Sir,

One J.D. Maduranayagam was admitted as a sti-
-pended Madras-Burma pupil in the Tanjore Medical School
on 1st July 1906. Subsequently a complaint was received
that the lad had understated his age in his application in
order to evade the rule regarding the age limit. This
complaint was duly inquired into with the result that the
copy of the baptismal certificate obtained from the Priest
C.M.S. Palamcottah showed that on the date of the pupil's
admission into school his age was 2½ months above the pres-
-cribed limit of 21 years. I accordingly issued for his
dismissal.

2. Maduranayagam has now submitted a petition
praying

praying for a reconsideration of the order of his dismissal.

It appears that he belongs to a respectable though poor Native Christian family and was very keen and zealous in his studies.

The Superintendent is of opinion that he had no intention of concealing his age, while Captain Harley, I.M.S., from his

experience of the lad who attended the Palamcottah Hospital

during the school vacation thinks it a great pity if the Depart-

-ment were to lose so promising a student. I have therefore

the honor to request the sanction of Government for the relaxa-

-tion of the age restriction as a special case and the readmis-

-sion of the pupil. Early orders are requested as the school

session begins on the 1st Proximo.

S u b j e c t.

Requesting sanction of Government for the relaxation of the age restriction of Madras-Burma pupil J.D. Maduranayagam of Tanjore Medical school.

Early please. It should be noted whether in the case of Madras-Burma pupils the Government of Burma has to be consulted in regard to any relaxation of the age limit, or whether the Government can act on their own responsibility.

2. The only ground on which the concession can be granted is that the concealment was due not to intention but to ignorance.

It is submitted that the Burma Government need not be consulted in regard to the relaxation of the age limit in favour of the student referred to. The rules for the selection of the Madras-Burma pupils for the Hospital assistant class were framed by this Govt. vide G.O. No. 429 G.O. dated 3rd June 1892; and appear to have been revised from time to time by this Govt. The rules, as they now stand, will be found on pages 11 to 13 of G.O. No. 171 G.O. dated 11th March 1904. This Govt. of Madras seem therefore to be competent to grant the relaxation applied for.

The pupil ~~was~~ being a native & Indian, could have had no difficulty in producing evidence of his age at the date of admission to the College - & must have been aware of the rules. The Supt. (Capt. Russell Wright) is of opinion that "he had no intention of concealing his age" but does not state what evidence of age was produced at the time of his admission - nor in his present petition forwarded.

A. Perhaps he may be readmitted provisionally and a further report called for.
