddanagori village, Alur taluk, Bellary district.

LOANS TO INDIVIDUALS FOR THE ACQUISITION OF HOUSE-SITES.

The arrears at the commencement of the year amounted to Rs. 58,840 under principal and Rs. 38,417 under interest. A sum of Rs. 7,045 fell due under

principal during the year and another sum of Rs. 1,847 under interest, making the total demand for the year Rs. 65,885 under principal and Rs. 40,264 under interest.

The collections during the year amounted to Rs. 31,502 under principal, and Rs. 19,194 under interest against the arrears, and Rs. 2,464 under principal and Rs. 537 under interest against the current demand. The total collection during the year was Rs. 53,697 (Rs. 33,906 under principal and Rs. 19,731 under interest) against the total demand of Rs. 1,06,149 which works out to 50.6 per cent against 7.2 per cent during the year 1946-47.

The total amount outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 52,452 (Rs. 31,919 under principal and Rs. 20,533 under interest).

EDUCATION.

In the field of education the facilities provided as usual consisted of—

- (i) the maintenance of schools;
- (ii) the provision of scholarships, boarding grants and grants for the purchase of books and clothing and for payment of fees;
- (iii) the grant of stipends for the training of teachers;
- (iv) the maintenance of free hostels at important centres; and
- (v) the grant of financial assistance to private bodies engaged in the maintenance of hostels, schools, etc., for the benefit of the eligible communities.

SCHOOLS.

There was no change in the policy of the department in regard to the starting and maintenance of schools. Efforts were, however, made to make the existing schools more efficient and to utilize the finances of the Government to greater advantage by closing inefficient schools and starting new ones in places where they were needed.

Particulars relating to the labour schools in the several districts are given in Statement IV. At the beginning of the year, there were 1,148 schools. Fifty-nine schools were newly started and thirteen schools were closed. There were thus 1,194 schools working at the end of the year. All of them were day schools. Eighty-four thousand four hundred and thirty-two children consisting of 55,944 boys and 28,488 girls received education as against 77,674 children consisting of 50,538 boys and 27,136 girls in the previous year. The number of teachers employed was 2,469 of whom 2,432 were trained and 7 untrained. A sum of Rs. 1,06,918-3-5 was spent on the construction and repair of school buildings.

MIDDAY MEALS.

The supply of midday meals to pupils in all the labour schools in the Province was continued during the year. The Labour Department arranged for the supply in 1,173 out of 1,194 schools—through contractors in 957 schools and through the headmasters in 216 schools. In Madras City, the Corporation arranged the supply of midday meals in 4 out of 5 schools. The scheme of supply of midday meals could not be extended to the other labour schools as most of them were started late during the year. In some of the districts the contractors are unwilling to take up or renew contracts for the supply of meals at the rate of 1 anna 9 pies per meal fixed by the Government. The question of increasing the rate in those districts is under the consideration of Government.

The number of Harijan pupils fed at the close of the year in the Labour schools was 74,319 as against 71,541 in the previous year. The expenditure incurred on the supply of midday meals in the schools was Rs. 11,15,703-14-8 as against Rs. 10,48,978-0-0 during the previous year. The health and attendance of the pupils in the Labour schools in the Province have improved as a result of the supply of midday meals.

GOVERNMENT SECONDARY SCHOOL, MASULIPATAM.

In G.O. Ms. No. 3063, Development, dated 14th July 1947, the Government sanctioned the conversion of the school into a secondary school and accordingly Form IV was opened in the school during the year. Sri V. Ramjee Rao Pantulu continued to be the honorary correspondent of the school on an allowance of Rs. 100 per mensem. Pupils belonging to backward communities and caste Hindus were also admitted into the school and the prescribed school fees collected from them. There were 353 pupils on rolls during the year as against 284 in the previous year. Of these 189 were Harijans, 13 Christians (converts from Harijans), 147 Backward classes and caste Hindus and 4 Muslims. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 28,458-11-0 as against Rs. 19,980 in the previous year. A sum of Rs. 3,450-0-0 was collected as school fees and Rs. 238-4-0 by sale of the finished products of the vocational sections (tailoring, carpentry and leather) of the schools.

