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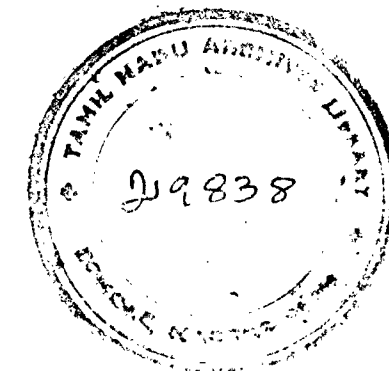
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PART I

Administration Report of the Harijan Welfare Department on the ameliorative measures undertaken for the Welfare of Eligible Communities for the year 1968-69.

PERSONNEL:

Thiru P. Sankaran, I.A.S., continued as Director of Harijan Welfare upto 4.2.69 A.N. Thiru C. Sundaramoorthy, I.A.S., assumed charge as Director of Harijan Welfare on the Forenoon of 5.2.69 and continued as Director of Harijan Welfare during the rest of the period under report.

The post of joint Director which was kept in abeyance has been revived in G.O.Rt.No.299 Public (Spl.A.) dt.15.2.69 (in the Grade of D.R.O.) Thiru V. Karuppan, M.A. assumed charge as Joint Director on 17.3.69 and continued as Joint Director during the rest of the period under report.

Thiru G. Krishnamoorthy, B.A., continued as Personal Assistant to the Director of Harijan Welfare Madras upto 25.2.69 A.N. Thiru A. Rajadurai, B assumed charge as personal Assistant to the Director of Harijan Welfare on the F.N. ^{of} 26.2.69 and continued as personal Assistant to the director of Harijan Welfare during the rest of the period under report. Thiru V. Palaniyappan, B.A., continued as Special Officer for Government of India Scholarships during the period under report.

Thiru V. Chandrasekaran continued as Senior Accounts Officer during the period under report.

DISTRICT ESTABLISHMENT:

The Collectors of the Districts continued to be responsible for the ameliorative measures undertaken in the districts. The Collectors were assisted by the District Welfare Officers who were in the grade of Deputy Collectors in all districts. In Madurai District there is a Special Deputy Collector to look after Kallar Reclamation work. He is assisting the Collector in the implementation of Kallar Reclamation works.

Particulars of staff assisted in the offices of the Director of Harijan Welfare and District Welfare Officers are given in Annexure I.A. to I.C. of this report.

TOURING

The Director of Harijan Welfare and Joint Director of Harijan Welfare are state touring Officers and they have inspected the Harijan Welfare Schools, Hostels, Colonies, works and examined land Acquisition cases in the following districts during the period under report.

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The Senior Accounts Officer of this office assisted by two internal audit parties toured all the districts except Madras City and verified accounts and records in the Offices of the District Welfare Officers. He also inspected the accounts of the Special Deputy Collector, Kallar Reclamation, Madurai.

COMMUNITIES ELIGIBLE FOR HELP BY HARIJAN WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

The ameliorative measures undertaken by the Harijan Welfare Department were continued as usual to the communities specified in Annexure A.

2. STATE HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEE:-

The State Harijan Welfare Committee met twice during 1968-69. The first meeting was on 18.7.68 and 19.7.68 at Tiruchirapalli and the second meeting was on 9.1.69 and 10.1.69 at Karaikudi. This Committee discussed various subjects on polity matters relating to the Welfare of Scheduled Castes.

3. DISTRICT HARIJAN WELFARE COMMITTEE

The District Harijan Welfare Committees continued to function with the respective District Collector's as Chairman during the period under report. The number of meetings held by the Communities in the districts is given below:-

4. MADRAS TRIBES ADVISORY COUNCIL:-

During the period under report the council met twice (i.e. on 1.6.68 at Madras and on 13.12.68 at Salem) and discussed various measures to be adopted for the uplift of Scheduled Tribes.

