5. As to my efficiency in my present appointment as Taluq Head Accountant, I respectfully beg to solicit your honour's kind perusal of the District Reviews on the working of the Sub-Treasuries, issued from January to December 1906. During this period, I was in charge of the work at Cuddapah Sub-Treasury. It has continuously held the 1st rank among the "heavy" Sub-Treasuries except in October 1906, when it stood 2nd; and this slight fall in rank was recognized in the review itself to have been due to my temporary absence on leave at the time.

6. As to my efficiency in the control of the other branches of work, I beg to append herewith an extract from the remarks of Mr. F.A. Coleridge (the then Sub-Collector in charge of Madanapalle Division) in his Inspection Notes of the Taluq office, Kadiri in 1905.

"General Remarks."

"The office is in a better order than when I inspected" "last year. The present Head Accountant, Venkataramanachari" "has done his work well and kept an eye on the office routine" "work."

7. With all these good antecedents, I am now disabled to rise to the post of a Deputy Tahsildar, unless I should have passed at least the Criminal Judicial Test (Lower Grade). I, therefore, pray that, in consideration of my merits and past good service, recommendation be kindly made to Government for my exemption from the examination rules, at least tempo-

temporarily, for three years so as to make me eligible to appear for the Criminal Judicial Test, Lower Grade, to be held in October 1908, 1909 and 1910.

8. The concession prayed for, if allowed, would enable me to rise higher in service with a prospect of getting a larger pension at the time of my retirement, especially as, with an honest life throughout my official career, I have no other means to rely upon, for my old age, than what I am destined to get from the Government in the shape of pension.

9. For this act of kindness and benevolence, I shall ever pray for your honour's long life and prosperity.

M.R.Ry. M.A. Venkataramanachari, Head Accountant, Cuddapah Taluk Office, requests that he may be permitted to appear for the Criminal Judicial Test, Lower grade, to ^{be} held in October 1908, 1909, and 1910, so as to enable him to qualify for the post of a Deputy Tahsildar. He has put in a total service of about 18½ years. He is a Matriculate and has passed the following special tests:-

- (1) Revenue Lower, with Account Code.
- (2) Survey test,
- (3) Translation test, Lower grade, (Telugu)

2. The Collector of Cuddapah (Mr. J.J. Cotton) states that "the applicant is honest and hardworking ^{and} ~~and~~ "deserves to be promoted to the grade of Sub-Magistrate" ^{and} adds that "his work as Revenue Inspector and as Taluk Head Accountant has been satisfactory." He therefore recommends that the permission sought for may be granted. Under Note (2) to ~~the~~ Article 5 of the Special test notification only First in Arts men and Matriculates who have obtained the diploma in commerce may appear for the Criminal Lower test.

3. Attention is invited to the Honourable Member's remarks on page 9 of K.W. G.O. No. 372, dated 28th May 1906. The permission, if granted, will ordinarily be restricted to one or two years. The Revenue Department may perhaps, be consulted as to the desirability of complying with the applicant's ~~request~~ request

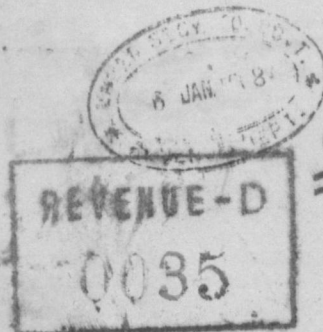

The grant of the concession in G.O. no 372 Ed. of 28-5-06 appears to have been made purely on personal grounds & in para 9 of the same G.O. the Hon. Mr. Forbes has expressed himself ^{from} averse to granting such concessions. The later orders on similar applications are G.O. no 863 Ed. of 24-5-06 & 381 Ed. 16-06 wherein Govt have invited the attention of the Collector to B.S.O. no 138 para 1 (iii) which authorizes Collectors to recommend such of the unqualified persons whose ~~the~~ ^{merits} ~~merits~~ they can "Certify to be such that the interests of the district administration will be distinctly promoted by his appointment." The ~~Revenue~~ ^{educational} Department now propose that the previous precedents may be followed in respect of the present application for permission to apply for Criminal Cases. 2. ~~Para~~ para 1 of the L & M note 921¹²/₀₇ appears to be incorrect. B.S.G no 138 para 1(iii) does not authorize the appointment of an unqualified man to the post of Sub Magistrate & is not to be taken as providing an exception to B.S.G no 129. According to S.G no 129 para 3(7) the minimum qualifications required for a By Tahsil post are @ Precis writing test, Revenue lower, Account lower, Translation lower & Criminal lower tests. A man may have all these qualifications but cannot yet be appointed as a Deputy Tahsildar, for, B.S.U no 138-1-iii requires that i either he should be a graduate or ii he should have passed one of the two tests - Revenue & Criminal - in the Higher grade. The certificate is ~~only~~ intended only for a non graduate who has the minimum qualifications prescribed in S.G no 129 para 3(7).

3. In the present case the applicant has not passed even the Criminal lower test & a certificate under S.O no 138-1-iii cannot help him. The cases disposed of in G.O 363 of 24-5-06, ^{+ 38171-6-06} were quite different as the applicants therein had
