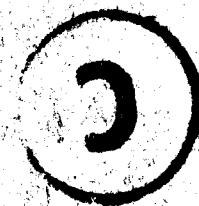

Resolution—No. 8, Press, dated 31st March 1958.

The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the State of Madras for fasli 1366 (1956–57) together with the prescribed statements. A separate report for the estates dealt with under the Rent Reduction Act and the Madras Estates (Abolition and Conversion into Ryotwari) Act will be submitted by the Board (Settlement of Estates) with reference to the orders in G.O. Ms. No. 1985, Revenue, dated 21st July 1954. This report does not cover the Kanyakumari district and Shenkottah taluk of the Tirunelveli district transferred from the former Travancore-Cochin State as the system of land tenure in the transferred areas is different from that obtaining in this State.

Main features.—The main features of the fasli were—

(i) The seasonal conditions during the fasli viewed as a whole continued to be satisfactory as in the previous year—vide paragraph 2 below.

(ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 254,443 acres from 13,409,113 acres (revised figure) to 13,663,556 acres—vide paragraph 7 below.

(iii) The total assessment on ryotwari holdings increased from Rs. 3,19,69,282 (revised figure) to Rs. 3,24,47,078, the increase being Rs. 4,77,796—vide paragraph 8 below.

(iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings increased by 231,597 acres—vide paragraph 9 below.

(v) The amount of water rate and second crop charge increased by Rs. 7,76,365—vide paragraph 10 below.

(vi) Seasonal remission decreased by Rs. 5,48,146—vide paragraph 11 (i) below.

(vii) Fixed remission increased by Rs. 8,485—vide paragraph 11 (ii) below.

(viii) Beriz deduction decreased by Rs. 94,093—vide paragraph 11 (iii).

(ix) The total amount of revenue remitted in this fasli under all the heads was Rs. 12,44,626 (12.44 lakhs) as against 18.91 lakhs (revised figures).

(x) Miscellaneous revenue increased by Rs. 2,55,309—vide paragraph 12 below.

(xi) An extent of 100 acres was sold for arrears of land revenue in the fasli—vide paragraph 25.

2. *Seasonal conditions—June 1956.*—The south-west monsoon advanced into the West Coast on 20th May 1956 somewhat earlier than usual, remained fairly active during the rest of the month, and got established over the whole region. Widespread rainfall in the West Coast districts and scattered showers in the other parts of the State occurred during the period and continued intermittently till the end of the third week of June 1956. Under the influence of a depression which formed in the Bay of Bengal on 25th June 1956 the monsoon strengthened over the State and was generally

active thereafter, till the end of the month. The monsoon was vigorous along the West Coast on 30th June 1956. There was widespread rain along the West Coast during the period. Rainfall occurred locally in the other parts of the State. The rainfall during the month was above normal in all the districts of the State.

July 1956.—The month of July commenced with vigorous monsoon activity along the West Coast, which was fairly active throughout the month. Widespread rainfall occurred along the West Coast districts while scattered rain fell in the other districts of the State. The rainfall during the month of July 1956 was normal in Chingleput district and below normal in all the other districts of the State.

August 1956.—Fairly widespread rainfall occurred along the West Coast during the first three weeks of the month while scattered or local showers occurred in the other districts of the State in the middle two weeks. The monsoon was generally weak and the weather was mainly dry over the State. On August 29, conditions became markedly unsettled in the West Central Bay of Bengal and persisted there for the next two days. Under its influence copious rain fell along the north Coromandal-Circars coasts. During August 1956 the rainfall was above normal in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli bordering on normal in Tanjore district and below normal in the other districts of the State.

September 1956.—Fairly widespread rainfall occurred along the West Coast throughout the month of September 1956 except for a few days in the middle of the month during which period the weather was mainly dry. Scattered showers also occurred in the other parts of the State during the month. The rainfall during the month was above normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Salem, Tiruchirappalli and Tanjore districts and below normal in the other districts of the State.

June to September 1956.—The rainfall during the south-west monsoon season was above normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Salem, Tiruchirappalli, Tanjore, Madurai and Ramanathapuram districts and below normal in the other districts of the State.

Sowings.—Sowings of early dry and wet crops were above average in the State.

