



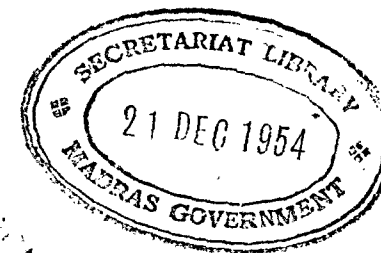

Tahsildars in other districts attended to the Harijan Welfare work in the districts during the year. Particulars of the staff that assisted the District Welfare Officers in each district are shown in Statement I.

STATE HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEES AND DISTRICT HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEES.

The State Harijan Welfare Committee which was reconstituted in G.O. Ms. No. 114, Rural Welfare, dated 12th August 1950, continued to function during 1952-53 with the same members. No meetings were held during 1952-53 as there were no important or special subjects for discussion during this period.

The District Harijan Welfare Committee continued to function satisfactorily with the respective Collectors as Chairmen.

BACKWARD CLASSES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

The term of office of the Backward Class Advisory Committee which was reconstituted in G.O. Ms. No. 117, Rural Welfare, dated 7th February 1951, for one year expired on 6th February 1952. The term was extended by three months. The Committee was not reconstituted after the expiry of its term during the year. No meetings were held during the year as the Committee was under reconstitution and also as there were no important special subjects for discussions during that period.

AMELIORATIVE MEASURES UNDERTAKEN BY THE HARIJAN WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

The ameliorative work consists of—

- (1) provision of house-sites;
- (2) maintenance of schools, grant of scholarships, stipends, boarding grants, grants for purchase of books, etc., and grants to private educational institutions for the benefit of the communities in Annexure 'A';
- (3) provision of wells, tanks for the supply of drinking water;
- (4) provision of sanitary amenities, pathways, street-lighting and burning or burial grounds;
- (5) grants to private bodies engaged in social and economic uplift of the eligible communities; and
- (6) assignment or lease of land for cultivation.

Details of the work turned out during the year under the heads mentioned above are given in the following paragraphs.

HOUSE-SITES.

House-sites have been provided by assignment of land at the disposal of the Government and by acquisition of private lands. Details of house-sites provided by assignment of Government lands are given in Statement II. During the year under report, 3,368 house-sites covering an extent of 472.14 acres of land as against 8,294 house-sites covering an extent of 672.12 acres of land in the previous year were provided in the various districts. The total number of house-sites provided since the commencement of the activities by the Labour Department now continued by Harijan Welfare Department up to the end of the year was 64,869.

Acquisition of private lands for the provision of house-sites for the Harijans including converts was made under G.O. Ms. No. 1025, Firka Development, dated 12th November 1949, during the year. Particulars of house-sites provided by acquisition are given in Statement III.

An extent of 616.322 acres was acquired at a total cost of Rs. 7,90,004-9-3 as against 694.275 acres of land at a total cost of Rs. 7,80,905-13-1 acquired in the previous year. The number of house-sites provided was 9,355 against 10,177 sites provided in the previous year. The cost borne by the Government as contribution towards the cost of house-sites and the cost of lands set apart for communal purposes were together Rs. 6,95,283-8-3 and the cost borne by the Harijans was Rs. 94,721-1-0. The total number of house-sites acquired up to the end of the year was 69,033.

LOANS TO INDIVIDUALS FOR THE ACQUISITION OF HOUSE-SITES.

The arrears at the commencement of the year under reference amounted to Rs. 12,124-13-7 under principal and Rs. 1,856-7-3 under interest. A sum of Rs. 3,215-9-5 fell due under principal and a sum of Rs. 238-9-4 under interest during the year. Thus the total demand for the year was Rs. 15,340-7-0 under principal and Rs. 2,095-0-7 under interest.

The collections during the year amounted to Rs. 551-14-1 under principal and Rs. 348-10-0 under interest against the arrears. The collection against the current demand were Rs. 325-11-8 under principal and Rs. 55-13-4 under interest. Thus the total collection for the year amounted to Rs. 877-9-9 under principal and Rs. 404-7-4, under interest.

The total balance outstanding at the end of the year (31st March 1953) is Rs. 14,462-13-3 under principal and Rs. 1,690-9-3 under interest.

EDUCATION.

In the field of education, the following facilities are provided :—

- (1) Maintenance of schools;
- (2) provision of scholarships, boarding grants and grant for purchase of books and clothing and for payment of examination fees;
- (3) maintenance of free hostels at important centres; and
- (4) grant of financial assistance to private bodies engaged in the maintenance of hostels, schools, etc., for the benefit of eligible communities.

SCHOOLS.

Steps have been taken to make the existing schools more efficient, old schools which were found to be not working well have been closed in the interest of economy. New schools were started wherever necessary.

Particulars of the Harijan Welfare schools in several districts are given in the Statement IV (Parts I and II). At the beginning of the year, there were 1,350 schools. Eleven schools were opened newly and 4 schools were closed down. There were thus 1,357 schools at the close of the year. Education was imparted to 106,005 children consisting of 70,262 boys and 35,743 girls as against 101,345 children consisting of 67,000 boys and 34,255 girls in the previous year. The total number of teachers employed were 3,032 of whom 2,990 were trained and 42 untrained. A sum of Rs. 1,26,041 was spent on the construction and repairs to school buildings.

MIDDAY MEALS.

The supply of midday meals in the Harijan Welfare schools was continued during the year. The Harijan Welfare Department arranged for the supply of midday meals in all the schools in the districts.

(Midday meals supplied to the children belonging to eligible communities in almost all the schools in the State.) The scheme is working satisfactorily. There is marked improvement in the health and the average attendance of the pupils in the schools on account of the supply of midday meals. There is no doubt an appreciable improvement in their education. The cost of each meal was As. 2-6. The number of Harijan pupils fed in the Harijan Welfare schools at the end of the year was 85,084 as against 81,895 in the previous year. The expenditure incurred on the supply of midday meals was Rs. 21,23,720-6-10 as against Rs. 18,00,493-1-9 in the previous year.

HIGH SCHOOLS RUN BY GOVERNMENT.

Government High School, Masulipatnam.

The strength of the school during the period under report was 569 as against 559 during the previous year. A sum of Rs. 7,888-0-6 was realized by way of school-fees and fines. The total expenditure for the maintenance of the school during the year under report was Rs. 52,589-10-5 as against Rs. 49,283-11-4 in the previous year.

