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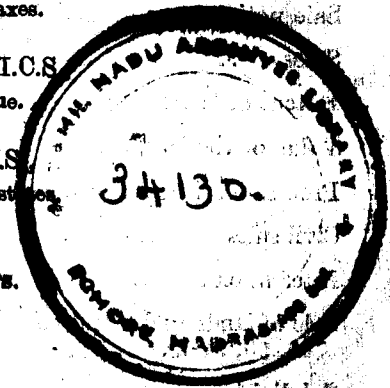

The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the State of Madras for fasli 1363 (1953-54) together with the prescribed statements. A separate report for the estates dealt with under the Rent Reduction Act and the Madras Estates (Abolition and Conversion into Ryotwari) Act will be submitted by the Board (Settlement of Estates) with reference to the orders in G.O. Ms. No. 1985, Revenue, dated 21st July 1954.

Main features.—The main features of the fasli were—

- (i) The season during the fasli was on the whole satisfactory.
- (ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings decreased by 425,756 acres, i.e., from 16,612,633 acres to 16,186,877 acres—vide paragraph 7 below.
- (iii) The total assessment on ryotwari holdings showed a decrease of Rs. 3,82,207, i.e., from Rs. 4,01,74,773 to Rs. 3,97,92,566—vide paragraph 8 below.
- (iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings increased by 2,39,848 acres—vide paragraph 9 below.
- (v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge increased by Rs. 7,15,934—vide paragraph 10 below.
- (vi) Seasonal remissions decreased by Rs. 47,39,120—vide paragraph 11 (i) below.
- (vii) Fixed remissions decreased by Rs. 1,56,445—vide paragraph 11 (ii) below.
- (viii) Beriz deductions decreased by Rs. 55,781—vide paragraph 11 (iii) below.
- (ix) The total amount of revenue remitted in this fasli under all the heads was Rs. 15,57,994, i.e., Rs. 15.58 lakhs against Rs. 65.09 lakhs in the previous fasli.
- (x) Miscellaneous revenue increased by Rs. 1,25,301—vide paragraph 12 below.
- (xi) There was only a small extent of land sold in this fasli—vide paragraphs 25 and 26.

2. *Seasonal conditions*—*South-west monsoon*—June 1953.—The onset of the south-west monsoon was slightly belated and it set in over Travancore-Cochin on June 7th and advanced rapidly into the West Coast by the end of the second week of the month. The monsoon was generally feeble over the State during the last week of the month and though rainfall was fairly widespread along the West Coast, the amount of rainfall was slight. The rainfall was above normal in the districts of South Arcot, North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and the Nilgiris and below normal in the other districts of the State.

July 1953.—The month commenced with very active monsoon along the West Coast. The active spell continued up to July 8th. During this period, widespread and locally heavy to very heavy rainfall occurred along the West Coast. The monsoon weakened during the second, third and early part of the fourth week of the month. In association with the formation of a depression in the Bay of Bengal, the monsoon strengthened from July 27th and was responsible for widespread and locally heavy rain in the West Coast districts. The rainfall during the month was below normal in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot and North Arcot and above normal in other districts of the State.

August 1953.—Under the influence of disturbances in the Bay of Bengal, there were two active wet spells in the State, one in the beginning of the week and the other in the following week. Active monsoon conditions prevailed over the State during first three weeks of the month. During the rest of the month, the

monsoon was generally weak along the West Coast. The rainfall during the month was above normal in the Nilgiris district, normal and bordering normal in Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli districts and below normal in other districts of the State.

September 1953.—Fairly widespread rainfall occurred in the first and third weeks of the month along the West Coast. Showers occurred in most of the districts of the State. A deep depression was formed in the Bay of Bengal on 24th October 1953, and by 26th it crossed West Bengal Coast. Fairly widespread rainfall occurred on 24th in West Coast districts. The rainfall during the month was above normal in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Ramanathapuram, and below normal in other districts of the State.

June to September 1953.—The rainfall during the south-west monsoon period was above normal in the districts of South Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Tirunelveli and the Nilgiris and below normal in other districts of the State.

Sowings.—Sowings of early dry crops were above normal in all the districts of the State. Sowings of early wet crops also were above normal in all the districts of the State.

Crops.—The condition of standing crops was generally satisfactory in all the districts of the State.