THE GOVERNMENT NANDANAR SECONDARY SCHOOL FOR BOYS, THE GOVERNMENT NANDANAR HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FOR GIRLS AT CHIDAMBARAM AND THE GOVERNMENT NANDANAR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FOR BOYS.

These institutions continued during the year to work under the supervision and control of the Collector of South Arcot.

The particulars regarding the strength of the pupils and teachers of the three schools during the year were :—

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the schools was Rs. 24,855-8-0 as against Rs. 16,412-12-0 in the previous year.

GOVERNMENT LABOUR SCHOOL AT HOOKER, NADUVATTAM, THE NILGIRIS DISTRICT.

The school continued to work satisfactorily under the control of the Superintendent, Government Cinchona Plantations, Naduvattam. The strength of the school was 80 as against 88 in the previous year.

During the year two more schools were started for the benefit of the children of the labourers at Dodabetta and Moyar. The strength of the schools was 35 and 25, respectively.

GOVERNMENT LABOUR SCHOOLS IN THE GOVERNMENT CINCHONA PLANTATIONS ANAMALAI, POLLACHI TALUK, COIMBATORE DISTRICT.

The three labour schools started by the Labour Department in the Cinchona Plantations, Anamalais, during the year 1945-46 continued to work under the supervision of the Superintendent, Government Cinchona Plantations. The strength of the three schools was 231 as against 846 in the previous year.

SERVANTS OF INDIA SOCIETY, AGRICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL, MAYANOR, TIRUCHIRAPPALLI DISTRICT.

The annual lump-sum grant to the servants of India Society towards the cost of maintenance of the school was increased from Rs. 2,300 to Rs. 3,500 with effect from the year 1947-48. The institution gives training in mat-weaving, dairy-farming, poultry-farming, etc. Fifteen pupils completed their course this year and appeared for the Elementary School-Leaving Certificate Examination.

GRANTS TO OTHER INSTITUTIONS FOR RUNNING SCHOOLS.

The following recurring grants were made during the year to private institutions or the maintenance of schools conducted by them for the benefit of eligible communities :—

SCHOLARSHIPS.

The grant of scholarships to the eligible communities proceeded on the usual lines. As in the previous years, separate allotments were provided in the budget for 1947-48 for granting scholarships to the Hindu members of the eligible communities and those who were converts to other religions.

Five thousand two hundred and seventy-seven non-residential scholarships for ordinary general education involving an expenditure of Rs. 98,303 were sanctioned during this year as against 5,236 scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 92,624 sanctioned in the previous year.

One hundred and fifty-four non-residential scholarships for students in the college classes (Hindus 115 and converts 39) involving an expenditure of Rs. 5,474 (Hindus Rs. 4,165 and converts Rs. 1,309) were sanctioned as against 94 non-residential scholarships (71 Hindus and 23 converts) involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,368-8-0 (Rs. 2,541 for Hindus and Rs. 827-8-0 for converts) in the previous year.

Three hundred and sixty-one residential scholarships as detailed below involving an expenditure of Rs. 72,634-8-0 (Rs. 59,227-8-0 for Hindus and Rs. 13,407 for converts) were granted during the year as against 322 residential scholarships (271 Hindus and 51 converts) involving an expenditure of Rs. 54,657 Rs. 45,676 for Hindus and Rs. 8,981 for converts) in the previous year.

In accordance with G.O. Ms. No. 1473, Development, dated 24th March 1948, the rates of the residential scholarships granted to the students of Arts and Science colleges and high schools during 1947-48 were increased in April 1948, so as to enable them to meet their full lodging and boarding charges involving an extra expenditure of Rs. 23,155.

The number of scholarships sanctioned for professional courses of study was 66 as detailed below involving an expenditure of Rs. 34,328 (Hindus Rs. 22,050-8-0 and converts Rs. 12,277-10-0) as against 66 scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 23,000 (Hindus Rs. 13,582 and converts Rs. 9,418), in the previous year.

The number of non-residential scholarships for professional courses of study was five (4 Hindus and 1 convert) involving an expenditure of Rs. 348 (Rs. 240 Hindus and Rs. 108 converts).

One pupil of the eligible community was granted a residential scholarship of Rs. 276 for compounding course this year.

