The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the State of Madras for fasli 1365 (1955-56) together with the prescribed statements. A separate report for the estates dealt with under the Rent Reduction Act and the Madras Estates (Abolition and Conversion into Ryotwari) Act will be submitted by the Board (Settlement of Estates) with reference to the orders in G.O. Ms No. 1985, Revenue, dated 21st July 1954.

Main features.—The main features of the fasli were—

- (i) The seasonal conditions during the fasli viewed as a whole continued to be satisfactory as in the previous year vide paragraph 2 below.
- (ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 34,811 acres from 16,212,336 acres to 16,247,147 acres—vide paragraph 7 below.
- (iii) The total assessment on ryotwari holdings increased by Rs. 50,238 from Rs. 3,93,14,569 to Rs. 3,93,64,807—vide paragraph 7 below.
- (iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings increased by 39,928 acres—vide paragraph 9 below.
- (v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge increased by Rs. 7,68,702—vide paragraph 10 below.
- (vi) Seasonal remissions increased by Rs. 3,40,732—vide paragraph 11 (i) below.
- (vii) Fixed remission decreased by Rs. 23,869—vide paragraph 11 (ii) below.
- (viii) Beriz deduction increased by Rs. 55,248—vide paragraph 11 (iii) below.
- (ix) The total amount of revenue remitted in this fasli under all the heads was Rs. 20,23,788, i.e. (Rs. 20.24 lakhs) as against Rs. 16.51 lakhs in the previous fasli.
- (x) Miscellaneous revenue decreased by Rs. 1,94,945—vide paragraph 12 below.
- (xi) An extent of 1,320 acres was sold for arrears of land revenue in this fasli—vide paragraph 25.

2. *Seasonal conditions—June 1955.*—The south-west monsoon set in on the West Coast on 28th May 1955, causing widespread rainfall along the West Coast. It was fairly active throughout the month. Showers also occurred in other districts of the State. The rainfall in the month was above normal in the districts of Chingleput, Ramanathapuram, Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris districts, normal in Tirunelveli district and below normal in other districts of the State.

July 1955.—Though the month commenced with inactive monsoon conditions, there were two short spells of monsoon activity on the West Coast, one from 13th to 14th and the other from 24th to 27th July 1955. There was also widespread rainfall along the West Coast. In the other districts, thunder showers occurred. The rainfall in July was above normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Salem and Madurai districts and below normal in other districts of the State.

August 1955.—In the second week of August, the monsoon strengthened resulting in widespread rainfall along the West Coast. Showers occurred in almost all districts during the period 17th August to 22nd August under the influence of trough of low pressure formed over the South-West and adjoining South-East Bay of Bengal on 17th August 1955. During the close of the month widespread rainfall occurred in the West Coast district under the influence of depression formed on 26th August 1955 in the North Bay of Bengal. The rainfall in August 1955 was about normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot and Tanjore districts and below normal in other districts of the State.

September 1955.—Fairly widespread rainfall occurred on the West Coast districts in the first fortnight of September 1955. There was thunder storm activity in the West Coast districts and in a few other parts of the State in the third

week of the month. In the last week of the month locally heavy to very heavy rainfall along the West Coast and scattered showers fell in the other districts of the State. The rainfall was above normal in all the districts of the State except Chingleput, South Arcot, Salem and Tanjore districts.

June to September 1955.—The rainfall during the south-west monsoon season was above normal in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Coimbatore and Tanjore and below normal in the other districts of the State.

Sowings.—Sowings of early dry crops and wet crops were above average in the State.

Condition of crops.—The condition of crops was generally satisfactory except in parts of South Arcot district, where paddy crop was affected by pest. Necessary remedial measures were taken.

October 1955.—Following a depression formed in the Bay of Bengal, the north-east monsoon set in on the East Coast of the State on the 15th October 1955. The monsoon was generally active during the second fortnight of the month and widespread rain or thunder showers occurred throughout the State during the period. The rainfall in the month was above normal in the districts of North Arcot, Salem, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Malabar South Kanara and the Nilgiris and below normal in other districts of the State.

