ADMINISTRATION REPORT OF THE STATE
BROADCASTING DEPARTMENT FOR THE YEAR 1949-50.

Introduction—With 31st March 1950, it is now twelve years since the State Broadcasting Department was formed and has kept up a steady and continuous expansion of service from year to year.

2. As usual the department has continued to install and maintain rural and municipal radio receiver sets in the Madras State. It also assisted the other departments of the Government like the Police, Publicity, Rural Welfare, Public Health, Fisheries, Jails, etc., in installing and maintaining their own wireless equipment.

3. The 500 Radio Receiver sets purchased under the sanction of Government in G.O. No. 1502, dated 29th April 1948, were completely tested, modified and 340 sets of these were installed in rural centres in the year. A special staff of the Assistant Radio Engineer and two Radio Supervisors were employed on this work.

4. The experimental scheme of assembling 20 departmental community receiver sets was completed. Seventeen of these sets were installed in various centres in the Madras, Tiruchirappalli and Vijayavada zones. A comparative and detailed study was made of the performance of this type of departmental set with the other community receiver sets purchased from the market and it was found that the performance of these departmental sets was as good as those of domestic type receivers of similar rating. They had the additional features required by the department, such as, low cost, robust cabinet and chassis to withstand rough transport, simplicity of construction, roomy layout of the components for easy and quick servicing, etc. None of these sets working in the field had given any trouble. One set was also sent to the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, Delhi, and the results of the tests conducted by them corroborated those obtained in this department.

5. The permanent loud speaker equipment installed by this department in Rajaji Hall is being utilized by the public for the functions that take place there. The equipment is maintained by the department.

6. (a) The two Research Assistants who were working on the Electrolytic condenser scheme and the Lead acid battery scheme of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research completed their research and the two schemes were closed on 31st August 1949.

(b) The research on loud speakers was continued during the year under review.

7. *Propaganda vans*.—The 16 propaganda vans in the districts with all their equipment were continued to be maintained by this department during the year under report. A preliminary inspection of all the equipment in the vans to ascertain their present condition was made and as some of the equipments were found to be too old and uneconomical to service and maintain, recommendations were made for replacing six numbers of old 35 m.m. projectors with new 16 m.m. sound projectors and 9 numbers of generating sets with new ones. Sanction for the above purchase was received in March and the equipments were purchased.

Government also sanctioned the purchase of 24 sets of Public Address system equipments for installation in the vans. As there were only 16 propaganda vans working in the districts excluding the city of Madras, 16 sets of equipments only were purchased. After necessary modifications, the equipments are being arranged to be installed in the vans.

Tirunelveli District Propaganda van was also taken up for maintenance by the department from 1st October 1949. South Arcot District Propaganda van was condemned and the van is to be auctioned. North Arcot District Propaganda van is at the Government coach building factory at Chromepet for the rebuilding of the body.

8. The department participated in the Exhibition organized by the Tamil Nad Congress Committee at Teynampet and also in the Exhibition conducted by the Radio Merchants' Association at Madras. Various statistical charts and diagrams on the work carried out by this department were exhibited and explained to the public who evinced keen interest on the subject. Working models of electronic piano, transmission and reception of radio waves with visual representation by means of cathode ray oscillographs, a working model of wire broadcasting system wired in a model layout of a town were also exhibited.

II. *Staff and establishment.*—(a) The two posts of leave reserve Radio Supervisors sanctioned first during 1947-48 were continued during this year. The three posts of junior van supervisors sanctioned in October 1948 were also continued during the year under review.

(b) Special staff of 1 Technical Assistant, 1 Radio Supervisor, 2 wiring fitters, 2 workshop fitters and 2 carpenters sanctioned in G.O. No. 3044, P.W., dated 24th August 1948, in connection with the assembling of 20 numbers radio sets in the departmental laboratories was continued in G.O. Ms. No. 1410, P.W., dated 20th April 1949, up to 16th May 1949. One post of Technical Assistant and one post of Radio Supervisor were sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No. 2389, P.W., dated 4th August 1949, for period of 2 months from date of appointment for work connected with the detailed test of the 20 radio receivers assembled in Radio Engineer's laboratory as also the sample sets assembled in other firms and sent for test.