In G.O. Ms. No. 2075, Development, dated 26th April 1948, the Government authorized the Commissioner of Labour to vary the rates of the residential scholarships sanctioned by the Labour Department to the students of B.T. or B.Ed. courses so as to enable them to meet their actual boarding and lodging charges with effect from the financial year 1948-49.

The number of scholarships granted for commercial courses of study in shorthand, typewriting and book-keeping was 10 (9 Hindus and 1 convert) involving an expenditure of Rs. 360 as against 9 scholarships (all Hindus) involving an expenditure of Rs. 324 in the previous year.

No grants were sanctioned in the following cases as there were no applications for them:—

(i) Scholarships for Physical Education course.

(ii) Stipends to Koya boys, for undergoing training in Practical Agriculture at the Agricultural Research Station, Anakapalle.

(iii) Grant to the Devadar Malabar Reconstruction Trust for running a demonstration plot in the Harijan colony at Gopalapuram, North Malabar.

(iv) Capitation grants to Konga Parayah boys in the M.M. Industrial School, Karur, Tiruchirappalli district.

Eight Hindu pupils of the Madras Seva Sadan were granted scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 1,200 as against eight scholarships for Hindu pupils involving an expenditure of Rs. 1,200 granted in the previous year.

Eighty-four industrial scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,949 were sanctioned as detailed below for courses of study in carpentry, cabinet-making, spinning and weaving, engraving, drawing, fitting, enamelling, blacksmithy, painting, knitting, electric-wiring, metal work, paper-making, etc., as against 79 scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,314 in the previous year.

Five Hindu pupils who successfully completed their courses of training with the help of the industrial scholarships were granted bonus involving an expenditure of Rs. 90 as against two Hindus involving an expenditure of Rs. 54 in the previous year.

No scholarships were granted for training as apprentice fitters in the Engineering Department of the Deccan Sugar and Abkari Co., Ltd., Samalkot apprenticeships in motor mechanism or for apprenticeship in the P.W.D. Workshops at Madras, Bezwada and Dowlaiswaram as there were no applications for these scholarships.

Fourteen scholarships (eight for the year 1947-48 and six for 1946-47) for Co-operative Training and Education involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,783 Rs. 3,473 for Hindus and Rs. 310 for converts) were granted to the pupils of the eligible communities studying in the Co-operative Training Institutes at Coimbatore, Rajahmundry, Tanjore and Anantapur with reference to G.O. Ms. No. 3,070 Development, dated 14th July 1947. In their Memo. No. 78334 P.-II/47, Development, dated 20th October 1947 the Government have permitted the Commissioner of Labour to utilize the unutilized scholarships of one institute for the award of scholarships in another institute from the year 1947-48 onwards, subject to the condition that the scholarships do not exceed eight in any particular year.

In Government Memo. No. 75967 P.-II/47-4, Development, dated 4th December 1947, the Government have ordered that the last date of receipt of applications for the scholarships should be postponed to 15th August from the school year 1948-49.

In G.O. Ms. No. 3070, Development, dated 19th March 1948, the Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to increase the value of the scholarships for Law Course by an amount equal to the actual tuition fee that the student concerned has to pay with effect from 1st April 1948.

In G.O. Ms. No. 1920, Development, dated 1st May 1947, the Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant non-residential scholarships of the value of Rs. 4 each to the pupils belonging to the eligible communities who are undergoing the apprentice physicians course in the school of Indian Medicine, and to convert these scholarships into residential scholarships in deserving cases.

In G.O. Ms. No. 2176, Development, dated 15th May 1947, the Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant every year two non-residential scholarships to the pupils belonging to the eligible communities for the

Diploma in Medical Radiology course and the certified Radiological Assistant's course and to convert these scholarships into residential scholarships in deserving cases.

In G.O. Ms. No. 4215, Development, dated 29th August 1947, the Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant non-residential scholarships to girl pupils belonging to the eligible communities who take up training courses in Music in the Madras University, Annamalai University and in the Madras Teachers' College of Music, and to convert these non-residential scholarships into residential scholarships in deserving cases.

In G.O. Ms. No. 1371, Development, dated 19th March 1948 the Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant non-residential scholarships to the pupils belonging to the communities eligible for help by the Labour Department, who take up the Overseer course in the College of Engineering, Guindy, and to convert these non-residential scholarships into residential scholarships in deserving cases at such rates as are adequate to cover the boarding and lodging charges of the student.

