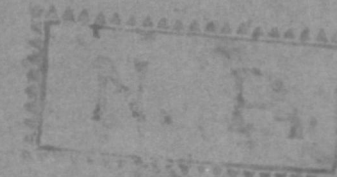

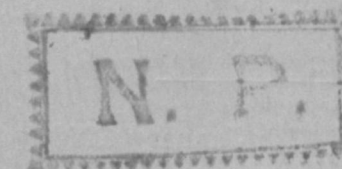

Letter—from the Hon'ble Mr. A. G. BOURNE, D.Sc., F.R.S., Director of Public Instruction.

Dated—Madras, the 13th January 1908.

A teaching grant of Rs. 520 which was sanctioned for the current official year under chapter IV of the Grant-in-Aid Code to the Central Middle school, Tanjore, has been attached by the Subordinate Judge of Tanjore in connection with a civil suit in which the manager of the school is the second defendant, and the Subordinate Judge has instructed the Inspector of Schools, Third Circle, either to remit the amount to the Court to the credit of the above suit or, if this could not be done, to state the grounds of objection to so remitting it. As will be seen from the correspondence read in G.O., No. 90, Educational, dated 20th February 1901, grants to schools are not subject to attachment in suits against managers, because such grants are not debts due by Government to the managers, payment of which could be enforced by suit. The present case being similar to that referred to in the Government Order quoted above, I have the honour to request that Government may be pleased, under rule 2 of the Grant-in-Aid Code, to withdraw the grant of Rs. 520 sanctioned to the Central Middle school, Tanjore.

The favour of early orders is requested.

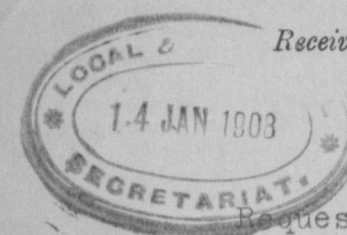