5. DISTRICT TRIBAL WELFARE COMMITTEE OOTACAMUNE.

The District Tribes Advisory Committee continued to function during the year under report. The Collector, The Nilgiris is the chairman of the Committee.

6. STATE BACKWARD CLASSES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

During the year under report the Committee met once on 4.10.68 at Chidambaram.

7. AMELIORATIVE MEASURES UNDERTAKEN BY HARIJAN WELFARE DEPARTMENT

THE AMELIORATIVE WORK REPRESENTS:

1. Provision of House Sites.
2. Maintenance of Schools Hostels grant of Scholarships, stipends Boarding grants and grants to private educational institution for the benefit of communities eligible for help by the Harijan Welfare Department.
3. Provision of wells and overhead tanks for Drinking water.
4. Provision of irrigation wells, sanitary amenities, street lights, pathways to Harijan colonies and burial and ~~burning~~ *burning* grounds.
5. Grants to private bodies engaged in Social, Economic uplift of ~~subsidies for the~~ Eligible communities.
6. Grant of subsidies for the purchase of plough bulls.
7. Grant of subsidy and loan for construction of houses.
8. *+ implements* Starting of cottage industries for the benefit of Eligible Communities and grant of the technically trained persons belonging to Scheduled Castes. (X)
9. ~~Government~~ Grant of subsidies and loans for the organisation of Co-operative Societies etc.
10. Coaching candidates belonging Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes for All India Services Examinations conducted by the Union Public Service Commission.
11. Grant of interest free loans to Scheduled castes for starting petty trader.

8. HOUSE SITES:

House sites have been provided by assignment of of lands at the disposal of Government and by acquiring private lands. Details of house sites provided by assignment of Government lands are given ⁱⁿ ~~to~~ ^{ment} State No. II.

1433 House Sites covering an extent of 53.11 acres of Government lands were assigned for Scheduled Castes in the State during 68-69. The total number of house-sites provided out of Government lands since the commencement of the scheme upto 31.3.69 is 75614.

An extent of 527.02 acres of land was acquired ^{at} a cost of Rs.13,75,986.69 as detailed in the Statement III. The total number of house-sites provided during the year under report is 8322. The total number of house-sites provided after acquisition since the commencement of the scheme upto 31.3.1969 is 199,843. Thus the total number of house sites provided out of Government lands and out of acquired lands comes to 275457 upto 31.3.69.

9. LOANS TO HARIJAN FOR ACQUISITION OF HOUSE SITES:-

During the year under report a sum of Rs.2679.81 was collected under Principal against the demand of Rs.20,711.40 leaving the balance of Rs.88031.59. Under interest a sum of Rs.521.98 was collected against the demand of Rs.15234.53 leaving a balance of Rs.14,742.55.

10. EDUCATION.

The following facilities have been provided in the field of Education.

1. Maintenance of Schools run by this Department.
2. Sanction of boarding grants, scholarships, Supply of Midday Meals, books, clothing and payment of examination fees.
3. Maintenance of Government

4. Grant of financial assistance to private bodies engaged in Maintenance of hostels, schools etc. for the benefit of Eligible Communities.

SCHOOLS:

Particulars showing the number of Harijan Welfare Schools in Madras State are given in the Statement IV part I to III with the strength of pupils, teaching staff etc. (The total number of children who received education during the period under report was 1,10,746. Consisting of 48999 girls and 61747 boys.) The total number of teachers employed was 3724. The details showing the number of trained and untrained teachers employed under different categories is furnished in Statement IV Part II. (In addition to 829 Harijan Welfare Schools) Schools were run by this department for the benefit of Scheduled Tribes, Kallar and Denotified Tribes children.

MIDDAY MEALS:

(The Supply of Midday Meals was made to the pupils studying in all the Schools run under the Control of this department and also to the pupils in select Non Harijan Welfare Schools where the strength of the Harijan pupils exceeds 70% subject to the availability of funds.)

