I have the honour to request that Government will be pleased to extend the exemption from examination rules granted in G.O. No. 655 Rev., dated 13th November 1901 to M. Kunju Nair so as to enable him to hold appointments in the plains in this district as well as in the Wynaad.

2. Kunju Nair is at present permanent abkari clerk on Rs.20, Wynad Taluk Office. He has been in the Wynad for about 18 years and his health, originally excellent, has been much impaired in consequence, as he has contracted malaria of a bad type and is moreover very lame with rheumatism and compelled to hobble about with a stick. He has been on leave for over a year, but is little the better and is physically quite unfit for more service in the Wynad. Kunju

Kunju Nair's efficiency as a clerk has already been brought to the notice of Government in Board's Reference No. 621, dated 5th November 1901, upon which the G. O. quoted above was passed. The Tahsildar of Wynad reported about him in 1901 as under -- "Though he is unpassed he writes a good hand, both English and Malayalam, and his English composition is equal if not superior to several other passed clerks of this office." He has continued to be a useful and deserving clerk.

3. M.R.Ry. C. Gopalan Nair Avargal, Head-quarters Deputy Collector, Calicut, under whom Kunju Nair served when he was Tahsildar of Wynad, gives the following opinion of him:--

"I have known Kunju Nair since 1893 when I was Tahsildar of Wynad. His equal as a Taluk clerk it is difficult to find, especially as there is no department where he cannot give satisfaction. A strong and healthy constitution has broken down entirely by 18 Years' service (of which for about 11 years he was amsam menon) in the Wynad"

Every Tahsildar under whom Kunju Nair served as clerk, including my present Huzur Sheristadar, has a good opinion of his work and capacity.

4. To send him back to the Wynad again would be cruelty, I think, and would be a poor return for years of good service. I beg therefore to request that Government may be pleased to sanction the concession applied for. In the plains the clerk may recover his health.

SUBJECT.

Permanent Exemption of M. Kunju Nair, Clerk, Wynad Taluk Office from the Exam. rules to enable him to hold appointments in the plains as well as in the Wynad.

In G.O. No. 655 Educational, dated 13 Nov 1906 M. Kunju Nair was permanently exempted from the examination rules with the view of his being employed as a clerk in the Wynad Taluk Office.

2. The Collector of Malabar (Mr. Francis) requests that this exemption may be extended to the clerk so as to enable him to hold appointments in the plains in the district as well as in the Wynad.

3. The Collector states that the candidate for exemption is, at present, the permanent Abkari clerk on Rs 20 in the Wynad Taluk Office, that he has been in the Wynad for about 18 years, and that his health has been much impaired in consequence and that he is physically quite unfit for more service in the Wynad. Mr. Francis also states that every Tahsildar, whom Kunju Nair served as a clerk, including his (Mr. Francis) present Huzur Sanichtadar has a good opinion of his work and capacity. He observes that
