Delegation of powers.

Authorizing the Inspector-General of Police, with remark, to sanction the temporary exemption from special tests of unqualified clerks in the Police Department for a period not exceeding twelve months, and requesting the Commissioner for Government Examinations to submit a draft of the necessary alterations in the Public Service notification.

I have the honour to submit, for the favourable consideration of Government, a proposal to empower the Inspector-General to grant temporary exemption from special tests to unqualified clerks promoted to act in clerical appointments for which special tests have been prescribed.

2. The appointments referred to are Managers and Accountants in District Police offices and clerks on Rs. 50 and upwards in my office and the office of the Deputy Inspector-General, Criminal Intelligence and Railways.

3. As the number of qualified candidates for acting appointments in these posts is small, applications for exemption are not infrequent, and in the case of short appointments, applications are sometimes not made and the acting incumbent is unable to draw any extra allowance. To grant this power to the Inspector-General would tend to lessen correspondence. I understand that the High Court and the Board of Revenue exercise it.

[SUBJECT.—*Delegation to the Inspector-General of Police of power to exempt from Special tests unqualified clerks promoted to act in clerical appointments for which Special tests have been prescribed.*]

From the Inspector-General of Police, dated 24th January 1908, No. 89.

The question of delegating extended powers of exemption from examination rules to heads of departments is separately under consideration of Government.

2. It is submitted that the Inspector-General's current letter may lie over pending the issue of orders on that file.

Clauses (2) and (3) of article 5 of the Public Service Notification empower the Honourable the Judges of the High Court and the Members of the Board of Revenue to sanction the exemption from the special or departmental tests of persons in the departments administered by them for a period not exceeding twelve months, provided that the exemption shall remain in force only until the publication of the results of the next examination. The clauses prescribe, it will be observed, no limit of pay in respect of the appointments for which exemption may be granted.

2. The Inspector-General of Police now requests that he may be empowered just like the High Court and the Board of Revenue to sanction the temporary exemption from the special tests of unqualified clerks in the Police department. The clerical appointments in the Police department for which special tests are prescribed are given under *K. Police Department* on page 6 of the Public Service Notification.

3. It is for consideration whether the request of the Inspector-General of Police may be acceded to. At present, no heads of departments (other than the High Court and the Board of Revenue) enjoy such powers as the Inspector-General applies for, but in another file, which is being submitted separately for orders, the Board of Revenue have proposed that the Directors of Survey, Land Records and Agriculture may be empowered to sanction the exemption of their subordinates from passing the special tests for a period of one year.
