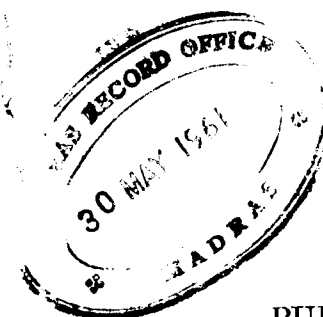

PART I-A

NARRATIVE PORTION.

1. ADDITIONS AND ALTERATIONS TO TERRITORIAL CHARGES.

(1) COIMBATORE CIRCLE.

1.1. The Krishnagiri Project Division was continued with the following three subdivisions :—

- (a) Stores and Machinery subdivision.
- (b) Dam subdivision.
- (c) Canals subdivision No. II.

1.2. On the abolition of the Amaravathi Project Circle, the Amaravathi Division and Parambikulam Project Division were transferred to the control of Superintending Engineer, Coimbatore Circle, with the following subdivisions with effect from 7th June 1958 afternoon :—

Amaravathi Division—

- (a) Masonry Dam subdivision.
- (b) Camps and Stores subdivision.
- (c) Mechanical and Electrical subdivision.
- (d) Localisation subdivision.
- (e) Main Canals subdivision.

Parambikulam Project Division—

- (a) Aliyar subdivision.
- (b) Thunakadavu subdivision.

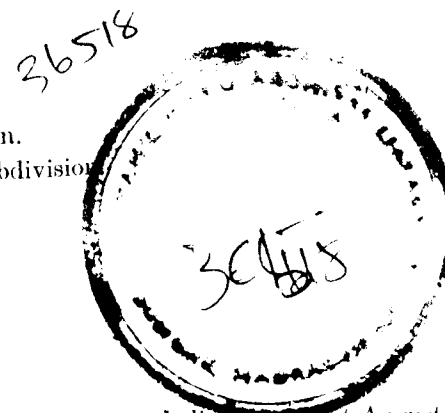
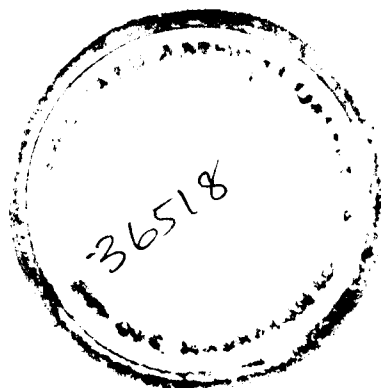
1.3. The Parambikulam Project Division was abolished on 31st August 1958 afternoon and the two subdivisions were attached to the Amaravathi Division.

1.4. The Parambikulam Project Division was again re-formed on 21st December 1958 and it was transferred to the control of the Special Chief Engineer (Parambikulam-Aliyar Project) in February 1959.

1.5. A special subdivision was formed at Ootacamund on 5th December 1958 attending to urgent works and for the safe custody of expensive furnishings, in the "Aranmore" Palace renamed "TAMIZHAGAM" at Ootacamund.

R 1.6. The Canals subdivision No. I of the Krishnagiri Project Division was closed on 30th June 1958.

DI 1.7. The Camps and Stores subdivision of the Amaravathi Project Division was closed on 30th September 1958.



(2) MADRAS CIRCLE.

1.1. The Sathanur Reservoir Project Canals Division and the Vidur Project Division were continued.

1.2. A Special Division with five subdivisions was formed at Madras on 17th January 1959 for the purpose of repairing the irrigation tanks in Chingleput and North Arcot districts under Desilting-cum-Reclamation Scheme.

1.3. The Public Works Workshops, Madras, continued to remain under the supervisory control of the Superintending Engineer, Madras Circle.

(3) TANJORE CIRCLE.

1. *Cauvery Division*.—1.1. One supervisor was employed for conducting gaugings in rivers and channels.

1.2. One supervisor was employed for the work of construction of quarters for the Armed Reserve Police at Tanjore.

1.3. The overseer Section at Kumbakonam which had been temporarily converted into a Supervisor's Section in 1956 was continued as a Supervisor's section.