November 1955.—Fairly widespread rain or thunder showers occurred in the first week of the month in the West Coast and at a few places in the other districts. Mainly dry weather prevailed in the second week of the month. Thereafter the monsoon was fairly active and by the close of the month it intensified under the influence of a shallow depression formed in the Bay of Bengal on 28th November 1955. The depression intensified into a cyclonic storm by 30th November 1955. The rainfall in the month was above normal in Madurai and Tirunelveli districts and below normal in the other districts of the State.

December 1955.—The cyclonic storm which was formed in the Bay of Bengal on 30th November 1955 crossed the coast to the south of Nagapattinam on the morning of the 1st December 1955 and moved into the South Arabian Sea on the 2nd December 1955. Under its influence locally heavy rain fell in the State. Serious damage to property including houses and other buildings, roads and railways, and crops was caused by the cyclone in the districts of Tanjore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Ramanathapuram. There was also appreciable loss of human lives (417) and cattle (47,863) in Tanjore district. In Tiruchirappalli, Ramanathapuram and Madurai districts the number of human lives lost was 18, 86 and 7 respectively. 95,518 heads of cattle including the goats and sheep were lost in Ramanathapuram district 5,378 in Tiruchirappalli district and 3,299 in Madurai district. A large number of tanks breached or suffered appreciable damage in these districts. The weather remained dry during the rest of the month. The rainfall during the month was above normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, Salem, Tiruchirappalli, Tanjore, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli districts and below normal in the other districts of the State.

October to December 1955.—The rainfall during the north-east monsoon season was above normal in Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Malabar and South Kanara districts, and below normal in other districts of the State.

Sowings.—Sowings of late dry crops and wet crops were above average in the State.

Condition of crops.—The condition of the crops was generally satisfactory in all districts except in parts of Chingleput, South Arcot, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Tanjore and Tirunelveli districts where the crop was affected by pests. Heavy losses were averted by timely remedial and preventive measures. Crops in Tanjore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Ramanathapuram districts were affected by cyclone.

January 1956.—The weather was mainly dry in the month except for showers which occurred on 9th and from 11th to 13th January and in the last four days of the month in few districts of the State. The rainfall in the month was

above normal in Madurai district normal in Tanjore district and below normal in other districts of the State except South Kanara districts where there was no rainfall.

February 1956.—In February also the weather was mainly dry except for showers which occurred on 9th and 25th to 26th February in certain districts of the State. The rainfall in the month was normal in Malabar district, below normal in Tirunelveli, and the Nilgiris districts, and little or negligible in the other districts of the State.

January to February 1956.—The rainfall during the period January–February 1956 was below normal in all districts of the State except South Kanara where there was no rainfall.

March 1956.—The weather in March, 1956 was mainly dry except for isolated thunder showers which occurred on 11th, 14th and from 17th to 18th March in certain districts. The rainfall in March 1956 was normal in South Kanara district, and below normal in North Arcot, Tirunelveli, Malabar and the Nilgiris districts and nil in other districts of the State.

April 1956.—The weather was mainly dry in the first three weeks of the month, except for scattered thunder showers which occurred in the Southern and West Coast districts. Under the influence of cyclonic storm of small extent, which formed in the West Central Bay of Bengal on 29th April 1956 there was fairly widespread rainfall in the State on the 29th and 30th with locally heavy falls in the West Coast districts. The rainfall during April was above normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris districts below normal in the other districts of the State.

May 1956.—Except for widespread rainfall which occurred in the West Coast districts on 1st May 1956, and scattered thunder showers on a few days in the Central districts of the State, the weather was mainly dry in the first and second weeks of May. Fairly widespread thunder showers occurred in the West Coast during the third week of the month. The south-west monsoon advanced along the Malabar Coast on 20th May 1956 and was active along the West Coast during the rest of the days of the month. There was widespread rainfall in Malabar and South Kanara districts during this period. Thunder showers also occurred at a few places in the other districts of the State. The rainfall during the month of May 1956 was above normal in Malabar and South Kanara districts and below the normal in other districts of the State.

