Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following case for favour of obtaining orders of the Government:-

F. 2. In their order No. 757/Rev., dated 5th May 1904, the Government of Madras sanctioned the proposal of the District Magistrate, Godavari, for the entertainment of a -- clerk on Rs. 15 per mensem, for each of the three Bench - Courts at Cocanada, Rajahmundry, and Ellore in the old - District of Godavari. On receipt of this order, Mr. Roy, who was then incharge of Ellore Division appointed substan- - tively, Sirikonda Ganapati, the Muchi of his office as - Bench clerk on Rs. 15 in the Sub Magistrate's Court, Ellore on the 23rd day of June 1904. This Ganapathi passed the old Middle School Examination in the 2nd class and conse- - quently was not qualified for confirmation on Rs. 15. Mr. Roy seems to have made this appointment under the impres- - sion that the Bench Clerks' appointments are not pension- - able though it was clearly laid down in G.O. No. 522 Ju- - dicial dated 18th March 1892 that Bench clerks should be treated as permanent and carrying pension.. This appoint- - ment was made prior to the trifurcation of the Districts - Godavari, Kistna and Guntur - This irregularity has been noticed in checking the District establishment last year.

3. S. Ganapathi in question is a Muchi by caste and has put in a total service of over 18 years. He was a Muchi in the Divisional Office, Ellore on Rs. 10 for about 10 years, and acted as Rs. 15 clerk in the Divisional and Taluk offices for about 5 years before / he was promoted to Rs. 15 on the 23rd June 1904. Since then he has been Bench clerk on Rs. 15-up to now. All his superiors have

3/ spoken well of him and certify that he is a very intelli- gent and hard-working man. He has actually held for over three years, the appointment to which Mr. Roy irregularly appointed him. It seems hard to revert him now. It is very difficult to secure non-Brahmin clerks in this Dis- trict. I beg to recommend that the Government may be -- pleased to permanently exempt him from passing Matricula- tion with Hand-writing and dictation test so as to make him eligible to hold the appointment in question.

SUBJECT. Permanent exemption from the Upper Secondary examination of S. Ganapati, Bench Clerk, Sub. Magistrate's Court, Ellore.

M^r. Roy who was in charge of the Ellore Division in 1904, apparently, under a mistaken impression that the posts of Bench clerks in Sub. Magistrate's Courts ~~is~~ not pensionable, appointed S. Ganapati, the Muchi of his office ^{on Rs 10 per m.} as Bench Clerk on Rs 15 in the Sub. Magistrate's Court, Ellore, with effect from 23rd June 1904. The Collector of Kistna (M^r. R. Morris) now states that under G.O. 522. Judicial dt 18th March 1892 Service as Bench clerks ~~should be~~ ^{will} regarded as permanent and ~~would~~ carry pension, and he requests that S. Ganapati may be permanently exempted from passing the Upper Secondary examination so as to enable him to hold the Bench Clerk's post.

2. Ganapati has passed the Lower Secondary examination in the second class and has put in a total service of over 18 years of which 10 years' service was as a much ^{on Rs 10} and the rest ~~was~~ as an ag. clerk on Rs 15 in the Taluk and Divisional offices. It is urged that "all his superiors have spoken well of him and certify that he is a very intelligent and hardworking man", that "he has actually held for over three years the appointment to which M^r. Roy irregularly appointed him", that "it seems hard to revert him now", and that "it is very difficult to secure non-Brahmin clerks in this district."

3. The Collector does not, however, state what steps have been taken to secure the services of qualified Candidates; nor is it stated that the Muchi Caste to which the Candidate belongs is one which deserves encouragement as a special class. The application seems, on the whole, to have been made merely on personal grounds. Please see in this connection the Secretary's and the H.K.'s remarks on pages 11 and 12 of your 537 R d, 14. 10. 07.

4. It is for consideration whether ^{there are} any special circumstances ^{which would} justify a relaxation of the rule ~~in~~ in the present case.

The exemption may, it is submitted, be sanctioned in the present case, especially in view of the proposed alteration in the Public Service notification raising the minimum salary of appointment for which educational qualifications are required from Rs 15 to Rs 20 p.m.
