NOTIFICATION.

In the matter of the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890,
and

In the matter of the endowment of "The Princess Alice Scholarship".

It is hereby notified that the Governor of Fort St. George in Council in the exercise of the power conferred by section 5 of the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890, hath settled the scheme set forth in the schedule hereto for the administration of the Princess Alice Scholarship fund and that such scheme shall come into operation on the day of 1908.

SCHEDULE.

Scheme.

The Treasurer of Charitable Endowments shall stand possessed of the securities and moneys to the credit of the Princess Alice Scholarship fund upon trust to permit the same to be administered by the Director of Public Instruction for the time being of the Presidency of Madras and the Inspectress of Girls' Schools for the time being of the Central Circle, Madras.

2. From the interest accruing on the said fund shall be provided a scholarship to be called the Princess Alice Scholarship and tenable for three years.

3. The amount of the said scholarship, which shall be Rs. 4 per month during the first year, Rs. 5 per month during the second year and Rs. 6 per month during the third year, shall be paid monthly to the holder of the said scholarship.

4. The said scholarship shall be open to Hindu, Muhammadan and Christian girls being natives of the Tanjore district who have obtained an elementary school leaving certificate marked "good" or who are studying in the fourth class of a secondary school during the school year in which the examination for the said scholarship hereinafter mentioned is held.

5. Whenever a vacancy occurs, the said scholarship shall be awarded on the results of an examination to be held at such convenient centres selected by the Sub-Assistant Inspectress of Schools for the time being of South Arcot-Tanjore girls' range and at such convenient times as shall be notified in the *Tanjore District Gazette* provided that the said examination may be held simultaneously in the several schools in which the candidates for the scholarship are studying if the said Sub-Assistant Inspectress shall be satisfied that the supervision in such schools is adequate and genuine.

6. The subjects of the said examination shall be the vernacular language of the candidate and arithmetic.

7. The said scholarship shall ordinarily be awarded by the said Director of Public Instruction to the candidate who shall stand first in the said examination, but it shall be open to the said Director to select any one of the other candidates who may be recommended by the said Inspectress of Girls' Schools, Central Circle.

8. The holder of the scholarship shall be required to continue her studies for three years in any recognised secondary school.

9. The Director of Public Instruction shall have at all times the power to suspend or withdraw the said scholarship on a report from the Inspectress of Girls' Schools, Central Circle, of irregular attendance, negligence in study or bad conduct on the part of the holder thereof.

10. All interest on the said fund that may not be required for the purpose of the said scholarship shall be accumulated and such accumulations shall from time to time when possible be invested in securities of the Government of India and be added to the principal amount of the said fund.

In the matter of the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890,

In the matter of the endowment of "The Princess Alice Scholarship".

It is hereby notified that the Governor of Fort St. George in Council in the exercise of the power conferred by section 4 of the Charitable Endowments Act, 1890, doth hereby order and direct that the securities and moneys respectively now in the hands of the Accountant-General of Madras to the credit of the Princess Alice Scholarship fund and being more particularly set forth in the schedule hereto shall as from the date of publication of this notification vest and be thenceforth vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments for the territories subject to the Government of Madras and be held by him and his successors (subject to the provisions of the said Charitable Endowments Act, 1890, and to any rules which may from time to time be framed thereunder by the Governor-General of India in Council) upon the trusts for the purposes and subject to the conditions set forth in a scheme under section 5 of the said Charitable Endowments Act, 1890, for the administration of the said Princess Alice Scholarship fund.

The Treasurer of Charitable Endowments shall stand possessed of the securities and moneys to the credit of the Princess Alice Scholarship fund upon trust to permit the same to be administered by the Director of Public Instruction for the time being of the Presidency of Madras and the Inspectress of Girls' Schools for the time being of the Central Circle, Madras.

2. From the interest accruing on the said fund shall be provided a scholarship to be called the Princess Alice Scholarship and tenable for three years.

3. The amount of the said scholarship, which shall be Rs. 4 per month during the first year, Rs. 5 per month during the second year and Rs. 6 per month during the third year, shall be paid monthly to the holder of the said scholarship.

4. The said scholarship shall be open to Hindu, Muhammadan and Christian girls being natives of the Tanjore district who have obtained an elementary school leaving certificate marked "good" or who are studying in the fourth class of a secondary school during the school year in which the examination for the said scholarship hereinafter mentioned is held.

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 18th December 1907, No. 5223.

The Director of Public Instruction submits a joint application signed by the Inspectress of Girls' school, Central Circle, and himself together with a draft notification prepared by the Government Solicitor for vesting the Princess Alice Scholarship Endowment fund in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments.

2. According to the opinion of the Advocate-General printed on pages 3 and 4 of K.W. G.O., No. 1150 M., dated 31st May 1907, two separate applications should be made—one for vesting the property in the Treasurer and the other for settling a scheme for its administration.