The expenditure incurred towards the supply of Midday Meals was Rs.32,20,828.45 during 68-69 as against 27,19,395. in the year 67-68. This scheme worked satisfactorily during the period under report.)

11. GOVERNMENT HOSTELS:-

(At the beginning of the year 1968-69 there were 396 Government Hostels all over the State run by this department for the benefit of Eligible Communities. During the year under report the following hostels for Scheduled Castes were ordered to be newly opened by the Government.)

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The Subsidised hostels, A.T.M. Bajaji Hostel, Tirupathur and Residential Scholarship boarding home Tambaram were ordered to be taken over in G.O.Ms.No.3705 Home dated 18.9.68. The staff and other items of expenditure were sanctioned for the opening of hostels in G.O.Ms.No.3385 (Home) dated 17.8.68. In G.O.Ms.No.3074 Home dated 15.10.68 the staff and other items of expenditure were sanctioned for Government Boys Hostel, Tirupathur and Tambaram.

The Residential Scholarship Boarding Home, Tambaram, is not functioning for want of accommodation. The hostel for Industrial Students at Dharapuram was closed and a boys hostel was opened at Talavadi with reference to G.O.Ms.No.3591 Home dated 5.12.68 and G.O.Ms.No.169 (S.W.) dated 28.3.69 respectively.

The Residential Scholarship Home Pattukkottai was not taken over during 1968-69. Thus in all there were 410 Hostels functioning all over the State at the end of 1968-69. The total strength of boarders of 410 hostels was 38,974 (boys + girls 21608 + 7366). The details of 410 hostel are furnished in Annexure.B.

Admission was open to all communities in the Hostels in certain proportions. This enabled them to mingle with each other freely and this aided the removal of untouchability in the State. According to the orders of Government ~~is adopted~~ the following percentage is adopted in the admission of the students belonging to various communities.)

The 91 part time tutors sanctioned during 66-67 and 67-68 were ordered to be continued during 68-69. Out of this 89 posts were utilised and ~~two~~ ^{Two} could not be utilised for want of suitable hands.

The concession granted in G.O.Ms.No.3237 Home dated 24.9.66 for the award of two cash rewards of Rs.200/- each annually to the best warden/matron selected for each district including Madras City who significantly worked to the improvement of the inmates of Government Hostels was also continued during 1968-69. The selection is made by the Collectors.)

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13. HOSTELS SUBSIDISED BY THE HARIJAN WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

The policy of granting financial assistance to organisation such as Harijan Sevak Sangh, Thakkar Bapa Vidyalaya etc. towards the maintenance of boarding Homes conducted by them for the benefit of Eligible Communities was continued during the period under report. The names of such institutions the number of boarding grants and the amount of boarding grants sanctioned are shown in Annexure C. A sum of Rs.7,35,688.96 was sanctioned to the managements of these hostels towards the maintenance of 3773 Scheduled Caste pupils residing in these hostels. The rate of boarding grant was sanctioned at Rs.20/- p.m. per boarder for 10 months in respect of hostels located in plain and at Rs.21 /-p.m. per boarder for 10 months for hostels located in hill areas.

BOARDING GRANTS TO BACKWARD CLASSES

During the period under report, boarding grants amounting to Rs.4,46,802.84 were sanctioned to 2268 students belonging to Backward Classes residing in the subsidised hostels. The details of hostels, the number of grants and the amount sanctioned etc. are furnished in Annexure C.

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BOARDING GRANTS TO FORWARD COMMUNITIES ::

With a view to eradicate untouchability and also to avoid segregations of Scheduled Castes from other communities a sum of Rs.33,293.45 was sanctioned to 247 students of forward communities residing in the subsidised hostels during the period under report. The grant was sanctioned at 2/3 of the normal rate of boarding grants. The details of number of grants and amount involved are furnished in Annexure C.