The Government Nandanar Schools, Chidambaram.

The following institutions continued to be run by the Government in Chidambaram :—

- (1) The Government Nandanar High School for Boys.
- (2) The Government Nandanar Elementary School for Boys.
- (3) The Government Nandanar Elementary School for Girls.
- (4) The Government Nandanar Secondary School for Girls.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of these schools was Rs. 68,749-5-0 as against Rs. 56,580 in the previous year.

The Nilgiris.

There were five elementary schools with higher elementary trained teachers, in this district, including the three schools in the Government Cinchona Plantations, viz., Hookur, Dodapetta and Moyar. During the year the school at Kunjappanai which is meant to serve mainly the Irula pupils was taken over by the Government. The strength of the five schools was 280 as against 253 in the previous year in the four schools.

Coimbatore District.

The five schools in the Government Cinchona Plantations, Anamalais, are functioning properly. The strength was 371 as against 283 in the previous year. The school and a hostel for the children of the hill tribes at 'Topslip' in the Anamalais are functioning under the control of the Forest Department.

CHARITABLE ENDOWMENTS.

The Gray Memorial Prizes Endowments Fund, Government Nandanar Institutions, Chidambaram.—A sum of Rs. 15-2-0 was available for the award of these prizes and they were awarded as follows on the recommendation of the Collector of South Arcot district :—

The Lieut.-Col. R. E. Critchley Salmonson Prize Endowment Fund, Masulipatnam.—A sum of Rs. 36 was available for the award of this prize and it was ordered to be paid in cash to the boarder of the Government Hostel, Masulipatnam, for the best all-round progress in the year at the school on the recommendation of the Collector of Krishna.

GOVERNMENT HOSTELS.

The Sundaracharlu Hostel, Salem.—The strength of the boarders in the hostel was 60. A sum of Rs. 13,995-7-6 was spent on the maintenance of the hostel as against Rs. 16,000 in the previous year.

The Government Nandanar Hostel for Boys and the Government Nandanar Hostel for Girls.—Sri Swami A. S. Sahajananda continued to be the Founder-Supervisor of these institutions, which were controlled by the Collector.

The sanctioned strength in the boys hostel, and girls hostel continued to be 320 and 145 respectively. The total expenditure incurred was Rs. 74,120 on the maintenance of both the hostels as against, Rs. 64,890-14-4 in the previous year.

As in the last year, the Headmaster of the school was the Chief Warden and he was assisted by three of his assistants who were Honorary Deputy Wardens. The Chief Warden was paid at Rs. 15 per mensem and Deputy Wardens were paid at Rs. 10 each per mensem as honorarium. The Founder-Supervisor Sri Swami Sahajananda, M.L.A., was not paid any honorarium now as in the last year. The accounts of the institutions were checked twice a year by the District Welfare Officer and reviewed by the Collector. The Civil Assistant Surgeon, Chidambaram, visited the hostel once a week and he was paid a conveyance allowance of Rs. 5 per visit. A sum of Re. 1 per head per mensem was sanctioned to the girl boarders for the purchase of toilets and the amount was spent every month.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Kozhikode, Malabar.—The hostel continued to be located in the same rented building. There were 31 free boarders and 5 paying boarders. The vacancies of free boarders and paying boarders were filled up by selection made at the District Harijan Welfare Committee meeting. A sum of Rs. 567-12-0 was collected from the paying boarders of the hostel towards boarding charges. A sum of Rs. 8,302-2-11 (including the building rent of Rs. 816) was spent for the maintenance of hostel. The post of tutor-cum-warden was filled up by a qualified school assistant on 27th June 1952.

Harijan Hostel, Palghat.—The hostel continued to remain in a rented building. There were 30 free boarders in the hostel. The vacancies of boarders were filled up by selecting students from among those attending the educational institutions at Palghat, the selection being made at the District Harijan Welfare Committee meeting. A sum of Rs. 8,414-2-1 (including rent for the building Rs. 1,560) was spent on the maintenance of the hostel. The post of tutor-cum-warden was filled up by a qualified school assistant on 28th June 1952.

Nayadi Colony, Olavakode.—The settlers of the colony fared well during the year. A sum of Rs. 389 was spent for the renewal of thatches and repairs to the huts in the colony. The waste lands in the colony measuring 9·87 acres and poramboke wet lands measuring 635 acres which were being leased to the Nayadi settlers year after year have since been permanently assigned to the settlers in the colony as per G.O. Ms. No. 786, Revenue dated 19th March 1953. Nineteen children of the Nayadi settlers studying in the Harijan Welfare School at Olavakkot and the local higher elementary schools given boarding grants at Rs. 4 per mensem. A sum of Rs. 800 was spent in the year for the purpose.

The Government Depressed Classes Hostel, Masulipatnam, Krishna district.—The strength of the hostel during the year was 190 as in the previous year. Sixty college students were admitted during the year as against 65 in the last year. Almost all the old boarders who were eligible for admission were readmitted and the vacancies were filled up from out of the applications received by the hostel advisory committee.

Fair representation as far as possible was given to all the Telugu districts and also to the eligible applicants from the sub-sects of Harijan community. The health of the boarders was good in general. The boarders had good medical aid from the residential Medical Officer, Government Hospital, Masulipatnam, who continued as medical attendant on Rs. 20 per month for the hostel.

The Government Harijan Girls' Hostel, Anantapur.—The sanctioned strength of the hostel was 30. An expenditure of Rs. 7,557-2-3 was incurred on the maintenance of the hostel.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Rajampet, Cuddapah.—The hostel was run with a strength of 30 Harijan pupils and an amount of Rs. 5,087-6-2 was spent on the maintenance of the hostel as against a sum of Rs. 6,283-5-6 in the previous year.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Kotagiri, the Nilgiris.—The strength of the Harijan hostel at Kotagiri for the year continued to be 30.

The Government Harijan Boys' Hostel, Visakhapatnam.—The Harijan Hostel at Visakhapatnam maintained a strength of 40 boarders during 1952-53. The expenditure incurred for its maintenance was Rs. 10,967-15-7 against an allotment of Rs. 11,000.