(c) The following staff were also sanctioned during the year for the purposes noted against each:

- (1) Radio Supervisors ... Sanctioned up to end of 1949-50 for maintenance of lease lend sets installed from 1st January 1947 to 31st March 1949. (d) One post of Radio Supervisor for testing components, etc., in Radio Engineer's laboratory was sanctioned for a period of six months from 23rd August 1949 in the first instance and continued up to end of the year under review in G.O. No. 2925, P.W., dated 6th August 1949, and G.O. Ms. No. 694, dated 22nd February 1950.

(e) The following additional ministerial staff were sanctioned for clearance of arrears of work in Radio Engineer's Office:—

(h) Deputation of Sri C. Satyanarayana Rao, Radio Supervisor of the State Broadcasting Department to the Visakhapatnam Municipality, was extended for a further period of one year from 4th August 1949 in G.O. No. 3729, P.W., dated 7th October 1949.

(i) The post of one Battery Mechanic which has been in existence from 4th September 1947 was also continued during the year due to continued and increased work in the Battery Section of the Workshop.

(j) The Research Assistant who joined duty in January 1949 for the Industrial Research Scheme on the design and construction of loud speakers, continued his research work with his staff of one Workshop Assistant and Instrument Mechanic under the supervision and guidance of the Radio Engineer.

The above list excludes the staff specifically sanctioned for the execution of special works mentioned above and also the skilled labourers like carpenters and the menials like sweeper, watchmen and gardener, etc.

(m) The services of 34 Radio Supervisors were regularized during the year. Proposals for making certain posts permanent (in addition to those already made permanent as per G.Os. No. 1286, P.W., dated 5th May 1944, and Ms. No. 2272, P.W., dated 23rd August 1946) were submitted in January 1950 in accordance with instructions contained in G.O. No. 780, Finance, dated 19th July 1949, on this subject. The matter is under correspondence.

(n) Twelve Radio Supervisors were selected by the Madras Public Service Commission during the year and they were appointed by the department.

(o) Two Research Schemes carried out in this laboratory under the auspices of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research and the respective staff sanctioned for them were continued till 31st August 1949.

The steady annual increase in the above figures will clearly indicate the steady and progressive expansion of the department.

III. Field staff.—(a) (i) The five Assistant Radio Engineers in the mufassa were continued this year also with their major servicing laboratories. Some more laboratory equipments like Rider Chanalyst, Cathode ray oscilloscopes, etc., were supplied this year to each of these circle major servicing laboratories.

(ii) *Laboratory and workshop.*—Major servicing of radio sets and allied equipments were continued to be attended to in these circle laboratories. The usual and routine work of servicing the amplifiers, petrol generators, battery chargers, vibrator triller units, meters, rewinding of transformers of various types (viz., output, input, driver, vibrator, etc.) and L.F. Chokes, reconing of loud speakers, centering and replacing of speakers, capacity test on batteries and general tests, etc., were carried out in these laboratories during the year. Thirteen new service stations were opened this year with the appointment of 13 Radio Supervisors and 13 Battery Transport Peons as detailed elsewhere in this report.

(b) *Maintenance of radio receivers.*—Transport difficulties continued to be felt during this year also. There has been no change in the method of maintenance of both the mains operated as well as battery operated radio sets. The maintenance of the two sets in the East Godavari Agency area, viz., Dummagudem and Venkatapuram, has since been revived on the undertaking of the East Godavari Agency District Board authorities to provide transport facilities.

(c) The rate of maintenance charges for the rural and municipal radio sets remained the same this year also, viz., Rs. 90 per set per year in the case of sets in panchayat boards and Rs. 120 (exclusive of cost of components used) per year irrespective of the number of sets and type of equipment maintained in the case of municipal installations.

(d) With the developments of certain major panchayat boards bordering on cities and townships, larger audiences had to be provided with the amenity of radio reception and to meet these necessities, amplifiers were installed in conjunction with the radio sets in these panchayat boards where the electricity is available.

(e) The rates of maintenance charges for sets installed in district board or municipal schools only are Rs. 90 per year per set. If in a municipality radio sets are installed both in public places and schools, the usual rate of Rs. 120 per annum is collected as in the case of maintenance of radio equipment in the municipalities. Applications from a large number of district boards and municipal schools are being received and sets are being installed in them. The installation of radio receivers in all the schools in the Province has become a necessity now as listening to the broadcast school programmes had now become part of school curriculum. Estimates for installing the sets in all Government and aided schools in the province are furnished to the Director of Public Instruction and the matter is under consideration by Government.

