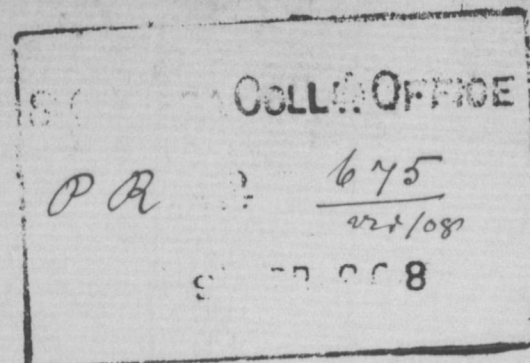

Collector's office, South Canara. He has passed the Matriculation
examination and has now put in a service of about 14
years. Sultan Mohideen has ^{also} passed the following special

- (2) Account (Lower); and
- (3) Survey test

2. He now requests that he may be permitted to appear
for the Criminal Judicial and the Revenue tests, Higher
grade. The Collector (Mr. Aziz-ud-Din) speaks very

4 & 5 of current file. From the Copies of testimonials

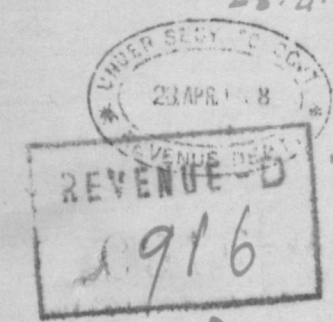