The Hill Tribes Hostel at Narasapatnam.—This hostel which was managed by the District Board, Visakhapatnam, functioned during the year with a strength of 56 boarders. A sum of Rs. 4,200-14-0 was paid to the district board towards the extra cost incurred by the district board in respect of the number of boarders over and above 30 maintained during 1952-53.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Ootacamund, the Nilgiris.—The Government Harijan Hostel, Ootacamund, maintained 20 boarders during the year.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Ponneri, Chingleput district.—The hostel was run with a strength of 20 Harijan boarders and a sum of Rs. 4,000 was spent on the maintenance of the hostel.

The Government Harijan Hostel, Coondapoor, South Kanara district.—There were 20 boarders in the hostel. In G.O. Ms. No. 910, Rural Welfare, dated 14th August 1952, the Government have increased the strength of the hostel to 25. A sum of Rs. 4,161-2-6 was spent during the year under report for the maintenance of the hostel (including Rs. 1724-5-0 towards pay and allowances of the staff).

The Government Hostel at Villupuram, South Arcot district.—The Government Hostel at Villupuram was run with 30 boarders. A sum of Rs. 7,000 was spent on the hostel.

The Girls' Hostel, Tiruchirappalli.—The hostel had a strength of 28 boarders. The Government spent a sum of Rs. 5,368-10-11 for running the hostel during 1952-53.

The Government Irula Hostel, Chinnathadagam, Coimbatore district.—A Government hostel for Irular boys is run at Chinnathadagam in Coimbatore taluk. The hostel maintained a strength of 13 boys during 1952-53 as against 12 in the previous year. The Government sanctioned a sum of Rs. 4,000 for maintaining the hostel. The sanctioned strength of the hostel is 25.

The Harijan Hostel, Krishnagiri, Salem district.—The hostel was run with a sanctioned strength of 20 boarders under the supervision of the Tahsildar, Krishnagiri. A sum of Rs. 4,600 was spent on the maintenance of hostel during the year 1952-53.

The Government Hostel, Srikakulam.—The strength of the hostel was 40. A sum of Rs. 7,766-10-0 was spent on the maintenance of the hostel.

GOVERNMENT HOSTELS MAINTAINED IN THE CITY.

The Slater Hostel, Madras.—The strength of free boarders and paying boarders in the hostel was increased during the year from 3 to 35 as per G.O. Ms. No. 918, Rural Welfare, dated 19th March 1952, and from 32 to 50 as per G.O. Ms. No. 1359, Rural Welfare, dated 16th December 1952, respectively.

A sum of Rs. 16,693-8-0 was spent on running the hostel as against Rs. 11,846-8-0 during last year.

The M. C. Rajah Memorial Hostel.—The hostel continued with the same strength as during the last year.

A sum of Rs. 9,398-0-6 was spent on running the hostel as against Rs. 7,309-8-7 during last year.

HOSTELS SUBSIDISED BY THE HARIJAN WELFARE DEPARTMENT

The policy of granting financial assistance to organization such as the Harijan Sevak Sangh and other private individuals, towards the cost of maintenance of boarding homes conducted by them for the benefit of the communities eligible for help by the Harijan Welfare department was continued during the year 1952-53 also. The names of such institutions, the number and the amount of boarding grants sanctioned to them during the year are given in the Annexure B. A sum of Rs. 21,24,870 was sanctioned to the management of these hostels and boarding homes towards the maintenance of 14,132 pupils residing in them.

In their Memorandum No. 410, R.W.-IV/53-1, dated 27th January 1953, the Government permitted the Director of Harijan Welfare to grant the subsidy towards the pay of matrons employed in the subsidized hostels for the year 1952-53 and in subsequent years at the rates sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No. 381, Rural Welfare, dated 4th April 1952. In pursuance of these orders the Director of Harijan Welfare accorded sanction to the payment for 1952-53 of a subsidy at Rs. 10 per mensem or half the pay of matron whichever is less for a period of twelve months in a year or the actual period of employment of the matron in the case of hostels maintaining 10 to 15 girl pupils, and Rs. 15 per mensem or half the pay of matron whichever is less for a period of twelve months in a year or the actual period of employment of the matron in respect of hostels maintaining more than 15 pupils. Particulars of hostels which were sanctioned matron's subsidy for the year 1952-53 are given in the Annexure C.

Grant of scholarships (eligible communities).—The grant of scholarships to the pupils of the eligible communities was made on the usual lines. As in the previous year separate allotments were provided in the budget for 1952-53 for granting scholarship to Hindu members of the eligible communities and converts to Christianity. As many as 14,408 non-residential scholarships for ordinary general education in elementary, higher elementary and secondary schools involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,21,639 were sanctioned during the year as detailed below as against 16,885 non-residential scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 3,22,781-8-0 in the previous year. NOTE.—The non-residential scholarships to pupils studying in Standards IV to VIII in elementary and higher elementary schools and from Forms I to VI in secondary schools were sanctioned during the year by the Collectors of all districts except Madras where it was sanctioned by the Director.

Non-residential scholarship.—Two hundred and eighty-four non-residential scholarships for the students in Arts College classes (106 Harijans and other eligibles and 178 converts) involving an expenditure of Rs. 10,753-7-0 (Rs. 3,948-9-0 for Harijans and Rs. 6,804-14-0 for converts) were sanctioned as against 579 non-residential scholarships (194 Harijans and 385 converts) involving an expenditure of Rs. 25,936-8-0 (Rs. 8,931-2-0 for Harijans and Rs. 17,005-6-0 for converts) in the previous year.

*Residential scholarships (collegiate, arts and high schools).—*Two thousand and ten residential scholarships as detailed below involving an expenditure of Rs. 6,52,363 (Rs. 5,32,025 for Harijans and Rs. 1,20,338 for converts) were granted during the year as against 1,870 scholarships involving an expenditure of Rs. 5,89,365-8-0 (Rs. 4,38,869-11-0 for Harijans and Rs. 1,50,495-13-0 for converts) in the previous year:—

EDUCATION—MADRAS CITY.

There were 5 Harijan Welfare Schools in Madras City. The total number of teachers employed were 43, out of whom one is untrained.

MIDDAY MEALS.

In all the 5 Harijan Welfare Schools in Madras City midday meals were supplied. The number of Harijan children fed in these schools at the end of the year was 1,300. The expenditure incurred on the supply of midday meals in these schools was Rs. 32,154-6-0 during the year.

OTHER GRANTS TO INSTITUTIONS.

The Olcott Memorial School, Adyar—Rs. 5,000.

PROVISION OF SANITARY AMENITIES.