(f) A large number of battery-operated sets were installed in remote villages under the rural development scheme. The District Collectors financed half the cost of installation out of their discretionary grants, the other half being met by the village panchayat boards or private bodies. Orders granting similar concessions to villages for installing main sets also were expected from the Government. Eighteen more sets were installed under the Prohibition Amelioration Scheme during the year under review thus bringing the total number of prohibition sets installed to 30. A battery set was installed at the Marine Biological Station, Crusadai Island, on 25th May 1949. Another set is proposed to be installed at Amindivi Islands off the West Coast.

(g) (i) The following major panchayat boards were constituted into municipalities during the current year :—

(ii) The radio sets in Pudukottai Municipality were taken for maintenance by this department from 1st June 1949.

(h) The department continued to maintain His Excellency the Governor's P.A. equipment for providing loud speaker arrangements at meetings presided over by His Excellency the Governor of Madras, the Hon'ble Ministers and other high

officials of the Government and hire charges of Rs. 10 together with the actual expenses incurred by the department in installing the system are being collected from the respective parties arranging these meetings, etc.

(i) *Transmission of Programmes.*—Besides the existing short wave transmitter at Madras and the medium wave transmitters at Tiruchirappalli and Vijayavada, one more medium wave transmitter at Kozhikode also was installed by the All-India Radio. With the installation of Kozhikode transmitter the service to Malayalam linguistic area has considerably improved with satisfaction to listeners in Malabar district.

(j) *Rural radio programme and programme planning.*—The planning of rural radio programmes continued to be done by the All-India Radio authorities at the above three stations. The programme and technical reports of these broadcasts collected by this department from the various centres were continued to be forwarded to them through the Government. This department furnished All-India Radio, Madras, Vijayavada and Kozhikode stations with reception data regarding Radio Broadcasts from these stations with the help of network of field service stations in the State. The quarterly conference of the heads of nation building departments were not held during this year also. The suggestions of the Special Officer, State Broadcasting, on the improvement of broadcasting facilities in the State were duly considered and are being given effect to as far as possible.

(k) *Working hours of the rural sets.*—There has been no change in the working hours of the rural sets. But the concessions granted by the Government as an experimental measure in G.O. No. 621, dated 22nd February 1949, permitting the sets to be tuned to the concert programmes, was changed into a permanent one in F.O. Ms. No. 4134, P.W., dated 8th November 1949. Accordingly, the community sets are allowed to work till 9 p.m. once a fortnight in the case of battery operated sets and twice a fortnight in the case of mains operated sets. Sets tuned to Madras Short Wave and Vijayavada are permitted to be tuned for a continuous period of 2 hours between 6 and 8-30 p.m. daily.

(l) (i) *Propaganda Vans of the Prohibition (Amelioration) Department.*—The 6 propaganda vans with all their equipments were continued to be maintained by his department during the year under report. The equipments are periodically inspected and over-hauled and serviced whenever necessary, by the special staff of three Junior Van Supervisors.

(ii) *The Rural Reconstruction Vans of the Tanjore District Board* were also continued to be maintained by this department.

(m) *Service rendered to other departments.*—The services and technical advice of this department were sought by other sister-departments such as Prohibition (Amelioration), Education, Public Health, Women's Welfare, etc., of the Madras State.

The radio sets in the various Health Units of the Public Health Department were serviced by this department.

(n) *Assistance to radio industry, wireless trade and technical education.*—The department continued to conduct standard tests on radio equipment and accessories on payment of prescribed fee and on requisition by various firms.

IV. *Battery section.*—New 6 volts lead acid batteries in uncharged condition are purchased and are initially filled and charged in the battery section. More than 500 new batteries have been initially filled and charged during this year in addition to the routine examination and servicing of defective batteries. Consequent on the above procedure an appreciable saving has been effected on the cost of initial filling and charging of batteries alone. Proposals are under consideration for having a permanent battery mechanic with necessary assistance and a well-equipped battery section.

V. *Accommodation for Central Workshop, Laboratory and Office.*—The Central Offices of the Radio Engineer at Madras which had hitherto been accommodated in two different buildings in Kilpauk were shifted to a more spacious building "Fallow Field", No. 53, Peters Road, Cathedral P.O., Madras-6, from the 12th December 1949. This building was taken on lease by this department for a period of five years in the first instance with the prospect of extending the lease period. This building is centrally situated and is easily accessible from all parts of the city. Consequently the six rooms in the Government Branch Press Buildings, temporarily occupied by this Department to store the 500 sets and other stores have since been vacated and handed over back to the Public Works Department.