North-east monsoon—October 1953.—In the first fortnight of the month, fairly widespread thunder showers occurred in most districts of the State. The north-east monsoon set in on 13th October 1953, causing widespread rainfall in the State. It was active over the State on 16th and 17th October, and during the period 18th to 20th, thunder-showers occurred in the State. In the last week of the month, two depressions were formed, one on the 22nd and the other on the 26th October. Under the influence of these depressions fairly widespread rainfall occurred in the State. The rainfall during the month was slightly below normal in Tirunelveli district and above normal in other districts of the State.

November 1953.—The north-east monsoon was generally inactive in the State during the first fortnight of the month. On the 3rd November, a depression was formed in the Bay of Bengal and moving northwards, it weakened by 10th. It induced a cold spell in the State outside southern districts of the State. The north-east monsoon was active between 15th and 19th November, and it brought in widespread rain in Southern districts of the State. A second depression formed in the Bay of Bengal on the 21st November. Moving west-north-west, at first and west later, intensified into a deep depression. It approached the Coromandal Coast near N. Pattinam on the 25th and then weakened. In association with this depression fairly widespread rain occurred in Central and Southern districts of the State and local showers on the West Coast districts. The rainfall for the month was above normal in the district of Ramanathapuram, normal or bordering the normal in Tirunelveli district and below normal in other districts of the State.

December 1953.—The weather was dry except for two spells during 3rd and 4th weeks of the month. North-east monsoon activity over the Central and Southern districts of the State. During the first spell local showers occurred on the Southern districts of the State. The rainfall for the second spell gave widespread showers in the Southern districts. The rainfall for the month was below normal in all districts of the State except Salem, Malabar and South Kanara where the rainfall was little or negligible.

October 1953 to September 1954.—Considering the north-east monsoon season (October-December) as September 1953, rainfall was above normal in the districts of Salem, Coimbatore, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Tirunelveli, the district of Ramanathapuram, South Kanara, normal or bordering normal in the State. Below normal in the other districts of the State.

Sowings.—Sowings of late dry crops were above normal in Central and West Coast districts and below normal in Carnatic and Southern districts. Sowings of late wet crops were above normal in all the districts of the State.

Crops.—The condition of the standing crops was reported to be generally satisfactory. The paddy crop was affected by pests in parts of Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Coimbatore, Tanjore, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Tirunelveli and South Kanara districts. Heavy losses were averted by timely preventive measures taken by the Agricultural Department.

January 1954.—A low pressure wave moved westwards across Ceylon on 4th January 1954. Under its influence fairly widespread rain fell in the Central and Southern districts of the State during the period 4th to 12th January. Thereafter, the weather was mainly dry. The rainfall during the month was above normal in all the districts of the State.

February 1954.—Except for scattered showers in the Coastal Southern districts of the State on the 1st February, weather remained dry. The rainfall during the month was below the normal in the districts of South Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tanjore, Madurai and Tirunelveli. The rainfall was little or negligible in the other districts of the State.

January to February 1954.—The rainfall during this period was below normal in the districts of Chingleput and Malabar and above normal in the other districts of the State.

March 1954—Hot weather period.—The first ten days of the month were dry. A shallow depression formed in the South-West Bay on the 12th morning and passing through the Southern districts of the State as a low pressure wave, emerged into the Arabian Sea on the 14th morning and lay thereafter for a few days, as a low pressure area off the Malabar Coast. In association with this, local rain with some heavy showers occurred in Southern and West Coast districts of the State. Showers also occurred locally in the Central districts of the State. Mainly scattered to local showers fell in the Southern districts of the State in the last week of the month. During this period isolated heavy falls occurred in the Central districts of the State. The rainfall during the month was above normal in all the districts of the State.

April 1954.—During April, there were frequent minor showers. In association with the westward passage of two low pressure waves across Southern districts of the State during the last week of the month, moderate to heavy showers occurred in the State. The rainfall for the month was above normal in the districts of Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Tanjore, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris and below normal in other districts of the State.

May 1954.—Fairly widespread or local thunder showers occurred in the Central, Southern and West Coast districts on most days of the month. Scattered thunder showers also occurred in the State. The rainfall was above normal in the districts of North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli and Madurai, normal or bordering normal in the districts of Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli and below normal in other districts of the State.

March 1954 to May 1954.—The rainfall in that hot weather period was below normal in Chingleput and Malabar districts and above normal in other districts of the State. The seasonal conditions during the fasli viewed as a whole were satisfactory.