March to May 1956.—The rainfall during the period was above normal in Chingleput, Malabar and South Kanara districts and below normal in other districts of the State.

The seasonal conditions during the fasli viewed as a whole continued to be satisfactory as in the previous year.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the State was 14,151 as against 14,137 in the previous fasli, thereby showing an increase of 14 villages. The increase is due to the following reasons:—

- (i) Addition of nine estate villages in Chingleput district on account of introduction of ryotwari settlement;
- (ii) Increase of five villages in Ramanathapuram district due to the adoption of revised and correct figures.

4. *Sources of land revenue.*—The land revenue of the State is derived from the following sources:—

- (i) peshkush or revenue from permanently settled estates;
- (ii) shrotriyam, jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (iii) assessment including water-cess on lands held under ryotwari tenure; and
- (iv) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkush or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkush payable during the fasli was Rs. 38,001, as against Rs. 56,231 in the previous fasli. The decrease was due to the reduction of demand on account of estate villages taken over by the Government during the fasli.

6. *Quit-rent.*—The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or on favourable tenure was Rs. 1,73,315 as against Rs. 1,78,507 in fasli 1364, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 5,192. The decrease is noticed in Ramanathapuram, Madurai, South Arcot, Tanjore and North Arcot and it is due to the acquisition of inam lands for public purpose.

7. *Ryotwari holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 16,247,147 acres as against 16,212,336, acres in the previous fasli.

The increase is noted in the following districts :—

The large increase in the districts of Salem and Malabar is due to the assignments made during the year.

The decrease is noticed in the following districts :—

The decrease is due to the acquisition of lands by the Government under the Land Acquisition Act.

8. *Assessment of ryotwari holdings.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 393.64 lakhs as against Rs. 393.14 lakhs in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 50,232.

9. *Area cultivated.*—(i) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 12.14 million acres as against 12.18 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of 39,928 acres and this was due to want of timely rains in certain areas.

(ii) The total area cultivated during the fasli including the area under miscellaneous cultivation was 12.67 million acres as against 12.81 million acres (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 104,383 acres. Miscellaneous cultivation alone decreased by 99,38.9 acres.

10. *Water-cess and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from this source amounted to Rs. 54.21 lakhs as against Rs. 46.52 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an overall increase of Rs. 768,702 in the State as a whole. All the districts except Chingleput, Salem, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Tirunelveli and South Kanara showed an increase. The increase is as follows: North Arcot, Rs. 96,178; South Arcot, Rs. 97,955; Tanjore, Rs. 82,352; Tiruchirappalli, Rs. 7,467; Coimbatore, Rs. 4,54,783 and Malabar Rs. 89,229. The increase in these districts is due to the favourable seasonal conditions. The extension of irrigation under the Lower Bhavani Project Canal, Mettur West Bank Canal in Coimbatore district, the levy of water-cess consequent on the advent of

Malampuzhā Project in the Malabar district and the levy of special water rate during the off season for cultivation of sugarcane in Tanjore district also contributed to the increase. The decrease is noticed in the following districts and this is due to the unfavourable seasonal condition in certain localities in these districts :—

