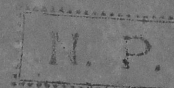

Letter—from R. A. NELSON, Esq., M.A., LL.M., Barrister-at-Law, Principal, Law College, Madras.

To—the Director of Public Instruction.

Dated—the 3rd December 1907.

In reference to your Proceedings, No. 7501, dated 29th November 1907, I have the honour to request that Government may be pleased to alter the date for closing the college for the summer vacation 1908, viz., Monday April 27th to Friday April 17th, owing to the special circumstances of the case peculiar to 1908.

2. Friday April 17th is Good Friday and therefore a college holiday. The 18th and 19th are non-working days and the college is closed for the Easter holidays during Easter week which ends on Saturday April 25th, the High Court vacation commencing on the following Monday (the 27th). There are therefore no working days at all after April 16th and to fix the first day of the vacation as Friday April 17th will therefore not shorten the working term by a single day.

3. If the college is not closed until Monday April 27th, both students and the staff will be unnecessarily detained in Madras for ten days, during which there is no work in college to be done, and, moreover, should any of the staff wish to proceed to Europe for the vacation, they would be unable to do so until Saturday May 2nd, which is a fortnight after the work has ceased and they would thus be unnecessarily detained in Madras. Under these special circumstances, I request that Government may be pleased to alter the date as suggested.

9TH JANUARY 1908.

[SUBJECT.—Alteration in the date of closing of the Law College for the Summer vacation of 1908.]

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 7th December 1907, No. 877.

For the summer vacation of 1908, the Law College, Madras, closes on the G.O., No. 785, Educational, dated 22nd November 1907. 27th April 1908, Monday (inclusive), and reopens on the 6th July 1908 (Monday).

2. The Principal of the Law College (Mr. Nelson) now requests that the date for closing the college, viz., 27th April, may be altered to 17th April 1908 (Friday) and urges the following grounds in support of his request :—

“ Friday, April 17, is Good Friday and therefore a College holiday. The 18th and 19th are non-working days and the college is closed for the Easter holidays during the Easter week which ends on Saturday April 25th, the High Court vacation commencing on the following Monday, the 27th. There are therefore no working days at all after April 16th and to fix the first day of the vacation as Friday April 17th will therefore not shorten the working term by a single day.” The Principal further points out that if the college is not closed until Monday, April 27th, both students and the staff will be unnecessarily detained in Madras for ten days during which there is no work and that, moreover, should any of the staff wish to proceed to Europe for the vacation they would be unable to do so until Saturday, May 2nd, which is a fortnight after the work has ceased.

3. With regard to this, it is submitted that the number of Easter holidays usually allowed is six and they usually commence on Thursday preceding Good Friday, in the case of the Law College. During the next year, the Easter holidays commence on Thursday 16th April and end with Tuesday 21st April 1908, and not on Saturday 25th April as Mr. Nelson states. Therefore work can go on for three days after the Easter holidays, viz., on 22nd, 23rd and 24th April 1908. Attention is, in this connection, invited to the Secretary's note on page 3 of K.W. G.O., No. 785, Educational, dated 22nd November 1907, where the question has already been discussed.

4. It is for consideration whether sufficient grounds have been shown for altering the date of closing of the Law College from 27th April to 17th April 1908. As pointed out in paragraph 3 of the office-note on page 3 of G.O., No. 785, Educational, dated 22nd November 1907, the combination of vacation with the Easter holidays is opposed to paragraph 3 of G.O., No. 833, Educational, dated 20th December 1906.

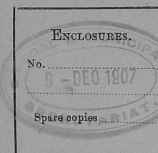

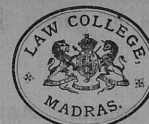

In reference to your Proceedings No. 7501 dated 29th November 1907, I have the honour to request that you would be pleased to alter the date for closing the College for the summer vacation 1908, viz. Monday April 27 to Friday April 17, owing to the special circumstances of the case peculiar to 1908.

2. Friday April 17 is Good Friday and therefore a College Holiday. The 18th and 19th are non-working days and the College is closed for the Easter holidays during Easter week which ends on Saturday April 25th - the High Court Vacation commencing on the following Monday (the 27th). There are therefore no working days at all after April 16th and to fix the first day of the vacation as Friday April 17th will therefore not shorten the working term by a single day.

3. If the College is not closed until Monday April 27, both students and the staff will be unnecessarily detained in Madras for 10 days, during which there is no work in College to be done, and moreover, should any of the staff wish to proceed to Europe for the vacation, they would be unable to do so until Saturday May 2, which is a fortnight after the work has ceased and they would thus be unnecessarily detained in Madras.