3. Number of ryotwari villages.—The total number of ryotwari villages in the State was 14,137 as against 14,493 in the previous fasli. The decrease of 356 villages is due to the following reasons:—

(i) In Chingleput district, there was a decrease in the number by one—one rented village was taken over by Government and treated along with estate villages.

(ii) In North Arcot district, Tiruppattur town and Tiruppattur village which are separate revenue villages were previously taken as one village; they have to be treated as two separate villages.

(iii) In Salem district, the number of villages reported for fasli 1362 was 1,458 against 1,102 for fasli 1363. The decrease is said to be due to the fact that the estate villages which had been taken into account were excluded.

4. *Sources of land revenue.*—The land revenue of the State is derived from the following sources:—

- (i) peshkush or revenue from permanently settled estates;
- (ii) shrotriem, jodi or quit rent levied on inam villages;
- (iii) assessment including water rate on lands held under ryotwari tenure; and
- (iv) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkush or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkush payable during the fasli was Rs. 1,71,180 as against Rs. 2,29,236 during the previous fasli. The decrease was due to the reduction of demand on account of villages taken over by the Government during the fasli.

6. *Quit-rent.*—The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriem or on favourable tenure was Rs. 1,71,715 as against Rs. 1,88,338 in fasli 1362 resulting in the decrease of Rs. 16,623. There was a decrease of Rs. 82 in Madras, Rs. 265 in North Arcot, Rs. 15,217 in Salem, Rs. 73 in South Arcot, Rs. 1,512 in Tanjore, Rs. 445 in Ramanathapuram, Rs. 926 in Tirunelveli districts. The Collectors report that the decrease is due to the reduction in the demand of some villages taken over by the Government.

7. *Ryotwari holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 16,186,877 acres as against 16,612,633 acres in the previous fasli. The figures for the previous fasli included the particulars regarding estate villages taken over. According to the reports received from the Collectors for this fasli, there was an increase over the last year's figures for the ryotwari villages in the following districts:—

South Arcot (945 acres), Tanjore (3,154 acres), Ramanathapuram (37 acres), Malabar (7,515 acres) and South Kanara (2,601 acres).

The following districts showed a decrease:—

Chingleput (88 acres), North Arcot (163,368 acres), Salem (139,965 acres), Tiruchirappalli (34 acres), Madurai (36 acres), Tirunelveli (7,125 acres), the Nilgiris (34 acres) and Coimbatore (16,234 acres).

The increase is accounted for by transfer of unoccupied lands to occupied dry, re-sale of bought in lands, etc.

The difference in North Arcot, Salem, Tirunelveli and Coimbatore districts is particularly due to the fact that the extent of holdings in estate villages which was included in the extent of the previous fasli has been excluded in this fasli and the acquisition of lands for the Lower Bhavani Project, apart from the general causes of changes in classification consequent on acquisition of lands for public purposes, relinquishment, etc.

8. *Assessment of ryotwari holdings.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 397.93 lakhs as against Rs. 401.75 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 3.82 lakhs. The difference is due to the fact that the assessment on holdings in estate villages which was included in certain districts in last fasli has been excluded in this fasli.

9. *Area cultivated.*—(i) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 12.11 million acres as against 11.87 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net increase of 239,848 acres.

(ii) The total area cultivated during the fasli including the area under miscellaneous cultivation was 12.68 million acres as against 12.40 million acres in the previous fasli. The net increase is 284,325 acres. There was an increase of 44,477 acres under miscellaneous cultivation.

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charges.*—The revenue derived from this source amounted to Rs. 35.49 lakhs as against Rs. 28.33 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of Rs. 67,875 in the districts of Chingleput and South Arcot while the other districts showed an increase of Rs. 7,83,809—North Arcot (Rs. 53,852), Salem (Rs. 9,399), Tanjore (Rs. 2,09,939), Tiruchirappalli (Rs. 1,12,990), Madurai (Rs. 66,470), Ramanathapuram (Rs. 4,753), Tirunelveli (Rs. 45,440), Coimbatore (Rs. 2,34,197) and Malabar (Rs. 46,969).

11. *Remissions.*—The total remission granted was Rs. 15.58 lakhs as against Rs. 65.09 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli, of which Rs. 6.19 lakhs related to seasonal remission. There was a decrease of Rs. 49.51 lakhs during the fasli when compared with the remission granted during the previous fasli. There was decrease in all the districts except the following districts where there was increase in remission:—

Madras (Rs. 1,357).

