I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. William's letter No. 6938, dated the 11th November 1907, requesting reconsideration of the question of the grant of a fixed travelling (conveyance) allowance of Rs. 25 a month to the Sub-Assistant Inspector of Schools in the Civil and Military station of Bangalore.

2. In the special circumstances of the case, the Government of India are pleased to sanction a local allowance of Rs. 25 a month for the Sub-Assistant Inspector.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Major Haig's letter No. 3523-I.A., dated the 9th September 1907, in which the Government of India regretted that they were unable to sanction the grant of a fixed travelling (conveyance) allowance of Rs. 25 a month to the Sub-Assistant Inspector of Schools in the Civil and Military station of Bangalore.

2. The position was not perhaps quite clearly explained in my letter No. 5084, dated the 2nd August 1907, and consequently it was not made apparent to the Government of India, that the refusal to give the proposed travelling allowance destroys the possibility of including the appointment in the Madras cadre inasmuch as without such an allowance the post of Sub-Assistant Inspector of Schools in Bangalore will be less attractive than the corresponding appointments in Madras with the result that it will not be practicable to transfer Sub-Assistant Inspectors from Madras to Bangalore. In that case, the doubtful prospects of the local Sub-Assistant Inspector's position would tend to reflect on his efficiency as he would be deprived of any chance of promotion.

3. With this explanation I beg to submit the case for favour of reconsideration and to add that Bangalore is a very straggling station, a fact which seems to justify the grant of a conveyance allowance at the rate (Rs. 25 per mensem) admissible to the Sub-Assistant Inspectors in the Madras City.

[SUBJECT.—*Fixed travelling allowance to the Sub-Assistant Inspector of Schools.*]

From the Director of Public Instruction, dated 26th February 1908, No. 2161.

In G.O., No. 423, Educational, dated 3rd July 1907, the Government sanctioned the inclusion of the post of Sub-Assistant Inspector of Schools, Bangalore, in the cadre of Sub-Assistant Inspectors in the Madras Presidency, with a fixed travelling allowance of Rs. 25 per mensem.
