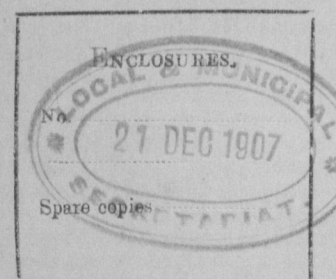

I humbly beg to submit the following few lines to your honour's kind consideration and favourable disposal. For the last about six years, I have been working in the Original Side Office in various capacities and you honour is aware that I have been discharging my duties to the entire satisfaction of my superiors. Your honour is also aware, that for the last about two years my duties are of such a nature as to necessitate my attending Court frequently before His Lordship sitting on the Original Side. As a knowledge of law is essential, for a clerk attending Court and as the Criminal Test is the only Test for which, under clause 4 (note 2) of the Public Service Notification dated 3-9-07, ^{App. Test?} I am not eligible to appear, I humbly beg to your honour to obtain the kind permission of His Lordship the Honourable the Chief Justice to enable me to appear for the said Test. There have been several instances both on the Appellate and Original Sides and also in several other offices in which such concessions have been granted by Government. I do not now seek exemption from passing the said Test but only beg permission to appear for the same and that for the Lower Grade.

The Criminal Judicial Tests, High^{ly} and Lower Grades shall be open only to (1) Candidates who have passed the First Examination in Arts of the Madras or Calcutta University. (2) Students of the College of Agriculture who have passed the examination for admission to the College and have obtained diploma in agriculture at the Government Technical Examinations. (3) Candidates who have passed either the Upper Secondary or the Matriculation Examination and have obtained the diploma in commerce at the Government Technical Examinations.

The applicant comes under clause 3 and has passed the Matriculation Examination, but since he has not obtained the diploma in commerce^{he} is not eligible for appearing.

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This is to certify that C.Dorasami Sastri has been a clerk in this office for the last three years during which period he has given me entire satisfaction in the discharge of his duties. He is hardworking and intelligent and his conduct has been uniformly good.

The Registrar of the High Court forwards for the orders of Government an application from C. Duraiswami Sastri, a clerk on the establishment of the Original Side of the High Court, praying that he may be permitted to appear for the Criminal Judicial Test, Lower Grade.

2. Under ^{Note (2) to Article 5} ~~Article 5~~ of the Special Tests Notification, the Criminal Judicial Test (Higher or Lower) is open ~~only open~~ to Candidates who have passed "either the Upper Secondary or the Matriculation examination and have obtained the diploma in Commerce at the Govt. Technical examinations". As the applicant, though a matriculate, has not obtained the diploma in Commerce, he requires the permission of Government for appearing for the Criminal Judicial Test, Lower Grade.

3. The applicant states that he has been working for ~~the last~~ about six years in the Original Side, that for the last about two years his duties ^{have been} ~~are~~ such as to necessitate his attending Court frequently before His Lordship sitting on the original side and ^{that} ~~as~~

a knowledge of law is essential, he begs permission to appear for the test in question.

4. The High Court, however make no special recommendation.

5. It is for consideration whether permission should be granted in this case. Attention is invited to G.O. No 82 Ee., 12.2.06 (M) 93 Ee., 15.2.06 (K) 218 Ee., 22.3.06 (D) and 267 Ee., 17.4.06 (I) in which similar applications were refused.

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The reason advanced by the applicant is doubtless bunkum. In the absence of a special recommendation the request may be refused.