MATRON'S SUBSIDY:-

The Government in their Memo No.410 R.W.D.IV. 1953-1 dt.27.1.53 have permitted the Director of Harijan Welfare to grant subsidy towards the pay of Matrons employed in Girls and mixed hostels subsidised by the Government at the rate sanctioned in G.O.Ms.No.381 R.W. dated 4.4.62 for every year. The particulars of hostels which were in receipt of Matron's subsidy during 1968-69 are furnished in the Annexure D. A sum of Rs.2160 was sanctioned for giving subsidy towards the pay of the matrons employed in 12 subsidised hostels.

SCHOLARSHIPS TO ELIGIBLE COMMUNITIES

The sanction of scholarships to the pupils of Eligible communities (Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Caste Converts and other Eligible Communities) continued on the usual lines as in the

previous years. Separate allotments were made in the Budget for the year 1968-69 for granting scholarships to the students of Eligible communities. The work relating to the sanction of Scholarships to the pre-matric and Post-matric Courses (except the Post-matric Technical and Industrial Courses for which the No. of scholarships to be awarded is limited) was attended to by the District Welfare Officers in all Districts, except Madras. In Madras the sanction of Post-matric scholarships was attended to by the Special Officer for Government of India Scholarships in the Office of the Director of Harijan Welfare and the award of Pre-matric scholarship by the District Welfare Officer, Madras City, under the control of the Collector, Madras. The sanction of scholarships for courses for which No. of scholarships is limited was continued to be sanctioned by the Special Officer in the Office of the Director of Harijan Welfare in Madras City.

According to the orders in G.O.Ms.No.2672, Home, dated 2.8.1962, the students belonging to Eligible Communities studying teachers Training Courses continued to enjoy the scholarships at a flat rate of Rs.25/- p.m. for 10 months in a year in lieu of stipend from Education Department. This expenditure on this account has been included in the statement regarding the Residential Scholarships to pupils in Secondary Schools.) ✓

(With a view to ensure that there was no disparity in the value of scholarships given by the Harijan Welfare Department and the Government of India Scholarships and to see that the Government of India scholarship holders do not drawn lesser amount of scholarships than the State Scholarship holders, the Government in their order No.2466, I.L.& C.Dept. dated 19.7.1955 empowered the Director of Harijan Welfare,

Madras, to award to the students enjoying the Government of India Scholarships, the difference in the value of the State Scholarships and the Government of India Scholarships wherever the Government of India Scholarships are lesser in value. An expenditure of Rs.3,09,127.15 was incurred towards supplementing of the Government of India scholarships in 2997 cases during the year 1968-69 as follows:-

The total amount spent since the commencement of the Scheme upto 31.3.69 works out to Rs.69,09,674.10 particulars of number of wells constructed, repaired etc. are furnished in Statement V.

19. PROVISION OF SANITARY AMENITIES:

A sum of Rs.14,39,013 was spent during the year under report for the provision of sanitary facilities to harijan colonies, such as formation of pathways, provision of burial grounds, public convenience, bath works etc. District-wise details are furnished in "Statement VI".

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20. ASSIGNMENT OF LANDS:

Particulars of lands reserved and the extent of lands assigned to Harijans during the year under report are furnished in Statement VII.

21. UNTOUCHABILITY OFFENCES ACT:

The untouchability offences Act of 1955 introduced in Supersession of the Madras Removal of Civil Disabling Act of 1947 continued to improve the social conditions of the Harijans to a great extent during *period under report. Though the* the practice of untouchability could not be eradicated completely, the above said Act has helped much to decrease the offences to the extent possible. As this Act has been declared cognizable prosecutions are launched against the offenders by the police Department which is entrusted with the work of enforcing the act successfully and the Government are watching the progress. 22. HARIJAN DAY CELEBRATION

During the year under report Harijan Day was celebrated on 30th of every month except in February when it was celebrated on the last day of the month throughout the State. Meetings were held during these celebrations and ameliorative measures undertaken for the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and the evils of untouchability were explained to the public. During the last week of January 1969 "Harijan Week" was celebrated throughout the State in a fitting manner. The Celebrations proved a great success in casting the Harijans nearer to caste Hindus and also to help them to have a sense of equality with others in the Society. Such meetings have also helped Harijans and others to know the facilities that the Government have offered

for their benefits. For celebrations Harijan Week a sum of Rs.13,387.40 was spent during 68-69 as against Rs.14,620.38 in 1967-68.