Conditions of crops.—The condition of crops was generally satisfactory in all the districts of the State except in South Arcot, North Arcot and Tanjore. Groundnut and gingelly crops were affected by pests in parts of South Arcot district, and groundnut crop was affected in parts of North Arcot district. In parts of Tanjore district, pest attack was noticed and the whole district was declared "pest affected" for selling pesticides at concessional rates. Necessary preventive measures were also taken by the Agricultural Department.

October 1956.—On most of the days during the first three weeks of October 1956 fairly widespread rain fell in Malabar and South Kanara districts, while local rainfall occurred in the other parts of the State. The south-west monsoon withdrew from the State on 23rd October 1956. Under the influence of a seasonal trough of low pressure which formed over the South Bay of Bengal, the north-east monsoon set in along the eastern coastal districts of the State on 26th October 1956 and got established over the whole

State thereafter. Fairly widespread rainfall occurred in most of the districts of the State during the period. The rainfall during the month was below normal in Chingleput and Tirunelveli districts, normal in Tanjore district and above normal in the other districts of the State.

November 1956.—The north-east monsoon was generally active along the State during the first fortnight of the month. Thunder-showers occurred locally in most districts of the State during the period. A depression had formed in the South-West Bay of Bengal on 19th November 1956 and was centred about 150 miles south-east of Nagapattinam. It crossed the coast slightly south of Cuddalore on 20th November 1956 and moved west-north-westwards. Under its influence, the monsoon strengthened over the State causing fairly widespread rainfall in the State till 24th November 1956. The monsoon weakened thereafter and except for thunder-showers at a few places, the weather was mainly dry over the State during the rest of the month. The rainfall during November 1956 was below normal in Chingleput, the Nilgiris and Kanyakumari districts, bordering on normal in Tirunelveli district and above normal in the other districts of the State.

December 1956.—During the first six days of the month local rainfall occurred in certain parts of the State. The weather was mainly dry over the State in the other days of the month. The rainfall during December 1956 was below normal in all districts of the State excepting North Arcot where it was bordering on the normal.

October to December 1956.—During the north-east monsoon period, the rainfall was above normal in North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and the Nilgiris districts and below normal in Chingleput, South Arcot, Tanjore and Tirunelveli districts. The rainfall for the period November 1956 to December 1956 was below normal in Kanyakumari district.

Sowings.—Sowings of late dry crops and wet crops were above average in the State.

Conditions of crops.—The condition of the standing crops was generally fair in all the districts of the State except South Arcot, Tiruchirappalli and Tanjore districts where pest attack on paddy crop was reported. Necessary remedial measures were taken by the Agricultural Department. In parts of Tanjore district transplanted samba crops were submerged under water for a few days for want of quick drainage facilities. Heavy rainfall retarded kuruvai harvest in that district. Groundnut crop was also damaged in Orathanad taluk due to heavy rains.

January 1957.—Except for showers which occurred at a few places on 19th and 31st January 1957 the weather was mainly dry over the State during the month of January 1957. The rainfall where it occurred during the month was below the normal.

February 1957.—The weather during the month of February 1957 was dry over the State except for local rainfall on 2nd and 3rd February 1957 and isolated or scattered showers on 4th, 16th and 28th February 1957. The rainfall during the month was above normal in the Nilgiris district, normal or bordering on normal in North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli and Tanjore districts, and below normal in all the other districts of the State except Chingleput and Ramanathapuram districts where it was little or negligible.

January to February 1957.—The rainfall during the winter period was below normal in all the districts of the State.

March 1957.—Scattered showers occurred in most districts of the State during the first week of the month. Showers also occurred at a few places in the interior parts of the State on 16th, 17th and on the last day of the month. The weather was mainly dry over the State during the other days of the month. The rainfall during March 1957 was above normal in Salem, Coimbatore and the Nilgiris districts, normal in North Arcot district and below normal in the other districts of the State except Chingleput and Tanjore districts where it was nil or negligible.

April 1957.—Except for scattered showers on a few days, the weather was mainly dry over the State during April 1957. The rainfall during the month was above normal in Kanyakumari district and below normal in all the other districts of the State except South Arcot district where it was negligible.

