ABSTRACT.—Approving tentatively, with effect from 1st April 1908, the proposals of the Director of Public Instruction for the redistribution of the territorial jurisdiction of Inspectors of Schools.

In continuation of G.O., No. 219, Educational, dated 23rd March 1908, the Director of Public Instruction will be informed that the Government have no objection to the new distribution of Inspectors' charges being deferred for the present, if he considers it desirable to do so and if the immediate introduction of the scheme is likely to disorganize existing arrangements.

With reference to G.O., No. 219, Educational, dated 23rd March 1908, approving the redistribution of the charges of the Inspectors of Schools with effect from 1st April, kindly say whether this means that I am to propose acting appointments for the two extra circles.

Papers please.

It is not at all likely that the Secretary of State's nominees will be available for some time to come. The despatch has only gone home by this mail. It will be six months at least before the Secretary of State appoints any one, in all probability. The Director of Public Instruction may be asked to propose acting arrangements so as to get the circles into working order without delay.

I have since seen the Director of Public Instruction. He considers that the present system may well go on and that to appoint two additional Acting Inspectors will cause more disorganization than benefit. The redistribution can be worked out by the present staff so as to be ready to be put into force from the date of arrival of the two new men.

Please draft saying that Government have no objection, if the Director of Public Instruction thinks it desirable, and if it will not otherwise disorganize existing arrangements, to bring the new redistribution into force at once.

Telephonic messages such as that sent by the Director of Public Instruction without expressing his own views are apt to be misleading.