23. AWARD OF GOLD MEDALS TO INTER CLASS MARRIED COUPLES.

In order to create a casteless and classless society, the Government have considered that this could be achieved by encouraging inter class marriages. To give sufficient inducement to the parties who might be disposed to enter into inter class marriages, the Government have ordered (in G.O.Ms.No.2748 Home dated 21.9.68) the award of gold medals for the couples who have married from 1.7.67. A final provision of Rs.10,300 for this purpose was made during 1968-69. One of the members of the couples should belong to Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, the other should belong to either forward community, Backward Community or Most Backward Community. Both should belong to Hindu religion. During 68-69 48 medals were awarded.

24. LOANS TO SCHEDULED CASTES FOR STARTING PETTY TRADES.

During 1968-69 the Government have (in G.O.Ms.No.1656 Home dated 8.6.68 and G.O.Ms.No.2773 Home dated 23.9.68) introduced a new scheme for the sanction of interest free loan to Scheduled Caste people (Hindus) having talent and at least 3 years experience for trades to better their economic

conditions. The amount of loan was upto Rs.5000. according to the nature of the trade for which security should be shown for $1\frac{1}{2}$ times of loan amount. A sum of Rs.1 lakh was finally provided for 68-69 and this amount was granted to 170 persons.

26. PERSONAL DEPOSIT ACCOUNT:

The personal Deposit Account in the name of the Director of Harijan Welfare was reopened for the year 68-69 with reference to G.O.Rt.No.1971 (Home) dated 1.4.68. During the year under report 5195 bills were passed for which 1188 cheques were issued involving an expenditure of Rs.95,59,172.67 towards payment of State and Government of India Scholarships during 1968-69.

26. AWARD OF GOVERNMENT OF INDIA SCHOLARSHIPS TO BACKWARD CLASSES:-

Under the Government of India Schemes, Scholarships to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward classes are awarded every year to the students belonging to these communities for post matric studies in India. The Government of India, Ministry of Education itself were awarding the scholarships till 1958-59. The Schemes were decentralised to respective State Governments from the year 1959-60.

A sum of Rs.61,32,500.00 was provided during the period under report for the award of Government of India Scholarships to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes Students. Against this provision a sum of Rs.61,66,391.65 was spent. The amount spent for the purpose during 67-68 was 5401539.20 against an allotment of Rs.5385100.00. These scholarships were sanctioned for post Matriculation studies in India.

SCHOLARSHIPS TO SCHEDULED CASTES:

During the year under report the Government of India have provided a sum of Rs.45,93,400 for the award of scholarships to Scheduled castes. The particulars of expenditure and the number of scholarships sanctioned are given below.

The total number of Habitual Offenders as on 1.4.68 was 5.

There is only one internee of South Arcot District in Aziz Nagar Settlement. His name is Nandimangalam Karuppan. He continues to sign the attendance register. His activities are being watched. The Superintendent of Police, South Arcot who visited the settlement has observed that the ~~and~~ ^{Said} internee is now aged 72 blinded in his vision and that his name may be lifted from the list proposals have been submitted for the removal of his name,. If the remaining four internees three are out of views and one is employed as a gardener in police station Neyveli 2 and he continues to sign the attendance register. The Superintendents of Police Thanjavur and Ramanathapuram have been addressed in respect of the three internees who are out of view.

3. AGRICULTURE

The main occupation of the settlers is cultivation. The total extent of Agricultural lands available in the settlement is 1114 acres and 38 cents. The lands have been conditionally assigned to the settlers to an extent of 481.35 acres and most of the remaining extent of lands is cultivated under Sivajina.

