Sir,

I have the honour to request the sanction of Government for payment of an additional grant of Rs. 288-13-8 to the Committee of the Madras Educational Exhibition towards the expenses of the Madras Educational Exhibition held at the close of August 1907. As already reported in my letter R. C. No. 2869/07, dated 22nd August 1907 a grant not exceeding Rs. 200/- has already been promised for this purpose.

2. The committee in submitting its Financial Statement and vouchers point out that the subscriptions and other receipts fall short of the actual expenditure by Rs. 483-13-8 and pray that the whole deficit may be met by a Grant from Provincial Funds. The subscriptions paid or collected by the Committee amount to Rs. 1063-8-0 and these subscriptions would have been more than sufficient to meet the whole cost of the Exhibition, had it not been for the expenses incurred in the

carriage of the very large collection of exhibits sent to the Exhibition from schools in England. A large number of these exhibits will remain permanently in this country-and they will be of great use in enlarging the scope and raising the ideals of Educational work. On these grounds, I consider that the prayer of the Committee is reasonable and may be granted.

In his Proceedings Ref. an order No 2869, dated
24th June 1907, the D.P.S. sanctioned under
Article 57 of the Grant in aid Code a grant
not exceeding Rs 200 or one-half of the
entire cost, whichever might be less, towards
the ^{cost of the} Madras Educational Exhibition
held in August 1907. It was then anticipated
that the cost of the Exhibition would amount
to Rs 570 and that the probable receipts
would be Rs 300 - vide page 5 of G.O. No. 609 Sol
17th September 1907.

2. The D.P.S. now states that the
Committee in submitting the financial statement
and vouchers point out

(1) that the subscriptions and other
receipts fall short of the actual
expenditure by Rs 483-13-8;

(2) that the subscriptions paid or
collected by the Committee, ^{which} amount
to Rs 1063-8-0, would have been ^{more than} suf-
ficient to meet the whole cost of
the exhibition, but for the heavy
expenditure involved by the carriage
of the very large number of exhibits
from England; and

(3) that a large number of these
exhibits will remain permanently
in this Country and will be of
great

great great use in enlarging the scope
and raising the ideals of Council

The Committee accordingly request that
the deficit of Rs 483-13-8 may be met
by a grant from Provincial funds.
Dr. Bourne considers the prayer of the
Committee to be reasonable and recommends
that it may be granted.

3. The D.P.G. has not submitted a copy
of the final accounts of the Exhibition,
nor does he give the total expenditure
on the Exhibition. Apparently the total
Cost is Rs 1063-8-0 + Rs 483-13-8 or
Rs 1547-5-8. Under Art. 57(i) of the Grant-in-aid
Code, a grant not exceeding one-half of the exp^{re} is admissible.

4. It is submitted that sanction may
be accorded to the payment of an additional
grant of Rs 283-13-8, to the Committee of
the Exhibition. In para. 1 of his letter the
D.P.G. requests sanction for ~~the~~ an additional
grant of Rs 288-13-8, but in para. 2,
he says that the actual deficit is
Rs 483-13-8; + deducting the grant
of Rs 200 already sanctioned by the
D.P.G., the balance of the grant to be
sanctioned is only Rs 283-13-8.