Malabar (Rs. 3,555).

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 6,19,191 as against Rs. 53,58,311 (revised figure) in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 47,39,120. There was a decrease in all districts except Malabar which showed an increase of Rs. 2,569. The decrease was due to the favourable seasonal conditions.

(a) *Waste remission.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 0.74 lakh as against Rs. 10.83 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 10,09,304.

(b) *Shavi or loss of crop.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,77,309 as against Rs. 22,92,242 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 21,14,933. The decrease is due to the favourable seasonal conditions.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions*, i.e. remission of the difference between the wet and dry rates of assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply. The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 3,10,903 as against Rs. 9,30,057 in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 6,19,154. There was a decrease in Chingleput (Rs. 15,969), North Arcot (Rs. 1,54,647), Salem (Rs. 99,403), South Arcot Rs. (71,422), Tanjore (Rs. 20,258), Tiruchirappalli (Rs. 25,518), Madurai (Rs. 1,06,956), Ramanathapuram (Rs. 34,334), Tirunelveli (Rs. 69,304) and Coimbatore (Rs. 21,343).

(d) *Remission for damages caused by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,223 as against Rs. 33,321 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 32,098. The decrease was due to favourable seasonal conditions.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 2,956 as against Rs. 3,205 (revised figure), in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 249.

(f) *Short crop or poor harvest.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 13,782 as against Rs. 9,78,725 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 9,64,943.

(ii) *Fixed remissions*, (i.e.), abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with season.

The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,72,035 as against Rs. 3,28,480 (revised figure) in the previous fasli, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 1,56,445.

(iii) *Beriz deductions.*—Deductions made in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 7,66,768 as against Rs. 8,22,549 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 55,781.

(iv) *Special remission of land revenue during fasli 1363.*—As the seasonal conditions improved very much during fasli 1363, there was no need to grant special remission. But the Government ordered that cases where the outturn was noted as 3 annas by the karnams, should be granted remission as a special case for fasli 1363 only in those taluks of Chingleput and North Arcot districts where the pest menace was intense. As a result of this grant, the revenue forgone by the Government was as follows :

12. *Miscellaneous revenue.*—The revenue realized under this head was Rs. 52.60 lakhs against Rs. 51.34 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 4,65,011 in certain districts while there was a decrease of Rs. 3,39,710 in other districts resulting in a net increase of Rs. 1,25,301.

The following are the various items of revenue under this head :—

(i) *Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 7.69 lakhs against Rs. 6.19 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 1,49,615.

(ii) (a) *Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 0.74 lakhs against Rs. 0.65 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing an increase of Rs. 9,388.

(b) *Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 1.73 lakhs against Rs. 1.24 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 49,052.

(iii) *Charge for water in villages in estates including tirvajasti and fasli-jasti.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.35 lakhs against Rs. 3.03 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 32,022.

(iv) *Enhanced water-cess on lands irregularly irrigated.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 5.77 lakhs against Rs. 5.02 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 75,746.

(v) *Charges levied for occupation (with or without permission) of assessed and unassessed lands.*—The revenue realized under this head was Rs. 4.74 lakhs against Rs. 6.25 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a decrease of Rs. 1,50,548.

(vi) *Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 10.69 lakhs against Rs. 9.93 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 75,738.

Taram assessment was levied on an extent of 69,085 acres as against 65,772 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in Chingleput, Salem, Tanjore and Coimbatore districts.

(vii) *Revenue from taxed trees.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3,88,331 against Rs. 3,49,006 in the previous fasli, showing an increase of Rs. 39,325.

(viii) *Commission for estates under the Court of Wards.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2,803 against Rs. 147 in the previous fasli, showing an increase of Rs. 2,656.

(ix) *Revenue from process fees.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 12 against Rs. 9,623 in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 9,611.

(x) *Sale-proceeds of lands sold.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 0.14 lakh against Rs. 0.21 lakh in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 7,146.

(xi) *Rent on lankas.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 0.02 lakh against Rs. 0.08 lakh in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 5,538.

(xii) *Quit-rent and ground rent.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.90 lakhs against Rs. 3.58 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in an increase of Rs. 31,469.

13. *Net ryotwari demand.*—The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue was Rs. 470.43 lakhs as against Rs. 416.46 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 53,96,679.