11. *Remissions.*—The total remission granted was Rs. 20.24 lakhs as against Rs. 16.52 lakhs in the previous fasli, of which Rs. 9.95 lakhs related to seasonal remissions. There was an increase of Rs. 3,72,111 when compared with the remissions granted during the previous fasli. The increase was noticed in the districts of Chingleput (Rs. 23,344), Salem (Rs. 37,138), Tanjore (Rs. 2,65,615), Tiruchirappalli (Rs. 37,947), Ramanathapuram (Rs. 1,746), Tirunelveli (Rs. 1,21,242), Malabar (Rs. 96) and South Kanara (Rs. 18,740) and there was decrease in the remaining districts of the State.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 9,94,928 as against Rs. 6,54,196 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 3,40,732. There was an increase in eight districts, viz., Chingleput (Rs. 6,337), Salem (Rs. 39,307), Tanjore (Rs. 2,77,622), Tiruchirappalli (Rs. 35,881), Ramanathapuram (Rs. 735), Tirunelveli (Rs. 1,51,391), Coimbatore (Rs. 3,051), Malabar (Rs. 87) and decrease in three districts, viz., North Arcot (Rs. 64,299), South Arcot (Rs. 5,086), and Madurai (Rs. 1,04,294). The increase is due to the unfavourable seasonal conditions and cyclone in certain local areas.

(a) *Waste remission.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,41,334 as against Rs. 1,21,237 in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 20,047.

(b) *Shavi or loss of crop.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 4,03,424 as against Rs. 1,40,738 in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,62,686. Appreciable increase was noticed only in the district of Tanjore and this was due to the havoc caused by the cyclone.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions, i.e., remission of the difference between the wet and dry rates of assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 3,63,346 as against Rs. 3,06,279 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 57,067. The increase was noticed in the districts of Salem (Rs. 19,926), Tanjore (Rs. 38,065), Ramanathapuram (Rs. 12,913), Tirunelveli (Rs. 48,463) and Coimbatore (Rs. 3,051) and decrease was noticed in the other districts.

(d) *Remission for damages caused by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 19,676 as against Rs. 27,346 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 7,670.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 5,055 as against Rs. 5,423 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 368.

(f) *Short crop or poor harvest.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 34,249 as against Rs. 32,146 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 2,103.

(ii) *Fixed remissions, i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with season.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,61,286 as against Rs. 1,85,155 in the previous fasli, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 23,869.

(iii) *Beriz deductions*.—Deduction made in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 8,67,574 as against Rs. 8,12,326 in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 55,248.

(iv) *Special remission*.—Due to adverse seasonal conditions special dry remission was granted in respect of dry lands which were left waste and also for dry lands grown with crops with an outturn of four annas and below in certain parts of Tirunelveli district.

In order to provide relief in the areas affected by the cyclone in the districts of Tanjore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Ramanathapuram in G.O. Ms. No. 126, Revenue, dated 11th January 1956, the Government sanctioned remissions on the scale indicated below in all the areas affected in the four districts other than those under the Cauvery and the Periyar systems of irrigation:—

(a) *Coconut topes and plantain garden*.—(i) Full remission where the percentage of trees destroyed is 75 or more.

(ii) Half remission where the percentage was above 50 and below 75.

(b) *Betel vines*.—Full remission for the extent completely destroyed.

(c) *Other fruit bearing trees*.—Full remission where the percentage of trees destroyed was 75 or more.

(d) *Lands cultivated with other crops*.—(i) Full remission for lands with an outturn of 4 annas and below.

(ii) Half remission for lands with an outturn of above 4 annas and below 8 annas.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue realized under this head was Rs. 55.73 lakhs as against Rs. 57.68 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 87,472 in certain districts while there was decrease of Rs. 2,82,417 in other districts resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 1,94,945.

The following are the various items of revenue under this head:—

(i) *Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.23 lakhs as against Rs. 6.18 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 5,070.

(ii) (a) *Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 0.86 lakh as against Rs. 0.82 lakh in the previous fasli, showing an increase of Rs. 4,205.

(b) *Water-cess on minor inams in ryotwari villages*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 2.66 lakhs as against Rs. 2.12 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 53,714.

(iii) *Charge for water in villages in estates including tirvajasti and fasti-jasti*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.62 lakhs as against Rs. 1.81 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 19,133.

(iv) *Enhanced water-cess on lands irregularly irrigated*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 8.95 lakhs as against Rs. 9.31 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 35,966.

