Sir,

I have the honour to request that you will be so
good as to obtain the sanction of Government to a personal
allowance of Rs 20/- per mensem for the Headmaster of the
Reformatory School, at Chingleput.

2 The present Headmaster is an efficient officer
and has done good work for several years. The next higher post
in the school is that of Deputy Superintendent which belongs
to the Provincial Service and he cannot therefore aspire to it.
He was promoted to his present pay of Rs 60/- in April 1900-
please see G.O. No. 552 Educational, dated 1st November 1900-and
has had no promotion since. As his long connection with this
school and his intimate knowledge of the nature of the pupils
render his retention in the school desirable in its own interests,
I consider that the best way of rewarding his good work is to
grant him a personal allowance.

3 The necessary proposition statement will be 4
submitted on receipt of orders on this letter and provision for
the allowance which may have effect from 1st March next will be
made in the budget estimates for 1908-1909.

S u b j e c t.

Application for a personal allowance to the Headmaster of the Reformatory school, Chingleput.

The pay of the post of headmaster of the Reformatory school is Rs.60 per mensem. Please see G.O.No.552 Edl., dated 1st November 1900 and the present headmaster has been drawing this pay since April 1900.

2. The Director of Public Instruction states

(1) that the present headmaster is an efficient officer and has done good work for several years;

(2) that he cannot get any promotion in the school, the next higher post being that of ~~the~~ Deputy Superintendent which belongs to the Provincial Educational service; and

(3) that his retention in the school is desirable on account of his long connection with the school and of his intimate knowledge of its pupils.

3. The Director therefore recommends that the present headmaster may be granted a personal allowance of Rs.20 per mensem with effect from 1st March 1908.

4. It is for consideration whether the Director of Public Instruction's proposal may be accepted.