16. *Demand, collection and balance of land revenue and cesses.*—The current demand under the land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 6,21,89,373. A sum of Rs. 5,83,31,290 was collected within the fasli and a sum of Rs. 1,362 was written off the accounts.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 74,83,744. A sum of Rs. 52,58,669 was collected and a sum of Rs. 10,619 was written off the accounts.

18. *Balance.*—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 60,51,177 against Rs. 79,07,180 in the previous fasli.

As reported by the Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for December 1954, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1364 was Rs. 66,57,241 up to the end of December 1954. A sum of Rs. 30,02,451 was collected and a sum of Rs. 31,005 was written off the accounts.

A sum of Rs. 47,773 was collected or adjusted after the close of the treasury month, and a sum of Rs. 1,45,634 was covered by orders of suspension or postponement. Further, a sum of Rs. 1,631 is due on estates under

attachment or Government management but not yet adjusted for want of funds and a sum of Rs. 53,192 is considered irrecoverable or of doubtful recovery. Deducting these amounts, the net collectable balance was Rs. 33,75,555 at the end of December 1954.

19. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collection between the land revenue and cesses is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

The statement showing the amounts collected during fasli 1362 on behalf of the local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amount to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from the Collectors after verification by the Accountant-General of the amount shown by the Collectors as payments made to the local boards. The recovery of the overpayments, if any, is being watched in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated 7th December 1926.

20. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges in the Land Revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head "25. General Administration—District Administration and Miscellaneous." The District Administration charges excluding village Administration Establishments amounted to Rs. 129.59 lakhs during fasli 1363 as against Rs. 225.11 lakhs during fasli 1362. The village service charges including those of the proprietary estate villages during the fasli under review were Rs. 113.06 lakhs as against Rs. 241.92 lakhs in the previous fasli. The total charges during fasli 1363 amount to Rs. 262.65 lakhs. The figures given for the previous fasli relate to the Composite State.

The above expenditure does not however, represent merely the cost of collecting land revenue only. The Revenue Department is responsible for multifarious items of Government work of which the collection of land revenue is one. The village service establishment is attending not merely for collecting land revenue, but to several items of work connected with other Government departments as well. Besides a considerable portion of the time of the Collectors and their subordinate officers is occupied by various new schemes like the National Extension Scheme, Community Projects, Block Developments and other reconstruction and Rural Welfare Schemes of Government. The actual cost of collecting land revenue is far less than the amount of expenditure shown above and it cannot be assessed with any degree of accuracy. The detailed Statement of expenditure under the various heads is given below.

21. *Process under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes employed for realizing the Government dues. The number of processes issued during the fasli are compared below with those in the previous fasli :—

23. *Sale notices.*—During the fasli year large number of sale notices were issued in Chingleput (445), Ramanathapuram (741) and in Malabar (777). Out of 11,046 defaulters, all except 2,478 paid the dues before the issue of sale notices.

24. *Sales.*—The percentage of sales to sale notices was 2.220 during the fasli 1363. It was 5.19 in fasli 1362 in all the districts. The percentage of sales to the total holdings was .001, same as in the previous fasli.

25. *Extent of land sold.*—An extent of 221 acres was sold. An extent of 188 acres was purchased by the Government for want of bidders and the balance was purchased by private persons. The sales were in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and Salem. There were no sales in other districts.

26. *Value of the land sold.*—The estimated value of the lands sold was Rs. 5,069 and a sum of Rs. 1,439 was realized by sale to private persons.

27. *Process-service establishment.*—Statement No. 13 shows the particulars of the processes served. The number served by village and special establishment was 117,926 and 76,611 respectively against 41,271 and 66,499 in the previous fasli.

28. *Civil suits.*—A sum of Rs. 27,572-13-2 was awarded to Government as costs. Including the opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 63,409-11-4 of which Rs. 23,465-8-9 were collected and Rs. 2,110-2-9 were written off as irrecoverable. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 39,006-11-0.

29. *Interest on arrears of land revenue.*—Statement No. 14 gives the demand, collection and balance under this item.

The total demand including opening balance was Rs. 86,284 of which a sum of Rs. 20,814 was collected and Rs. 21 was remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 65,449. The balance is heavy in Madurai district being Rs. 30,259.

30. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 24, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—An extent of 14.75 acres of land assessed at Rs. 15-5-0 was sold for Rs. 2,405-8-0 under Board's Standing Order No. 15 and an extent of 2.68 acres of house-sites and town-sites with a ground-rent of Rs. 146-7-0 was sold for Rs. 1,586-2-0 under Board's Standing Order No. 21. An extent of 142.57 acres of land with an assessment of Rs. 334-2-0 bought in by the Government for arrears of land revenue was sold under Board's Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 1,782-8-0.

