Sir,

As the appointments of the seven temporary assistants now working in the Rajahmundry Training College will cease on the 31st instant, I have the honour to request that Government will be pleased to sanction their retention until the 31st March 1909 as the Principal considers their services to be absolutely necessary. The sanction for the continuance of five of the above assistants up to the 31st March 1908 was accorded in G.O. No. 315 Mis. dated 24th May 1907 and the employment of the remaining two assistants for six months from 1st September 1907 was sanctioned in G.O. No. 555 Mis dated 26th August 1907. As it was not possible to give effect to the last order before the 1st November 1907, it is proposed to keep these two temporary assistants also till the 31st instant pending orders of Government on this letter. There are, at present, twelve classes in the practising section of the college, each class

requiring a teacher, and there are only five men on the permanent staff. The continuance of the seven temporary assistants is, therefore, absolutely necessary.

The necessary provision has been made in the Budget Estimate for 1908-1909.

SUBJECT.

Continuance of the temporary establishment
sanctioned for the Rajahmundry Training College.

The permanent staff of the Practising School attached to the Rajahmundry Training College consists of five teachers. But as there were 12 classes in the school and as under rule 28 of the Educational Rules, there should be a teacher for every class in addition to the headmaster, sanction was accorded to the employment of seven temporary assistants.

K 2. In G.O. no. 315 Bdl dated 24th May 1907, the continuance of five temporary asstts upto the 31st March 1908 was sanctioned
H and in G.O. no. 555 Bdl dated 26th August 1907 the employment of two additional assistants for a period of six months was sanctioned. These sanctions thus expire on the 31st instant.

3. The D.P.I. states that there are still 12 classes in the School and that, as each class requires a teacher, the ~~and~~ retention of the seven temporary assistants is absolutely necessary. He therefore requests sanction to their continuance

In paragraph 3 of his letter No. 4368 dated 25th July 1907, the D.P.D. stated that the question of reorganizing the practicing School attached to the Training College, Rajahmundry, including the substitution of permanent for temporary assistants should be over until the classification of schools into the Lower Secondary Schools under municipal & primary private management into elementary and Secondary was settled. The temporary assistants will have to be kept on until the establishment of the school is re-organized.

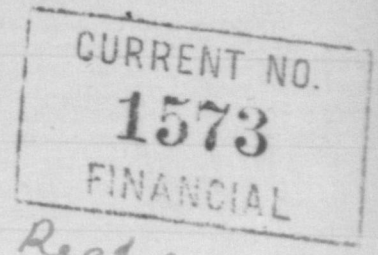

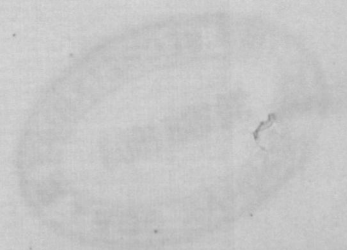
