Sir,

I have the honour to request you will be so good as to obtain the early sanction of Government to the admission, as a special case, of a non-Matriculate Muhammadan, Shaik Ibrahim, into the Medical School, Rayapuram, in the following circumstances.

2 Shaik Ibrahim was a Civil Medical pupil in the Rayapuram Medical School till 1906 and had nearly finished his course when he became deaf through illness which he contracted while on duty and was removed from the school on account of this disqualification. In June last he applied for readmission as a Civil Medical pupil on the ground that he had regained his power of hearing . Medical opinion on the point being divided he was brought before a Civil Medical Board for examination; and the Board while declaring him unfit for Government service observed that as the pupil had completed his compulsory lectures and

hospital attendance and had only to appear for the final examination they saw no serious objection to his being allowed to appear for the Final Examination as a private pupil as in their opinion he had sufficient power of hearing ^{to enable} him to practise as a private practitioner. But not being a Matriculate, Shaik Ibrahim is ineligible under the rules for admission as a private hospital assistant student. Both the Superintendent, Rayapuram Medical School and the Surgeon-General, however, consider him to be deserving of special exemption in the matter of educational standard and strongly recommend his readmission as a private pupil in order to make up the deficiency in his course and his admission to the ensuing Final Examination. I beg to support their recommendation and solicit the favour of early orders.

to make up the deficiency in his courses
to appear for the final examination, the
Sanction may perhaps be accorded to his
admission as a private pupil.
