In reply to your letter No. 116, dated the 14th February 1908, I am directed to say that the Government of India sanction the grant to M.R.Ry. M. Rangachariyar, a Professor in the Presidency College, of a local allowance of Rs. 150 a month for performing the duties of Registrar of Books, Madras, in addition to his own, with effect from the 19th December 1907. They are also pleased to authorize the local Government to grant the allowance to any other officer who may in future be appointed to perform the duties of Registrar of Books in addition to his own provided that the salary of such officer including the allowance does not exceed Rs. 750 a month.

2. I am to add with reference to paragraph 4 of your letter that the Government of India do not consider it necessary at present to address the Secretary of State, since it is apparently not yet certain that M.R.Ry. M. Rangachariyar will be promoted to a higher grade in the Provincial Educational Service.
