Copy of a letter from the Chairman of British Committee, Third International Art Congress, London, 1908, 151 Cannon Street, London E.C. to the Director of Education for the Madras Presidency dated 17th January 1908:-

May we call your attention to the forthcoming International Congress for the Development of Drawing and Art Teaching and their application to Industries, which will be held from August 3rd to 8th of this year.

This is the third of such Congress that have been held and continues the work of the First Congress which was held in Paris in 1906, and of the second which was held in Berne in 1904

The Congress work will comprise the reading and discussion of papers and the holding of an International Exhibition of work at which will be shown the results of Art Teaching in all countries of the world.

The enclosed circular gives full particulars of the forthcoming Congress and the arrangements which have so far been made therefor.

The Congress at Berne was attended by delegates and members from 21 nations. We are anxious that India should be represented this year both at the Congress itself and at the Exhibition and we venture to ask whether it would be possible for your Government to appoint official delegates to the Congress and to prepare an exhibit for the Congress Exhibition.

Any additional information may be obtained from the Organising Secretary, who will send on application further copies of the circular, rules regarding exhibits, and application from for space, and the like.
