Educational Department.

Sir,

I have the honour to invite reference to the Government
of India Order, No. 890 Home, Education, dated 31st October
1904, in which the grant of half pay to the Teachers under
training in the Madras Presidency has been sanctioned.

The Director of Public Instruction is allowing similar
concessions to the Sub-Assistant Inspectors of Schools
under training and quotes G.O. No. 45 Education, dated 25th
January 1884 in support of his action. This order grants
half pay to the Teachers and Deputy Inspectors (now Sub-
Assistant Inspectors) of Schools under training.

I have the honour to enquire if the Government order
of 1884 is still in force, or if the order of Government
of India quoted above excludes Sub-Assistant Inspectors of
Schools

Schools from the privileges detailed in that order.

H. In their order No.217 Educational, dated 13th
June 1369, the Government sanctioned the proposal
of Mr. Powell the then Director of Public Instruc-
tion, to send a teacher to the Government Normal
School for training, on half pay and authorized
the adoption of a similar course for the future.

F. 2. In 1333 the Accountant-General having
pointed out ~~that~~ that the above order had been
superseded by the rules framed for the working
of the Normal School under which leave without
allowances should be granted to a master while
under training, the Government once more formally
sanctioned the payment of half-pay to teachers
and Deputy Inspectors of Schools (corresponding to
the present Sub-Assistant Inspectors) sent for
training.- Vide G.O.No.45 Educational, dated 25th
January 1334.

B. 3. In 1904, the Government of India in their
letter No.390, Education, dated 31st October 1904,
approved the proposal of this Government ~~that~~ that
~~the~~ teachers sent for training to the Teachers' College
and Training Schools under Departmental management
should be allowed, in addition to their stipends,
a portion of their pay not exceeding one half and

also laid down certain other conditions, teachers
should be permitted to attend training institu-
tions — Vide G.O. No. 700 Edl. dated 23th November
1904. No ^{reference} ~~reference~~ was, however, made either in this
Government's letter No. 397 Edl. dated 23th June 1904
or in the Government India's ^{reply} ~~letter~~, ^{to} of Sub-Assistant
Inspectors of Schools sent for training.

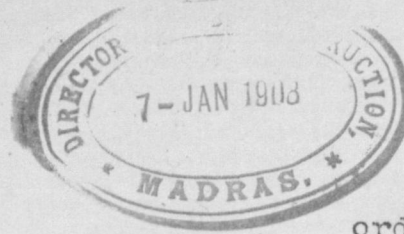
4. The Accountant General states that the
Director of Public Instruction is allowing half
pay to Sub-Assistant Inspectors of Schools sent
for training on the authority of G.O. No. 45 Edl.
dated 25th January 1884 and enquires whether this
order is still in force or whether it has been
superseded by the order of the Government of India
contained in G.O. No. 700 Edl. dated 23th November
1904. The orders of the Government of India
are embodied in Rule 122 of the new Educational
Rules, but even in this rule no reference is made
to the case of Sub-Assistant Inspectors sent for
training although the heading of the Rule which
runs "Salaries of teachers and others while under
"training" implies that the rule is intended to
apply to ^{a class of persons} ~~persons~~ other than teachers, sent
for training.

5. It is also observed that G.O. No. 45 Edl.
dated 25th January 1884 has never been formally
cancelled and that it does not appear to be
inconsistent with the orders of the Government of
India issued in 1904.

6. It is, therefore, for consideration whether
the Accountant General may be informed that the
order

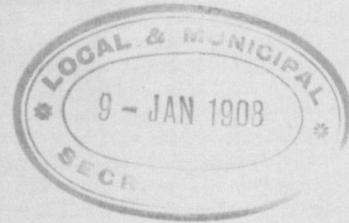