1.4. One supervisor was employed from 30th July 1958 for the work of construction of buildings for the Rural Extension Training Centre at Aduthurai.

1.5. The three supervisors employed for the speedy implementation of the special minor irrigation works at Peralam, Mayuram and Nannilam were abolished on 31st October 1958.

2. *Vennar Division*.—2.1. One supervisor was employed for gaugings in rivers and channels.

2.2. One Special subdivision was formed at Thiruthurai on 25th February 1959 for investigation and execution of schemes under the special minor irrigation in Vennar Division area.

3. *Grand Anicut Canals Division*.—3.1. The Special subdivision that was formed on 30th May 1956 for attending to the localisation of ayacut, etc., was continued.

3.2. One supervisor was employed for conducting gaugings in rivers and channels.

3.3. One supervisor was employed for the preparation of plans and estimates and for the execution of Improvements to the District Livestock Farm, Orthonad.

3.4. The supervisor at Nagudi to look after the irrigation under the Narasinga Cauvery Scheme was continued.

3.5. The three supervisors employed at Pattukkottai, Ottangadu and Peravunni for special minor irrigation were continued.

3.6. On the abolition of the Special Minor Irrigation Programme Division on 30th April 1958 afternoon, the residual work with two Assistant Engineers one at Pattukkottai and the other at Arantangi was attached to this division.

4. *River Conservancy Division*.—4.1. The supervisor employed for the maintenance of Raja Kumrapalayam and Mohanur channels taken over by the Revenue Department was continued.

4.2. The supervisor employed for the extension of Pugalur channel to Popular Mudaliar Channel was continued up to 31st May 1958 afternoon.

4.3. The Special subdivision formed at Kodumudi on 25th September 1957 afternoon for shifting the head of Pugalur channel to a site above Jadarpalayam regulator was continued.

5. *South Arcot Division*.—5.1. The supervisor employed for the construction of a permanent building and hostel block for the Government Nandanar Boys' School at Chidambaram was continued.

5.2. The Special subdivision for implementation of Special Minor Irrigation Programme works was continued.

5.3. The supervisor for supervising the work of construction of quarters for the Police staff of the Armed Reserve at Cuddalore was continued.

6. *Minor Irrigation Programme Division, Tanjore*.—The Division was abolished on 30th April 1958. The residual work was attached to Grand Anicut Canals Division with two subdivisions one at Pattukkottai and the other at Arantangi.

(4) TIRUCHIRAPPALLI CIRCLE.

1. *Tiruchirappalli Division*.—1.1. One supervisor was continued for the major Police Line works at Tiruchirappalli.

1.2. Two supervisors were continued up to 31st August 1958 for the valuation of Government buildings at Pudukkottai.

1.3. One supervisor was continued for maintaining existing anti-erosion works and to formulate proposals for the new works in Pudukkottai area.

1.4. The Special subdivision for the formation of a tank in the southern side of Cinnar in Eraiyur village of Perambalur taluk was continued. Its headquarters was shifted from Perambalur to Tiruchirappalli on 1st July 1958.

2. *Periyar Division*.—2.1. The two subdivisions formed for lowering the water-shed cutting in the Periyar Lake near Thakkady Head Sluice were closed on 30th June 1958.

2.2. Two supervisors were employed up to 31st October 1958 for the investigation of hard cases for admission under Periyar Irrigation System. One more supervisor was employed for the same purpose from 11th September to 31st December 1958.

2.3. One supervisor was employed up to 10th May 1958 for the construction of buildings for Rural Extension Training Centre at Gandhigram.

2.4. On the abolition of the Vaigai Canals Division, the Alanganallur subdivision was attached to Periyar Division with effect from 1st July 1958 for attending to the balance of work relating to improvements to the Periyar Main Canal and Lessees and Shields Kal.

2.5. One supervisor was employed from 13th October 1958 to 28th February 1959 for the construction of buildings for Basic Training School at Melur.

3. *Ramanathapuram Division*.—3.1. The Special subdivision formed at Aruppukkottai on 20th January 1956 for looking after the building works in Ramanathapuram district was continued.

