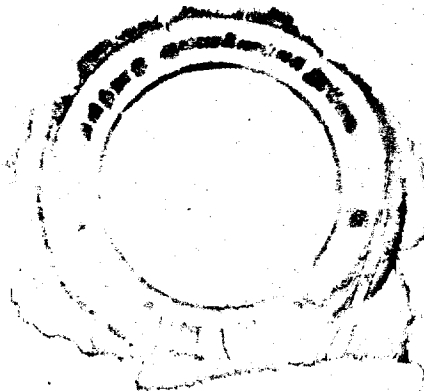

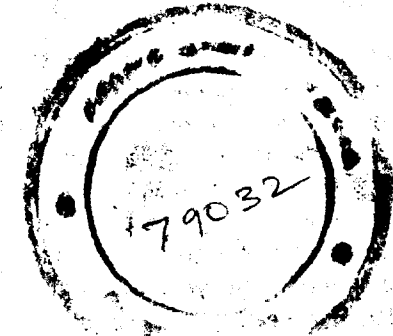

Introduction

The Fourteenth Census of Social Science Research in Southern States reported here relates to post-MA/M.Sc. research projects on going and completed in 1983. As in previous years information was canvassed from all universities in the area and the major research institutions. In Tamil Nadu alone an attempt was made to reach colleges offering post-graduate courses in the social sciences and where research leading in M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees was being done. As can be seen from Table 1, in all 38 institutions responded—the largest so far - of which 13 are colleges from Tamil Nadu. It is a matter of regret that some of the leading research institutions have not coöperated with the effort to make the Census Report a comprehensive document of current research in social sciences in the four Southern States. The total number of items reported this year is 422 which is less than last year's record

number of 470 and the 456 recorded in the Twelfth Census.

Table 1 and 2 that follow the introductory note gives the basic information pertaining to the census. Table 1 gives the list of institutions that have participated in the census and the general classification of the entries according to subjects. The columns in the Table show the subject entries alphabetically arranged. As in previous years Economics takes the lead with 132 entries which, however, is much less than the 179 reported in 1983 and the 166 in 1982. The second place goes to Political Science and Public Administration with 69 entries and the third place is taken by History which has 50 items. The fourth place goes to Psychology with 38 entries. Commerce and Business Administration which with 60 entries had the second place last year

goes down to the fifth place in this report with 31 items. The figures for the remaining subjects are : Agriculture 29, Anthropology 20, Education 13, Sociology 12, Linguistics 9, Law 8, Social Work 4, Interdisciplinary research 3, Adult Education and Geography 2 each. There is no entry in Demography this year although there were 15 last year.

The rows in Table 1 give the entries from the institutions arranged according to the States. The State totals are also indicated. Tamil Nadu, not surprisingly, takes the lead with 192 entries. As in the past year the second place is taken by Andhra Pradesh with 91 entries. Karnataka has 79 entries and Kerala 60, a big increase from last year's 24.

Table 2 gives a more detailed classification of the entries according to the purpose for which the research is being done. Of the 422 entries 244 lead to the Ph.D. theses and 98 to the M. Phil dissertations. General research not leading to any degree has 80 entries. Research for the M. Phil dissertation had 152 entries last year and the reduction there may be mainly responsible for the decline in the total entries this year.

Presentation of the Census

Part I of the census which reports on research projects is organised as follows :

The classification is first, subject-wise, second, institution-wise (University, institute and college), third, degree-wise (M.Phil Ph.D and projects not leading to any degree) and fourth, sub-area-wise (alphabetically) and within each sub-area the order is chronological. The subject classification and the institutional listing is

alphabetically arranged beginning with Anthropology.

Every entry first carries the title of the project. This is followed by the sub-area to which the research project belongs. It should be noted that the sub-area is as given by the respondents. Where this or any other information is absent from an entry, it may be understood that the same was not furnished by the respondent. The sub-area is followed by a brief account of the objective and methodology of the project. Then follow the degree to which the project leads ("Gen"), standing for 'General' is indicated if the project does not lead to a degree, the date of commencement of the project and date of termination, in that order. Finally, the names of the researcher and supervisor respectively are furnished. The abbreviation "(Ind)" appearing against the name of the researcher(s) indicates that the project has been undertaken independently by the researcher(s).

In the case of projects which have been reported either in the last census or in an earlier one, two points should be noted (1) The objectives and methodology of projects are not repeated if they have already been reported in sufficient detail. However all other information is furnished. (2) In addition to other details, the objectives and methodology are included in cases where i) this information was missing in the earlier report, ii) the presentation in the current report appeared to be more clear or detailed, and iii) any change was noticed in the Objectives and or methodology.

The following abbreviations have been used in the presentation :

A : Sub-area

O : Objectives

M : Methodology

R : Name of the researcher

S : Name of the supervisor

Gen : General

Ind : Independent research

In part II of the Census, the areas of specialisation of different centres is listed on the basis of information supplied by

the heads of concerned centers (departments or institutes as the case may be). It is hoped that the information given in part II will help the researchers to find out where research work of their interest is currently going on. The appendix provides the addresses of the universities, institutes and colleges which have responded to the census.

Comments on the census from users and suggestions for improving the presentations of the reports will be most welcome and may be sent to the Director of the Institute.