May 1957.—The weather was mainly dry over the State during the first week of May 1957. Thereafter there were thunder-showers on several days in parts of the State. In association with a well-marked trough of low pressure off Malabar coast a temporary advance of the south-west monsoon took place on 21st May 1957 into the West Coast and extended into the adjoining West Madras on 23rd May. This temporary activity of the monsoon ceased on 27th May. Rain or thunder-showers occurred locally in the State during the period. The rainfall during the month of May 1957 was above normal in North Arcot, Coimbatore, Madurai, Tirunelveli, the Nilgiris and Kanyakumari districts, and below normal in the other districts of the State.

March to May 1957.—The rainfall during the hot weather period, March to May 1957, was above normal in Coimbatore, the Nilgiris and Kanyakumari districts and below normal in the other districts of the State.

The seasonal conditions during the fasli viewed as a whole was satisfactory as in the previous year.

3. Number of ryotwari villages.—The total number of ryotwari villages in the State was 11,953 as against 11,598 (revised figure) in the previous fasli, as a result of,

(i) Addition of 59 estate villages in Chingleput district on account of introduction of ryotwari settlement.

(ii) Addition of 274 villages in Ramanathapuram district due to introduction of ryotwari settlement in Aruppukottai taluk.

(iii) Addition of four estate villages in Salem district due to introduction of ryotwari settlement.

(iv) Decrease of 40 villages in Coimbatore district due to the transfer of the Kollegal taluk to Mysore State consequent on the reorganization of States.

(v) The correct number of villages in Tanjore being reported as 1,501 against 1,433 adopted in the report for the last year.

4. Sources of land revenue.—The land revenue of the State is derived from the following sources :—

(i) Peshkush or revenue from permanently settled estates;

(ii) Shrotriem, jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;

(iii) Assessment including water-cess on lands held under ryotwari tenure; and

(iv) Miscellaneous revenue (including the assessment on inams under the Madras Inams Assessment Act).

5. Peishkush or revenue from permanently settled estates.—The total amount of peshkush payable during the fasli was Rs. 39,878 as against Rs. 38,001 in the previous fasli. Increase in peshkush is due to revised figures furnished under this head by the Collectors of North Arcot and Salem for this fasli.

6. Quit-rent.—The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriem or favourable tenure was Rs. 2,43,028 as against Rs. 1,73,315 in fasli 1365 resulting in an increase of Rs. 69,713.

The increase is noticed in Madras, Chingleput, Salem, Tanjore and Ramanathapuram.

7. Ryotwari holdings.—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 13,663,556 acres as against 13,409,113 acres in the previous fasli; and the increase was due to the introduction of ryotwari settlement in a number of estate villages taken over under the Abolition Act (Madras Act XXVI of 1948) and the assignments made during the year.

The increase is noted in the following districts :—

The decrease was due to the transfer of Kollegal taluk to Mysore State and the acquisition of lands in Coimbatore and Tirunelveli districts for public purposes.

8. Assessment of ryotwari holdings.—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 324.47 lakhs as against Rs. 319.69 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 4,77,796.

9. *Area cultivated.*—(i) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 10.19 million acres as against 9.96 million acres (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was increase of 231,597 acres and this was due to the increase of area under ryotwari settlement.

(ii) The total area cultivated during the fasli including the area under miscellaneous cultivation was 10.51 million acres as against 10.29 million acres (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was a net increase by 224,427 acres. Miscellaneous cultivation alone decreased by 7,170 acres.

10. *Water-cess and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from this source amounted to Rs. 58.92 lakhs as against Rs. 51.16 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was an overall increase of Rs. 7,76,365 in the State as a whole. All the districts except South Arcot, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli showed an increase. The increase is as follows :—

Chingleput, Rs. 31,211; North Arcot, Rs. 55,509; Salem, Rs. 54,853; Coimbatore, Rs. 6,20,051; Tanjore, Rs. 89,422; Tiruchirappalli, Rs. 38,129. The increase in these districts was due to the adequate supply of water in the irrigation sources on account of favourable seasonable conditions. The levy of special water-cess for "off season" supply for sugarcane cultivation in summer months in Tanjore district, and the extension of irrigation under the Lower Bhavani Project and Mettur West Bank Canal in Coimbatore district also contributed to the increase. The decrease is noticed in the following districts, and this was due to the failure of the north-east monsoon in Tirunelveli district and lack of adequate supply in certain areas in other districts :—