The Director of Harijan Welfare was in charge of the work connected with the provision of civic and sanitary amenities for the members of the eligible communities living in Harijan Welfare Colonies in the City of Madras assisted by the two Deputy Directors of Harijan Welfare (North and South).

Supervision of Harijan Welfare Schools and construction and repairs of Harijan Welfare Schools and buildings were also attended to by them, assisted by a Supervisor and a Special Revenue Inspector.

A sum of Rs. 42,043 was spent during the year on the provision of civic amenities and sanitary improvements in the Harijan colonies in the City of Madras as against Rs. 34,503 in the previous year.

*Details of Sanitary improvements to the Harijan Colonies
in the City of Madras.*

In G.O. Ms. No. 914, Rural Welfare dated 14th August 1952, the Government have written off the amount of Rs. 35-14-1 as irrecoverable loan. The Government have also ordered that the sum of Rs. 20,041-1-0 representing the interest on the principal of the loan advanced to the Harijan residents of Swaminaicken Cheri be written off.

SWATHANTHRAPURAM COLONY.

A sum of Rs. 989 was collected as rent from the occupants in the colony as against the total demand of Rs. 2,396.

A sum of Rs. 1,407 was outstanding on 31st March 1953. Steps were taken to realise the arrears.

ASSIGNMENT OF LANDS.

Particulars regarding the extent of lands reserved for assignment and assigned for cultivation are given in the Statement VI. The percentage of the extent of land inspected to the extent of land assigned was over 80 per cent in 8 districts as against 9 during previous year.

The Madras Removal of Civil Disabilities (Amendment) Act, 1947 and the Madras Temple Entry Authorization Act of 1947.

The promulgation of these Acts has definitely resulted in an improvement of social atmosphere throughout the State. The Harijans are gradually taking advantage of these Acts but the caste Hindus are not co-operating whole heartedly for the removal of the social disability of the Harijans. Every effort is being taken by the Government for the removal of civil disabilities, etc., as early as possible.

OFFENCES UNDER THE ABOVE ACTS.

South Kanara district.—Five cases were reported under the Removal of Civil Disabilities Act and all these cases ended in conviction.

Tirunelveli district.—There were 21 cases under Removal of the Civil Disabilities Act of which three ended in conviction and 18 were pending trial.

Coimbatore district.—There were 4 cases in district under Removal of Civil Disabilities Act of which 2 ended in conviction.

There were no cases under the Madras Temple Entry Authorization Act, 1947, in State during the year.

Village Vigilance Committee.—The committees in the districts of South Kanara, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, the Nilgiris, Tirunelveli, Chingleput, and North Arcot were working satisfactorily by holding regular meetings explaining the necessity of removing the disabilities of Harijan, etc. In the remaining districts the committees were not working properly and necessary instructions were given to the districts in the matter.

HARIJAN DAY CELEBRATION.

On the 30th of every month the celebration was observed in all districts during the year in accordance with the programme laid down by the Government.

The post of the Special Revenue Inspector, Kallar Reclamation, Usilampatti, was disbanded with effect from 18th April 1952, *f.n.* The post of the Additional Overseer was abolished from 26th April 1952. One of the peons sanctioned in G.O. No. 1189, Rural Welfare, dated 12th November 1951, was retrenched with effect from 6th January 1953, *a.n.* The post of the 'Accountant' was converted into 'Head Clerk' on a fixed pay of Rs. 110 in G.O. Ms. No. 383, Rural Welfare, dated 14th March 1953. The post of Assistant Warden, Government Kallar Boarding Home, Usilampatti, has been converted into a full-time Assistant Warden-cum-Scout Master in G.O. Ms. No. 1172, Rural Welfare, dated 21st October 1952 and the part-time Warden was relieved on 22nd January 1953, *f.n.* The Additional District Scout Master, Theni, has been designated as District Cub Master with headquarters at Madurai.

Budget.—The statement below shows the budget allotment and expenditure incurred (both recurring and non-recurring) on the special measures taken for the uplift of the Kallar during the year. The co-operative loans sanctioned by the Government have been shown in column (4) of the statement.

Education.—At the beginning of the year there were 247 schools in the district. During the year four schools were closed. The continuance of 242 schools up to 30th September 1954 is covered by the sanction accorded in G.O. Ms. No. 1189, Rural Welfare, dated 12th November 1951 and school at Pasukaranpatti up to 31st May 1953 in G.O. Ms. No. 227, Rural Welfare, dated 3rd April 1952.

Accommodation.—A sum of Rs. 30,951 was sanctioned for the construction of the following three Kallar schools at (1) K.S. No. 119, Meikilarpatti, (2) K.S. No. 91, Pungankulam, and (3) K.S. No. 125, Nallathuvarpatti. The work were entrusted to the Executive Engineer, Public Works Department, Ramanathapuram Division, for execution. The Government have also sanctioned the construction of the following four schools at (1) K.S. No. 1, Marakayankottai, (2) K.S. Kodikalam, (3) Musavanathoo and (4) K.S. Meyyampatti at a total cost of Rs. 38,770.

Repairs.—Twenty Government school buildings and other minor repairs to the school buildings were executed during the year at a cost of Rs. 14,824-8-0.

One labour well was repaired for Rs. 195 during the year.

The above statement shows that there has been a fall by 1.3 per cent in the strength as compared with the previous year. The fall in strength is probably due to adverse seasonal conditions resulting in several families migrating to other districts. As a result of the scheme for the admission of non-Kallar pupils in the Kallar schools started during 1949 (in accordance with G.O. Ms. No. 4200, Home, dated 15th November 1948), there has been further improvement in the admission of non-Kallar pupils. The number of non-Kallar pupils receiving instruction at the end of the year was 5,841 as against 5,583 of last year.

Staff.—The total strength of teachers was 557 as against 567 of last year. The teachers employed are qualified and trained hands.

During the year Standard VII was opened in each of the four Higher Elementary schools at Thurgilipatti, Pappapatti, Vellayammalpuram and Nellore. The Kallar school at Chinnalapatti has been converted into a Basic school in the year under report. Departmental instruction is also imparted to the teachers by their respective Supervisors.

Method of teaching.—The syllabus for Elementary schools introduced in G.O. Ms. No. 1055, Education, dated 10th May 1929, was followed in all Kallar schools. Necessary steps were taken to minimise stagnation and to improve efficiency. The record sheets introduced in G.O. No. 2103, Law (Education), dated 22nd October 1935, were maintained in all schools.