GRANTS TO SCHEDULED CASTE CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES.

A grant of Rs. 2,813 was sanctioned to 337 Scheduled Caste Co-operative societies selected by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Madras, to enable them to pay remuneration to persons employed in writing up their accounts (as against Rs. 2,996 sanctioned to 408 co-operative societies in the previous year).

CHARITABLE ENDOWMENTS.

1. *Critchley Salmonson Prize Fund.*—A sum of Rs. 41-9-0 was realized as interest from the fund. The amount was utilized for awarding a prize to a boarder of the Government Depressed Classes Hostel, Masulipatam.

2. *Gray Memorial Prize Endowment Fund.*—A sum of Rs. 15-13-0 was realized as interest from the fund and it was utilized for awarding prizes to four boarders of the Government Nandanar Hostels for Boys and Girls, Chidambaram.

HOSTELS CONDUCTED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

The Slater Hostel, Madras.

The Slater Hostel, Madras, is maintained by the Government for the students of the eligible communities taking up industrial courses in the City of Madras. Twenty-seven free boarders and 24 paying boarders were admitted into the hostel. A sum of Rs. 9,639 was spent on its maintenance as against Rs. 9,962 in 1946-47.

The Sundaracharlu Hostel, Salem.

This hostel continued to be under the supervision of the Stationary Sub-Magistrate, Salem town. The rate of the supplementary diet to the boarders has been increased from Rs. 3 to 5. The strength of the Hostel was increased from 30 to 76, selections were made by the District Advisory Committee. A sum of Rs. 6,300 was spent on its maintenance as against Rs. 4,800 in the previous year.

Government Nandanar Hostels for Boys and Girls, Chidambaram.

These hostels continued to be supervised by Swami A. S. Sahajananda, M.L.A., and controlled by the Collector of South Arcot. The sanctioned strength of 200 in the boys hostel and 92 in the girls hostel was maintained. The total expenditure on the maintenance of both the hostels was Rs. 34,594-15-7 as against Rs. 31,432-4-0 in 1946-47.

Government Harijan Hostel, Calicut.

This hostel continued to be under the supervision of the Collector of Malabar. The strength was raised to 30. There were 5 paying boarders. A sum of Rs. 5,908 was spent on its maintenance as against Rs. 5,378 in the previous year.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Masulipatam.

The hostel continued to be under the supervision of Sri V. Ramjee Rao who was also the Honorary Correspondent of the Government Secondary School, Masulipatam. The hostel was under the control of the Collector of Krishna assisted by the District Advisory Committee. In G.O. Ms. No. 2387, Development, dated 2nd July 1947, the

Government were pleased to increase the strength of the hostel from 75 to 110 during the year besides the one additional boarder a Burma evacuee. A sum of Rs. 23,621 was spent on the maintenance of the hostel as against Rs. 13,652 in the previous year. The health and discipline of the boarders were generally satisfactory.

Labour Hostel, Ootacamund, The Nilgiris District.

The Labour Hostel at Ootacamund was under the management of the Ootacamund Municipality assisted by an Advisory Committee, with the Collector of the Nilgiris as its ex-officio president. The strength of the hostel continued to be 17 up to December and was increased to 22 from January 1948. There were 4 paying boarders in the hostel during the year.

A Government grant of Rs. 3,760-8-0 was drawn during the year towards boarding grants for the free boarders and rent and honorarium for the Warden.

Labour Hostel, Mubbathalai, The Nilgiris District.

The Labour Hostel at Mubbathalai continued to be managed by the District Board, the Nilgiris, assisted by an Advisory Committee with the Revenue Divisional Officer, Coonoor, as the ex-officio president. There were 37 free boarders and six paying boarders in the hostel during the year. A sum of Rs. 7,395-2-0 was drawn by the hostel during the year towards boarding grants, rent and honorarium.

Harijan Hostel for Girls, Anantapur.

A hostel for girls was opened at Anantapur on 1st July 1947. It was financed by Government and managed by the District Harijan Sevak Sangh, with the help of a committee consisting of 5 members appointed by the Andhra Provincial Harijan Sevak Sangh and a paid matron. There were 15 boarders in the hostel on the average during the year. An expenditure of Rs. 3,283-10-3 was incurred on the maintenance of the hostel for the year.