11. *Remissions.*—The total remission granted was Rs. 12.44 lakhs as against Rs. 18.91 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli, of which Rs. 4.46 lakhs related to seasonal remissions. There was a decrease of Rs. 6.47 lakhs when compared with the remissions granted during the previous fasli. There was decrease of Rs. 7.77 lakhs noticed in all the districts except Tirunelveli where there was an increase of Rs. 1,30,090.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 4,46,458 as against Rs. 9,94,604 in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 5,48,146. There was increase in two districts, viz., Chingleput (Rs. 278); Tirunelveli (Rs. 1,33,018); and decrease in the rest of the districts, viz., North Arcot (Rs. 1,87,840); Salem (Rs. 75,265); South Arcot (Rs. 12,124); Tanjore (Rs. 3,02,042); Tiruchirappalli (Rs. 58,076); Madurai (Rs. 6,957); Ramanathapuram (Rs. 37,890); Coimbatore (Rs. 1,248).

(a) *Waste remission.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 99,393 as against Rs. 1,41,334 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 41,941.

(b) *Shavi or loss of crop.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,22,297 as against Rs. 4,03,215 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 2,80,918. Appreciable increase was noticed in Tirunelveli district (Rs. 39,116).

(c) *Tirvakammi remission, i.e., remission, of the difference between the wet and dry rates of assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,89,478 as against Rs. 3,63,346 (revised figures) in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 1,73,868. Increase was noticed in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 12,319), Salem (Rs. 13,076), Tirunelveli (Rs. 1,50,755) and decrease noticed in other districts.

(d) *Remission for damages caused by flood.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 3,253 as against Rs. 19,581 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 16,328.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 878 as against Rs. 5,055 resulting in a decrease of Rs. 4,177.

(f) *Short crop or poor harvest.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 17,984 as against Rs. 64,481 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 46,497.

(ii) *Fixed remission, i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with season.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,42,721 as against Rs. 1,34,236 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 8,485.

(iii) *Beriz deductions.*—Deduction made in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 6,59,438 as against Rs. 7,53,531 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 94,093.

(iv) *Special remission.*—Due to complete failure of the monsoon in parts of Nanguneri taluk of Tirunelveli district, the Government in their Order Ms. No. 1085, Revenue, dated 4th March 1957, sanctioned the full remission for dry lands (excluding mamul waste and topes) which were left waste for want of rains and also for dry lands grown with crops with an outturn of four annas and below. Such remission was granted to the tune of Rs. 36,078.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue.*—The revenue realised under this head was Rs. 56.13 lakhs as against Rs. 53.58 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 4,48,687 in certain districts while there was decrease of Rs. 1,93,378 in other districts, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,55,309.

The following are the various items of revenue under this head :—

(i) *Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.04 lakhs as against Rs. 6.00 lakhs (revised figures) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 3,846.

(ii) (a) *Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 0.96 lakh as against Rs. 0.85 lakh (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 11,585.

(b) *Water-cess on minor inams in ryotwari villages.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.40 lakhs as against Rs. 2.65 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase by Rs. 74,574.

(iii) *Charge for water in villages in estates including tirvajasti and fasli-jasti.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.16 lakhs as against Rs. 1.61 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 54,926.

(iv) *Enhanced water-cess on lands irregularly irrigated.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 7.31 lakhs as against Rs. 8.95 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 1,63,860.

(v) *Charges levied for occupation (with or without permission) of assessed and unassessed lands.*—The revenue realized under this head was Rs. 4.55 lakhs as against Rs. 4.79 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 24,046.

(vi) *Charges levied for the occupation of poramboke lands.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 11.27 lakhs as against Rs. 10.17 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 1,10,494.

Tharam assessment was levied on 59,635 acres as against 54,336 acres (revised figure) in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in Chingleput, North Arcot, Salem, Tanjore, South Arcot, Tiruchirappalli and Coimbatore.

(vii) *Revenue derived from tared trees.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.99 lakhs as against Rs. 4.00 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 1,221.

(viii) *Commission for estates under the Court of Wards.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3,033 as against Rs. 3,360 in the previous fasli, showing a decrease of Rs. 327.

(ix) *Revenue from process fees.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 5 as against Rs. 309 (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 304.

(x) *Sale-proceeds of land sold.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 0.09 lakh as against Rs. 0.12 lakh (revised figures) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 3,177.

(xi) *Rent on lankas.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 275 as against Rs. 718 showing a decrease of Rs. 443.

(xii) *Quit-rent and ground-rent.*—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 3.71 lakhs as against Rs. 3.70 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 1,485.