Equipment.—Equipment to the value of Rs. 1,431 was purchased and supplied to the Kallar schools and a sum of Rs. 879 was spent on repairs to equipment.

Boarding Homes.—The two boarding homes managed by the Government for the benefit of the Kallar boys studying in the District Board High Schools at Uthamapalayam and Usilampatti are working satisfactorily. The headmaster of the High school at Uthamapalayam is the ex-officio warden of the boarding home and he is paid Rs. 22-8-0 per mensem as honorarium. In addition, there are two full-time Assistant Wardens, one at Usilampatti and the other at Uthamapalayam. The continuance of the Assistant Warden in the grade of a secondary grade teacher at the Government Kallar Boarding home at Uthamapalayam was sanctioned for a further period of one year from 1st April 1953 in G.O. Ms. No. 292, Rural Welfare, dated 27th February 1953. One additional Warden has been sanctioned to the Government Kallar Boarding Home at Usilampatti in G.O. Ms. No. 1172, Rural Welfare, dated 21st October 1952 and one secondary grade teacher has been appointed with

effect from 22nd January 1953 and the honorarium paid to the headmaster of the Board High School, Usilampatti, the ex-officio warden, has been stopped from that date. The number of boarders studying at the end of the year at the places is given below:—

The enhanced rate of boarding charges at Rs. 12 sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No. 4160, Home, dated 18th October 1949, continued during the year. The Special Deputy Collector inspected the two boarding houses regularly and gave instructions to the warden and boarders. The health and morale of the boarders were satisfactory. Whenever there were breaches of discipline, suitable action was taken to put them down. Ten out of 25 boarders at Usilampatti passed the S.S.L.C. examination held in March 1952. While one out of nine boarders at Uthamapalayam came out successful in the March examination and one more in the September examination.

Boarding grants.—Besides free village schools and boarding homes, boarding grant at fixed monthly rates varying from Rs. 10 to Rs. 12 for each boy were granted to 528 Kallar boys and 517 girls admitted in the several institutions under the management of Christian Missions and other private agencies.

The Kallar Boarding at Batlagundu is working satisfactorily. The boys in the Boarding Home were sanctioned boarding grants just as other boarders in the other institutions. The number of pupils receiving boarding grants in other institutions is given below:—

The movement continued to do good work during the year. Divisional rallies and inter-pack competitions were held as usual at different centres in the district during the year.

Cubs, scouts and rover did commendable acts of rescue, gallantry and fire fighting during the year and their services were recognized individually and collectively. There were periodical excursions and camps during the year. Training camps for cub-masters and courses for flock leaders and girl guides were held during the year at different places to enable the Kallar school teachers to acquire the requisite qualifications in the prescribed crafts. Conduct of night schools for adults is one of the items of Rover Scheme.

General.—The Bee-keeping and Jaggery-making Instructor continued to do fairly good work by encouraging cottage industries such as poultry farming, bee-keeping, milch goat rearing, etc., besides supervising the maintenance of bee-hives set up in the villages.

Kallar schools of the district were regularly inspected as usual during the year by the Supervisors of this department and the officers of the Educational department.

Assignment of lands.—No land was assigned to any Kallar during the year.

Co-operative branch.—There were 287 Kallar Co-operative Societies besides two Kallar 'Employees' Co-operative Societies at the beginning of the year. During the year six new Co-operative Credit Societies and two milk supply societies were started at Madakulam Pykara Pudhur line, Kalluthu Keela Urappanur, Appipatti, Mela-kuyilady and Vadgupatti, Mallanampatti (milk supply) and Nellore (milk supply). On the whole there were 295 Kallar co-operative societies at the end of the year including two supervising unions, besides Cottage Industries, Co-operative Society, at Usilampatti, the Vyilerichanpatti Egg Production and Sale Society, the Sale Society at Usilampatti, the Labour Society at Checkanurani, Sathangudi Milk Supply Society, Andrewspuram Milk Supply Society, Uthamapuram Milk Supply Society and Mallanampatti Milk Supply Society and Nellore Milk Supply Society.

Ranges and staff.—The Co-operative Sub-Registrar continued to be in charge of the Co-operative branch. Of the four Senior Inspectors of Co-operative Societies sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No. 1189, Rural Welfare, dated 12th November 1951, one Senior Inspector has been placed in charge of the labour society. One Senior Inspector in charge of Sale Society at Usilampatti, another stationed at Cumbum and the fourth at Madurai. The Senior Inspector, Madurai, is now in charge of the milk supply societies. He is also attending to collection work in Kallar Co-operative Societies along with the Special Co-operative Inspectors. The Senior Inspector at Cumbum is in charge of the branch of the Sale Society at Cumbum and he is also supervising the Milk Supply Society at Uthamapuram. He is also attending

the year. A sum of Rs. 80,000 was due to the Trust Fund Account of the District Magistrate at the end of the year. During the year 41 works were taken on contract from Public Works Department, Highways Food Production, and the Kallar Reclamation Department for an estimated amount of Rs. 1,29,293. On the last date of the year 14 works were pending execution. The society has earned a gross profit of Rs. 5,508. The labour society has taken contracts for the maintenance of roads in the Highways Department for three breaches for a total estimated amount of Rs. 54,000.

The society has taken the Kallar Common Fund lands at Usilampatti on an annual lease of Rs. 480 for a period of one year. The lands were irrigated by a pump set owned by the society.

Sale Society, Usilampatti.—This society has entered its 15th financial year of working. There were 2,351 members with a paid-up share capital of Rs. 47,332 at the beginning of the year. During the year 240 members were newly admitted with a paid-up share capital of Rs. 980 and 10 members were removed and their share capital of Rs. 67 was refunded. There were thus 2,581 members with a paid-up share capital of Rs. 48,253 at the end of the year. A sum of Rs. 1,29,343 was due to the Madurai District Central Co-operative Bank at the end of the year. Loans to the extent of Rs. 1,64,305 were advanced to the members during the year on the pledge of their produce. A sum of Rs. 2,05,392 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 76,691 at the end of the year.

The branches at Checkanurani, Cumbum, Theni and Chinnamanur are doing their business satisfactorily. The branches at Cumbum and Chinnamanur are running retail cloth section. In addition to this the Chinnamanur branch was doing manure business. During the year, the societies purchased articles such as leather, agricultural implements and zinc sheets for Rs. 54,557 and sold them for Rs. 58,721.