The water in the artesian wells has ceased to flow for the past 9 or 10 years due to de-watering operations carried on by the Newveld Lignite Corporation and as a result large extents of dry lands are laid waste and consequently the economic condition of the settlers is adversely affected.

The Government in their order Rt.No.1717 Home dated 20.3.68 sanctioned a sum of Rs.2250/- for cleaning the nine bore wells in the Settlement and the work has been carried out.

4. AGRICULTURAL SUBSIDY:

A sum of Rs.6250/- was spent for 3 irrigation wells.

5. MAINTENANCE OF GOVERNMENT WORKS BULLS AND CART

The bulls and carts maintained in the Settlement for Government work have been sold in auction during the year 1968-69 and the sale proceeds credited to Government.

6. INDUSTRIES:

There are 3 industries in the settlement viz. carpentry, weaving and leather. Each Industry is in-charge of a qualified Instructor. About 20 settlers are normally provided with work in these Industries.

7. CARPENTRY :

As against an allotment of Rs.20,000/- a sum of Rs.20,001/- was spent towards the purchase of raw materials payment of wages etc.

Apart from this a coir making Industry is also run by the Women's Welfare Department in the Aziz Nagar Settlement. A women Welfare Centre is also maintained by the Womens Welfare Department for giving training to the female members in Embroidery spinning, mat weaving and needle work etc.

10. Other forms of Occupation.

In addition to the above, the settlers find employment in the neighbouring agricultural lands as labourers and in Neyveli Lignite Corporation as coolies, fitters, turners, sailicks, watch and yards etc.

There is a training centre for training men for the coir Industry which is run by the Industries department with 20 trainees. They are given a monthly stipend of Rs.30/- p.m. The finished products viz. Matting and Mattress, ~~Chair~~ Chair Mat, Bush Mat etc. are sent to the sales emporium at Neyveli for Sales.

11. HEALTH AND SANITATION:

There is a dispensary Consisting of one Medical Officer, (M.B.B.S.), one Pharmacist, one Maternity Assistant, one Male Nursing orderly, one Female Nursing orderly and one Sweeper-cum-watchman Drinking water supply and other items relating to the maintenance of sanitation is attended to by the Manager, Aziz Nagar Settlement. The construction of an over head tank at an estimated cost of Rs.24,500/- has been sanctioned by the Government and estimates are under preparation.

12. EDUCATION:

For the free education of the Denotified Tribes pupils there was a Government Senior Basic School at Aziz Nagar Settlement. This school was converted into a High School during 67-68 and the Xth Standard. was opened during the year. The students were supplied with Midday Meals clothing and books.

KALLAR CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES

347 Kallar Co-operative Societies were registered for Piramalai Kallar Community for the issue of loans to improve their economic condition. As the financial accommodation was inadequate the Government have ordered that all Kallar Co-operative Societies should be affiliated with Madurai District Co-operative Central Bank, so that the bank can finance these societies. 255 Kallar Co-operative

Societies have been affiliated with the Madurai District Central Co-operative Bank till the end of the year. One society viz. Usilampatty Cottage Industrial Society has been transferred to the Control of Village Industries Officer. Out of the remaining unaffiliated Kallar Co-operative Societies, 45 have been liquidated. 42 Societies are under R.R. Act for the recovery of Government dues one society is functioning. steps are being taken to liquidate 3 more societies.

TRUST FUND:

The trust fund was constituted by pooling the Reserve Fund and accumulated fixed Deposit of the Kallar Co-operative Societies. Out of this fund loans were granted to the Kallar Co-operative Societies for Agricultural purpose as the Government loans were inadequate.

The Government have passed orders for the dissolution of the Trust Fund on the recommendation of the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Madras as the object of the Trust Fund was not existing since the Madurai District Central Co-operative Bank is affiliating and financing the Societies that are working satisfactorily.