Hostels subsidized by the Labour Department.

The policy of granting financial assistance to private bodies, such as the Harijan Sevak Sangh, the Servants of India Society, etc., towards the cost of maintenance of hostels and boarding homes conducted by them for the benefit of the communities eligible for help by the Labour Department was continued during the year. A list showing the names of such institutions, the amount and the number of boarding grants sanctioned during the year 1947-48 is given in Appendix B.

The Adi-Andhra Boarding Home, Atmakur, Kurnool district, was given a sum of Rs. 600 as usual, for the maintenance of the vocational sections of the home.

INDIVIDUAL BOARDING GRANTS.

Individual boarding grants at the rate of Rs. 15 each per mensem for ten months in the year were sanctioned to three hundred and fifty Hindus and ninety-six converts towards their boarding and lodging charges in the various boarding homes and hostels maintained by private bodies throughout the Province.

Special boarding grants for providing boarding and lodging facilities to deserving pupils of the eligible communities studying in high schools and whose parents or guardians were residents of the Madras City were granted to 20 pupils at the rate of Rs. 15 each per mensem for ten months in the year in the various boarding homes and hostels maintained by private bodies in the Madras City.

BOARDING GRANTS TO TODA PUPILS IN THE NILGIRIS DISTRICT.

Boarding grants at the rate of Rs. 15 each per mensem for ten months in the year, were sanctioned to fifteen pupils (boys).

THE ABSTRACT OF GRANTS.

The annual grant of Rs. 900 sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No. 790, P.W.D. dated 21st March 1948, to the Gokulam Method Village Welfare Association, Madras, for the welfare work done in three movable centres—Govindarajapuram Centre, Valapuram Centre and Echur Welfare Centre, was paid during the year.

CONSTRUCTION OF WELLS AND PROVISION OF SANITARY AMENITIES.

Particulars of the number of wells, etc., constructed and repaired in the various districts are given in Statement V. The work was carried out by the special Labour staff appointed in districts. The total expenditure incurred on the construction and repairs of wells was Rs. 3,09,795-7-0 as against Rs. 3,00,362 in the previous year. In Guntur district, burial-ground was provided in one village at a cost of Rs. 152-11-9. A gravel road and a wooden bridge were provided in West Godavari district at a cost of Rs. 1874 in all for the use of the Harijans. In North Arcot district a burial-ground was provided for Harijans in one case at a cost of Rs. 170-3-2 and a pathway in another case at a cost of Rs. 120-12-0.

MADRAS CITY.

The Personal Assistant to the Commissioner of Labour continued to be in charge of the work connected with the provision of civic amenities and sanitary improvements for the members of the eligible communities in the City of Madras. Supervision of labour schools, construction and repair of school buildings were also attended to by him. He was assisted by a special overseer.

A sum of Rs. 29,825 was spent during the year on the provision of civic amenities, sanitary improvements and construction of model houses in the labour colonies in the Madras City and a sum of Rs. 600 was spent on improvements and repairs to school buildings.

SCHOOL-WORKS.

1 Repair to the Kannigapuram Labour Day School, Vyasarpady .. RS. AS. PS. 600 0 0

A sum of Rs. 1,020 was collected as rent from the occupants in the Brislee Nagar Settlement. A sum of Rs. 578 was outstanding on 31st March 1948. Steps are being taken to realize the arrears.

The construction of 37 huts in R.S. No. 1847/2 of Tondiarpet has been completed and the huts have been allotted to the evictees of Katterithottam on a rental basis.