SPECIAL TYPES OF NON-CREDIT ACTIVITIES.

Usilampatti Co-operative Cottage Industries Society.—There were 215 members at the beginning of the year. Twenty-two members were admitted and 56 members were removed during the year. On the whole there were 181 members at the end of the year. During the year the society had cleared the entire dues of the Madurai District Central Co-operative Bank.

The society is maintaining a poultry farm. The farm consists of 1 cock, 5 cockerals, 9 pullets, 13 chicks and 5 country hens. During the year 80 bee hives were colonized. The society has collected 141 lb. of honey at a cost of Rs. 2 per lb. and sold at the rate of Rs. 2-4-0 per lb. With a view to develop the bee-keeping in the Kallar Nad 101 bee hives, have been purchased from the Madurai District Kallar Co-operative Labour Society. Veyilsrechampatti Kallar Co-operative Egg Production and Sale Society is dormant from the date of starting. Steps are being taken to revive it.

There are three Milk Supply Co-operative Societies at Sathangudy, Andrewspuram and Uttamapuram and two more new societies were started at Mallanampatti and Nellore. The number of members and the share capital etc., are given below:—

Multipurpose activities through Co-operative Credit Societies.—Madakulam-Pykarapudur line Multipurpose Co-operative Society was started with 38 members and the paid-up share capital was Rs. 888. The society has obtained a loan of Rs. 8,880 on 6th October 1952 and disbursed loans to 37 members for the purchase of milch animals. The milk produced during the year was 9,806 Madras measures valuing Rs. 8,352 and was sold for Rs. 9,750 getting a gross profit of Rs. 1,398.

Kallar Advisory Committee.—The Government, in their Order Ms. No. 588, Rural Welfare, dated 14th August 1950 have constituted a Kallar Advisory Committee with five official members and five non-official members to assist the Special Deputy Collector, Kallar Reclamation, Madurai, in framing schemes and in dealing with general questions relating to the reclamation of Kallars without interfering into the day-to-day administration. Two meetings were held during the year.

Piramalai Kallar Common Fund.—The Piramalai Kallar Common Fund is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and is administered by a body of 14 elected members belonging to the Piramalai Kallar community with the District Magistrate as the ex-officio President and the Special Deputy Collector, Kallar Reclamation, Madurai, as the ex-officio Secretary. The Accountant of the Special Deputy Collector's office is the treasurer.

During the year one general body and six committee meetings were held in each taluk to elect members to the Central Committee. The members of the Central Committee held office for a period of one year commencing from 1st July of every year. The object of the fund is to advance loans to the Kallars for improving their economic condition. As funds are limited, loans to individuals are sanctioned only for educational purposes. Loans are also issued to Kallar Co-operative Societies. During the year loans to the extent of Rs. 1,565 and Rs. 21,360 were sanctioned to eight individuals and to six Kallar Co-operative Societies, respectively. The fund is also financing the Kallar Boys Hostel at Batlagundu, Government Kallar Boarding Homes, Usilampatti and Uthamapalayam, by advancing funds which are recouped out of boarding grants sanctioned by Government. A sum of Rs. 11,450 was advanced to Kallar Boys hostel, Batlagundu, Rs. 1,925 and Rs. 350 to the Government Kallar Boarding Homes at Usilampatti and Uthamapalayam respectively.

Free grants.—Free grants amounting to Rs. 80 were sanctioned during the year for educational purposes.

Kallar warehouses.—The Kallar Warehouses at Usilampatti, Checkanurani and Theni belonging to the Kallar common fund continued to be occupied by the Kallar State Society at Usilampatti and its branches at Checkanurani and Theni. The sale society has paid Rs. 2,270 by way of rent for the warehouses. The dry land owned by the Kallar common fund measuring 8 acres and 70 cents at Usilampatti were leased for a period of one year for Rs. 450.

Ramanathapuram district.—The Kallar Reclamation work in this district was ordered to be transferred to the Harijan Welfare Department from the Police Department in G.O. Ms. No. 2960, Home, dated 2nd August 1949. Accordingly the Reclamation work is being attended to by the District Welfare Officer, Ramanathapuram, from September 1949 onwards.

The Kallar reclamation work was confined to the maintenance of two Kallar schools in Srivilliputtur taluk—one at Mangapuram and the other at Chatrapatti. The average attendance of the schools for the year under report is as shown below:—

There are five standards in each of the schools and 147 children (108 boys and 39 girls) are studying. Both the schools were inspected by the District Welfare Officer and by the Officers of the Education Department. The Kallar pupils were supplied with books and stationery. The two schools are housed in Government buildings constructed for the purpose.

There are two registered cub packs in these two Kallar schools and the District Scout Master, Kallar Reclamation, is in charge of them.

Camps and excursions.—Both the cub packs in the district had their periodical camp and excursions to places of interest.

General.—There is a Group Scout Master for the Kallar pupils in the C.S.M. Boarding Home, Virudhunagar, and he is paid a monthly remuneration of Rs. 5. A sum of Rs. 700 was spent for the repairs of the schools and a sum of Rs. 99-14-6 was spent on equipment to these schools. To Veduvarpatti Korava pupils studying in the A.M.C.C. Boarding Home, Aruppukottai a boarding grant of Rs. 14-8-0 per mensem per pupil was sanctioned to them for ten months. A sum of Rs. 10,150 was spent to these Korava pupils towards boarding grants.

