Satyanarayana, Government Tele-
graph Signaller, Madras,

Most respectfully Showeth:-

That Your Humble Petitioner studied in the Matriculation class in London Mission High School at Vizagapatam in the year 1899 and after selected by the Principal of the School in the Selection Examination appeared for the Government Examination, but unfortunately failed; and again applied the next year for the same as his Principal selected him again, but in November 1900 before the Examination i.e, in December 1900 he passed the Competative Examination of the Government Telegraph Department and was appointed in that Department.

That Your Humble Petitioner while in the said Department applied for a few days leave to appear for the Matriculation Examination, but it was refused; and consequently he could not attend the Examination.

That Your Humble Petitioner worked in the Telegraph Department for seven years from 8th November 1900 to 12th -- April 1908 as a Signaller on a permanent pay of Rs.45/- and owing to several domestic troubles he applied to the Department to grant him a transfer to any station in the East -- Coast Division or to accept his resignation, whereon the Department accepted his resignation (copy attached).

That as Your Humble Petitioner now desires to --

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serve in any Department of the gracious Government and as his present age is only 24 years prays Your Lordship will be -- graciously pleased in consideration of the above recognised -- Government service of seven years to grant him exemption that he may be eligible for Government Service.

For which act of kindness and charity, Your Humble Petitioner shall as in duty bound ever pray.
