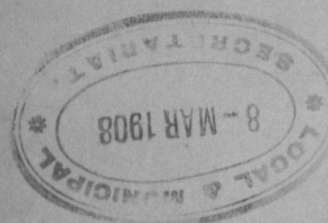

Most respectfully sheweth:-

(1) That the petitioner entered the Revenue Department in 1900 and has put in a satisfactory service of nearly --- 7½ years up to now.

He has already had Magisterial experience as he has done Magisterial work in the Office of the Sub Magistrate Kulasekarapatnam and Srivaikuntam and has also acted as --- Magisterial Clerk in this Office temporarily in 1903 under -- Mr. Wallace. He is quite confident that he will cope with the Magisterial work in any Office. Your Honour has had -- also occasion to test his work during the short period he -- has taken up Magisterial work.

(5) That he humbly begs to submit that he belongs to -- the backward class of Shepherds. The number of educated --

educated men in that community in this District can be --
counted by one's fingers, especially so in superior ----
Government service. As Matriculates are debarred under --
present rules from appearing for Criminal Lower he has to
labour under a special disqualification and to be shut out
of necessity from higher branches of service.

Honour with a humble request that he may be recommended to --
Government as a special case for permission to appear for
Criminal Lower so as to qualify himself for further promotion
in the Revenue Department.

The petitioner P.S. Muthukrishna Doss, Ag. 5th Clerk, Sub-Collector's Office, Tuticorin, is only a Matriculate and as such cannot appear for the Criminal Judicial test, Lower Grade, without the special permission of Government. - Vide note (2) to Article 5 of the Special Test Notification. He now applies for this permission. The Collector (Mr. Wynne) recommends that the permission may be granted, because the petitioner belongs to "the backward class of shepherds which needs encouragement," and also because the applicant is reported to have done good work and to have been much above the average. The petitioner has passed all the tests for which he was qualified to appear. The Head Assistant (Mr. Bracken) Collector, ~~Tinnevely~~ strongly recommends the grant of the permission.

2. In these circumstances, it is for consideration whether the permission applied for may be granted. The application is based mainly on personal grounds and does not appear to be one made in the interests of administration.