3.2. A Special subdivision was formed at Ramanathapuram on 1st May 1958 for attending to the balance of cyclone damage works and the maintenance of tanks in Ramanathapuram district.

4. *Tirunelveli Division*.—4.1. The Special subdivision formed on 11th June 1956 for attending to the Investigation of Small Irrigation Schemes in the Tirunelveli district was transferred to the control of the Special Minor Irrigation Programme Division, Tiruchirappalli, with effect from 9th May 1958.

4.2. One supervisor was employed for gaugings from 1st October 1958.

4.3. One supervisor was employed from 9th December 1958 for attending to special repairs to Udumbathur Anicut in Sankarankoil taluk, Tirunelveli district.

4.4. The maintenance of the Shencotta water-supply was handed over to the Shencottah Municipality on 10th March 1959.

4.5. A special subdivision was formed at Palayamkottai on 23rd January 1959 for the investigation and execution of Special Minor Irrigation Programme works.

5. *Kanyakumari Division.*—5.1. The three regular sub-divisions in this Division are—

- (1) Nagercoil subdivision.
- (2) Thuckalay subdivision.
- (3) Kulaekaram subdivision for Kolayar Extension Project.

5.2. The two subdivisions formed at Nagercoil and Cheruppalur for work connected with improvements to Pechipara and Perunchani systems were continued. The Special subdivision at Cheruppalur was temporarily shifted to Tiruchirappalli and attached to the Special Minor Irrigation Programme Division with effect from 21st January 1959.

5.3. A special subdivision was formed at Kuzithurai on 30th April 1958 for attending to the detailed investigation and for framing detailed proposals and preparation of detailed proposals and preparation of detailed plans, etc., for the second stage of Neyyar Irrigation Project. Another subdivision was formed at Kuzithurai on 13th January 1959. On the formation of Neyyar Irrigation Project Division at Nagercoil on 12th February 1959 under the administrative control of the Superintending Engineer, Projects Circle, Tiruchirappalli, the first subdivision was transferred to its control. The Second subdivision was however retained in the Kanyakumari Division for attending to Minor Irrigation Programme Works in the Kanyakumari district. The Headquarters of the subdivision was shifted to Cheruppalur.

6. *Special Minor Irrigation Programme Division at Tiruchirappalli.*—A special Division for the investigation and execution of Special Minor Irrigation Programme works was formed at Tiruchirappalli on 9th May 1959.

5 SPECIAL BUILDINGS CIRCLE, MADRAS.

1.1. The Special Buildings Circle continued to function with four divisions, two at Madras, one at Madurai and one at Coimbatore.

1.2. During the year the following new subdivisions were formed for the execution of Building works.—

- (a) Special subdivision at Guindy.
- (b) Hospital subdivision, Tanjore.
- (c) Special subdivision at Tondiarpet.

1.3. The Secretariat subdivision was abolished on 31st July 1958.

6. SPECIAL CIRCLE, MADURAI.

The Circle was closed on 30th April 1958.

7. SPECIAL CHARGE UNDER THE CHIEF ENGINEER (GENERAL).

The Stock Verification subdivision functioning under the Executive Engineer Gaugings Division, was continued.

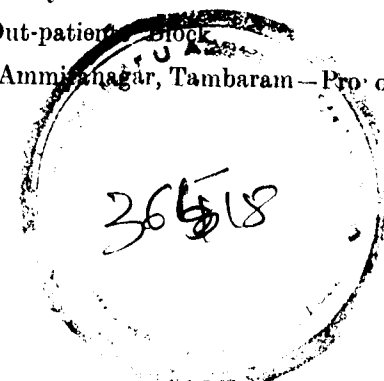

III. DIRECTION.

Chief Engineer (General and Buildings).—Sri J. M. Fredrick, re-employed on 19th November 1956, continued as Chief Engineer, General and Buildings, till 18th November 1958. Sri J. G. Abraham assumed charge as Chief Engineer, General and Buildings post, on 19th November 1958 forenoon.
