Order—No. 277, Educational, dated 10th April 1908.

The Government resolve to delegate to the Director of Public Instruction the powers now vested in them by articles 12 and 14 of the Grant-in-Aid Code, namely, (a) of prescribing list of text-books for use in aided schools and colleges and (b) of forbidding the employment in aided schools and colleges of teachers whose certificates had been withdrawn. They also consider it desirable to raise from Rs. 200 to Rs. 500, the limit prescribed in article 60 of the Code as to the amount of furniture, etc., grants which may be sanctioned by the Director of Public Instruction without reference to Government.

2. The following alterations will be made in the Grant-in-Aid Code :—

(1) In paragraph 2 of article 12 for the word "Government" substitute the words "the Director of Public Instruction", and add at the end the words "which may from time to time be issued by him".

(2) In article 14 for the words "The Government reserve to themselves the right" substitute the words "It shall be competent to the Director of Public Instruction" and for the words "the Director" occurring in line 4 substitute the word "him".

(3) In article 60 substitute "500" for "200" wherever it occurs.

[SUBJECT.—Amendment of the Grant-in-Aid Code.]

Among the several proposals made in connection with decentralization, it was suggested that the following powers vested in the Local Government under the Grant-in-Aid Code should be delegated to the Director of Public Instruction :—

(1) Article 12.—Prescribing list of text books for use in aided schools and colleges.

(2) Article 14.—Forbidding the employment in aided schools and colleges of teachers whose certificates have been withdrawn.

(3) Article 15.—Declaration of backward classes.

(4) Article 60.—Raising the Director of Public Instruction's limit of power to sanction furniture, etc., grants from Rs. 200 to Rs. 500.

2. Article 12.—This article runs—

"Government reserve to themselves the right to forbid or to prescribe the use of any book or books in aided schools and colleges.

"Managers of schools shall, as a condition of receiving grants-in-aid from public funds, be required not to use, without the express sanction of Government, any text-book which is not included in the authorized list of text-books."

3. There is no express provision in this rule requiring that the list of authorized text-books for use in aided schools should be approved by Government. In the absence of any provision to the contrary, this power is now exercised by the Local Government. It is submitted that in the second paragraph of the rule the words

4. Article 14.—This article says—

4. Articles 14. This Article says

"The Government reserve to themselves the right to forbid the employment in aided colleges and schools of any teacher whose certificate has been withdrawn after due enquiry or who after due enquiry has been considered by the Director unfit to be a teacher."

5. In this rule for the words "The Government reserve to themselves the right" the following words may be substituted:-

"It shall be competent to the Director of 'Public Instruction'."

The words "him" may also be substituted for the words "the Director" occurring at the end of the rule.

6. Article 15. This rule runs thus:-

"For the present the amount of grant allotted will be at the rate of Rs. 30 per year for each teacher and As. 8 per year for each pupil in average daily attendance. Provided that the sanctioning authority may, in its discretion, increase the rate of grant for each pupil by not more than 25 per cent. in any defined locality in favour of any school attended by a majority of pupils drawn from backward classes or castes."

7. There is no express provision in this rule that any additions to ^{or} alterations in the list of backward castes or classes given in this rule should be sanctioned by Government, but as the Code was framed by Government all alterations therein are also approved by Government. It is submitted that the following may be added at the end of this rule:-

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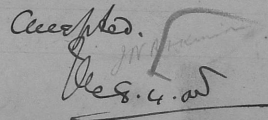

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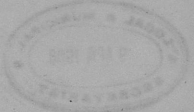
