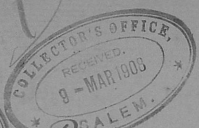
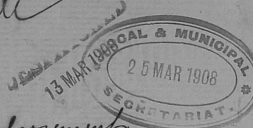

2. He now requests that he may be granted temporary exemption from the above test to enable him to secure at least acting appointments in higher grades until he passes the Test.

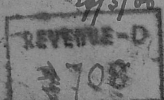
3. His request is very indefinite and the Board of Revenue agree with the Collector (Mr. Robertson) that the applicant has made out no case for a temporary exemption.