(xiii) *Other items.*—The revenue under the head 'other items' was Rs. 12.56 lakhs as against Rs. 10.65 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 1,91,777.

13. *Net ryotwari demand.*—The net ryotwari demand including water-cess, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue was Rs. 427.09 lakhs as against Rs. 405.73 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 21,35,881.

16. *Demand, collection and balance of land revenue and cesses.*—The current demand under the land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 5,58,69,208. A sum of Rs. 5,12,87,893 was collected during the fasli. A sum of Rs. 393 was written off. As the rules under the Madras Inams (Assessment) Act, 1956, could be issued only in May 1957, and as the levy under the Act can be made only after the publication of the prescribed notices and the disposal of objections thereto, no collections under the Act could be made within the fasli.

17. *Demand, collection and balance of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 78,26,881. A sum of Rs. 53,84,368 was collected. A sum of Rs. 99,832 was remitted.

18. *Balance.*—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 69,23,603 as against Rs. 85,18,546 (revised figure) in the previous fasli.

19. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collection between land revenue and cesses is effected in Collectors' offices after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

The statement showing the amounts collected during fasli 1366 on behalf of the local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amount to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from the Collectors after verification by the Accountant-General of the amount shown by the Collectors as payments made to the local boards. The recovery of overpayments, if any, is being watched in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. Ms. No. 5197, L. & M., dated 7th December 1926.

20. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges in regard to the Land Revenue Department are shown in the accounts under "25. General Administration—District Administration and Miscellaneous". The District Administration charges excluding the cess on establishment for village administration amount to Rs. 144.67 lakhs in fasli 1366 as against Rs. 144.69 lakhs in

fasli 1365. The village service charges including those of proprietary estate villages were Rs. 136.28 lakhs in fasli 1366 as against Rs. 138.12 lakhs in the previous fasli. The total charge in the fasli amounted to Rs. 280.95 lakhs.

The expenditure shown above does not relate solely to collection of land revenue. The Revenue Department is responsible for multifarious items of work of which collection of land revenue is one. The village service establishment is not attending to collection of land revenue alone but attends to several other items of work relating to other Departments of Government also. A considerable portion of the time of the Collectors and other subordinates is taken up by various schemes like National Extension Service, Local Development, Block Development, Community Projects, etc., and other schemes relating to Rural Reconstruction and Rural Welfare undertaken by the Government as part of National Planning. The actual cost of the collection of land revenue is therefore far less than the total expenditure shown above and the exact cost cannot be assessed with any degree of accuracy. The detailed statement of expenditure under the various heads of account is given below :—

23. *Sale notices.*—During the fasli year large numbers of sale notices were issued in the districts of Chingleput (2,235) and North Arcot (705). Out of 133,359 defaulters, all except 3,541 paid the dues before issue of sale notices.

24. *Sales.*—The percentage of sales to sale notices was 30.59 in fasli 1365 and 9.74 in fasli 1366. The percentage of sales to the total holdings was 0.078 as against 0.037 in the previous fasli.

25. *Extent of land sold.*—An extent of 100 acres was sold. An extent of 76 acres was purchased by the Government for want of bidders and the balance was purchased by private persons. The sales were in the districts of Chingleput, South Arcot and Tanjore.

26. *Value of land sold.*—The value of lands sold was Rs. 6,007 and a sum of Rs. 1,281 was realised by sale to private persons.

27. *Process service establishment.*—Statement No. 13 shows the particulars of the processes served. The number served by the village and special establishment was 31,788 and 188 respectively as against 64,007 and 93,829 in previous fasli.

28. *Civil suits.*—A sum of Rs. 26,579-11-8 was awarded to Government as costs. Including the opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 59,513-5-5 of which a sum of Rs. 23,841-3-1 was collected and a sum of Rs. 2,084-13-0 was written off as irrecoverable. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 21,901-8-10.

29. *Interest on arrears of land revenue.*—Statement No. 14 gives the demand, collection and balance under this item.

The total demand, including opening balance was Rs. 1,34,822 of which a sum of Rs. 5,242 was collected and Rs. 168 was remitted, leaving a balance of Rs. 1,29,412. The balance is heavy in the districts of Madurai, South Arcot and Tanjore.

