The Honry Secretary, Madras Teachers' Guild states that at a meeting of the Guild held at the Wesley College, Royapettha, on the 10th instants, with Mr. J. H. Stone, President of the Guild, in the chair, it was resolved that Govt be requested to appoint a representative of the Madras Teachers' Guild to serve on the School Final Examination Committee and requests that effect may be given to the wishes of the Guild.

In para. 5 of G.O. No. 212 28th, dated 20th March 1908, it was decided that the Committee on the School Final Examination should consist of the D.P.I. as President, four officers of the Educational Department to be nominated by the D.P.I., and four nonofficials, three of whom were to be nominated by the Syndicate of the Madras University, the Council of State Education.