The Office and Laboratory of the Assistant Radio Engineer, III Circle at Madras, and the office and service station of the Radio Supervisor, Headquarters, Madras, are now accommodated in the building "Green Hall", Kilpauk, Madras.

VI. *Installation of sets.*—Eleven sets of private bodies, local bodies and panchayat boards were taken over by this Department for maintenance on their request owing to their inability to maintain them by themselves. Twelve sets were withdrawn during the year for various reasons. Out of the 500 battery receivers purchased during the year, 340 were installed during the year. The remaining sets are expected to be installed before July 1950. There is still a very great demand for installation of sets in several centres.

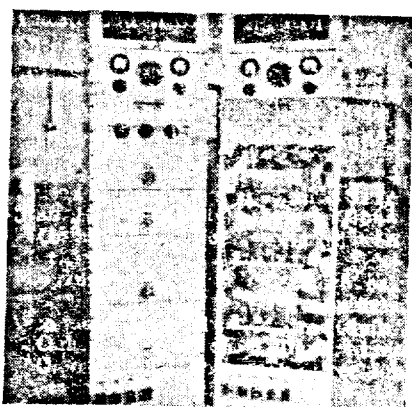
VII. *Research.*—(a) *State.*—(i) One non-stipendiary student was working on Intermediate frequency transformers and amplifier circuit. A suitable test amplifier for work in this connexion has been assembled by the research student.

(ii) One non-stipendiary research student was engaged on the design and construction of a wireless transmitter for use in the Amateur Radio Station of this Department. The various sections such as modulator, amplifier, etc., have been completed and the work is in progress.

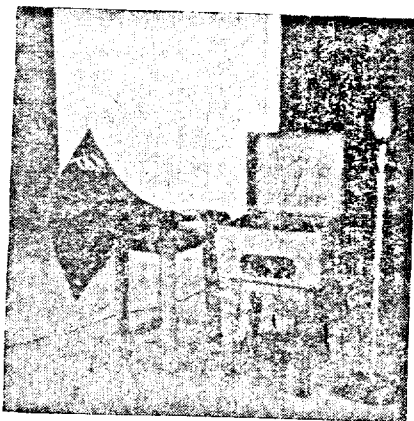
(iii) *Loud speaker.*—Another Research Assistant working on loud speakers had also progressed well in his work. A pulp beater for the making of loud speaker cones on a small production scale has been designed and the manufacture of the same was taken up. As the commercially available High H. permeameter for the measurement of flux density, and other magnetic characteristics of different steels and alloys was prohibitively costly and there was difficulty in importing one from foreign market, one permeameter was designed and finished in the Research section under the guidance of the Radio Engineer. With this instrument, a suitable alloy of steel can be chosen for the making of efficient loud speaker magnets. The equipment will be also useful for the correct choice of magnet steel for measuring instruments and meters.

Research work on this scheme is in progress.

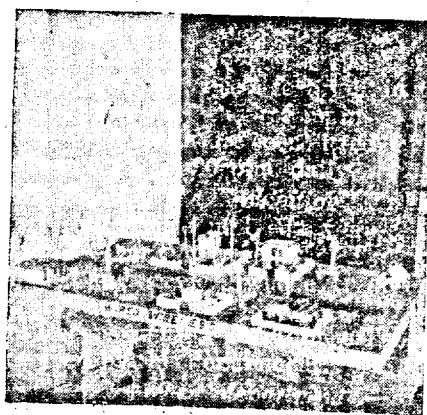
(b) *Council of Scientific and Industrial Research.*—The investigation schemes on the electrolytic condensers and lead acid batteries were completed as per the initial programme. A further scheme for manufacturing electrolytic condensers

on a semi-industrial scheme to assess the feasibility for manufacture of electrolytic condensers on an industrial scale has been submitted to the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research for sanction. It is under the consideration of the Radio Research Committee, New Delhi.

The Laboratory of the State Broadcasting Department, in view of their continued activities in the field research, have been able to contribute useful articles in Technical journals for publication.