An extent of 17.87 acres of land with an assessment of Rs. 13-6-0 acquired for public purposes, but subsequently relinquished was sold under Board's Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 1,055. An extent of 1.86 acres with an assessment of Rs. 3-7-0 was sold for a sum of Rs. 1,589-8-0 under Board's Standing Order No. 91.

There were no disposals of tank-bed lands under Board's Standing Order No. 16 or sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 22, 24 and 197.

31. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—There were no cases of subdivision of the joint liability of the shareholders in enfranchised inam to the payment of quit-rent under Board's Standing Order No. 58 in the fasli under report.

32. *Jamabandi by Collectors.*—The jamabandi was conducted by the Collectors with reference to the instructions in the Board's Standing Order No. 12 (2) and the orders of the Government in G.O. No. 356, Revenue, dated 14th February 1949, fixing time-limits for the conduct of jamabandi.

33. *Advances under the Loans Acts.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year 1954-55 amounted to Rs. 80.47 lakhs only against Rs. 100.09 lakhs in the previous year.

The Collector of South Arcot has shown an expenditure of Rs. 87,862 under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, whereas no loans were sanctioned under this head. Presumably it is due to misclassification of account in the Collector's figures.

34. *Loans—Demand, collection and balance (principal).*—The total amount repayable during the year (fasli year 1363) under review under Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts including the balance left uncollected at the end of the previous year was Rs. 91.41 lakhs. Out of this a sum of Rs. 0.56 lakhs was suspended during the year, leaving a sum of Rs. 90.85 lakhs to be collected. Out of this 90.85 lakhs of rupees, a total sum of Rs. 38.37 lakhs including a sum of Rs. 5.40 lakhs representing the payments which were not yet due for collection during the year under review had been collected. The percentage of collection during the year was 42 against 35 in the previous year.

The net amount repayable during the year under Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 0.86 lakh and a sum of Rs. 0.49 lakh including a sum of Rs. 0.04 lakh representing the payments which were not yet due for collection during the year under review had been collected.

35. *Loans—Demand, collection and balance (interest).*—An amount of Rs. 15.78 lakhs was due for collection under interest during the year (fasli year 1363) including the amounts outstanding at the beginning of the year under Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts. Out of this a sum of Rs. 0.04 lakh was suspended and a sum of Rs. 6 lakhs was collected during the year.

Under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment Act), 1935, an amount of Rs. 0.57 lakh was due for collection under interest during the year under review. A sum of Rs. 0.33 lakh was collected out of this amount.

36. *Debt Conciliation Boards.*—There were no Debt Conciliation Boards in any of the districts during the fasli.

37. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing general or collective notice in each village with reference to B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked satisfactorily. The ryots were well aware of the rules and made representations in time to the Jamabandi Officers which resulted in prompt investigation of objections and reduction in the number of water-rate and encroachment appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed except in cases covered by Grow More Food concessions.

38. *Cultivation of tank-bed lands.*—There were cultivations of tank-bed lands and abandoned tanks. Objectionable cases were dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Land Encroachment Act.

39. *Cowles.*—During the fasli 13.29 acres of land were held on Rs. 14-9-0 against 10.85 acres on Rs. 14-6-0 in the previous fasli.

40. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these registers was generally satisfactory in all the districts. The accounts were checked at the time of jamabandi by the Jamabandi Officers and by Revenue Divisional Officers at the time of inspection of taluk offices. Minor defects noticed were rectified then and there.

41. *Taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara districts. The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages.

42. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of minor irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them up to the end of 31st March 1954. Out of 28,464 works in the State, 3,358 minor irrigation tanks requiring repairs and included in the programme drawn up for 1954-55 were repaired and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 31,10,125. The statement also shows the number of works proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1955. Four thousand two hundred and ninety-eight works have been proposed for repairs in fasli 1364.

43. *Ryots' conference.*—Ryots' conferences were held in all the districts except in Madras, Chingleput, South Arcot, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Coimbatore and Malabar. Such conferences enabled the ryots to come into personal contact with the Revenue, Public Works Department and Agricultural Department Officers who explained to them the various aspects of the Government policy particularly the local development works undertaken by Government with the aid of local contributions.

