Despatch—from His Majesty's Secretary of State for India.

To—His Excellency the Right Honourable the Governor-General of India in Council.

I have considered in Council the letter of your Excellency's Government in the Home Department (Education), No. 26, dated the 19th December 1907, forwarding a memorial submitted through the Government of Madras by Miss A. M. C. Arnold, First Inspectress of Girls' Schools in that presidency, in which she prays that inspectresses of schools in the presidency may be eligible for a personal allowance and certain special allowances similar to those attached to other appointments in the Indian Educational Service.

2. I agree with your Excellency's Government and with the Government of Madras in thinking that Miss Arnold cannot herself be held to have a claim to special treatment, and that there is no necessity at present for increasing the pay of inspectresses in India by means of allowances. I am therefore unable to accede to the prayer of the memorialist, and I request that you will cause her to be informed of my decision.

We have the honour to forward for your orders a memorial submitted through the Government of Madras by Miss A. M. C. Arnold, First Inspectress of Girls' Schools in that presidency, in which she prays that the inspectresses of girls' schools in the presidency may be eligible for one personal allowance of Rs. 200—10—250, similar to the junior allowances attached to the regular appointments in the Indian Educational Service, and may receive special allowances of Rs. 100 a month after fifteen years' service.

2. We agree with the Local Government in thinking that Miss Arnold is not personally entitled to any special consideration; and we would add that we are not prepared to recommend for inspectresses the system of allowances which at present prevails for men in the Indian Educational Service. The question of the pay of inspectresses in India generally is engaging our attention but we are not prepared at present to make any representation on the subject.

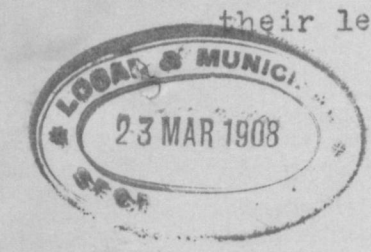