(v) *Charges levied for occupation (with or without permission) of assessed and unassessed lands*.—The revenue realized under this head was Rs. 5.25 lakhs as against Rs. 7.16 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 1,90,907.

(vi) *Charges levied for the occupation of poramboke lands*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 10.40 lakhs as against Rs. 10.52 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a decrease of Rs. 12,537.

Taram assessment was levied on 56,550 acres as against 50,115 acres (revised figure) in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in South Arcot, Salem, North Arcot and Tanjore.

(vii) *Revenue derived from taxed trees*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 4.03 lakhs as against Rs. 4.13 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 9,866.

(viii) *Commission for estates under the Court of Wards*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3,360 as against Rs. 8,264 in the previous fasli, showing a decrease of Rs. 4,904.

(ix) *Revenue from process fees*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 4,381 as against Rs. 4,345 (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 36.

(x) *Sale-proceeds of lands sold*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 0.20 lakh as against Rs. 0.26 lakh (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 6,138.

(xi) *Rent on lankas*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 718 as against Rs. 572, showing an increase of Rs. 146.

(xii) *Quit-rent and ground rent*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.92 lakhs against Rs. 3.95 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 2,966.

(xiii) *Other items*.—The revenue under the head 'other items' was Rs. 11.51 lakhs as against Rs. 11.27 lakhs (revised figure) showing an increase of Rs. 24,301.

13. *Net ryotwari demand*.—The net ryotwari demand including water-cess, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue was Rs. 483.35 lakhs as against Rs. 480.83 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,51,884.

16. *Demand, collection and balance of land revenue and cesses*.—The current demand under the land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 6,83,75,486. A sum of Rs. 6,20,36,290 was collected during the fasli. A sum of Rs. 4,560 was written off.

17. *Demand, collection and balance of arrears*.—The total arrear demand under all the heads excluding amounts suspended or postponed due to cyclone, etc., amounted to Rs. 71,67,709. A sum of Rs. 46,92,693 was collected. A sum of Rs. 2,82,450 was written off.

18. *Balance*.—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 85,27,202 against Rs. 72,42,561 in the previous fasli.

19. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses during the fasli*.—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collection between the land revenue and cesses is effected in the Collectors' offices after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

The statement showing the amounts collected during the fasli 1365 on behalf of the local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amount to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from the Collectors after verification by the Accountant-General, of the amount shown by the Collectors as payments made to the local boards. The recovery of overpayments, if any, is being watched in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. Mis. No. 5197, L. & M., dated 7th December 1926.

20. *Charges debitable to land revenue*.—The charges in regard to the Land Revenue Department are shown in the accounts under the head "25. General Administration—District Administration and Miscellaneous". The District Administration charges, excluding the cess on establishment for village administration amounted to Rs. 144.69 lakhs in fasli 1365 as against Rs. 134.75 lakhs in fasli 1364. The village service charges including those of proprietary estate villages were Rs. 138.12 lakhs in the fasli under review as against Rs. 131.55 lakhs in the previous fasli. The total charges in the fasli thus amounted to Rs. 282.81 lakhs.

The expenditure shown above does not solely represent the cost of collection of land revenue. The Revenue Department is responsible for multifarious items of work of which the collection of land revenue is one. The village service establishment is not merely attending to the collection of land revenue, but attends also to several other items of work relating to other departments of the Government as well. A considerable portion of the time of the Collectors and their subordinates is also taken up by various new schemes like National Extension Service Community Projects, Local Development, Block Development, etc., Schemes and other Reconstruction and Rural Welfare Schemes undertaken by the Government as part of National Planning. The actual cost of collecting land revenue is therefore far less than the total expenditure shown above and the exact quantum cannot be assessed with any degree of accuracy. The detailed statement of expenditure under the various heads is given below:—

23. *Sale notices*.—During the fasli year large number of sale notices were issued in the districts of Chingleput (3,650), North Arcot (861), Malabar (744) and South Arcot (419). Out of 12,257 defaulters, all except 5,976 paid the dues before issue of sale notices.

