Copy of letter from the Deputy Collector of Cuddapah Division to the Collector of Cuddapah, Disposal No.44 of 1908, dated 10th January 1908.

I have the honour to submit herewith the application of A.Venkataseshayya, acting Head Clerk of the Cuddapah Taluq office, and to state as follows:-

2. The applicant was exempted in Government Order No.194 dated 30th April 1903, from the Upper Secondary Examination for employment in the Cuddapah District; and in Government Order No.253, dated 27th May 1903, it was said that the exemption from passing the Upper Secondary Examination carries with it the privilege of appearing for all the Special Tests for which a candidate who has passed that examination is eligible.

3. The applicant has recently passed both Revenue Lower and Account Lower Tests, and a doubt has arisen if he can appear for Criminal Lower Grade also. Note 2 of para 4 of the Public Service Notification published in page 489 of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 10th September 1907, reads as follows:

"(iii) Candidates who have passed either the Upper Secondary or the Matriculation Examination, and have obtained the diploma in Commerce at the Government Technical Examinations." If a person who has passed the Upper Secondary has to obtain the diploma in Commerce at the Government Technical Examinations before he can appear for the Criminal Lower Grade, then the applicant cannot appear for that test. But there is one circumstance which I beg to bring to your kind notice. An Upper Secondary man can appear for the Pleader's Test (2nd Grade) and a man who has passed the Pleader's Test (2nd Grade) need not pass Criminal Lower Test. It is not therefore clear why an Upper Secondary man cannot appear for Criminal Lower Test also.

4. If you consider that the applicant cannot appear for the Criminal Lower Test, I request that the Government may be moved to permit him, at least as a temporary measure, to appear

Subject.

Requesting that V. Venkateseshayya, Head clerk, Cuddapah Taluk Office, may be permitted to appear for the Criminal Judicial Test, Lower Grade, for three years.

In G.O. No.194, Educational, dated 30th April 1903, the Government sanctioned the permanent exemption from the Upper Secondary examination of A. Venkateseshayya, ^{for employment in the} ~~Head clerk~~, ^{District} ~~Cuddapah Taluk office~~. In G.O. No.253, Educational, dated 27th May 1903, the Collector was informed that the ^{above} ~~previous~~ G.O. gave the candidate the privilege to appear for all the Special Tests for which an Upper Secondary man could appear. Accordingly Venkateseshayya has appeared and passed the Revenue and Account tests, Lower Grade.

2. Venkateseshayya now requests that he may be permitted to appear for the Criminal, Judicial test, Lower grade. Under note 2 to Article 5 of the Special test notification, the Criminal Judicial test, Lower grade, is open only to (i) F.A.'s, (ii) diplomates in agriculture and (iii) candidates who have passed either the Upper Secondary or the Matriculation examination and have obtained the diploma in Commerce at the Government Technical examinations.

3. The Deputy Collector of Cuddapah, while strongly recommending the grant of the permission asked for, argues thus:-

"An Upper Secondary man can appear for 'the Pleaders' test (2nd grade) and a man who 'has passed the Pleaders' test (2nd Grade) need 'not pass Criminal Lower test. It is not therefore clear why an Upper Secondary man cannot 'appear for Criminal Lower test also'. The Collector (Mr. Cotton) agrees with the Deputy Collector and supports his recommendation.

4. It is for consideration whether the Collector's recommendation may be accepted and whether Venkataseshayya may, as a special case, be permitted to appear for the ^{Criminal test} test. ^{Lower grade} If the permission is to be granted, orders are solicited as to whether such permission should be given for three years as asked for, or only ^{for} two years as is usually done.

5. The general question raised by the Collector as to whether a person who has passed the Upper Secondary Examination should not be permitted to appear for the Criminal Lower Test, will be considered separately after issue of orders on the present case.
