Delegation of powers.

Sanctioning the delegation of certain powers to the Director of Industrial and Technical Inquiries and Special Settlement-officers regarding the employment of unpassed candidates under them; and requesting the Commissioner for Government Examinations to submit a draft of the necessary alterations in the Public Service Notification.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

Order—No. 294, Educational, dated 22nd April 1908.

The Governor in Council is pleased to authorize the Director of Industrial and Technical Inquiries to sanction the employment of unpassed candidates in *acting* and sub. *pro tem.* vacancies in his office and in temporary posts under him for a period of one year, provided the salaries attached to the appointments do not exceed Rs. 25 per mensem.

2. Special Settlement officers will also be authorized to employ unpassed candidates as acting and sub. *pro tem.* classifiers without limit of time.

3. The Commissioner for Government Examinations is requested to submit a draft of the necessary alterations in the Public Service Notification.

[SUBJECT.—*Delegation of powers.*]

REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

11. *Power to sanction the employment of unpassed candidates in acting and sub. pro tem. vacancies and in temporary posts* for a period not exceeding one year in case of the Director of Technical Industries and provided the pay of the post does not exceed Rs. 25. In the case of Special Settlement Officers, similar powers provided the clerical posts do not carry more than Rs. 15 and without limit of time for posts as acting or sub *pro tem.* or temporary classifiers.

The Board proposes the delegation of the powers within specified limits to the Director of Industrial and Technical Inquiries and to Special Settlement Officers. The proposal to delegate the power to the Directors of Survey, Land Records and Agri-

culture was supported in this Department (*vide* note on page 20 of the notes to G.O., No. 2965, dated 4th December 1907). The Board's recommendation may be supported in this Department and forwarded to Educational for consideration.

The word “temporary” underlined above is clearly a mistake, because the Public Service Notification does not apply to temporary Settlement establishments. The rest may be supported.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

The Board of Revenue makes three separate proposals—

(1) That the Director of Industrial and Technical Inquiries may be authorized to sanction the employment of unpassed candidates in acting and sub. *pro tem.* vacancies in his office as well as in temporary posts under him for a period of one year, provided the salaries attached to the appointments do not exceed Rs. 25 per mensem.

(2) That Special Settlement Officers may be similarly authorized to sanction the employment of unpassed candidates in clerical appointments carrying salaries of not more than Rs. 15 per mensem.

(3) That the Special Settlement Officers may be also authorized to employ unpassed men as acting, sub. *pro tem.* or temporary classifiers without limit of time.

2. Item (1)—That the Director of Industrial and Technical Inquiries may be authorized to sanction the employment of unpassed men in posts with salaries up to Rs. 25.—Under paragraph 4 of the Public Service Notification certain Heads of Departments have been authorized to sanction, subject to the conditions specified, the employment of unpassed candidates in acting and sub. *pro tem.* vacancies and in temporary posts. The Director of Technical and Industrial Inquiries is not one of the Heads of Departments so authorized. The present proposal is to give him general power to sanction the employment of unpassed men up to Rs. 25 per mensem.

In G.O., No. 226, Educational, dated 24th March 1908, the minimum limit of salary fixed in article 1 of the Public Service Notification as requiring general educational qualifications, has been raised from Rs. 15 to Rs. 20. It is for consideration whether

3. Item (2)—That the Special Settlement Officers may be authorized to sanction the employment of unpassed men as acting, sub. pro tem. or temporary classifiers.—At present, temporary classifiers on the field establishment of Settlement Parties are excluded from the operation of article 1 of the Public Service Notification—vide the entry No. (2) under Survey Department in column B of the table under article 2 of the Public Service Notification. It is for consideration whether acting and sub. pro tem. classifiers may also be granted a similar concession. The Revenue Department supports the Board's recommendation.

12. Power to sanction exemption from special tests for a period of one year.—The Board recommends the delegation of the power to Special Settlement Officers. The Board reports that exemptions of this kind are frequently necessary in the case of Special Revenue staffs and that the delegation would save much time and correspondence. The proposal may be supported in this Department and forwarded to Educational for consideration.

The proposal in this case is that Special Settlement Officers may be authorized to sanction the exemption of subordinates from the special tests for one year. At present this power is exercised in the Revenue Department only by the Members of the Board of Revenue. Please see article 5 (3) of the Public Service Notification. The proposal to delegate this power to Special Settlement Officers is supported by the Revenue Department. It is for consideration whether the proposal may be accepted;
