I, P. Govinda Menon, a native of Malabar, am a student here in the second year class of 'Textile Manufacture' Dept. of the V. J. T. Institute Byculla, (Bombay)

I passed at the Annual Examination held at the end of first year.

The loss of my father three years ago and my uncle last year has made it very difficult for me to meet with all the high costs of study and living in Bombay; and therefore it is that I humbly apply to your honour for a scholarship for two years, as I have to study in the above Institute two more years in order to get a full Certificate.

I may also add that I have passed the Matriculation, of the Madras University in 1905, and have studied one year in the First-in-Arts Class in Zamorin's College, Calicut, before joining this Institute.

I have also to add that I am the only Nayar from Malabar in this Institute and none had come before ~~me~~ I came.

I hope, therefore, your honour will kindly sanction me a scholarship of Rs 30 per mensem and send a favourable reply at an early date.

P. Govinda Menon a student of the Textile Manufacture department of the Victoria Jubilee Technical Institute, Bombay, requests that he may be given a Scholarship of the value of Rs 30. per mensem for two years so as to enable him to study in that institution for a period of two years more and secure a full certificate.

2. With regard to this it is submitted that there are 203 Govt Scholarships of the value varying from Rs 1 to Rs 10 for students of Technical, Industrial or Art classes connected with the Madras Educational department. These Scholarships are awarded either by the Inspector of Technical Schools or by the Inspectresses of Girls' Schools under the control of the D. P. I.

3. As Govinda Menon is studying in an institution not connected with the Madras Educational department, it does not appear that any one of these Scholarships can be awarded to him. Nor is there any other provision for the award to him of a Scholarship of the value of Rs 30 per mensem tenable for two years.

4. In these circumstances it is for consideration whether the applicant may be informed that the Govt regret their inability to comply with his request or whether the application may be transferred to the D. P. I. for disposal & the applicant referred to that

The applicant does not appear to be eligible for the State Technical Scholarship, in regard to which a notification inviting applications was recently published in the Fort St. George Gazette. Nor does his application seem to have reference to this Scholarship. He asks for a scholarship of Rs 30 ^{for two years} per ^{annum} for the study of textile Manufacture at the Public Technical Institute Bombay. No such Scholarship has been instituted by Govt and if the application is favourably considered, a Special Scholarship will have to be sanctioned by Govt. - Before however, taking the application into consideration, it seems to be desirable to consult the D.P.I.