24. *Sales*.—The percentage of sales to sale notices was 4.14 in fasli 1364 and 30.59 in fasli 1365. The percentage of sales to the total holdings was 0.037 as against 0.004 in the previous fasli.

25. *Extent of land sold*.—An extent of 1,320 acres was sold. An extent of 1,053 acres was purchased by the Government for want of bidders and the balance was purchased by private persons. The sales were in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot, Tanjore and Tiruchirappalli.

26. *Value of land sold*.—The value of land sold was Rs. 30,867 and a sum of Rs. 3,860 was realised by sale to private persons.

27. *Process Service Establishments*.—Statement No. 13 shows the particulars of the process served. The number served by the village and special establishment was 64,007 and 93,829 respectively as against 56,256 and 95,974 in the previous fasli.

28. *Civil Suits*—A sum of Rs. 22,718-0-2 was awarded to Government as costs. Including the opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 60,686-9-7 of which a sum of Rs. 18,511-15-0 was collected and a sum of Rs. 1,923-4-11 was written off as irrecoverable. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 39,648-8-2.

29. *Interest on arrears of land revenue*.—Statement No. 14 gives the demand, collection and balance under this item.

The total demand including opening balance was Rs. 1,21,325 of which a sum of Rs. 9,822 was collected and Rs. 20 was remitted, leaving a balance of Rs. 1,11,483. The balance is heavy in the districts of Chingleput, North Arcot, Madras, Coimbatore and Tirunelveli.

30. *Sale of land under B.S.Os.* Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 24, 45, 90, 91 and 197.—An extent of 144.13 acres of land assessed at Rs. 177-10-0 was sold for Rs. 17,143-5-0 under Board's Standing Order No. 15 and an extent of 7.12 acres of house-site and town-site with a ground-rent of Rs. 24-8-0 was sold for Rs. 2,933 under Board's Standing Order No. 21. An extent of 334.41 acres of land with an assessment of Rs. 411 brought in by the Government for arrears of land revenue was sold under Board's Standing Order No. 45 for a sum of Rs. 6,927-4-0.

There was no disposal of tank-bed lands under Board's Standing Order No. 18 or sale of lands under Board's Standing Order Nos. 22, 24, 90, 91 and 197.

31. *Subdivision of quit-rent*.—There were no cases of subdivisions of the joint liability of the shareholders in enfranchised inam to the payment of quit-rent under Board's Standing Order No. 58 in the fasli under report.

32. *Jamabandi by Collectors*.—The jamabandi was conducted by the Collectors with reference to the instructions in the Board's Standing Order No. 12 (2) and the orders of the Government in G.O. No. 356, Revenue, dated 14th February 1949, fixing time-limit for the conduct of jamabandi.

33. *Advances under Loans Acts*.—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year 1955-56 amounted to Rs. 108.75 lakhs against Rs. 63.12 lakhs in the previous year.

The Collectors of South Arcot and Madurai have shown an expenditure of Rs. 12,008 and Rs. 1,94,910 respectively under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, whereas no loans were sanctioned under this head. Presumably it is due to wrong classification in the accounts.

34. *Loans—Demand, collection and balance (principal)*.—The total amount repayable during the year (fasli year 1365) under review under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts including the balance left uncollected at the end of the previous fasli year was Rs. 150.74 lakhs. Out of this a sum of Rs. 13.19 lakhs was suspended during the year, leaving a sum of Rs. 137.55 lakhs to be collected. Out of this sum of Rs. 137.55 lakhs a total sum of Rs. 59.47 lakhs including a sum of Rs. 13.58 lakhs representing payments which were not yet due for collection during the year under review was collected, leaving a balance of Rs. 91.66 lakhs. The percentage of collection during the year was 43 against 38 in the previous year.