The tenements in Ganesapuram, Perambur, were constructed at Government cost and given to the members of the eligible communities on condition that they should repay the cost of the tenements in equated monthly instalments spread over a period of fifteen years from 1st April 1926. The time-limit for the repayment of the loans expired on 31st March 1941. The balance due from the occupants of the tenements was Rs. 24,646-11-9 towards principal and Rs. 23,527-2-7 towards interest. In G.O. No. 3240, Development, dated 24th July 1947, the Government ordered (1) that the entire balance due from the occupants should be written off; (2) that the house-sites and superstructure thereon should be resumed and taken possession of by the Government for non-payment of the arrears of loan, the loan instalments so far paid by the Government being forfeited to Government; (3) that monthly rents ranging from Rs. 1-8-0 to Rs. 2-8-0- according to the sizes of the huts should be levied with effect from 1st July 1947, the existing occupants being permitted to remain in the tenements as tenants; and (4) that immediate repairs to the tenements may be carried out at a cost of Rs. 7,630 and that in future the expenditure on annual maintenance of the tenements should be limited to the income derived from the tenants by way of rent. The Collector of Madras reports that no rent has been collected from the occupants from 1st July 1947.

PERUNDURAI COLONIES, COIMBATORE DISTRICT.

No loans were sanctioned to the colonists during the year. No other expenditure was also sanctioned for the colony during the year.

NAYADI COLONY, OLAVAKKOT, MALABAR DISTRICT.

The Nayadi Colony and the Labour school attached to it functioned satisfactorily during the year. A sum of Rs. 511 was spent during the year for the annual and special repairs to the colony huts, temples and the school buildings in the colony.

The waste lands in the colony and the poramboke lands measuring about 6.35 acres leased to the settlers free of rent were cultivated by them with paddy, topioca, etc. The settlers supplemented their income from the lands by doing cooly work outside the colony. Fourteen children of the colony received education in the Labour school attached to the colony. The pupils were also given practical training in agriculture by the headmaster of the school who is a trained Agricultural Instructor. They were paid boarding grants at the rate of Rs. 4 each per mensem. The Nayadi settlers were provided with a pair of buffaloes at a cost of Rs. 400 in accordance with G.O. Ms. No. 3851, Development, dated 30th July 1947.

In G.O. No. 5057, Development, dated 31st October 1947, sanction was accorded to the introduction of cottage industries in the Nayadi colony at a cost of Rs. 670. The settlers are given training in bee-keeping, spinning, bamboo mat-weaving and poultry farming. Equipments and articles required for the cottage industries referred to were supplied to the colonists at a cost of Rs. 450. In pursuance of the Government Order referred to above, eight Nayadi students who studied in the Higher Elementary School outside the colony are being paid boarding grants at the rate of Rs. 4 each from November 1947. A sum of Rs. 2,186-2-0 was spent in all on the colony during the year. The total expenditure incurred since the formation of the colony came to Rs. 33,020-14-10.

ASSIGNMENT OF LANDS.

Particulars regarding the extent of land reserved for assignment and assigned for cultivation are given in Statement VI. The ban imposed by the Government on the permanent assignment of lands reserved for the communities eligible for help by the Labour Department for the duration of the war continued during the year. The percentage of inspections to the number of assignments was 80 and over in nine districts.

In pursuance of Government Memorandum No. 1308-P. 11/47-1, (Development), dated 10th January 1947, the reasons for the non-cultivation of lands assigned in the several districts were ascertained from the Collectors and a report was submitted to Government through the Board of Revenue on the measures to be undertaken to enable the assignees to make better use of the lands.

In East Godavari district a total extent of 3,672.41 acres was leased out to eligible communities since the introduction of the Grow More Food Scheme and an extent of 5,678.42 acres of land was leased out to the registered societies composed of Adi-Andhras and Adi-Andhra Christians for a total rental of Rs. 1,88,603-8-2 during fasli 1357.

GENERAL.

Though legislation to remove all the social disabilities under which the Harijans were suffering has been provided by the Madras Removal of Civil Disabilities (Amendment) Act XI of 1947 (amending the Removal of Civil Disabilities Act XXI of 1938), and the Madras Temple Entry Authorization Act V of 1947, it cannot be said that the Harijans, especially those in rural areas, have developed the sense of equality to the extent necessary to assert their civic rights. It is hoped that the measures suggested by the Provincial Harijan Welfare Committee will enable them to do so in the not distant future.

In Tiruchirappalli district a hotel-keeper refused to allow a Harijan into his hotel. The hotel-keeper was charge-sheeted by the Police and was fined Rs. 10 by the Additional First-class Magistrate under section 6 of the Removal of Civil Disabilities Act.

In Nellore district several of the wells exclusively used by the caste Hindus were thrown open to the Harijans.

