Sir,

With reference to paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 57 Educational dated 21st January 1908 and in continuation of my letter Ref on Cur No. 2070 dated 24th March 1908, regarding the appointment of an officer outside the Public Works Department and free from the Public Works Department rules as to pay and allowances to the post of additional instructor of the College of Engineering, I have the honour to report that the Principal, College of Engineering, who was consulted on the point, states that he knows of no such officer who would be likely to accept the appointment. An upper subordinate on the completion of his college course regards an appointment on Rs 60 as third grade overseer as the lowest he can accept, and as the post of instructor

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tor in the college requires a man with practical experience and somewhat above the average in ability, it is not likely that such a man will be attracted by an appointment in the College on Rs 75-100. He will not be eligible for transfer to any other college but must expect promotion only in the College of Engineering, and his prospects in this institution are not likely to be so good as in the Public Works Department. It is not unlikely that a number of passed upper subordinates will be available at the outset, if any college vacancy is advertised: but they cannot be expected to continue long in the appointment.

Please see the notes and orders with G.O. No. 57 Ed., dated 21st January 1908.
In that order, the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, was requested to depute a suitable overseer of the third grade, who would draw Rs 60 + Rs 25, to take the place of Mr. P. S. Krishna Aiyar, the additional instructor in the College of Engineering, who was to be reverted to the P.W.D. at the close of the current term. The D.P.I. was at the same time requested to consider whether no permanent officer outside the Public Works Department and free from the Public Works Department rules as to pay and allowances could be found for this post.
2. The D.P.I. (Mr. Hanbilal S. Poonme) now reports that the Principal, College of Engineering, whom he consulted in the

states that he knows of no such officer who would be likely to accept the appointment. For the post of instructor in the College an upper subordinate with some practical experience and ability is required and the Principal considers that such a man is not likely to be had for a pay of Rs 75 rising to Rs 100. Moreover an instructor in the College of Engineering cannot expect promotion by transfer to any other College this prospect in the College are not therefore as good as those in the P.W.D. ^{The Principal} ~~Mr James~~ accordingly considers that even if the services of a passed upper subordinate not belonging to the P.W.D. are secured he cannot be expected to continue long in the College.

3. The arguments put forth above seem to be general and to apply to all subordinate posts in the College of Engineering. The question raised in G.O. No 57 Est, dated 21st January 1908, related only to the temporary additional Instructor in the College, and it does not appear that the Principal's argument that passed men will not remain long in this post, has much force.