The net amount repayable during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 1.93 lakhs and a sum of Rs. 0.79 lakh including a sum of Rs. 0.02 lakh representing the payments which were not due for collection during the year under review was collected, leaving a balance of Rs. 1.16 lakhs.

35. *Loans—Demand, collection and balance (interest)*.—An amount of Rs. 25.29 lakhs was due for the collections under interest during the year (fasli year 1365) including the amount outstanding at the beginning of the year under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts. Out of this a sum of Rs. 2.18 lakhs was suspended of and a sum of Rs. 7.44 lakhs was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 15.67 lakhs.

Under the Agriculturists Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, an amount of Rs. 0.95 lakh was due for collection under interest during the year under review. A sum of Rs. 0.31 lakh was collected out of this amount.

The following special loans were sanctioned for the relief of distress caused by the cyclone and floods in the districts of Tanjore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Ramanathapuram :—

(1) Loans for replacement of cattle and other livestock up to Rs. 1,000 interest free and recoverable in six annual instalments.

(2) Subsistence loans up to a maximum of Rs. 200 per individual repayable in not more than six annual instalments.

(3) Loans for seed and manure according to Takkavi rules.

(4) Loans for raising plantain topes up to a maximum of Rs. 200.

(5) Loans to coconut growers up to Rs. 3,000 in the case of each applicant for removal of fallen trees and replantation.

(6) Loans for repair of houses damaged by floods or cyclone up to a maximum of Rs. 3,000 repayable in ten years with interest at 4½ per cent.

Subsidies were granted to the ryots in the following cases :—

(1) For reclaiming sand cast lands, the departmental tractors and bulldozers were ordered to be hired out to the affected ryots at one-third the normal charges.

(2) Departmental pumpsets were ordered to be hired out at half the usual charges.

36. *Debt Conciliation Boards*.—There were no debt conciliation boards in any of the districts during the fasli.

37. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation*.—The system of publishing general or collective notice in each village with reference to B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated the 10th April 1919, is reported to have been working satisfactorily. The ryots were well aware of the rules and made representations in time to the jamabandi Officers which resulted in prompt investigation of objections and reduction in the number of water-cess appeals and encroachment appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed. In deserving cases, the officer levying enhanced water-cess, (viz., Tahsildar and Deputy Tahsildars, reduced the amounts suitably with reference to the powers vested in them under rule V of H to Appendix I to Board's Standing Order, Volume I.

38. *Cultivation of tank-bed lands*.—The cultivation of tank-bed lands was noticed in the districts of Tiruchirappalli, Chingleput, Coimbatore and Salem. Objectionable cases were dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Land Encroachment Act by ordering eviction and imposition of penalty.

39. *Cowles*.—During the fasli, an extent of 13.29 acres of land was held on Rs. 14-9-0 against the same extent and assessment in the previous fasli.

40. *Examination of village and taluk registers*.—The maintenance of the registers was generally satisfactory in all the districts. The accounts were checked at the time of jamabandi by the jamabandi officers and by the Revenue Divisional Officers at the time of inspection of taluk offices. Minor defects noticed were rectified then and there.

41. *Taluk and village statistical registers*.—The taluk statistical registers as prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara districts. The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages.

42. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of Minor Irrigation works in charge of the Revenue department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them up to the end of 31st March 1956. Out of 28,887 works in the State, 2,601 Minor Irrigation works requiring repairs and included in the programme drawn up for 1956-57 were repaired at a cost of Rs. 35,44,640. The statement also shows the number of works proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1957. Three thousand five hundred and fifty-three works have been proposed for repairs in fasli 1366.

43. *Ryots' conferences.*—Ryots' conferences were held in all the districts except Madras, Coimbatore, Chingleput, Malabar and Madurai. Such conferences enabled the ryots to come into personal contact with the Revenue, Public Works department and Agricultural department officers who explained to them the various aspects of the Government policy, particularly the local development works undertaken by Government with the aid of local contribution.