VIII. Public address equipment in the Madras Legislative and Council Chambers.—A comprehensive improvement to the existing Public Address equipment in the Assembly Hall at a cost of Rs. 40,500 was sanctioned in G.O. No. 2633, P.W., dated 15th July 1949. The number of microphones was proposed to be increased from 25 to 69 so that all the Hon'ble Members of the Legislature may have the facility of speaking from their respective seats. The relay equipment used for automatically connecting the microphones to the amplifiers was proposed to be replaced by a new one having the required capacity. Different types of sample relays were tested in this connexion and all the preliminary grounds in carrying out the improvements have been covered.

Two additional loud speakers were installed in the Assembly Hall to enable the press reporters to follow the proceedings clearly.

Sliding arrangements specially designed by the Department were provided for four microphones in the Legislative Council Hall. Four additional microphones were also installed in the Council, bringing the total installed to 12.

The equipment both in the Assembly and Council Chambers have been giving satisfactory performance during the year.

IX. Radio installations in the Government House, Mount Road, Madras.—The radio set with the amplifier and the permanent Public Address equipment installed in the Rajaji Hall and Government House at Mount Road was continued to be maintained by this Department.

X. Wire-broadcasting system.—During the year under report, wire broadcasting systems were installed in Pollachi (in Coimbatore district) and Kurnool. The wire broadcasting system working in Masulipatnam Municipality in Krishna district was extended by the addition of twelve more speakers to the system. The wire broadcasting systems in Visakhapatnam, Eluru, Periyakulam and Kancheepuram Municipalities, Tungabhadra Project, Tambaram T.B. Sanatorium and Villivakkam Panchayat Board, and Allinagaram continued to be under the maintenance of this department.

XI. Dissemination of correct news and useful information among the people in the villages.—As before, the department took special interests in arranging for the working of the radio sets for extra hours during the Republic Day celebrations and other important functions, thus enabling the rural audience to get utmost benefit out of this kind of amenity. As usual the rural programmes were also kept up to the needs of the rural public.

XII. Programme of work in the following year.—(i) The installation of 500 receivers which was commenced in the current year is expected to be completed by July 1950.

(ii) Assembly on a larger scale of the special type of community radio receiver designed by the Department and twenty numbers of which had been designed on an experimental scale, is expected to be taken up.

(iii) Installation of special type wire broadcasting installations is expected to be carried out widely in more centres in the State.

(iv) Special problems of immediate interest to the department will be tackled in the research section.

Future of the department.—Listening to radio broadcasts for education and recreation through community radio centres in the villages has come to stay in this State. More than 1,500 community rural radio centres are being used in the State now. Hundreds of new villages are applying to the department for installation of sets.

The department has been able to render useful service to other sister departments who carry on certain specialized propaganda work using publicity equipments. This has been especially so in the case of Prohibition (Amelioration), Department of Public Instruction and Department of Public Health. It is expected that more propaganda vans will be shortly put into service by the Department of Prohibition (Amelioration) in the districts where there are none now. The work of equipping these vans with audio-visual education and propaganda equipments such as film projectors, radio receivers, amplifiers, etc., will be carried out by this department economically and efficiently.

It is understood that the Department of Public Instruction is contemplating a scheme of large-scale installation of radio receivers in all the schools in the State to encourage the students to listen to educational broadcasts. Necessary estimates have been furnished for installing special low cost community radio receivers designed in this departmental laboratory so that the cost of these installations may be as low as possible to enable even the smallest school to afford to have such an amenity. It is expected when the scheme materializes, this department will install these sets and maintain them subsequently, economically and efficiently.

It is also under contemplation under the adult education scheme to install a large number of community radio receivers in the Adult Education Centres. It is expected that this department would install and maintain these sets under this scheme in various Adult Education Centres in the State at economical cost.

The Department of Public Health have schemes for disseminating correct information to the public in the villages through specially equipped publicity vans on sanitation, public health and other variety of subjects of importance. It is also expected that the technical equipments necessary for these publicity vans will be installed and maintained by this department economically and efficiently.

In addition to the various Government departments, other local bodies like district boards and municipalities have found from experience that they could obtain expert advice on installation and maintenance of special publicity equipments for large-scale works such as wire broadcasting installations, audio-visual equipments, etc., at economical cost. A large number of local bodies has come forward for such installations through this department. It is expected that during the course of the year 1950-51 special works to the value of Rs. 1 lakh may be carried out by this department. Various private bodies (such as co-operative societies, banks, devasthanams, etc., have realized the usefulness of expert advice offered by the department in the matter of installation of radio receivers, amplifiers, publicity equipments, etc., and have requested the department to install projectors, amplifiers, etc., in their respective premises in large numbers. There has been a remarkable increase in the demand for community sets from panchayat boards during this year and it is expected that the demand will continue in the next year also and the installations may be carried out at the rate of 500 sets annually.