Labour department—Eligible communities—Amelioration—Administration report—1947-48—Reviewed.

READ—the following paper :—

From the Commissioner of Labour, dated 22nd September 1948, No. A-2-Pdl.-86/48.

Order—No. 67, Firka Development, dated 21st January 1949.

Recorded.

2. The Provincial Harijan Welfare Committee which was constituted in 1947 has since submitted its report to Government and its recommendations are under consideration.

One of the recommendations of the Committee in regard to the removal of civil disabilities, is that village vigilance committees should be constituted in a few places to watch closely, the difficulties to which the Harijans are subjected and if possible, to bring about a settlement of their disputes or to report the matter to the District Harijan Welfare Officer concerned. The Government have accepted the recommendation and directed the constitution of such committees. The Government have also issued instructions to all heads of departments and Collectors to see that Officers visit as many cheris as possible during their tours and draw the attention of the Collectors to the difficulties and disabilities experienced by Harijans and to any grievance in regard to the implementation of Harijan Welfare schemes.

The Government have impressed on all Collectors and other District Officers the necessity to take adequate interest to settle amicably and speedily all differences arising in villages between Harijans and Caste Hindus out of communal ill-feelings in the larger interests of the people and of good administration.

The Government have nominated the District Health Officers as additional members of the District Harijan Welfare Committees to advise the committees especially on subjects relating to public health matters. They have also nominated the District Educational Officers as additional members of the District Harijan Welfare Committees to advise the committees on matters relating to educational matters.

3. Provision of house-sites.—During the year under review 441 house-sites covering an extent of 24.39 acres of land as against 589 house-sites covering an extent of 34.34 acres in the previous year, were provided by assignment of Government lands in the various districts. Six hundred and twenty-six house-sites were provided by acquisition of private lands as against 444 in the previous year. The Commissioner of Labour should take effective steps to recover the arrears of loans granted to individuals for the acquisition of house-sites.

4. *Assignment of land for cultivation.*—The ban imposed by Government on the assignment of land reserved for Harijans for the duration of the war continued during the year under review. The reasons for the non-cultivation of land assigned in the several districts have been ascertained by the Commissioner of Labour and the report from the Board of Revenue is awaited in the matter.

5. *Education.*—There were 1,148 schools at the beginning of the year. Fifty-nine schools were newly started and 13 schools were closed during the year. There was considerable improvement in the number of children who received instruction in these Labour schools, the total number being 84,432. The number of teachers employed was 2,469 of whom 2,462 were trained and 7 untrained. During the year under review a sum of Rs. 1,06,918 was spent on the construction and repair of school buildings.

During the year under review, midday meals were supplied by the department in 1,173 schools out of 1,194. In Madras City, the Corporation arranged for the supply of midday meals in four out of five Labour schools. In some of the districts, the contractors for midday meals complained of inadequate rates. The question of increasing the rates in those districts is under consideration of Government. The expenditure incurred by the department on the supply of midday meals during the year under review was Rs. 11,15,704.

The Government have authorized the Commissioner of Labour to vary with effect from 1948-49 the rates of residential scholarships to the students of eligible communities for B.T. and B.Ed. courses, to enable them to meet their actual boarding and lodging charges. They have sanctioned eight scholarships to Harijan students for four institutions. The Commissioner of Labour has been empowered to utilize the unutilized scholarships from one institute to another from the year 1947-48 onwards, subject to the condition that the number of scholarships does not exceed eight in any year. The Government have empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant non-residential scholarships of the value of Rs. 4 each to pupils of eligible communities who are undergoing the apprentice physician course in the School of Indian Medicine and to convert these scholarships into residential scholarships in deserving cases. Two non-residential scholarships are awarded for Diploma in Medical Radiology course and the certified Radiological Assistant's course which scholarships are also being granted to pupils who take up training courses in Music in the Madras University, Annamalai University and the Teachers' Training College, Madras, and the Commissioner of Labour has been empowered to convert those into residential scholarships in deserving cases. The Government have also empowered the Commissioner of Labour to grant non-residential scholarships to students who take up the Overseer course in the College of Engineering, Guindy, and to convert these into residential scholarships in deserving cases at such rates as are adequate to cover the boarding and lodging charges of the students.