44. *Extent to which inspection of subordinate offices has been carried out.*—(1) Subordinate offices in the districts were inspected by the Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers. The inspection of the offices of the Revenue Divisional Officers, Special Deputy Collectors for Land Acquisition and other special work and also of the District Welfare Officers during the fasli under review was generally thorough. The Board examined the summary of the notes of inspection submitted by the Collectors and issued suitable instructions wherever necessary, and took disciplinary action against the Officers wherever called for.

(2) During the fasli, the members of the Board inspected the offices of the Collectors in the following seven districts with reference to instructions in G.O. Ms. No. 2086, Revenue, dated 17th September 1942, and G.O. Ms. No. 2954, Revenue, dated 22nd September 1943, and found that the administration of the districts continued to be generally satisfactory:—

(i) The Nilgiris, (ii) Chingleput, (iii) Madras, (iv) Tiruchirappalli, (v) Tirunelveli, (vi) Salem and (vii) Coimbatore.

45. *Administration of charitable and religious inams.*—The administration of charitable and religious inams continued to be satisfactory. Action for resumption of inams on the ground of alienation of inam lands was taken where necessary.

There were no cases of resumption of religious and charitable inam lands in the fasli on the ground of inability to continue the service. There were also no cases of resumption due to disappearance of institutions.

46. *Well subsidy schemes.*—(1) The scheme of granting financial assistance to the agriculturists for sinking wells under the Grow More Food campaign was in operation between the years 1946 and 1951-52 both years inclusive, with the assistance of the Government of India. The quantum of loan advanced to ryots varied normally between Rs. 300 and Rs. 750 per well in districts other than those in the West Coast, while in the West Coast districts, loans up to a maximum of Rs. 2,000 in each case were granted per well or tank as the case may be. The general procedure was to advance the amount in the first instance as a loan and later on to convert it into a subsidy in favour of the grantee on the successful completion of the well or to recover the amount summarily from the grantee on his failure to commence or complete the work. In the cases where the work done was substantial, the amount was recovered in five instalments. In bona fide and deserving cases, where the well failed for reasons beyond the control of the grantees, the amount of subsidy loan advanced was also written off.

(2) The amount converted into subsidy on successful wells and the amount written off in the case of unsuccessful wells was shared equally by the Government of India and the State Government. The scheme of issue of subsidy loans under the well scheme was discontinued from 1952-53.

(3) During the fasli 1365, no fresh loans were granted, but only the completion of the wells for which subsidy loans had been granted during the earlier years was being watched. The ryots were given extension of time for the completion of the wells, the extension last accorded having expired by 30th September 1955. Statistics showing the work done under several subsidy schemes during the fasli are furnished in the Annexures 'A' and 'B'.

47. *Rent roll.*—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the State for fasli 1365 (1955-56) excluding Madras, where the land revenue consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites. According to the statement for fasli 1365, the total number of pattas held was 4,910,233 which was more than that of fasli 1364 by 116,399. There was an increase in all the districts except North Arcot, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai and Malabar.

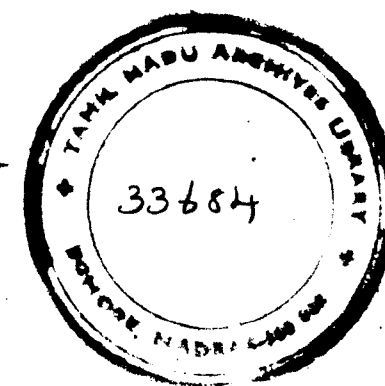

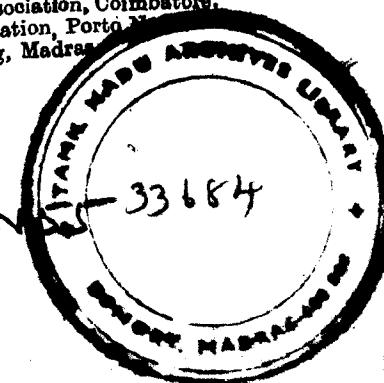