Reclamation of Yanadis and Sugalis.—The supervision of reclamation work of Yanadis and Sugalis which were transferred from the Police to the Harijan Welfare Department in G.O. Ms. No. 3618, Home, dated 4th August 1949, continued to be under the administrative control of the District Collectors concerned. The Yanadis, Irulars and Sugalis are the principal tribes living in the districts of Chittoor, Kurnool and Anantapur. The Yanadis are identical with Irulars and all of them live in the taluks of Chandragiri, Kalahasti, Tiruttani, Puttur, Chittoor and Vayalpad. The population of Yanadis and Sugalis in the district of Chittoor are 6,588 and 4,289 respectively. There are now 1,109 Yanadi children and 572 Sugali children of school-going age of whom 673 and 420 children respectively have been admitted into the elementary schools. The Sugali pupils have a better aptitude for education than the Yanadis. Private sites have been selected for the construction of school houses in Narayanapuram thanda and Juvvaladinai Thanda where Sugalis schools are run. There are about 112 Yanadi Colonies out of which 25 are recognised colonies. There were 145 Yanadi births and 66 deaths during the year. The Yanadis in general are interested in agriculture and they are slowly settling down in agricultural life in preference to their former nomadic life with criminal propensities. The tank in Jayantha colony in Chittoor taluk under which an extent of about 1,200 acres of land is available for cultivation by Yanadis got repaired at a cost of Rs. 15,500 and another tank at Melachur got repaired at a cost of Rs. 12,000. Agricultural advances at the rate of Rs. 200 per family besides free supply of seeds were granted and a sum of Rs. 16,000 was granted under "Agricultural advances". Industries such as (1) Charcoal burning, (2) Bee-keeping, (3) Basket-making, (4) Poultry farming and (5) Goat-breeding are being attended to by the Yanadis and Sugalis. Anti-malarial operations are being conducted in the excepted colonies where Yanadis and Sugalis suffer from Malaria. Thirty-nine Yenadis were granted subsistence allowance at the rate of Rs. 50 each for construction of houses. A sum of Rs. 2,350 was sanctioned for repairs to huts. Drinking water wells were sunk during the year. There are ten Yanadi Reclamations and seven Sugali Reclamation schools in Chittoor district. The pupils were supplied with midday meals, slates, books and clothing at State Cost. Khadi clothing worth of Rs. 3,668-1-9 were stitched and supplied to all the Yanadi and Harijan pupils studying in the Reclamation schools.

In Anantapur district there are three Sugali Reclamation Schools at the beginning of the year. They have been supplied with midday meals. There are five Sugali Reclamation schools. A sum of Rs. 3,700 was spent towards supply of midday meals. A sum of Rs. 300 was incurred towards equipment to the reclamation schools.

The Settlement school at Bitragunta and Nellore was transferred to the direct control of the District Collector as ordered in G.O. Ms. No. 308, Firka Development, dated 12th April 1950. The school is maintained mainly for the educational advancement of the settlers of the Bitragunta Settlement. There were seven standards in the school and VIII Standard was started in 1952. There were 90 boys and 87 girls receiving education. The building where the school is located belongs to Government. There are separate quarters provided for the teachers to live in. Midday meals were supplied to them at a cost of Rs. 3,959-4-0. A sum of Rs. 1,139 was spent for repairs of the school buildings and teachers' quarters. The settlers belong to Yerukulas and Katheri communities who are not accustomed to honest living. Clothing to the value of Rs. 1,250 was

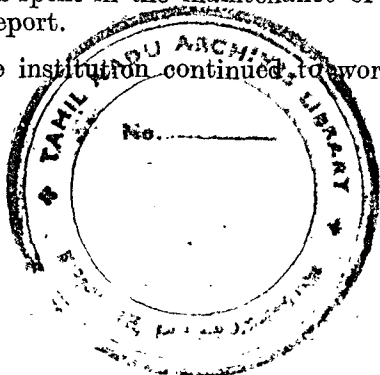
distributed to the children reading in the school and a sum of Rs. 180 was spent on clothing to the children of the ex-settlers reading in the school outside the Settlement. Boarding grants to the extent of Rs. 2,280 was spent to the children reading in higher classes. The existence of the school is a real benefit to the settlers who are educationally backward. In all a total expenditure of Rs. 10,267-3-0 was incurred on the maintenance of this settlement school.

There were four Korava Reclamation schools, two at Attur, one at Manivalandan and one at Madathur in Salem district. The school at Madathur is a primary school with two teachers, one higher grade trained and the other higher trained but failed hand. The average attendance of the school was 44. Pupils of other communities from the neighbouring villages are also attending the school. The Korava Harijan pupils reading in this school are supplied with midday meals, clothes, books, etc., freely at Government cost. There were 17 Korava pupils besides pupils from other communities in the school at Manivalandan. The school is working with a single teacher; midday meals are being supplied to these children. The other two reclamation schools at Attur, one for the Korava boys and the other for the Korava girls are managed by the London Missionary Society. The schools are situated in Korava Boarding Homes, one for the girls and the other for the boys. There is also an agricultural farm attached to the home where the Korava pupils got some practical training in farming. There are three teachers in the boys school and two in the girl's school. The Headmaster of the Boys' school is the warden of the Boys' Home. There is a separate matron for Girls' Home. A total expenditure of Rs. 24,688-5-0 was incurred on the reclamation work in Salem district for the year 1952-53.

General.—The inmates of the Boarding home are well looked after, they are given gruel of rice and millets in the morning and rice and millet at noon and night. There are special facilities for games and special activities such as farming, gardening, scouting and literary societies. The girls have special classes in practical Home Science which includes cooking and serving.

Konnur Boarding Home at Chingleput district continues to be under the District Welfare Officer, Chingleput. The sanctioned strength of the boarding home is 70 boarders and it consists of one warden. The Headmaster of the Criminal Tribe School at Konnur is working as warden. He is paid Rs. 10 per mensem as Warden allowance. There were 69 boarders 7 of whom were reading in the high schools in Madras and other places 7 in the local High School and the rest 55 in the Criminal Tribe School at Konnur. The boarders were provided with free clothing and books. A sum of Rs. 16,188 was spent in the maintenance of the Boarding Home during the year under report.

General.—The institution continued to work satisfactorily.

The Administration Report of the Harijan Welfare Department for the year 1952-53 contains the report relating to the work done for the amelioration of the eligible communities and Backward Classes (Part I) and the report on the reclamation of Kallars, Koravars, Yanadis and Sugalis (Part II). The report covers the Composite Madras State before partition.

PART I—ELIGIBLE COMMUNITIES AND BACKWARD CLASSES.

Eligible Communities.

Provision of house-sites—The statement below shows at a glance the progress made under this head:—

Loans.—The total amount of loan outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 16,153-6-6 as against Rs. 39,613-15-2 outstanding at the end of the previous year.

Education schools.—At the beginning of the year there were 1,350 Harijan Welfare schools. During the year 11 schools were newly opened and 4 were closed down thus bringing the total number of Harijan Welfare schools at the end of

the year to 1,357. The number of pupils who received education in the Harijan Welfare schools increased from 101,345 (67,090 boys and 34,255 girls) in the previous year to 106,005 (70,262 boys and 35,743 girls) during the year. The total number of teachers employed in the schools was 3,032 of whom 42 were untrained. A sum of Rs. 1,26,041 was spent on the construction and repair of school buildings.

