With a view to corroborate my statement I beg to instance
the following for your kind information.

Mohomed Sudder Hoosain Saib and Mohomed Hoosain Ali Saib sons of late Sydoo Meak Saib Khan Bahadur and Ali Dost Khan Bahadur retired officers and pensioners drawing Rs 150/- and Rs 125/- per mensem respectively also well known rich people, owners of several houses and gardens, were besides being granted general exemptions, were also appointed sub inspectors of Police.

I know not why and under what circumstances these sons of Millionaires who apparently did not merit such concessions were entitled for exemptions , a fact which is avowedly left for your honors decision.

I regret very much that the benign Government's reply is as disappointing as it is most disparaging too in my case. A boy whose educational progress was inevitably impeded for lack of sufficient funds owing to the poverty of his parents who are now consummately thrown into despondency and whose progenitors succeeded the Government in days long gone by.

With reference to the last portion of your order No. 313
Mis d/- 28th April which runs as follows :-

" No~~x~~ can an application for exemption be taken into co

" sideration except upon the special recommendation of a
" head of a Public department who wishes to employ a person
" in regard to whom exemption is desired "

I beg to point out that the wording of the order being
such, no head of a Public Department will dare either to appoint
me or undertake to apply for exemption, thus practically debarring
me from joining the Government service - but on the contrary, a
slight modification in the above order, or a similar order, as indited
below, will infallibly succour me to a considerable extent..

" The Government will be pleased to exempt you from the
" examination rules provided that the head of a Public
" Department who wishes to appoint you applies for
" exemption "

In conclusion I most respectfully request that taking into
consideration of the valuable services rendered by my progenitors
to the British Government, also, pitying the critical circumstances
into which I am at present overwhelmed, your honor will kindly
reconsider over the matter again, taking a compassionate view of my
pitiable case, kindly granting the boon herein solicited.

For which charitable act of clemency not only myself but my old
parents shall invariably be under debt of gratitude to you.

This application is made not for the general exemption but
for an order as particularised above.

Lastly I may mention that while the Governments of Bengal
Punjab, are striving their best efforts to bring mahomedans
specially who belonged to the backward community by granting them
special concessions and offering them appointments I hope similar
concessions in case of poor indigent boys, one like myself will not
be overruled by our benighted local Government.
