The Humble petition of Saiyed Ahmed Hussain Albeez, grandson of Saiyed Mustafa Sahib Albeez Bahadur, late pensioned District Munsif, Dindigul.

Most Humbly Sheweth:

That with profound respect and humble submission, the petitioner brings the following few lines to Your Excellency's benign consideration, feeling confident that Your Excellency would take a merciful view of the same.

That the petitioner begs to state without exaggeration that he hails from a respectable and illustrious family that has rendered meritorious services to the British Government ever since the beginning of the 19th century. Vide, G. Lung's letter to the Secretary of State. During the time of the Mahomedan sway the petitioner's fore-fathers had held high and responsible offices and were exalted very much by the people not for their high appointments but for their lofty and noble virtues which are the characteristics of the family to which he has the proud privilege to belong.

Further, he begs to state that even under the Benign British and His Highness, the Nizam's Governments his nearest relations both on his paternal and maternal side held and are still holding high appointments, to wit his paternal grandfather, the late SAIYED MUSTAFA SAHIB who was a District Munsif and in recognition of whose services, for a period extending over 30 years he was granted a certificate. Vide, certificate. He would enumerate numerous other noble instances, but he is afraid that it would be tedious and taxing His Excellency's patience.

As for his educational qualifications he begs to state that he passed creditably the Government Lower Secondary Examination in the 1st Class and studied up to Matriculation Class but unforeseen calamities in the family, prolonged illness and in addition to these the strained financial difficulties of his parents disabled him from passing the Matriculation Examination and prosecuting higher studies. The petitioner remained at home without work for the last 2 years refusing to be employed in low posts, for, he thought that it would be degrading the prestige of his family. The petitioner is extremely desirous, true to the spirit of his grandfather to serve His Excellency's Government, but his not possessing higher Educational qualification at least a pass in the Government Upper Secondary Examination stands in the way. He therefore respectfully begs that His Excellency will graciously be pleased to exempt him from passing the Upper Secondary Examination so that he will get at least a Sub-Inspectorship in the Police Department, or some suitable jobs in other

For this act of charity and benevolence, the petitioner shall, as in duty bound, ever pray for Your Excellency's long life and prosperity.

A SHORT SKETCH

OF

The Family History

OF

Saiyid Ahmed Hussain Albiz.

SAIYID AHMED HUSSAIN ALBIZ is, as the paternal Geneological table will show, the 5th in descent from Rev: & renowned Moulvi Saiyid Mustafa Sahib Albiz Bahadur Kaziulnulk (Kazi of the land) the Karnatic and as the maternal Geneological table will show the 6th in descent from Nawab Saiyid Mohomed Khan Bahadur, the Chief Killadar of the Bangalore fort and 7th in descent from Nawab Mir Asadullah Khan Bahadur, the Prime minister, to Nawab Subadur Ali Khan Bahadur, the Ruler of Arcot.

The Prime minister his maternal ancestor is praised by Robert Orme F. A. S the Historian in his "History of the Military Transactions of the British Nation in Indoostan" in Vol. I Pages 39, 43, 45 and 48.

The Khilladar, his maternal ancestor, treated the British prisoners of war with much humanity and kindness and assisted them with large sums of money at a time when there was war waging from one corner of the Peninsula to another and gave them their liberty. He did this at a time when he had no connection with the British.

[Vide extract of letter from General Lung to the Secretary of State for India under date the 10th of April, 1815 and Government Order No. 952, dated the 20th of September 1820 and Government Orders Nos. 234 & 809 dated respectively 6th & 27th of February 1838 and also the letter No. 290 from the Chief Secretary of the Madras Government to the Government of India, dated 21st September 1870.]

His paternal great grand-father, Janab Hazarath Moulvi Saiyid Maroof Sahib Albiz Bahadur was appointed to the respectable and high post of Kaziul Kuzzath of the Supreme Court of Madras as a circuit Dt Judge with independent Civil & Criminal powers by the then Sadar Adalat Court of Madras which is the High Court of the day. Also he was the Supreme Kazi of the Presidency of Madras being vested with the power by the Government of nomination of Kazis in this Presidency holding required Special tests examinations His total service in the Government amounted to 47 years.

His maternal great grand-father Moulvi Saiyid Abdul Razak Sahib had held high and responsible posts under Tippu Sultan and on the fall of Srirangapatam was appointed Kazi of "Baramahal" and the Jaghir of Goornathapalli in the Krishnageri Taluk, Salem District was conferred on him by the British Government and this Jaghir is still enjoyed by the family.

His paternal grand-father, Janab Saiyid Mohomed Mustafa Sahib Albiz Bahadur was appointed as Mufty Sadar Amin of Madura in the year 1858. Sometime hence the office of Mufty was totally abolished by the Home Government, consequently he was obliged to accept the post of District Munsif of Madura on a salary of Rs 200 kindly volunteered by the then Honourable Judges of the High Court Madras, then he rose upto the grade of Rs. 300. He served under the Government for 30 years with utmost loyalty and due faithfulness. Even after he turned out a retired officer he did not spend his retirement in vain. But he tried to be useful both to the benign Government and to the public as much as he could. Hence he was Special Bench Magistrate Dindigul, member of the Taluk and District Boards of this circle and his long and meritorious service was recognised by the Benign Government on the auspicious occasion of Her (late) Majesty's Diamond Jubilee on 8th September 1897 by grant of a certificate presented in the name of Her Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria Empress of India (*Vide true copy of the certificate on Page 6 of the booklet*)

His maternal grand-father Moulvi Saiyid Abdul Kasim Sahib who was an eminent Mohomedan law officer and Special Commissioner of Mangalore attached to the then Eastern Provincial

Court was also appointed by the Government under Regulation II of 1802, a Commissioner of Coorg with John Voghlan Esq., Judge of the Western Provincial Court & Thomas Strange Esq., Judge of the Auxiliary Court at Tellicherry. *He assisted greatly the British Government, during the insurrection of Coorg.*

Mr. F. N. Maltbi in his official letter No 6, dated the 9th of March 1847, while recommending his maternal uncle to W. E. Lockshort Esq the Collector of Salem states as follows:—"The Services of his maternal grand-father and father establish a claim to Government employment." The same officer in his letter to his maternal uncle dated the 19th of July 1850 says:—"Your father served the Government with credit and I hope you will do the same,

Mr H. J. Stokes I. C. S. a former Collector of Madura in 1882 certifies his paternal uncle Saiyid Mohideen Sahib, Sub-magistrate who was then serving under him *to be the son of a highly respectable father.*

Honorable Mir Humayun Jah Bahadur C. I. E., F. M. U. a grand-son of Tippu Sultan and who had been a member of Madras Legislative Council for a period of 24 years and who was also appointed a member of the Imperial Legislative Council was the cousin of his maternal great grand-father. His maternal great grand uncle, Nawab Mir Abdul Kasim Khan Moinud-dowlah Nasib-ud-dowlah Bahadur, was the son-in-law of his highness the Nawab Sikandar Jah Bahadur, the late Nizam of Hyderabad,