30. *Sale of land under B.S.O. Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 24, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—An extent of 697.39 acres of land assessed at Rs. 239-12-0 was sold for Rs. 91,989-10-0 under B.S.O. No. 15, and an extent of 131.86 acres of house-site and town site with a ground rent of Rs. 207-10-0 was sold for Rs. 3,071-4-0 under B.S.O. No. 21. An extent of 548.56 acres of land, with an assessment of Rs. 808-14-0 bought in by the Government for arrears of land revenue was sold under B.S.O. No. 45 for a sum of Rs. 2,394-2-0.

There was no disposal of tank-bed lands under B.S.O. No. 16 or sale of lands under B.S.O. Nos. 22, 24, 90, 91 and 197.

31. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—There were no cases of subdivision of the joint liability of the shareholders in enfranchised inam to the payment of 1949, fixing time-limit for the conduct of jamabandi.

32. *Jamabandi by Collectors.*—The jamabandi was conducted by the Collectors with reference to the instructions in B.S.O. No. 12 (2) and the orders of the Government in G.O. No. 356, Revenue, dated 14th February 1949 fixing time-limit for the conduct of jamabandi.

33. *Advances under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year 1956-57 amounted to Rs. 92.03 lakhs against Rs. 108.75 lakhs in the previous year.

34. *Loans—Demand, collection and balance (principal).*—The total amount repayable during the year (fasli 1366) under review under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts including the balance left uncollected at the end of the previous fasli year was Rs. 175.71 lakhs. Out of this sum of Rs. 175.71 lakhs, a total sum of Rs. 68.84 lakhs including a sum of Rs. 5.66 lakhs representing payments which were not yet due for collection during the year under review was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 112.53 lakhs. The percentage of collection during the year was 42 per cent against 43 per cent in the previous year.

The net amount repayable during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 0.76 lakh and a sum of Rs. 0.24 lakh including a sum of Rs. 0.01 lakh representing payments which were not yet due for collection during the year under review was collected, leaving a balance of Rs. 0.52 lakh.

35. *Loans—Demand-collection and balance—Interest.*—An amount of Rs. 29.03 lakhs was due for collection under interest during the year (fasli year 1366) including the amount outstanding at the beginning of the year under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts. Out of this a sum of Rs. 13.81 lakhs was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 15.22 lakhs.

Under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, an amount of Rs. 0.47 lakh was due for collection under interest during the year under review. A sum of Rs. 0.18 lakh was collected out of this amount.

Subsidy-cum-loan.—In view of the adverse seasonal conditions prevailing in Nanguneri, Tiruchendur, Sankarankoil, Tirunelveli and Tenkasi taluks of Tirunelveli the scheme of subsidy-cum-loan at Rs. 1,000 per well for the deepening of existing irrigation wells was in force.

36. *Debt Conciliation Boards.*—There were no Debt Conciliation Boards in any of the districts during the fasli.

37. *Enhanced water cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing general or collective notice in each village with reference to B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919 is reported to have been working satisfactorily. The ryots were well aware of the rules and made representations in time to the Jamabandi Officers which resulted in prompt investigation of objections and reductions in the number of water-cess appeals and encroachment appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed. In deserving cases the officers levying enhanced water cess (viz., Tahsildar and Deputy Tahsildar) reduced the amounts suitably with reference to the powers vested in them under rule V of H to Appendix I to Board Standing Order, Volume I.

38. *Cultivation of tank-bed lands.*—Cultivation of tank-bed lands was noticed in the districts of Tiruchirappalli, Chingleput, Coimbatore and Salem. Objectionable cases were dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Land Encroachment Act by ordering eviction and imposition of penalty.

39. *Cowles.*—During the fasli, an extent of 13.29 acres of land was held on Rs. 14-9-0 as against the same extent and assessment in the previous fasli.

40. *Examination of village and taluk registers.*—The maintenance of the registers was generally satisfactory in all the districts. The accounts were checked at the time of jamabandi by the Jamabandi Officers and by the Revenue Divisional Officers at the time of inspection of taluk offices. Minor defects noticed were rectified then and there.

41. *Taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the Nilgiris district. The village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages.

42. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of Minor Irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department the number repaired and the amount spent on them up to the end of 31st March 1957. Out of 28,840 works in the State, 2,159 minor irrigation works requiring repairs and included in the programme drawn up for 1956-57 were

repaired at a cost of Rs. 23,67,126. The statement also shows the number of works proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1958. Three thousand one hundred and thirty-four works have been proposed for repairs in fasli 1367.