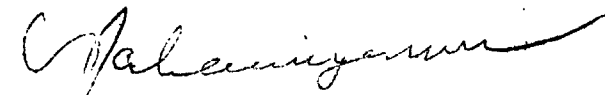
KALLAR LABOUR CONTRACT SOCIETY

The Madurai District Kallar Co-operative Labour Society is carrying out the work connected with the construction and repairs to the School

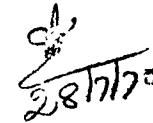
buildings under Kallar Reclamation Scheme through the sub-contractors who are members of the Society. All works pertaining to Kallar Schools etc. under the control of the Special Deputy Collector are entrusted to this Society for execution. A sum of Rs.60782.00 borrowed from the Trust Fund account is outstanding at the end of the year and the entire amount has already become over due. The Society is being managed by a Senior Inspector of Co-operative Societies as Ex.Officio Secretary and the Board of Director's consisting of 10 members elected by the General Body. During the year 1968-69 the Society has undertaken 133 contracts to the tune of Rs.1,91,780 and earned a commission of Rs.9,668.24.

PIRAMALAI KALLAR COMMON FUND.

The General body of Piramalai Kallar Common fund Committee met on 16.2.68 unanimously resolved to transfer the entire properties of this fund to Kallar Kalvi Kozhagam. The Government have also agreed to this and the fund was transferred to Kallar Kalvi Kozhagam, Usilampatty on 6.4.68.

RECLAMATION OF KALLARS, KORAVARS AND DENOTIFIED
TRIBES IN RAMANATHAPURAM DISTRICT.

- (a) KALLARS: The Kallar reclamation work was confined to the maintenance of two Kallar Schools in Srivilliputhur Taluk in this district. The pupils were provided with books and slates. 2 sets of dresses were also provided to the students of these schools.
- (b) KORAVARS: There are two Government hostels one for the Koravar boys and the other for Koravar Girls at Aruppukottai. The sanctioned strength of these 2 hostels is 100 and 50 respectively.
- (c) WELFARE OF DENOTIFIED TRIBES. For the Welfare of Denotified Tribes 5 Marava Schools are maintained by the Harijan Welfare Department. The children of these schools were provided with free supply of books and slates midday meals and two sets of dresses. Five reading rooms and libraries are attached to these schools. The 5 Marava boarding Homes at Kadaladi, Panmanandal, Mudukulathu, Kanuthi, Nainankoil were continued to be maintained.

KORAVA RECLAMATION:- (SALEM)

There are two Korava Reclamation Schools in Salem District one at Muthampatty of Salem Taluk and the Other at Manivilandan of Attur Taluk. The students are being fed with midday meals and they are also being supplied with free clothing, books and slates. Besides, one Moral instructor is visiting the villages where there are Denotified Tribes and working for the Social, Educational and Economic Uplift of the Koravar and Denotified Tribes.

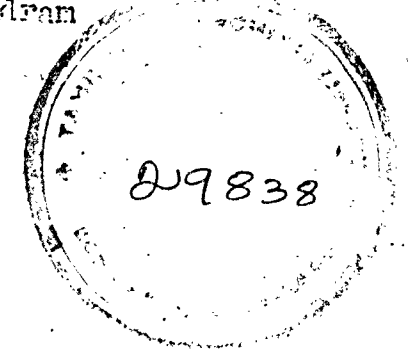

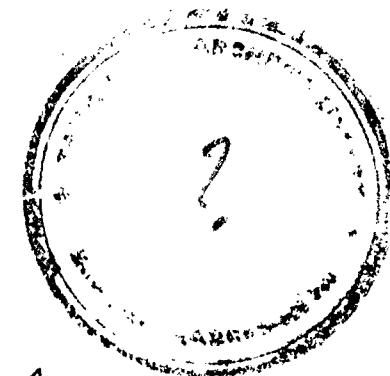