The Government have fixed 15th August as the last date for the receipt of applications for scholarships from the eligible communities, in the office of the Commissioner of Labour, so as to provide all reasonable facilities to the applicants and the managements of educational institutions to submit the applications within all date prescribed.

Exemptions from payment of examination fees of the total value of Rs. 5,425 was sanctioned to 403 pupils appearing for the various examinations as against 400 involving an expenditure of Rs. 4,795 last year. The Commissioner of Labour has granted repayable advances for the payment of examination fees to the students of eligible communities involving an expenditure of Rs. 832.

6. *Boarding grants.*—A sum of Rs. 5,35,051 was spent on boarding grants and other grants as against the sum of Rs. 3,43,740 in the previous year. A sum of Rs. 2,995 was spent for the welfare work of the eligible communities from the allotment of Rs. 3,000 under discretionary grant.

7. *Maintenance of hostels.*—The department is maintaining one hostel (the Slater Hostel for the students of eligible communities taking up Industrial courses) in the City of Madras; the following eight hostels are also maintained by the department in the districts:—

- (1) The Sundarachariu Hostel, Salem.
- (2) & (3) The Government Nandanar Hostel for Boys and Girls at Chidambaram.
- (4) The Government Harijan Hostel, Calicut.
- (5) Do. Masulipatam.
- (6) The Labour Hostel, Ootacamund, the Nilgiri district.
- (7) Do. Hubbathalai, the Nilgiri district.
- (8) Harijan Hostel for Girls at Anantapur.

Admissions to all the hostels are open to Hindu members of the eligible communities.

The department subsidized during the year, 148 hostels and orphanages, etc., maintained by private agencies for the benefit of the eligible communities by sanctioning a total sum of Rs. 5,15,325 as against Rs. 2,49,285 in the previous year. Individual boarding grants were also sanctioned to 350 Hindu pupils of the eligible communities and 96 Christian converts in other boarding houses and hostels maintained by private bodies throughout the Province. Special boarding grants were granted to 20 pupils at the rate of Rs. 15 per mensem for ten months in the boarding homes and hostels maintained by private bodies in the Madras City.

The total expenditure during the year on education amounted to Rs. 36,42,050 as against Rs. 31,32,504 during the previous year.

8. *Provision of wells and sanitary amenities.*—A sum of Rs. 29,825 was spent during the year under review, on the provision of civic amenities, sanitary improvements and construction of model houses in the Labour colonies in Madras City.

9. *Other activities of Government.*—A sum of Rs. 1,020 was collected as rent from the occupants in the Brislee Nagar settlement. The rental scheme of the Brislee Nagar settlement continued to work. The construction of 37 huts in Tondiarpet has been completed and the huts have been allotted to those evicted from Katteri thottam on a rental basis. The Government have ordered the writing off of the entire balance of the loan of Rs. 48,174 due from the occupants of the tenements in Ganesapuram colony and the resumption of the house-sites and the superstructures. They have also ordered the introduction of the cottage industries in the Nayadi colony, Malabar, and have sanctioned a sum of Rs. 670 for the purpose.

The Government have set apart a sum of rupees one lakh in the budget for 1948-49 for the amelioration of the conditions of the backward classes, as distinct from Harijans, by granting scholarships to students reading in the college classes and high schools. The Government have authorized the Commissioner of Labour to set apart 75 per cent of the sum of one lakh of rupees for grant of scholarships to deserving students of backward classes studying in Arts and Professional Colleges including Law and the balance for grant of scholarships to the deserving students.

of backward classes studying in high schools, preference being given to women students. The constitution of a Standing Advisory Committee to advise Government on matters relating to the amelioration of the conditions of the backward communities, is under consideration of the Government.

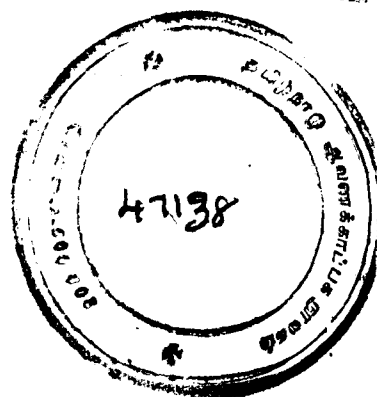