43 *Ryots' conferences*.—Ryots' conferences were held in all districts except Madurai and Coimbatore.

Such conferences enabled the ryots to come into personal contact with the Revenue, the Public Works, and the Agricultural Department Officers who explained to them the various aspects of Government policy, particularly local development works undertaken by Government with the aid of local contribution.

44. *Extent to which inspection of subordinate offices has been carried out*.—(1) Subordinate offices in the districts were inspected by the Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers. The inspection of the offices of the Revenue Divisional Officers, Special Deputy Collectors for Land Acquisition and for other special work and of the District Welfare Officers by the Collectors concerned was generally thorough. Summaries of the notes of inspection of these offices submitted by the Collectors were examined by the Board and instructions were issued wherever necessary. Disciplinary action for slackness on the part of the officers and for the irregularities noticed during inspection was taken against such officers wherever called for.

(2) During the fasli under review the Members of the Board inspected the offices of the Collectors of the following five districts with reference to the instructions in G.O. Ms. No. 2086, Revenue, dated 17th September 1942, and in G.O. Ms. No. 2954, Revenue, dated 22nd September 1943 and found that the administration of the districts continued to be generally satisfactory: (1) North Arcot, (2) South Arcot, (3) Tanjore, (4) Madurai and (5) Ramanathapuram.

45. *Administration of charitable and religious inams*.—The administration of Charitable and Religious Inams continued to be satisfactory. Action for resumption of inams on the ground of alienation of inam lands was taken wherever necessary.

There were no cases of resumption of religious and charitable inam lands in the fasli on the ground of inability to continue the service. There were also no cases of resumption due to disappearance of institutions.

46. *Well subsidy schemes*.—The well subsidy scheme for sinking new wells was stopped from the year 1952-53, consequent on the decision of the Government of India to reduce the quantum of financial assistance for the scheme.

What remains to be done is only the settlement of accounts in respect of completed wells. As a result of the representations made by the State Government regarding the prevalence of severe drought conditions for six successive years, the Government of India extended the last date for completion of wells and settlement of accounts till 31st March 1956. Although a special drive was launched and very satisfactory results were achieved, there still remain some more work to be completed. In order to complete the work, the Government of India were addressed for extension of time till 28th February 1958 for final settlement of accounts. The Government of India have

agreed to the extension. The extension is applicable only to wells completed up to 31st March 1956. During the fasli 1366, no well works were in progress.

47. *Rent roll*.—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the State for fasli 1366 (1956-57) excluding Madras, where the land revenue consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites.

According to the statement for fasli 1366, the total number of pattas held was 44,20,540 which is more than that of fasli 1365 by 1,51,331. There was an increase in all districts except North Arcot and Coimbatore.

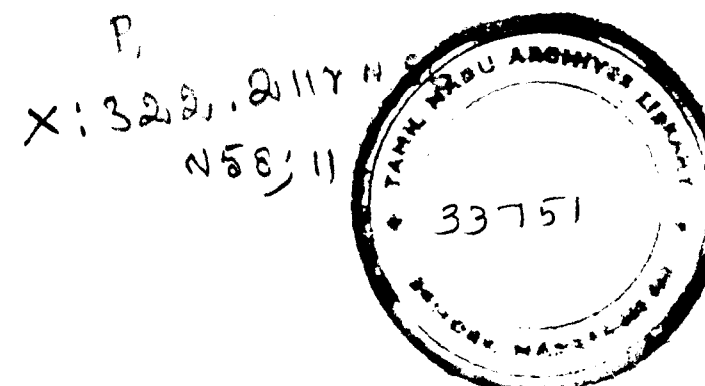

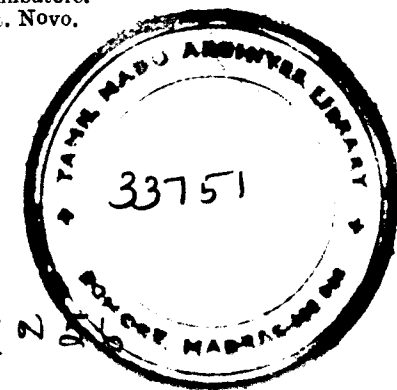
