Order—No. 413, Educational, dated 29th June 1907.

Under rules 36, 42 and 47 of the rules for the working of the College of Engineering, which were in force before 1st April 1907, fees were levied for the entrance examinations at the rates of Rs. 20, Rs. 15 and Rs. 10 respectively for the several classes, while for the final examinations, similar fees were levied (Rule 60). The final examinations, as well as the term examinations, for which no fees were levied, were conducted by the Board of Examiners, while the entrance examination in respect of which fees were levied was conducted by the College staff.

2. Under the revised rules issued in G.O., No. 159, Educational, dated 20th March 1907, there is no entrance examination with fees, as before, the selection of candidates for the several classes being made by the Principal, and only a registration fee of Rs. 5, Rs. 4 and Rs. 3, respectively, is levied from the candidates. The fees for the final examinations are the same as before, namely, Rs. 20, Rs. 15 and Rs. 10, respectively; but in view of the abolition of the entrance examination, there is likely to be a considerable fall in the total realisations from fees which in 1906-1907 amounted to Rs. 7,157 against an expenditure of Rs. 5,500 on account of remuneration to the examiners. If the registration fees are also excluded from the examination fees, the total income from fees will be still further reduced. The Director of Public Instruction is requested to see that the remuneration to the examiners does not exceed the examination fees, and should for this purpose revise, if necessary, the scale of remuneration approved in G.O., No. 204, Educational, dated 9th April 1902.
