[SUBJECT.—Annual Administration Report—Government Mental Hospital, Madras—1959—Submitted to Government.]

I forward herewith the annual report on the working of the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, for the year ending 31st December 1959.

2. *Administration.*—The Government Mental Hospital, Madras, continued to be under the charge of Dr. T. George, M.B.B.S., D.P.M. (Eng.), M.P.S., during the year under report.

3. *Accommodation.*—The accommodation for patients in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, was as follows:—

The daily average population in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, during the year was 2,435 (1,658 males and 777 females) as against 2,259-166 (1,540-666 males and 718-500 females) in the previous year.

The total admissions during the year were 1,825 as against 1,542 in the year 1958.

[STATEMENT I.]

4. *Population.*—The total population of the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, during the year under report was 4,160 (2,822 males and 1,338 females) as against 3,712 (2,522 males and 1,190 females). The number of patients that remained at the commencement of the year was 2,335 (1,580 males and 755 females) as against 2,170 (1,512 males and 658 females) in the year 1958.

Of the total number of patients treated during the period 229 were cured, 1,200 improved, 63 not improved, 47 discharged otherwise and 82 died.

[STATEMENT II.]

5. *Cases admitted for observation.*—During the year under report, 280 cases were observed in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras. Of these, 260 were certified and admitted in the hospital, one was released under section 14 of the Indian Lunacy Act, five were released as uncertifiable, four died and ten continued to remain under observation at the end of the year.

6. *Criminal cases.*—Thirty criminal mental cases were admitted into the Government Mental Hospital, Madras. The number of criminal mental patients that remained in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, at the end of the year was 171 as against 164 in the year 1958.

[STATEMENT IV.]

7. *Classes.*—Of the total number of 1,825 patients admitted during the year, 7 were Europeans and Anglo-Indians, 146 Indian Christians, 1,511 Hindus and 161 Muslims.

[STATEMENT V.]

8. *Age of patients admitted.*—Out of the 1,825 patients admitted during the year, 145 were below 20 years of age (as against 139 in 1958), 1,238 between 20 and 40 years of age (as compared with 1,035 in the previous year), 400 patients were between the ages of 40 and 60 years (as against 336 in 1958) while 42 patients were above 60 years of age (as against 32 in the previous year). As usual the largest number of patients admitted was in the age group of 20 to 40 years.

9. *Types of insanity.*—The principal types of insanity were mental deficiency, Neurosis, psychosis, schizophrenia, Manic, depressive psychosis, neurosyphilis, toxic psychosis, etc.

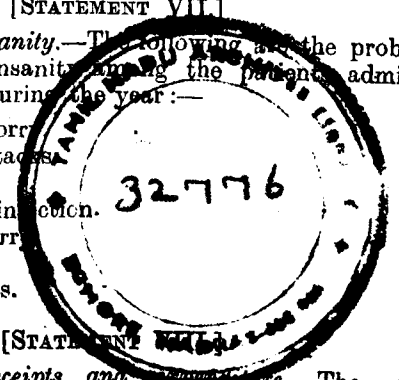
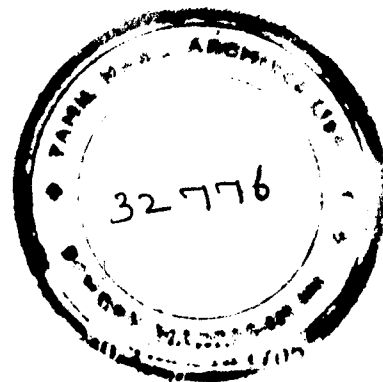
10. *Causes of insanity.*—The following are the probable main causes of insanity among the patients admitted into the hospital during the year:—

- 1 Domestic worry
- 2 Previous attacks
- 3 Ill-health.
- 4 Hereditary infection.
- 5 Business worry
- 6 Syphilis.
- 7 Mental stress.

[STATEMENT VIII.]

11. *Finance—Receipts and Expenditure.*—The total receipts including those from paying patients in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, during the year under report amounted to Rs. 21,76,821 as against Rs. 20,55,620 in the previous year. The following statement indicates the variation in figures under the main heads of expenditure:—

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12. *Treatment*.—Treatment is given to patients on modern lines. The following methods of treatment were adopted:—

- (1) Treatment with tranquillising drugs.
- (2) Electric convulsive therapy.
- (3) Insulin coma therapy.
- (4) Hormone therapy.
- (5) Psycho therapy.
- (6) Occupation therapy.
- (7) Recreation therapy.
- (8) Psycho surgery.

With the more liberal supply of the new drugs, Tranquilliser, the number of patients that were discharged as 'Improved' and those who were able to adjust themselves outside, without the necessity of institutional treatment is progressively on the increase.

13. *Deaths and mortality*.—The number of deaths in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, during the year under report was 82.

14. *Accidents and injuries*.—There were no major accidents or injuries during the year under report.

15. *Escapes*.—Ten patients escaped from the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, during the year 1959. Two of them were brought back and the remaining eight who could not be traced were treated as having been discharged as per section 36 of the Indian Lunacy Act.

16. *General hygiene*.—Every precaution was taken to maintain the highest standard of sanitary condition of the hospital. General hygiene among the insanes was good.

17. *Water-supply*.—As usual Red Hills water is used for all drinking and cooking purposes, while well water is used for cleaning and gardening purposes.

18. *Occupational therapy*.—The patients are engaged in the following kinds of occupation in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, since occupational therapy is one of the methods employed for the treatment of mental cases:—

- (1) Carpentry.
- (2) Blacksmithy.
- (3) Book-binding.
- (4) Masonry.
- (5) Gardening.
- (6) Spinning.
- (7) Weaving.
- (8) Tailoring.
- (9) Laundry.
- (10) Poultry farming.
- (11) Kora mat weaving.

- (12) Palmyra mat making.
- (13) Paper cutting and flower making.
- (14) Stitching, embroidery and needle works.

19. *Recreation therapy*.—Recreation to patients is afforded by group games (indoor as well as outdoor) music, reading of newspapers, journals, film shows, etc.

20. *Religious ministrations*.—Religious ministrations were rendered by the Church of South India, Catholic Priests from Perumbur and the Salvation Army and the Youth League of the Apostolic Christian Assembly, Madras Muslim patients attended mosque whenever they desired Weekly Bhajan was conducted for the Hindu patients.

21. *Visitors*.—The usual monthly visiting committee of the hospital was attended by all the official and non-official visitors. There were other distinguished persons who visited the hospital during the year including His Excellency the Governor of Madras.

22. *Temporary discharges*.—Temporary discharges are granted to patients to watch their adjustability to home surroundings and outside environment. Two hundred and sixty-five patients were sent on temporary discharge during the year under report.

23. *Buildings*.—The periodical repairs to the buildings were carried out by the Public Works Department. The buildings were kept in a good condition.

24. *Out-patient department*.—The out-patient department in the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, is functioning satisfactorily. Three thousand seven hundred and fifty cases (old and new) were treated in the out-patient department of the hospital during the year under report.

Verification of stock registers and service books.—The verification of stock registers and service books of the staff of the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, was carried out for the year under report.

General.—The hospital continues to be overcrowded. The proposal for the construction of an After-Care Colony to relieve the congestion in the hospital was deferred by Government for consideration as a scheme for the Third Five-Year Plan. The proposal to transfer the criminal lunatics to the Jail department or to construct a separate Mental Jail for housing them has also been negated by Government. The overcrowding could be relieved if an After-Care Colony is opened to accommodate the patients who have no other place to go and who need only minimum attention.

The administration of the Government Mental Hospital, Madras, was carried out satisfactorily during the year under report.