It is hoped that the department may assemble the low cost community radio receivers in its own well-equipped laboratory and workshops during the coming years for installation in the village radio centres. The ratio of average cost of maintenance of sets to the amount recovered from the respective local bodies as annual maintenance fees has been reduced from 5 to nearly 2 during the last ten years. This has been possible owing to increased volume of work turned out by the department now, which enables economy to be effected at various stages in the departmental organization. It is hoped that with the extension of the service of this department further and reorganizing the departmental set-up, the cost of maintenance would further be reduced so that even a smallest panchayat board or smallest school can afford the amenity of community radio receiver.

The cost of domestic type of receivers in the State has not shown any tendency to come down from what it was during previous years. The sale of radio receivers has not, therefore, shown any remarkable rise. As has already been said, in the previous Administration Report, the purchase, installation and maintenance of community radio sets will have to be effectively supported and encouraged by Government in order to extend this facility to all the villages in the State at an economical cost.

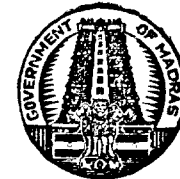

Broadcasting—State—Administration Report for 1949-50—Recorded.

LEAD—the following paper :—

From the Chief Engineer (Buildings and Grow More Food),
dated 25th September 1950, No. 1297-R/50-7.

Order—No. 4661, P.W., dated 19th December 1950.

The administration report of the State Broadcasting Department, annexed to these proceedings, records the activities of the department from 1st April 1949 to 31st March 1950.

2. The total number of rural sets working on 31st March 1950 was 1,001 and the total number of sets installed in municipalities was 237. Besides these, 171 sets have been installed in various district boards, Government and private institutions, etc., thus making a total of 1,409.

3. The community radio sets maintained by the State Broadcasting Department were in fair working condition and the average stoppage of reception (on statistical basis) was about 4 per cent. These sets are generally located at places suitable for public assemblage which has varied from 100 to 300 persons daily depending upon the locality. The popularity of the radio broadcasts and the efficiency of the State maintenance seems to be evident from the demand for new installations.

4. The popularity of the State broadcasting system has directed the attention of Government to the possibility of organizing community centres at the location of the sets. It should be examined if [local enthusiasm cannot] be organized to supply other items of interest to the audiences attracted by the broadcasts: Music, drama and discussions, should be attractive items, which would not only entertain the audience but also encourage local talents.

5. During the year under review, the State Broadcasting Department installed 340 new sets and it also took over 11 sets from private bodies, local bodies, etc., owing to their inability to maintain the sets themselves.

6. The experimental scheme of assembling 20 sets departmentally proved successful and the Government have recently allowed the Radio Engineer to assemble ninety sets departmentally to meet the immediate demands from panchayat boards. The cost of these sets will be appreciably less than the price of imported sets.

7. The panchayat boards, municipal councils and district boards continued to enjoy the concessional rates of maintenance charges. In addition, the panchayat boards have since been permitted to work their main sets without time limit, subject to the payment by them of maintenance charges as in the case of public sets in municipalities, viz., Rs. 120 per annum.

8. During the year, one Research Assistant, who was engaged on design and construction of loud-speakers, successfully designed a pulp beater for making loud-speaker cones on a small production scale and the manufacture of the same was taken up. Besides this, one premeameter was designed and finished under the guidance of the Radio Engineer, with a view to choose a suitable alloy of steel for the making of efficient loud-speaker magnets.

9. The two Research Assistants who were working on (1) salvage design and construction of electrolytic condensers and (2) Salvage and investigation on the type of lead acid batteries, sanctioned by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, completed their research and the two schemes were closed on 31st August 1949.

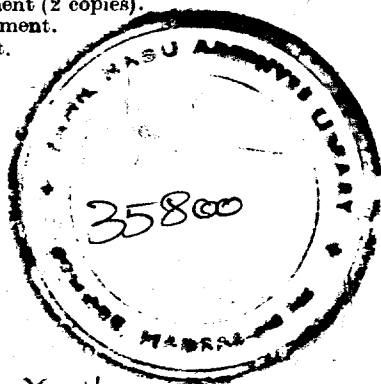
