I have the honour to submit the enclosed plan with estimate amounting to Rs. 14,006 for extending the building occupied by the Hindu High School, Triplicane, Madras, and to recommend that, under rule 51 of the Grant-in-Aid Code, a grant of Rs. 4,668 be sanctioned to be paid during 1908–1909. The estimate includes Rs. 3,500, the cost of the site.

2. The proposed extension (marked with yellow lines) consists of two stories containing four rooms and verandahs and is urgently needed.

3. Out of the allotment for building grant in the current year's budget estimate, payment of Rs. 2,826 has been made up to date. The amount of grant that may have to be paid during the current year is Rs. 69,105.

4. The manager has been asked to report the nature of the soil and sub-soil and to certify that the funds at the disposal of the school are sufficient if the grant be added to meet the full cost of the work.

With reference to your Ref. on C. No. 5138/03, dated 13th August 1907, I have the honour to inform you that the nature of the surface soil of the site on which it is now proposed to have the school building extended, is made-earth, and that of the sub-soil is clay mixed with a little sand. The soil and sub-soil are similar to those of the site on which the last additions to the school house have been built.

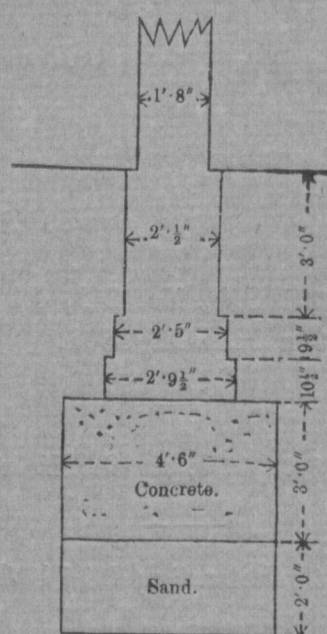

With reference to your U.O.D. No. 123, dated 24th June 1907, I have the honour to state that the nature of surface soil for one foot depth is made earth and subsoil clay slightly mixed with sand.

The sketch below is a section of the foundation of the existing building:—

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

In the accompanying estimate provision is made for an extension of the building by two rooms and a verandah in front rear and side, but the plan shows six rooms, with verandahs, as the extension. At the head of the plan it is noted the "proposed extensions are coloured red."* All six rooms are coloured red. There is no cross section of the building or proposed extension and there is also no report. The file may be returned to Educational for proper plan, cross section and report.

The proposed extension consists in building, on the right-hand of the building seen from the street, a block similar to that on the left-hand of the building.

The cost of the extension works out at just under Rs. 5 per square foot.

The details of construction cannot be checked without a cross section.