44. *Extent to which inspection of subordinate offices has been carried out.*—
(1) Subordinate offices in all the districts had been inspected by the Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers. The inspection of the Revenue Divisional Officers' offices by the Collectors during the fasli year under review was generally thorough. The Board examined the inspection notes submitted by the Collectors and issued suitable instructions wherever necessary and took disciplinary action whenever it was called for.

(2) During the fasli, the Members of the Board inspected the offices of the Collectors in the following four districts with reference to instructions in G.O. Ms. No. 2086, Revenue, dated 17th September 1942, and G.O. Ms. No. 2054,

Revenue, dated 22nd November 1943, and found that the administration of the districts continued to be efficient:—

(1) Chingleput, (2) Tirunelveli, (3) South Kanara and (4) South Arcot.

45. *Administration of charitable and religious inams.*—The administration of charitable and religious inams continued to be satisfactory and there were no complaints from any districts. Action for resumption of inams on the ground of alienation of inam lands was taken where necessary.

An extent of 28.76 acres of religious and charitable inam lands bearing an assessment of Rs. 115-7-0 was resumed in the fasli on the ground of inability to continue the service. There were no cases of resumption due to disappearance of institutions.

46. *Well subsidy scheme.*—Advances to ryots for sinking wells were granted from 1946 to the end of March 1952 under the several well subsidy schemes. The time-limit for completion of wells subsidized under the New Wells Subsidy Schemes, 1950-51 and 1951-52 was extended beyond 30th June to 30th September 1954 having regard to the fact that 1953-54 was in fact the first year in which the agriculturists had a fairly good season following successive years of drought and that they have also had the benefit of the moratorium during the year 1954, and that it was probable that many of the grantees would have seriously taken on hand the completion of works already started. Such extension of time was applicable only to well works under these two schemes which were started on or before 30th June 1954.

During the fasli 1363, the New Well Subsidy Schemes, 1950-51 and 1951-52, were in progress. Statistics showing the work done under the several well subsidy schemes during the fasli are furnished in the Annexures 'A' and 'B'.

47. *Rent roll.*—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the State for fasli 1363 (1953-54) excluding Madras, where the land revenue consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites. In G.O. Press, No. 976, dated 15th April 1954, the Government ordered that this statement which had to be prepared quinquennially should be prepared and annexed to the jamabandi report every year. The statement was last prepared for fasli 1360 for the Composite State. According to the statement for fasli 1363, the total number of pattas held was 4,901,055 which was less than that at the end of the quinquennium ending with fasli 1360 by 18,122. There was an increase in all the districts except Chingleput, South Arcot, Tiruchirappalli and Madurai where

there was a decrease. The increase was mainly due to the grant of lands on darkhast, and to the splitting of joint holdings resulting in the grant of separate pattas after subdivision to the several former joint holders.

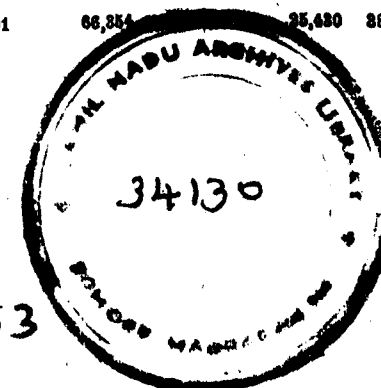

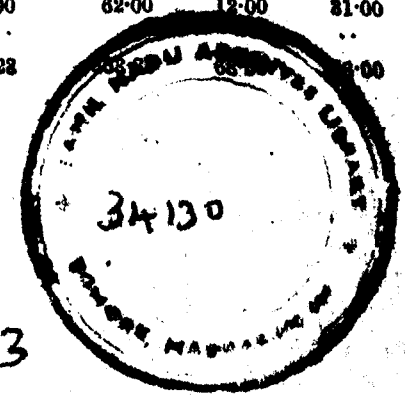

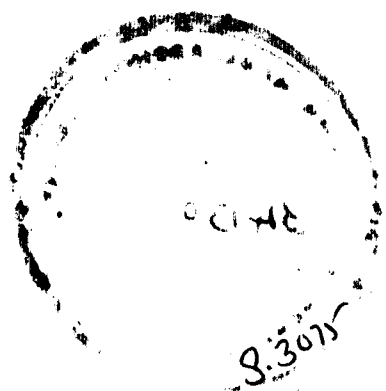
