Sir,

In G.O. No. 214 Mis. dated 10th April 1907, sanction was accorded to the entertainment for one year, from the 1st July 1907, of a temporary assistant lecturer on Rs 75 per mensem in the Kumbakonam College with a view to the division of the F.A. classes into two sections. The Principal reports that the division has been most beneficial to the classes resulting in a larger percentage of passes in the F.A. Examination. The numbers in the two classes are now reported to be 172 viz. 96 in the Senior class and 76 in the Junior class and it is proposed to continue the division not only in Mathematics but also in Physiology. In these circumstances, the Principal requests that the services of the temporary assistant lecturer may be

retained until the end of the current calendar year and I beg to recommend the proposal for the sanction of Government.

2. No provision exists for the purpose in the current year's budget; and the Principal states that no provision was made as the continuance of the services of the Assistant lecturer had not been assured when he submitted the Budget Estimate. A reappropriation statement will be submitted later, on receipt of the final issue of the Civil Budget Estimates.

In G.O. no. 214 Edl dated 10th April 1907
the Govt. sanctioned the employment for
one year from the 1st July 1907, of a temporary
assistant ^{teacher} on Rs 75 per mensem in the Kumbakonam
College, with ^{The} a view ^{of dividing} to ~~the division~~ of the F.A.
classes into two sections. There were then 226 students
in the F.A. classes - 106 in the Senior and 120 in
the junior class.

2. The D.P.I. states that there are now
172 students in the F.A. classes - 96 in the
Senior and 76 in the junior class - and that it
is proposed to continue the division as it has been
most beneficial to the classes resulting in a larger
percentage of passes in the F.A. examinations.
The Director therefore requests that sanction may
be accorded to the retention of the temporary Assistant
until the end of the current calendar year.

3. According to Rule 86 (1) of the Educational
Rules the strength of a class in a Secondary School
shall not exceed 40. If this rule is applied to
College classes, both the Senior and junior F.A. classes

of the Kumbakonam College shall be divided into two sections each.

4. In these circumstances the retention of the temporary assistant until the end of the current calendar year may be sanctioned.

5. There is no provision for this charge in the current year's budget; but the D.P.I. states that he will submit a reappropriation statement later, when the final issue of the C.B.E. has been published.

6. A draft is placed below for approval; if approved, it may be sent to the Financial Dept for acceptance.

Under Regulation 349 of the University Regulations, one of the conditions of affiliation of a college is that the application for affiliation shall contain an assurance that "except with the special permission of the Syndicate, no College professor or lecturers will be allowed to lecture to a class or section of a class which has on its rolls more than 150 students".