Mid-day meals.—The supply of mid-day meals to the children belonging to eligible communities reading in the Harijan Welfare schools was continued. 85,084 children were fed with mid-day meals during the year as against 81,895 in the previous year. The expenditure on this account was Rs. 21,23,720-6-10 during the year as against Rs. 18,00,493-1-9 during the last year. The Government observe that there has been a substantial increase in the number of children provided with mid-day meals. Marked improvement in the health, attendance and education of children is reported on account of the supply of mid-day meals.

Scholarships.—17,126 scholarships (residential and non-residential) to the value of Rs. 11,61,362-7-0 were awarded during the year as against 19,717 to the value of Rs. 10,52,945-14-0 during the previous year. The statement below gives the comparative picture of the scholarships awarded for the various courses of studies during 1951-52 and 1952-53.

Though the number of scholarships allowed during the year is less than the number during the previous year, the expenditure during the year is higher than that during the previous year. The decrease in the number of scholarships is mainly due to the fact that a larger number of scholarships have been granted for collegiate studies during the year.

Exemption from payment of examination fees.—Exemption from payment of examination fees to the value of Rs. 40,175 was sanctioned to 2,449 pupils appearing for the various examinations (Government and University) during the year as against 1,755 pupils to the value of Rs. 31,749-8-0 during the previous year.

Non-recurring grants for the purchase of books, etc.—Non-recurring grants amounting to Rs. 3,992 were sanctioned by the Director of Harijan Welfare for the purchase of books, etc., for pupils studying in Madras City. In the districts non-recurring grants amounting to Rs. 13,469 were granted for the same purposes by the Collectors concerned.

Hostels subsidized by the Government.—A sum of Rs. 21,24,870 was sanctioned to the management of the institutions towards the maintenance of 14,132 students residing in them, the figures for the previous year being Rs. 20,01,200 and 13,314 pupils respectively.

Maintenance of Government hostels.—The department continued to maintain the following 20 Harijan hostels:—

- (7) The Government Harijan Hostel for Girls, Anantapur.

- (10) The Government Harijan Hostel, for Boys' Hostel, Visakhapatnam.
- (11) The Government Harijan Hostel, Ootacamund.
- (12) The Government Harijan Hostel, Ponneri.
- (13) The Government Harijan Hostel, Coondapur.
- (14) The Government Harijan Hostel, Villupuram.
- (15) The Government Harijan Girls' Hostel, Tiruchirappalli.

A sum of Rs. 2,56,441 was spent on the maintenance of the hostels during the year as against Rs. 2,29,740 during the previous year.

The total expenditure incurred on 'Education' amounted to Rs. 95,12,106 during the year as against Rs. 79,07,643 during the previous year. The increase in expenditure is mainly due to the increase in the amount of scholarships granted, supply of mid-day meals and boarding grants.

Backward classes.—During the year a sum of Rs. 11,85,889 was spent for the amelioration of backward communities as against Rs. 9,88,414 during the previous year.

3,981 scholarships for the various courses of studies were granted during the year as against 3,325 scholarships granted during the previous year.

In addition to the scholarships mentioned above, 1,648 boarding grants to the total value of Rs. 2,47,200 were sanctioned during the year.

Construction of wells.—The total expenditure incurred on the construction and repair of wells for the use of eligible communities was Rs. 5,61,915 during the year as against Rs. 5,49,623 during the previous year.

General.—The enforcement of the provisions of the Madras Removal of Civil Disabilities (Amendment) Act, 1947 and the Madras Temple Entry Authorisation Act, 1947 throughout the State resulted in improving the social status of the Harijans.

The Village Vigilance Committees in the districts of South Kanara, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, the Nilgiris, Tirunelveli, Chingleput and North Arcot, were working satisfactorily. The Committees in other districts were not functioning properly and the Director of Harijan Welfare has issued necessary instructions to the Collectors of these districts.

The Harijan Day was celebrated in all the districts as usual.

PART II—RECLAMATION OF KALLARS, KORAVARS, YENADIS AND SUGALIS.

Kallar Reclamation.—At the beginning of the year there were 247 schools. Five schools were closed down during the year. 10,861 Kallar children were given education in these schools during the year as against 11,337 in the previous year. The fall in the strength of these schools is attributed to adverse seasonal conditions resulting in several families migrating to other districts. The Government observe

that more non-Kallar pupils attended these schools. The number of teachers employed was 557 out of which 151 were women teachers. Steps should be taken to improve the attendance of Kallar pupils in these schools especially intended for them.

Boarding homes.—The two boarding homes maintained by Government for the benefit of Kallar boys studying in the District Board high schools at Uttamapalayam and Usilampatti were working satisfactorily. The sanctioned strength of these two boarding homes was 300 and 100, respectively. The number of pupils on rolls as on 31st March 1953 was 266 and 66, respectively.

Boarding grants.—Boarding grants at fixed monthly rates varying from Rs. 10 to Rs. 12 a head were sanctioned for 528 Kallar boys and 517 girls studying in the institutions managed by private agencies and christian missions.

Scholarships and stipends.—Four hundred and two Kallar pupils having higher education in various institutions were sanctioned non-residential scholarships during the year as against 357 during the previous year.

Expenditure on education.—The total expenditure incurred on 'Education' (under the Kallar Reclamation Scheme) during the year was Rs. 6,76,363 as against Rs. 6,48,244 during the previous year.

10. *Ramanathapuram district.*—There were two Kallar schools in the district during the year as against three during the previous year.

Reclamation of Koravars, Yenadis and Sugalis.—Koravar reclamation work was carried on in the districts of Salem and Ramanathapuram and Yenadi and Sugali Reclamation work was continued in the districts of Kurnool, Nellore, Chittoor and Anantapur. There were 25 schools working in these districts for the benefit of these communities. The two Korava Boarding Homes at Attur, one for boys and the other for girls attached to the Koravar schools and the agricultural farm attached to the boarding home continue to work satisfactorily. The Konnur Boarding Home in the Chingleput district also continued to function satisfactorily.

3. The Government note with satisfaction that steady progress of the amelioration work relating to eligible communities and backward classes and reclamation of Kallars, etc.
