Sir,

I have the honour to state that I think it very
desirable that the Superintendent of the School of Arts should
reside upon the premises. The lower portion of the house
attached to the school is almost entirely used for office
purposes, but there is sufficient, though not extensive, accommo-
dation upstairs.

2. I presume that in accordance with G.O. No. 1242, Public,
dated 20th November 1896, the quarters would be rent free and
upon these terms Mr. Hadaway is willing to occupy them.

3. There should, however, be a distinct understanding that
if they are at any time required for the use of the school, he
may be compelled to vacate without any claim to house-rent.

Recommending that Mr. Hadaway, Superintendent of the School of Arts, may be allowed to live in the premises of the school subject to certain conditions.

U. G. Under G.O. No.1242 Public, dated 20th November 1896, the Superintendent of the School of Arts, Madras, was granted a house-rent allowance of Rs.50 or free quarters.

2. In accordance with the above order, former Superintendents of the School of Arts ~~were living~~ ^{used to live} on the school premises. But owing to the need for additional accommodation for school purposes, it was decided in 1898 to utilize the Superintendent's quarters for school purposes, the Superintendent being given the rent allowance of Rs.50 per mensem which was attached to the post — Vide G.O. No.772 Educational, dated 14th December 1898.

3. In the letter to the Government of India No.404 Educational, dated 1st June 1906, requesting them to address the Secretary of State regarding the selection of a new Superintendent for the School of Arts, no mention was made of the house rent, apparently because a higher rate of salary than what was allowed to former Superintendents was recommended. Consequently no provision for house-rent or free quarters appears

in

in Mr. Hadaway's agreement printed with G.O. No. 712 Educational, dated 21st October 1907.

3. The Director of Public Instruction now proposes that Mr. Hadaway may be permitted to live on the premises rent-free on the distinct understanding that if they are at any time required for the use of the School, he will be compelled to vacate it without any claim to

house-rent. When Mr. Chatterlan vacates completely, there will perhaps be sufficient room for school purposes and the Superintendent's residence.

4. It is for consideration whether the Director of Public Instruction's proposal may be approved.

According to the statement showing the various classes of officers in the Madras Presidency who are granted house-rent or free quarters, which was approved by the Secretary of State in 1891, the Superintendent, School of Arts, Madras is entitled to a house-rent of Rs. 50 per mensem or free quarters in lieu.

2. There was a clause to this effect in the agreement executed by the several officers who ^{previously} held the post of the Supdt., School of Arts. ~~in 1891~~. In 1906 the Govt. decided to raise the pay of the Supdt. from Rs 500-50-1000 to Rs 750-25-1000. In the letter to the Govt. asking them to address the Secretary of State for sanction to the latter ~~to~~ ^{for} the scale, and ^{for} the selection of ^{a gentleman} ~~the~~ for the post, no mention was made by this Govt. ~~in regard~~ ^{to} the grant of house-rent. Accordingly the ^(a) agreement executed by Mr. Hadaway the present Supdt. does not contain any clause in regard to the grant of house rent.

3. On the other hand it may be argued that the orders of the Secy of State in 1891, for the grant of house-rent of Rs 50 or free quarters in lieu to the Supdt., School of Arts, are still in force as there is nothing in Mr. Hadaway's agreement, expressly prohibiting the same.



On the other hand it may be contended that as the concession of house-rent or free quarters is not specifically mentioned in the agreement and as the pay of the post ~~4~~ has been raised, Mr Hadaway cannot claim it, nor can the local Govt grant the concession.

4. As the matter is not free from doubt, it is submitted, that it ^{will be} preferable ^{to} ~~it~~ ^{to} obtain a definite ruling from the Govt I.

5. There is however no objection to Mr Hadaway's being permitted to reside on the premises of the school, ~~the~~ the usual rent to be calculated by the P.W.D. ^{(vide: paragraph 1068 - c. clause I. W. (W) (H) P.W.D. de. vol I)} instead of a nominal rent being recovered from him.
