May it please your Excellency,

I, Mahamed Yusuf Sahib, Subpoena clerk in the --
Madras Court of Small Causes, most respectfully beg to submit
the following few lines for your Excellency's kind considera-
tion.

I humbly beg to submit that I belong to the Muhomedan
community and was entertained as a clerk in the said Court on
Rs. 17 - 8 - 0 a month, on 7th January 1881, during the time of
the late T. M. Mustafed Esquire, the then Chief Judge, on the
recommendation of the late Col. Drever C. S. I. the then Com-
missioner of Police for the City of Madras.

I was promoted to Rs. 20/- in 1883, which place I
have been holding since for the last 25 years without any lift,
as I am barred from promotion under the Examination Rules.

I beg to submit that I have a fair knowledge of Tamil,
Telugu and Hindustani languages and I have worked in almost all
the departments of the Establishment, where I have been dis-
charging my duties to the entire satisfaction of my superiors,
during a long service of 27 years and odd in this Court.

At present I am doing the duties of Subpoena clerk
as the small pay of Rs. 20/- I receive is too inadequate to --
maintain my large family of 8 souls Viz:- My-self, wife, three
sons, two daughters and an aged mother, and as I have not been
found wanting or deficient in satisfactorily discharging what-
ever work I had been put to these 27 years and odd, I most --

humbly crave that your Excellency would be graciously pleased to take into consideration my pettiabie case and grant me exemption from the Examination rules, so as to enable me to hold an appointment in this Court carrying a salary of up to Rs. 75/-.

I beg to add, that previous to this there have been cases in which similar merciful considerations have been shown by Government on the recommendations of the respective Chief Judges, to Mahomedali Sahib and Meer Ahsa Mullah Sahib 1881, to P. Venkoba Rao in 1882, and P. Rajagopal Naidu in 1903 on their similar solicitations.

For this act of your Excellency's esteemed kindness and Generosity, I shall as in duty bound ever pray.
